Land Obtained From Park Department; Will Serve West End Of Peninsula

The Council of the City of New York has read and referred to the Committee on Parks and Thoroughfares a local law introduced by Councilman Eric J. Treulich which allows the transfer of Park Department lands to the Fire Department for the construction of a fire house to serve the west end of the Rockaway Peninsula.

The land is located 180 feet east of Beach 169th street and 645 feet south of Rockaway Beach boulevard. It is a plot 100 feet by 60 feet large.

The acquisition of the land from the Park Department will result in considerable savings in the construction of the fire house.

According to Councilman Treulich, this is one of the few instances in which Park Commissioner Robert Moses has relinquished the land he controls.

At the present time, the Rockaway Point area is served by a Volunteer Fire Department.
