In fiscal year 2019, we continued our mission to Restore, Maintain and Improve Health through a number of achievements and enhancements.

▪ We launched Health Anywhere, our telemedicine application, which enabled us to bring our dedication to care and excellent service to patients in the comfort of their own homes – or

anywhere with an internet connection. By using technology, we were able to extend our footprint throughout the state, meeting patients where they are – 24/7 – and stretching far beyond the walls of our facilities here in Acadiana. ▪ We physically broke ground on a number of new expansions and initiatives at many of our campuses. We celebrated a brand new emergency department at Acadia General Hospital, broke ground on a new urgent care center at University Hospital & Clinics, and opened Lafayette General

Orthopaedic Hospital, the first healthcare facility in the region dedicated to orthopaedics.

reflect on 2019 without mention of the start of a different kind of groundbreaking – a planned merger with Ochsner Health – a

partnership that will help us expand our clinical services and continue to not only grow as a healthcare system, but to improve the health of Louisianans across the Gulf South by

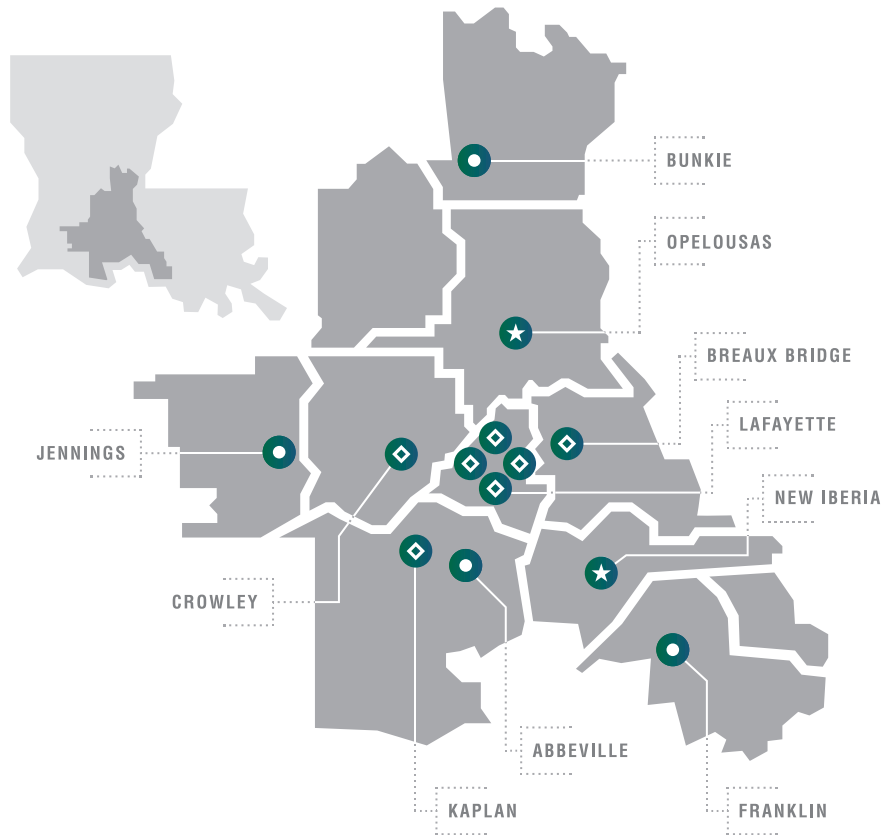
is a non-profit, community-owned regional healthcare system committed to always delivering excellence.

LGH also owns or manages Lafayette General Orthopaedic Hospital (LG Ortho), Lafayette General Surgical Hospital (LGSH), University Hospital & Clinics (UHC), St. Martin Hospital (SMH), Acadia General Hospital (AGH) and Abrom Kaplan Memorial Hospital (AKMH). At the close of fiscal year 2019, LGH had clinical affiliations with Abbeville General Hospital, Bunkie General Hospital, Franklin Foundation Hospital, Jennings American Legion Hospital and Collaborative Agreements with Iberia Medical Center and Opelousas General Health System. Lafayette General Health owns Lafayette General Medical Doctors (LGMD), a non-profit corporation that operates and manages several physician clinics in many different specialties. Both LGMC and UHC are major teaching hospitals, providing graduate medical education across many disciplines.

LAFAYETTE GENERAL MEDICAL CENTER

There were a number of groundbreaking achievements for Lafayette General Medical Center (LGMC) during fiscal year 2019. ■ From the completion of a chapel expansion and renovation project that now offers 1,100 square feet of support to patients, visitors and staff to the facility being established as a Level II Trauma Center—marking it as one of the most prepared hospitals to provide life-saving measures in the region. ■ LGMC also saw the renovation of its catheterization lab; a two-year project that expanded the three existing cath labs to include four new state-of-the-art suites, additional space in its cardio short-stay unit and three new holding bays for optimizing inpatient cases. ■ LGMC also saw an expansion of its services through the acquisition of Lafayette General Surgical Hospital, which became wholly owned by LGMC in fiscal year 2019. ■ In partnership with Louisiana Organ Procurement Agency (LOPA), LGMC also installed a button in its ICU to play ‘Amazing Grace’ when an organ donation is taking place in an effort to honor the families who have made the difficult decision of donating. ■ LGMC’s dedication to its community, its patients and its processes also won the facility the designation of being one of Women’s Choice Award’s 100 Best Hospitals for Patient Experience, as well as CHiME naming it one of the ‘Most Wired’ hospitals in the nation.

Acquired by Lafayette General Health (LGH) in 2015 as Lafayette General Southwest, the 2019 fiscal year was one of groundbreaking success for the campus. ■ 2019 saw the facility's official opening ceremony of the region's first hospital completely dedicated to orthopaedics. Its physicians, consisting of a number of alumnus from local high schools and carrying with them years of academic sports success and experience, also began working to further extend the campus's community reach. ■ Working with the Lafayette General Foundation, Lafayette General Orthopaedic Hospital began operating a Mobile Youth Athletic Training Room during the 2019 football season in an effort to work with high school athletes and ensure they remain in peak physical condition during the school year and beyond.

UNIVERSITY HOSPITAL & CLINICS

The most notable event in fiscal year 2019 for University Hospital & Clinics (UHC) was the construction of the region's first standalone, after-hours urgent care center that caters to both Medicaid and private insurance patients. ■ UHC continues to serve the region as its primary Graduate Medical Education center by training both residents and fellows in an effort to cultivate physicians for the future. ■ At the beginning of the fiscal year, UHC's Cancer Registry received the Gold Seal of Excellence Award from the Louisiana Tumor Registry for its achievements in data quality and timeliness. UHC's dedication to being a destination of choice for exceptional healthcare earned it the honor of being named one of America's 100 Best Hospitals for Patient Experience. ■ Additionally, the facility's focus on continuing education and training for its staff has led Modern Healthcare to select it as one of the Best Places to Work in the nation. ■ UHC expanded its services by opening rheumatology and gastroenterology clinics while also growing its gynecology clinic and adding plastic surgery to its surgical offerings.

LAFAYETTE GENERAL SURGICAL HOSPITAL OIL CENTER SURGICAL PLAZA

Fiscal year 2019 saw Lafayette General Surgical Hospital (LGSB) become wholly owned by Lafayette General Medical Center. ■ Both LGSB and OCSP continued to grow their surgical services in an effort to further their commitment to improving the patient experience, and 2019 saw an expansion of surgical services in podiatry, pain management, gynecology, urology and neurosurgery. ■ For the first time, the plastic & reconstructive surgery and breast surgical oncology teams partnered to incorporate state-of-the-art technology to assist them in performing DIEP flap breast reconstruction surgery, enabling them to naturally reconstruct a patient's breasts using their own tissue, skin and blood vessels. ■ OCSP also provides a first-of-its-kind procedure in Acadiana with the CATALYS Precision Laser System, which provides patients with a less-invasive option for cataract surgery. ■ Both facilities continued to increase in surgical volume while receiving high scores in Patient Satisfaction.

ACADIA GENERAL HOSPITAL

2019 was a year of expansion and growth at Acadia General Hospital (AGH) as they continued making strides in providing excellent healthcare to the communities they serve. ■ AGH celebrated the official opening of its new emergency department, completing a \$4 million expansion and renovation project that began in December of 2017. The department features the newest medical technology spread out among nine patient rooms, one trauma room, two triage rooms, two holding rooms and waiting area to hold 35. ■ In a further effort to bring quality healthcare close to home, Acadia General also partnered with LHC Group to open Acadia Extended Care Hospital inside of AGH. The hospital serves patients in Eunice, Crowley and the surrounding areas while bringing enhanced levels of care offered by a staff of highly trained healthcare professionals.

ST. MARTIN HOSPITAL

In fiscal year 2019, St. Martin Hospital (SMH), celebrating its 50th anniversary, rededicated its commitment to better serving its community with a groundbreaking ceremony that signaled the start of an \$11.2 million expansion and renovation project. The project, slated to add an additional 30,000 square feet of general site improvements, renovations and additions, would help the facility deliver new, vital offerings—including surgical services—for the first time in St. Martin Parish.

- In June, SMH also began providing inmate care in partnership with the BEACON project through 24/7 telemedicine services.
- Additionally, the campus was one of the first critical access hospitals recognized by HIMSS for its approaches to interoperability functionality with electronic medical records by receiving a Stage 7 award.
- On National Rural Health Day, St. Martin Hospital was recognized by the Louisiana Rural Health Association as the Outstanding Rural Health Program of the Year.
- SMH also received a Guardian of Excellence Award in Outpatient Services from Press Ganey for their continued excellence and quality performance throughout the year.

GRADUATE MEDICAL EDUCATION

As part of Lafayette General Health’s (LGH) commitment to the future of healthcare education, the system continues to expand educational opportunities offered to healthcare professionals in South Louisiana. LGH supports South Louisiana’s only two major teaching hospitals providing not only Graduate Medical Education (GME) residency programs (training competency-based and high quality physicians) but also the first evidence-based curriculum Nurse Residency Program (NRP) in Louisiana. LGH is affiliated with the LSU School of Medicine’s Graduate Medical Education residency programs at Lafayette General Medical Center and University Hospital & Clinics. Residents in the GME program are medical school graduates who elect for additional years of training to meet advanced standards to practice medicine. These structured education experiences follow specific requirements of an intern, resident or fellow’s specialty and are carefully regulated by the program’s site directors and GME faculty. The residents who rotate throughout our hospital system span a wide range of service lines including primary care and an expansive list of subspecialty services (*see tables below*).
