The Title 1 projects are plan ned for rental at about \$30 per room although other Title 1 projects in the city average \$42 per room. The Rockaway projects may average to lower cast because six to eight story buildings are contemplated as compared with the taller buildings constructed in other developments. The city will acquire the sites, and make them available for redevelopment by private capital. Losses suffered through condemnation and resale of the land are shared two thirds by the federal government and one-third by the city government.




