## A BILL

for

- 1 AN ACT relating to unclaimed property; including electronic
- 2 gift cards in the definition of intangible property;
- 3 extending the period for abandonment of gift certificates,
- 4 electronic gift cards and credit memos; and providing for
- 5 an effective date.

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7 Be It Enacted by the Legislature of the State of Wyoming:

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- 9 **Section 1.** W.S. 34-24-102(a)(x)(B) and 34-24-114 are
- 10 amended to read:

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12 **34-24-102.** Definitions.

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14 (a) As used in this act:

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16 (x) "Intangible property" includes:

1 (B) Credit balances, customer overpayments, 2 certificates, electronic gift cards, security 3 deposits, refunds, credit memos, unpaid wages, unused 4 5 airline tickets and unidentified remittances except balances represented on debit cards; 6 7 34-24-114. Gift certificates, electronic gift cards 8 9 and credit memos. 10 (a) A gift certificate, electronic gift card or a 11 credit memo in an amount greater than one hundred dollars 12 13 (\$100.00) that remains unredeemed for more than three (3) 14 five (5) years after issuance is deemed abandoned.

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(b) In the case of a gift certificate or electronic gift card, the amount deemed abandoned is the price paid for the certificate or card itself. In the case of a credit memo, the amount deemed abandoned is the amount credited as shown on the memo itself.

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(c) The amount of a gift certificate, electronic gift

card or credit memo deemed abandoned is subject to the

custody of this state in the following circumstances:

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(i) The records of the issuer show that the last 2 address of the purchaser of the certificate, 3 electronic gift card or recipient of the memo is in this 4 5 state; 6 (ii) The records of the issuer do not show the 7 address of the purchaser or recipient, but do show that the 8 9 certificate, electronic gift card or memo was issued in this state; 10 11 (iii) The records of the issuer do not show the 12 13 address of the purchaser or of the recipient and do not show the state where the certificate, electronic gift card 14 or memo was issued, but the issuer is a domiciliary of this 15 16 state; or 17 (iv) The records of the issuer show that the 18 19 address of the purchaser or recipient, or if none, the state where the certificate, electronic gift card or memo 20 21 was issued, is in or is a state whose escheat or unclaimed 22 property law does not provide for the escheat or custodial taking of gift certificates, electronic gift cards and 23

1 credit memos, and the issuer is a domiciliary of this 2 state.

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(d) Commencing on the effective date of this act, a
business association issuing a gift certificate, electronic

gift card or credit memo in this state shall have a duty to
record either the name and address of a purchaser of a
certificate or electronic gift card or a recipient of a
credit memo or the state in which the certificate,
