

The landmark work of comics journalism by Joe Sacco in a new hardcover edition with a new afterword by Israeli journalist Amira Hass and an introduction by Palestinian American author and critic Edward Said.

Joe Sacco's breakthrough work of graphic journalism - a now-established genre almost single handedly invented by Sacco - won the American Book Award upon its initial release in 1996 and has remained a perennial, essential work for understanding the Palestinian Israeli conflict in the Middle East. This new hardcover edition includes a new afterword by Israeli journalist Amira Hass and also features Palestinian academic and critic Edward Said's timeless 2001 introduction to the work.

Based on extensive research and an extended visit to the Gaza Strip, West Bank, and East Jerusalem in the early 1990s, where he conducted over 100 interviews with Palestinians and Jews, Palestine was the first major comics work of political and historical nonfiction by Sacco, whose name has since become synonymous with this graphic form of New Journalism. Like Safe Area Gorazde, Palestine has been favorably compared to Art Spiegelman's Pulitzer Prize-winning Maus for its ability to brilliantly navigate such socially and politically sensitive subject matter through the immersive lens of the comic book medium. Sacco has often been called the first comic book journalist, and he is certainly the best.

JOE SACCO is a Maltese American living in Portland, Oregon. He is the author of many acclaimed graphic novels, including Safe Area Gorazde, War's End, and Footnotes in Gaza. AMIRA HASS is an Israeli journalist and author, mostly known for her columns in the daily newspaper Haaretz covering Palestinian affairs in Gaza and the West Bank, where she has lived for almost thirty years. EDWARD W. SAID (1935-2003) was University Professor of English and Comparative Literature at Columbia. His celebrated works include Orientalism, The End of the Peace Process, Power, Politics and Culture, and the memoir Out of Place .



My Time Machine: A Graphic Novel By Carol Lay

My Time Machine unfolds across the socially and politically confused landscape of early 2020, where Carol Lay's middle-aged female protagonist (who bears a suspicious resemblance to the author) embarks on a time-hopping odyssey that takes her from the addled and anxious "contemporary" America to the farthest reaches of time.

Finding the blueprints belonging to the eponymous Time Traveler of H.G. Wells' novel, our reluctant and all-too-human heroine enlists her ex-husband Rob's engineering genius in constructing the same kind of machine capable of the same awesome power. With a (more or less) functioning time machine at her disposal, she decides there's no better time to do her part to save humanity from itself and starts looking for (figurative) butterflies to pin down in hopes of altering the history of human civilization and averting the impending effects of climate change.

Wary of causing unintended consequences by traveling into the past to change history, she heads into the future, alone, to see if she can gain any insights she can bring back to 2020 that could help change the course of a world suffering from the reckless consequence of the Anthropocene. She anticipates the worst, but that's not quite bad enough: Not only is there the ecological collapse she feared, but by 2035, America has devolved into a fascist state and by 2060 to full blown totalitarianism. It appears environmental havoc is ineluctably accompanied by political disaster.


My Time Machine is both a sly, cautionary political satire and a rollicking time travel story, full of playful time travel paradoxes, edge-of-your-seat suspense, breezy badinage, and a deeply felt wonder at the universe. It is serious and funny, timely and timeless (literally).

CAROL LAY graduated from UCLA with a B.F.A. in Fine Arts. Her first independent comics series, the critically acclaimed *Good Girls*, appeared in 1987 from Fantagraphics. Her work has appeared in the *Village Voice, Entertainment Weekly, Newsweek, The New York Times, The Wall Street Journal, The New Yorker, Mad Magazine*, and others. She lives in CA.






In its last decade, Schulz's iconic comic strip remains full of surprises!





Elise and the New Partisans By Tardi and Dominique Grange

Fêted French cartoonist Tardi masterfully dramatizes the activist and singer Dominique Grange's gripping first-person account of the powerful student protest movements that rocked France from the '60s to the '70s.

In May 1968, France exploded. Leftist student groups occupied the streets of Paris, riot police clashed with protesters, and a general strike spread across France like wildfire, threatening to grind government and industry to a halt. And at the heart of it all – Elise.

Ten years earlier, Elise came to Paris to try her luck in show business. While she met with success as a pop singer, she soon found herself radicalized by the Algerian War and the poor treatment of Algerian immigrants in Paris. For the next 20 years, she would join the fight against labor exploitation, social injustice, and racism in France — risking it all for progressive causes.

The firsthand account of activist and singer Dominique Grange, *Elise and the New Partisans* is an authentic and exhilarating glimpse into the front lines of the spirited social movements of late-20th century France. Drawn with typical mastery by legendary French cartoonist Tardi, this graphic novel resonates powerfully at a time when the fight against injustice still rages.


DOMINIQUE GRANGE is a French singer-songwriter, activist, and comics translator whose career was kicked off with her 1968 protest song "Les Nouveaux Partisans" ("The New Partisans"). She and Tardi married in 1983. TARDI is one of France's most celebrated cartoonists, whose remarkable oeuvre comprises masterworks of sci-fi and steampunk, crime and noir, and war.







FEDERICO BERTOLUCCI, is a comics artist best known for drawing the award-winning wildlife-themed graphic novel series *Love*, written by Frédéric Brémaud. Since the late 1990s, Bertolucci has also drawn for such Italian Disney comics as *Topolino* and *W.I.T.C.H.* His stories for the latter have also been reprinted in multiple American editions.



Sunday By Olivier Schrauwen

Internationally acclaimed graphic novelist Olivier Schrauwen returns with a masterfully funny and profound day in the life narrative.

Sunday follows, over the course of one day, the stream of consciousness of a fictionalized version of the author's cousin, Thibault. On the day of his girlfriend's return from an extended trip, Thibault wakes up, does nothing, gets James Brown stuck in his head, drinks and smokes, grows paranoid about his relationship, struggles to compose text messages, and watches *The DaVinci Code*, all the while avoiding anyone and everyone, descending deeper into his own thoughts and fears. Meanwhile, a former crush and another cousin of Thibault's plan a surprise birthday for him, sending the external and internal on a collision course.

Schrauwen's brilliant comic timing and formal mastery transcends the quotidian nature of the plot. Through use of color, flashback and the dissonance between text and image, the ways in which Schrauwen layers a depiction of human consciousness as lines on paper are infused heavily with slapstick and white-knuckle tension and make for an exhilarating read and breathtaking use of the comics medium.

OLIVIER SCHRAUWEN was born in Belgium in 1977 and studied animation at the Academy of Art in Gent, and comics at ESA Saint-Luc in Brussels. He currently lives in Berlin. He is the author of the books *The Man Who Grew His Beard* (2011), *Arsène Schrauwen* (2014), *Parallel Lives* (2018), and *Portrait of a Drunk* (2020, in collaboration with Ruppert & Mulot).





Similarly, the short poems each evoke a distinct sense of dread for the sleeping imagination to expand upon; together, the words and pictures conjure a nightmarish world tinged with pitch black humor. The sequences splay across double-page spreads, evoking Edward Gorey gone grand scale, and grand guignol.

For those of a nervous disposition, read in bright sunlight. For those in search of a nervous disposition, take two before bed.

JOHN KENN MORTENSEN is an illustrator, author, and film director. In 2011, he debuted a book of illustrations, *Sticky Monsters*, which has become an international bestseller. His other works in Danish include *The Wrestler* and two illustrated adaptations of classic Brothers Grimm tales. His most recent books include *Night Terror* and *A Christmas Bestiary* (with Benni Bødker). He lives in Copenhagen.

The second volume in Fantagraphics' series of lavish, over-sized volumes collecting the best work of single artists for the pre-superhero 1950s Marvel Comics, spotlighting industry stalwart Al Williamson (EC Comics, *Star Wars, Flash Gordon*).

After becoming a professional comics artist in 1948 at the age of 17, by 21 Al Williamson was well-regarded enough as a Western and science-fiction illustrator to be recruited for the EC Comics staff roster — the absolute peak of the field in the 1950s, and a team rarely challenged since. After the Comics Code forced EC to reduce their business, Williamson found himself at the door of Atlas Comics, the largest employer of freelancers in the field.

From 1955–60, Williamson would draw 99 stories for Atlas (both solo and with help by "Fleagle Gang" studio cohorts Angelo Torres and Roy Krenkel, plus Gray Morrow and Ralph Mayo) in mostly western and fantasy genres, with a smattering of war, romance and "jungle girl adventure". He flourished on Westerns, freely and loosely rendered four-page morality plays, many scripted economically by Stan Lee. With his extensive oeuvre subsequently based mostly in newspaper strips (including *Flash Gordon, Secret Agent Corrigan*, and the syndicated *Star Wars*, at George Lucas' own request), or working largely as an inker, his Atlas stories collectively are the largest single body of work Williamson would ever do as a primary creator for one company. Fantagraphics is proud to present this Al Williamson Artist Edition to finally showcase this distinct period of his remarkable career.

AL WILLIAMSON (1931–2010) was a comics artist best known for his work on EC's *Weird Science* and *Weird Fantasy* comics titles (and, later, *Creepy* and *Eerie*, comics magazines that featured EC alumni). He also adapted *Star Wars* into comics and worked on the newspaper strips *Flash Gordon* and *Secret Agent X-9*, both creations of Alex Raymond. He also inked various Marvel superhero comics and was inducted into the Will Eisner Hall of Fame in 2000.





Julia Gfrörer is quietly one of the most influential cartoonists of her generation. Emerging from the Portland scene at the height of the Obama era, her comics augured the dark times to come, using graphic sex, pitch-black horror, a hunger for exploring the past, and a line cruel as a whip to create her own unmistakable sense of millennial melancholy. Reflecting her DIY ethos, much of her work has only been available in self-published zines or independent anthologies, many of them rare or out-of-print — until now.

World Within the World features 30 of Gfrörer's short stories, culled from a decade of writing and drawing at the bleeding edge of the art form. Her tales of desire, despair, and the universal need for connection span centuries, continents, and cultures from prehistoric teenagers in love to Christian martyrs in the making to modern-day vampires on the make. Along the way her bold, confident work leads the reader to some unexpected places, whether erotica inspired by the works of Edgar Allan Poe or a post-apocalyptic parody of Frasier.

In World Within the World, there is no distinction between the realistic and the fantastic, the psychological and the supernatural, the modern and the medieval, the mundane and the sublime — just the artist's unflinching vision of how it feels to be human, no matter when or where.

JULIA GFRÖRER lives on Long Island where she maintains an extensive collection of black cardigans. She is the author of the graphic novels *Black Is the Color* (2013), *Laid Waste* (2016), and *Vision* (2020), and her work has appeared in Kramers Ergot and Best American Comics. She pronounces her name "gruh-*fare*," whether you do or not.





Jessica Farm By Josh Simmons

A career-spanning comics project 24 years in the making, Josh Simmons creates a deeply personal fantasy drama infused with psychological horror.

Like a Lynchian take on *Alice in Wonderland, Jessica Farm* opens with an exterior of what could be any Midwestern farmhouse. Once inside, we track our titular heroine (she is a person, not a place) as she bounds out of bed on Christmas morning and goes about her routine, eventually breakfasting with her grandparents. The banality of the situation is subverted by a ratcheting sense of dread as we discover that Jessica's increasingly nightmarish house — where the inside seems bigger than the outside, like Snoopy's doghouse — is filled with creatures around every corner: some whimsical, some sexual, some despairing, and some malevolent. Most terrifying of all is Jessica's father. Will she even get to open the presents under the Christmas tree?

Taking place over a single Christmas Day, *Jessica Farm* is a career-spanning comics project in which Simmons has been drawing one page every month for the past 24 years, starting in January 2000. This is a horror-fantasy-psychodrama that will appeal to fans of Charles Burns, David Cronenberg, and Dario Argento.

JOSH SIMMONS was born in Connecticut in 1977. He is the creator or co-creator of the graphic novels *House, Jessica Farm, Black River, The Furry Trap, Flayed Corpse, All Time Comics Zerosis Deathscape* and *Dream of the Bat.* In addition, he has contributed to many comics and anthologies including *Kramers Ergot, Creepy, Mome, Razorblades* and *NOW.* He has also self-published piles of mini comics, including his most recent series, *Ghouls.* He currently lives in Portland, OR.

James Swinnerton is one of the most creative, respected, and prolific comic artists from the first half of the 20th century. Yet to the disappointment of classic comics lovers, his work has seen little reproduction. Until now. This sumptuous volume covers Swinnerton's six-decade career in comics, from his beginnings as a sports/ editorial cartoonist for William Randolph Hearst in San Francisco to his years in the America's Southwest desert, where his love for the land and its people came through in his comics and illustration.

Swinnerton is an excellent storyteller offering a cinematic style with humor that is both slapstick and sophisticated. At the forefront is his long-running *Little Jimmy* comic strip. This namesake character began by mixing satire of New York society with stories of rural America. He then took the characters on the road to South America, Mexico, and then settling for many years in Swinnerton's beloved Southwest. Also included in this book are his early one-shots and series like the rakish *Mr. Jack* and the anthropomorphic Mt. Ararat, and his 1940s stylized comic of the modern West, Rocky Mason.

Swinnerton was famous for more than just comics. He wrote and illustrated the charming feature "The Canyon Kiddies" and similar titles for weekly magazines. In his later years he became known as a premier painter of desert landscapes. All of these are featured in this book.

painter of desert landscapes. All of these are featured in this book. *Jimmy!* includes an illustrated biography and essays by co-editor Michael Tisserand and Eddie Campbell. The comic strips in this volume are carefully restored to their original colors and printed at near-full size. Swinnerton lovers will be delighted by the richness and variety of the works seen here. Those new to this uniquely American artist will likely join the growing numbers who appreciate his important role in the history of the comics.





Tell Me a Story Where the Bad Girl Wins: The Life and Art of Barbara Shermund

This gorgeous art book celebrates the work and legacy of Barbara Shermund, one of the first female cartoonists for humor and lifestyle magazines in the United States, including *The New Yorker* and *Esquire*.

Tell Me a Story Where the Bad Girl Wins doubles as an official biography and coffee table art collection honoring the life and art of pioneering cartoonist Barbara Shermund, an unheralded early master of magazine cartooning whose career spanned the heyday of American magazines from the 1920s–1960s. Her sharp wit and loose style boldly tapped the zeitgeist of first-wave feminism with vivid characters that were alive and astute. Shermund's

women spoke their minds about sex, marriage, and society; smoked cigarettes and drank; and poked fun at everything in an era when it was not common to see young women doing so. Shermund left behind a body of work that was ahead of its time and remains insightful, witty, relevant, and contemporary.


As one of the first women cartoonists to work for *The New Yorker* the year of its launch in 1925, she created nine covers and more than 600 cartoons for the magazine, in addition to countless spot illustrations, giving the nascent


publication its unique visual brand. Shermund later became a mainstay at Esquire; contributed to *Life, Colliers, Judge,* and more; had a syndicated newspaper cartoon published by King Features; and illustrated a variety of books. In 1950, Shermund was among the first three women to be accepted as a member of the male-dominated National Cartoonist Society. A compelling facet of Shermund's work is her frequent nods to queer audiences, which appeared in her work more than that of any of her contemporary New Yorker cartoonists. There are indications in her personal files that she also may have been queer, including love letters and other personal archives that McGurk has unearthed.

Readers will discover Shermund's unique and vibrant life and art and gain an understanding of how women's place in the history of cartooning has been controlled and sublimated by greater societal and cultural allowances. Through close readings, archival research, reproductions of original art, correspondence and photographs, this volume uncovers and celebrates a trailblazing female magazine cartoonist, and rightfully places her in the canon of cartoon art history.

CAITLIN MCGURK is the Curator of Comics and Cartoon Art at the Billy Ireland Cartoon Library & Museum, and Associate Professor at The Ohio State University. McGurk's scholarship and exhibitions center the work of women in comics, alternative and underground comics, and early American comic strips. She lives in an old house in Columbus, Ohio. EMILY FLAKE is an American cartoonist and illustrator. Her work has appeared in *The New Yorker, The New York Times, Mad Magazine, Time*, and many other publications. She also writes a bi-weekly cartoon for *The Nib* and her weekly comic strip *Lulu Eightball* appeared in numerous alternative newsweeklies in the early 2000s.





She's won the Japanese Medal of Honor with the Purple Ribbon (the first woman comics creator to do so), received Japan's SF Grand Prize, the Osamu Tezuka Culture Award Grand Prize, and an Inkpot Award, among other accolades.




The Complete I, René Tardi, P.O.W. By Tardi



Vol. 8 contains Crepax's longest graphic novel — "Story of O." A woman finds fulfillment when she subsumes her identity by sexually submitting to a secret society. Crepax sumptuously draws every strike of the whip and taps into the sensuality of body modification in his adaptation of this groundbreaking work. Also included is his short story "The Unexpected



GUIDO CREPAX was born in Milan, Italy, in 1933. He went on to become one of Italy's most important cartoonists, most famous for his psychedelic and erotic Valentina stories. Some of her exploits were adapted into a TV series and a film. He died in 2003. ALAIN ROBBE-GRILLET (1922–2008) was an influential French writer and filmmaker associated with the Nouveau Roman movement in novels such as *Le Voyeur* and *La Jalousie*. His film collaborations, such as *Last Year at Marienbad* (with Alain Resnais), won prizes and Academy Award nominations.

The Atlas Comics Library No. 5: Police Action

By Joe Maneely, Gene Colan, Bob Powell, et al.

Pre-Code cops and robbers' action from the early 1950s! The fifth stand-alone genre-themed collection in Fantagraphics' archival series of mid-century Marvel Comics.

Before focusing on tales of justice via superheroes under the Marvel banner, the publisher covered ground-level crime across a range of comics titles and true-crime magazines. Under the Timely imprint from 1947, and Atlas from 1951, up to eleven graphic series including *Justice Comics, Official True Crime Cases, All-True Crime, Crime Cases, Crime Can't Win, Crime Must Lose,* and *Crime Exposed* all muscled each other and competitors for space on the newsstands.

For the first crime-themed volume in Fantagraphics' ongoing project to restore and resurrect pre-Marvel pulp classics, the Atlas Library has selected a book that debuted as the genre peaked, just before a Senate hearing and the institution of the Comics Code banned the use of the word "Crime" from even appearing in a comic's title. Escaping that fate, *Police Action* had a seven-issue run of violent and noir-ish morality plays, pitting the officers of the law against the forces of urban malevolence, and was produced by the cream of the Atlas freelance roster, including Joe Maneely, Robert Q. Sale, Gene Colan, Art Peddy, Mort Lawrence, Werner Roth and Bob Powell.

Rounding the volume off, also presented is a post-Code one-shot, *Police Badge #479*, a snapshot of the industry's attempts to adapt to new strictures on the genre: here we view "our boys in blue" in the fight against rank corruption, highlighting the work of Don Heck and Joe Maneely.

JOE MANEELY (1926–1958) blazed a trail through Marvel's 1950s comic books that is unsurpassed in both quantity and quality. Maneely was revered as a lightning-fast talent, and he launched most of Marvel's character features during that time, excelling at every genre. He is best remembered today for his signature character, The Black Knight. **EUGENE JULES COLAN** (1926 - 2011) was an American comic book artist best known for his work for Marvel Comics, where his signature titles include the superhero series *Daredevil*, the cult-hit satiric series *Howard the Duck*, and *The Tomb of Dracula*, considered one of comics' classic horror series. **BOB POWELL** (1916-1967) was a prolific artist who freelanced for Atlas, Fawcett, Harvey, Street and Smith's Shadow Comics, and many more. From 1961 until his death, he worked as the art director for Joe Simon's satirical *Sick* magazine, with other freelance work including several Marvel superhero stories, and penciling the art for Topps' famed *Mars Attacks* series of trading cards.

"Data entry" has never been so sexy (and a little sinister too).


GUIDO CREPAX was born in Milan, Italy, in 1933. After acquiring a degree in architecture, he worked on award-winning advertising campaigns for such corporations as Shell and Dunlop. He went on to become one of Italy's most important cartoonists, most famous for his psychedelic and erotic Valentina stories. Some of her exploits were adapted into a TV series and a film. He died in 2003.





The Fabulous Furry Freak Brothers: Times of No Money And Other Stories

Back to the beginning! See the original hippie days (and hippie daze) of the unrelated Brothers and watch as Shelton shifts from stoner slapstick to both sitcom and satire, building a broad approach that would let him comment comedically through these hapless mouthpieces for five decades. Also in this volume: the earliest appearances of the Freaks' feline flat mate Fat Freddy's Cat, and a selection of other contemporaneous cartooning by Shelton, showing the range of styles and voices that he would soon channel into the Freak Brothers as their stardom ensued.

Times of No Money is the sixth release in this special series of seven graphic albums. (The series presents all the Freak Brothers' adventures chronologically, but individual albums are being released in a different order.) *The Fabulous Furry Freak Brothers* comics have sold more than 45 million copies worldwide in 16 languages. These painstakingly restored hardcovers, featuring die-cut covers, are the first North American bookshelf editions in more than thirty years.

GILBERT SHELTON, a founding father of the underground comix movement, is the creator of the iconic comix characters The Fabulous Furry Freak Brothers, Fat Freddy's Cat, and Wonder Wart-Hog. He was inducted into the Will Eisner Award Hall of Fame in 2012. He has been known to sing and play piano for the Blum Brothers, a Paris-based rhythm and blues group. He lives in Paris, France, with his wife and an ever-changing number of cats.
