Torah Blessings

We say these blessings before and after we hear Torah read out loud.

Brachot Hatorah means Torah Blessings. Noten hatorah means gives the Torah and is seen a few times in these blessings.

The honor to lead this blessing is one that is only given to adults in the Jewish community.

BLESSING BEFORE READING FROM THE TORAH:

בְּרָכוּ אֶת יְיָ הַמְּבֹרָךְ.

Congregation reads, and then leader repeats. בְּרוּךְ יְיָ הַמְּבֹרָךְ לְעוֹלָם וָעֶד.

אֲשֶׁר קִרְבָּנוּ לְעִבּוּדְךָ

וְנָתַן לָנוּ אֶת תּוֹרָתוֹ.

בְּרוּךְ אַתָּה יְיָ נוֹתֵן הַתּוֹרָה.

BLESSING AFTER READING FROM THE TORAH:

בְּרוּךְ אַתָּה יְיָ אֱלֹהֵינוּ מֶלֶךְ הָעוֹלָם

אֲשֶׁר נָתַן לָנוּ תּוֹרַת אֱמֶת

וְתִי עוֹלָם נִטַּע בְּתוֹכָנוּ.

בְּרוּךְ אַתָּה יְיָ נוֹתֵן הַתּוֹרָה.

Before:

Bless the Infinite, the blessed One!

Blessed is the Infinite, the blessed one, now and forever!

Blessed are you Adonai our God, ruler of the world, who has drawn us to your service, and has given us your Torah. Blessed are you Adonai, who gives the Torah.

After:

Blessed are you Adonai our God, ruler of the world, who has given us a Torah of truth, and planted in our midst eternal life. Blessed are you Adonai, who gives us the Torah.
