Neponsit Home For The Aged Gets Green Light By Board Of Estimate

The Board of Estimate last Friday gave approval to the conversion of the former Neponsit Beach Hospital into a Home for the Aged.

Cost estimates were given at \$1,853,000, as compared to the original \$1,000,000 of three years ago when the plan was first introduced.

Operated by the Department of Welfare, the Home for the Aged will accommodate 250 ambulatory men and women, 65 years of age and older in 53 double rooms and 144 single rooms.

Plans also call for the maintenance of a day center for the aged to accommodate 400 persons from the Rockaways, Broad Channel and Flatlands section of Brooklyn.

New construction providing facilities will exceed \$4,000,000, according to Welfare Commissioner Henry L. McCarthy. He estimated that the operation of the home will cost the city about \$750,000 a year. It is expected that it will open late next year.

Contractors submitting the low bids were George Rosen and Son, Inc., general contract for \$1,039,500; Berk Plumbing Co., plumbing \$258,000; Koolaire Co., Inc., heating and ventilation, \$149,565 and Benjamin Hochman Electric Co., Inc., electrical work, \$248,350.

Zurmuhlen expects the reconstruction to take 540 working days. The hospital was built in 1913 for children. During World War II, it was closed because of the fuel shortage and it reopened after the war as a convalescent home for patients suffering from tuberculosis. It closed again four years ago.

The hospital occupies a choice site on the oceanfront between Neponsit and Ribs Park. Ten acres of grounds, including the beach front, will be turned over to the Department of Parks.
