Fiscal year 2018 was a year of firsts for Lafayette General Medical Center (LGMC). The hospital focused on bringing in new technology and designations that would set them apart from other hospitals and healthcare providers in Acadiana.

■ LGMC opened two new large state-of-the-art cath lab suites, 11 new short-stay patient rooms and three new holding bays for optimizing inpatient cases. ■ LGMC started offering the first and only FDA-approved device designed to help reduce the risk of recurrent ischemic strokes in patients diagnosed with a patent foramen ovale. ■ LGMC received prestigious, international recognition as a designated Baby-Friendly birth facility. LGMC was the first hospital in Lafayette to receive this designation and worked toward that goal for the past three years. Becoming a Baby-Friendly Hospital is a comprehensive, detailed and thorough journey towards excellence in providing evidence-based maternity care with the goal of achieving optimal infant feeding outcomes and mother/baby bonding. ■ In an effort to keep patient safety at the forefront, LGMC became the first hospital in Acadiana to use Xenex LightStrike Germ-Zapping Robots™ to enhance environmental cleanliness by disinfecting and destroying hard-to-kill germs, bacteria and superbugs in hard-to-clean places. LGMC joined innovative hospitals such as the Mayo Clinic, MD Anderson and Stanford, which were early adopters of the new technology.

Acquired by Lafayette General Health (LGH) in 2015 as Lafayette General Southwest, the 2017-18 fiscal year was a season of advancement and growth for this campus. Changing its name from Lafayette General Southwest to Lafayette General Orthopaedic Hospital (LG Ortho), Lafayette General Health blazed a trail by creating the region's first hospital dedicated to orthopaedics. • Named one of America's Best Hospitals for Orthopaedics by Women's Choice Award. • Underwent an upgrade to the operating room (OR) and ancillary space; these improvements allowed for any OR to accommodate orthopaedics. • Two ORs were dedicated to the use of the Mako Robotic-Arm assisted surgical technology for knee and hip replacement – the first hospital in the Acadiana region to use Mako. • Continued its distinction as the only Center of Excellence in a four-state area - Louisiana, Mississippi, Alabama and Arkansas - to have the Joint Commission's Gold Seal of Approval in three joint replacement certifications – knee, hip and shoulder. • In order to accommodate the change to a full-service orthopaedic hospital, all cardiology was moved from LG Ortho to Lafayette General Medical Center (LGMC), boosting coordination of resources and improving clinical protocols. Similarly, LHC Group relocated its existing long-term acute care (LTAC) hospital from LGMC to LG Ortho.

Through this grant, LGSH used the fund for video-assisted laryngoscopy for difficult intubations, securing an airway without multiple attempts. Video laryngoscopy is a form of indirect laryngoscopy in which the clinician does not directly view the larynx. Instead, visualization of the larynx is performed with a fiber optic or digital laryngoscope. • Increased volume to meet the 2/2 rule (two patients for more than two nights). • HCAHPS and OASCAHPS overall ratings were 96th and 93rd respectively. • Renovated four ORs - updated rooms with newer technology, new flooring and wall coloring for infection prevention. • Purchased FAXITRON, an innovative technology for breast surgery • LGSH Employee Engagement in 99th percentile. • Surgery volume at LGSH experienced 14% growth. • Oil Center Surgical Plaza (OCSP) was recognized as a 2018 Women's Choice Award recipient, placing in the Top 30 • OCSP began offering neurosurgery to its surgical service lines • Experienced 10% overall growth in surgical volume • 99th percentile with an overall rating for OASCAHPS.

The 4th Annual AGH Spring Gala raised \$180,000 to benefit the expansion and renovation of the hospital's new Emergency Department, which broke ground in December of 2017.

The \$4 million project slated to increase Emergency Department from 3,000 square feet to 7,378 square feet, enabling three times the number of patients to be seen • Hosted the Color of Hope 5K for Breast Cancer Awareness month. • Became stop point for pilot of Ride Acadiana, a local commuter bus service. • Replaced all IV Pumps with CareFusion Alaris "smart pumps," creating a better, quieter experience for patients and caregivers. • Invested \$2 million in new radiology equipment, including MRI • Medical Oncologist Kristen Sager, M.D., joined Rebecca Davis, M.D., and began seeing patients at the Cancer Center of Acadiana at AGH • Outpatient Satisfaction ranked in the 97th percentile.

Seventy percent of voters said "YES" to the proposition. This was the only tax vote that passed in the state of Louisiana on March 24. From the yard signs, business posters, and the phone bank, voters in the Hospital Service District felt personally connected to the cause and wanted to keep their hospital going and growing. • On National Rural Health Day, November 16, SMH was recognized by The Chartis Center for Rural Health/iVantage Health Analytics and the National Organization of State Office of Rural Health for overall excellence in patient perspective, reflecting top quartile performance among all rural hospitals in the nation. • In May, SMH expanded their services with the opening of their Wound Care Center. This is the first Wound Care Center in St. Martin Parish, and allows for residents to receive quality care close to home. • With overwhelming community support and expanding services, it's no surprise that SMH was selected by Modern Healthcare as 2018 Best Places to Work for the third time.

Abrom Kaplan Memorial Hospital (AKMH), part of the Lafayette General Health family since 2015, continued improving access for patients, enhancing services and creating a better overall patient experience. In August, AKMH broke ground on a \$4.7 million expansion and renovation project. While the hospital has undergone extensive renovations since opening its doors on June 2, 1960, this is the first time the hospital has expanded since 1984 when the emergency department was added. The project includes a new business and patient registration and consultation area, new patient waiting area and conference room, new restrooms, new ultrasound room and new pharmacy. • All outpatient cardio procedures and home-based sleep studies were consolidated to one area. • Other improvements included dedicated outpatient and inpatient entrances and dedicated space for physical therapy, occupational therapy and speech therapy. • Improved 64-slice CT scanner. • Received the 2018 Funds for Safety Grant for the second time, using the earnings to purchase bladder scanners to reduce catheter associated urinary tract infections in patients. • Hosted a family Community Health Event where free BMI analyses, blood pressure checks, cholesterol, glucose and PSA screenings were performed. • Inpatient satisfaction ranked in the 95th percentile while outpatient satisfaction ranked in the 97th percentile.

As part of Lafayette General Health's (LGH) commitment to healthcare education, LGH chose to expand education opportunities offered to healthcare professionals in Acadiana. LGH supports Acadiana's only two major teaching hospitals providing not only a Graduate Medical Education (GME) residency program but also the first evidence-based curriculum Nurse Residency Program (NRP) in Louisiana. • LGH is affiliated with the LSU School of Medicine's Graduate Medical Education residency programs at Lafayette General Medical Center (LGMC) and University Hospital & Clinics (UHC). Residents in the GME program are medical school graduates who elect for additional years of training to meet advanced standards to practice medicine. These structured education experiences follow specific requirements of an intern, resident or fellow's specialty and are carefully regulated by the program's site directors and GME faculty. • The residents who rotate throughout our hospital system span a wide range of service lines including primary care and an expansive list of subspecialty services (see tables below).

Lafayette General Medical Doctors (LGMD) continued to grow and evolve in fiscal year 2018. LGMD added 10 new physicians of various specialties, including: primary care, infectious disease, internal medicine, breast radiology and three new physicians specializing in medical oncology and hematology. The addition of three new oncologists allowed Cancer Center of Acadiana (CCA) to expand services at Iberia Medical Center in New Iberia and Opelousas General Hospital in Opelousas. Expanding cancer services to outlying communities has been an ongoing priority for CCA.

Urgent Care Centers (UCC) benefited from a new addition to the Lafayette General Health (LGH) app, Skip the Wait. This new feature, available on both Apple and Android devices, allows patients to schedule their arrival time for Urgent Care and diagnostics visits, which reduces friction caused by long wait times. Since the launch of Skip the Wait in August, 3,822 people have benefited from scheduling their UCC visit. LGMD opened a wellness and diabetes clinic in July at the medical office building at Lafayette General Orthopaedic Hospital (LG Ortho). Primary care physicians can refer patients to the clinic for an initial assessment to determine their goals/needs, and the clinic provides self-care management and education services to help patients manage their health and wellness.






