Ochsner Lafayette General owns Lafayette General Medical Doctors, a non-profit corporation that operates and manages several physician clinics in many different specialties. Both Ochsner Lafayette General Medical Center and Ochsner University Hospital & Clinics are major teaching hospitals, providing graduate medical education across many disciplines.





Over the years, Ochsner Lafayette General Medical Center has expanded its services and facilities to meet the community's growing needs, and currently boasts a Level II Trauma Center, a Center of Excellence in Breast Imaging and Lung Cancer Screening, an Accredited Cancer Center by the Commission on Cancer, a Cigna 3-Star Quality Program and Aetna Center of Excellence in Bariatrics, an Advanced Thrombectomy Capable Stroke Center and a Blue Cross Blue Shield Blue Distinction Center in Maternity Care and in Bariatrics. Its Women's Services program is also a designated baby-friendly facility that is Guided Infant Feeding Techniques (GIFT) Certified.

Ochsner Lafayette General Orthopaedic Hospital serves as an extension of Ochsner Lafayette General Medical Center. It is a full-service, acute care hospital that offers emergency room services, imaging services, rehabilitation services and a team of board-certified orthopaedic surgeons at Ochsner Lafayette General Orthopaedic Center, which is located in the Medical Office Building on the hospital's campus. From pre-operative services to post-surgery needs, it is the region's only hospital dedicated to orthopaedics and is certified by The Joint Commission for its disease-specific care in joint replacement of the hip, knee and shoulder as well as for its stroke rehabilitation unit. Ochsner Lafayette General Orthopaedic Hospital offers the most robust package of services and surgical talent in orthopaedics found throughout South Louisiana. In June of this fiscal year, the hospital was also designated by Blue Cross Blue Shield as a Blue Distinction Center for Knee and Hip Replacement.

OCHSNER UNIVERSITY HOSPITAL & CLINICS


Ochsner University Hospital & Clinics is a full-service, acute care hospital with multiple specialty clinics housed on its campus, including an after-hours urgent care center, dedicated to serving Acadiana's uninsured and under-insured population as well as those with private insurance. Services include outpatient labs, audiology testing, nutrition services, stress labs, an outpatient pharmacy, respiratory therapy, rheumatology, cardiology, endocrinology, family medicine and more. The facility also houses a learning resource center and operates as the region's primary Graduate Medical Education center, including internship, residency, subspecialty and fellowship programs, all of which lead to state licensure and board certification.



OCHSNER LAFAYETTE GENERAL SURGICAL HOSPITAL OIL CENTER SURGICAL PLAZA

Ochsner Lafayette General Surgical Hospital is owned by Ochsner Lafayette General Medical Center. It is an 18,500 sq. ft. hospital including 10 inpatient rooms and four operations rooms, and offers a variety of specialized services including radiology, general surgery, ENT surgery, vascular surgery, urology surgery, OBGYN surgery, podiatry surgery, plastic surgery, oncological breast surgery and neurosurgery. The hospital proudly ranks in the top decile in both employee and patient satisfaction surveys nationally. Our ambulatory surgery center, Oil Center Surgical Plaza (OCSP), is located on the second floor of Ochsner Lafayette General Surgical Hospital. The 12,656 sq. ft. facility accommodates less complicated surgical procedures related to ophthalmology, ENT (ear, nose and throat) and pain management. OCSP is co-owned by Ochsner Lafayette General Medical Center and local physicians.





OCHSNER ACADIA GENERAL HOSPITAL


Ochsner Acadia General Hospital serves a vibrant Acadia Parish population with a state-of-the-art facility, including an emergency department that is Level 3 Geriatric Emergency Department Accredited (GEDA). Currently, the facility provides robot-assisted surgery, 3D mammography, acute medical and surgical care, intensive care, gynecology, pediatric, orthopaedic, otolaryngology, cardiac, nephrology, ophthalmology, oncology and emergency services, as well as vein therapy, wound care and hyperbaric medicine. Additionally, the facility maintains one offsite outpatient department: Wound Care and Hyperbaric Medicine located in Tower One.

OCHSNER ST. MARTIN HOSPITAL



Founded in 1958 as a non-profit, general acute care facility, Ochsner Abrom Kaplan Memorial Hospital is a full-service hospital in the "Gateway to Acadiana's Wetlands" that serves a major role in caring for Vermilion Parish. The location provides easy access to healthcare and emergency medicine services not traditionally found in rural hospitals, including home sleep studies, an Outpatient Infusion Center, skilled nursing services, digital radiology and imaging, therapy services and more. In FY20, the facility opened a new specialty physician clinic that offers general surgery, gastro-intestinal, ENT (ear, nose and throat) and cardiology services to the residents of Kaplan and its surrounding areas.

As part of Ochsner Lafayette General's commitment to healthcare education, the system continues expanding education opportunities offered to area healthcare professionals. Ochsner Lafayette General supports South Louisiana's only two major teaching hospitals, which provide not only a Graduate Medical Education (GME) residency program but also the first evidence-based curriculum Nurse Residency Program (NRP) in Louisiana. Ochsner Lafayette General is affiliated with the LSU School of Medicine's Graduate Medical Education residency programs at Ochsner Lafayette General Medical Center and Ochsner University Hospitals & Clinics. Residents in the GME program are medical school graduates who elect for additional training to meet advanced standards to practice medicine. These structured experiences follow specific requirements of an intern, resident or fellow's specialty and are carefully regulated by the program's site directors and GME faculty. The residents who rotate throughout our system span a wide range of service lines including primary care and an expansive list of subspecialty services (see tables below).

From expansions to new services, we found more ways than ever to provide groundbreaking and quality care to our patients in and around Acadiana.

Providing Telemedicine Services to the Incarcerated

When an inmate needs to see a medical specialist, getting care can be complicated. Prisoners have to be transported under guard, often in shackles and the process is expensive for the correctional facility and time-consuming for the patient. Ochsner St. Martin Hospital has embarked on an innovative approach that removes those hurdles in partnership with the BEACON project.

The first comprehensive program for incarcerated inmates of its kind, the service includes telemedicine care available 24/7 with a nursing staff model – making it possible to see a nurse practitioner or physician at any time. Once an inmate is released, they are assigned to a social worker that works with the state's Medicaid program to provide immediate access to Medicaid coverage, with the hospital providing the electronic hospital record.

This program allows us to further care for members of our community that otherwise might not receive the access they need to vital services throughout their sentence and beyond.




Expanding Care to Jefferson Davis Parish

In March of 2020, Jennings American Legion Hospital and Ochsner Lafayette General signed a letter of intent (LOI) to explore a merger, whereby Ochsner Lafayette General will assume management and operations of the Jefferson Davis Parish facility. Under the proposed structure, Ochsner Lafayette General

will enter into a multi-year lease of the hospital, its clinics, physical plant and equipment with the Jennings American Legion Post.

The goal of this proposed relationship is to help Jennings American Legion Hospital remain the hospital of choice in Jefferson Davis Parish, keeping residents close to home while receiving high quality medical services. Ochsner Lafayette General is also able to provide expanded resources, technology, purchasing power and more access to services. This will enable the facility to deliver care more efficiently and cost-effectively, leading to enhanced patient outcomes, financial stability and long-term viability.



Delivering a Better Patient Experience

In December of 2019, Ochsner Lafayette General partnered with the nation's leading patient intake platform, Phreesia, to provide its patients with a more modern, convenient and engaging experience at all of its facilities.

Ochsner Lafayette General is leveraging Phreesia's now-generally available bidirectional, discrete integration with Cerner Millennium

to capture demographic and payment information from patients during intake. The data is automatically sent to staff in real time so they can more fully understand patients' individual status.

As COVID-19 testing began, Phreesia was crucial in providing convenient scheduling options and appointment notifications remotely to patients across the system, and its ability to reduce wait room times and offer an efficient check-in experience was an effective part of reducing congestion across campuses and urgent cares.



Ochsner Abrom Kaplan Memorial Hospital Completes Expansion

In March of 2020, Ochsner Abrom Kaplan Memorial Hospital completed a \$4.7 million expansion project that renovated more than 7,000 square feet of space while adding 6,419 square feet to the facility.

The largest renovation in the hospital's history since opening its doors in 1960, the expansion was designed to help create easier

patient access while enhancing services and the patient experience. It includes new business, patient registration and consultation areas, a new patient waiting area and conference room, new restrooms, a new ultrasound room and a new pharmacy. Other features include consolidating all outpatient cardio procedures, such as EKG, Holter monitoring and the facility's home-based sleep studies. Additionally, all phlebotomy is now located just off of the lobby area, making lab work quick and accessible for patients. Other improvements include dedicated outpatient and inpatient entrances and a dedicated space for physical therapy, occupational therapy and speech therapy. All radiology services are also now together, featuring an improved, 64-slice CT scanner. And, for the first time, Ochsner Abrom Kaplan Memorial Hospital can now offer MRIs to its patient population. This expansion is a part of the hospital's efforts to keep care closer to home than ever before.


OUR COMMITMENT
