

COW TO SKIP THE PYP?

During the summer period, the Preparatory Year Program conducts several online sessions in English and Math as part of the Skip Prep Program. This program is called **KFUPM-STARS**. The main objective of the program is to provide support to all students so they will be more confident in their studies at KFUPM and have a chance to skip the program partially or completely.



If you passed both the promotion exams of PEP and PMP, then you are ELIGIBLE to **SKIP ALL PYP courses** and become

FRESHMAN STUDENT.

PYP PROMOTION POLICY

SKIP-PREP

At the beginning of the 1st semester, all students who submitted valid English Proficiency Exam (IELTS/TOEFL) or passed the University TOEFL Exam and the Math002 Promotion Exam are considered eligible to be promoted to FRESHMAN YEAR. It indicates that all PYP courses will be WAIVED including the MODULAR COURSES.

MODEL 1

SECOND SEM

At the beginning of the 2nd semester, all students who completed all Prep-English and Prep-Math courses are considered eligible to be promoted to FRESHMAN YEAR. It indicates that the remaining two modular courses they need to take for this semester will be waived.

MODEL 2

END OF A.Y.

By the end of 2nd semester, students are expected to complete all PYP courses including **all 4 modular courses** (they have chosen). They are considered eligible to be promoted to FRESHMAN YEAR.



ELECTIVES

By the end of 2nd semester, students are expected to complete all PYP courses including all 4 modular courses.

If in case students FAILED one or two modular courses that they have originally chosen at the beginning of the first semester, they CAN choose and complete other modular courses provided that they passed at least 4 by the end of the second semester.



Note: In some cases, students who fail to finish all PYP courses, including the 4 modular courses, by the end of the second semester, may be allowed to take summer term and/or the first semester of the next academic year to complete the PYP courses.
