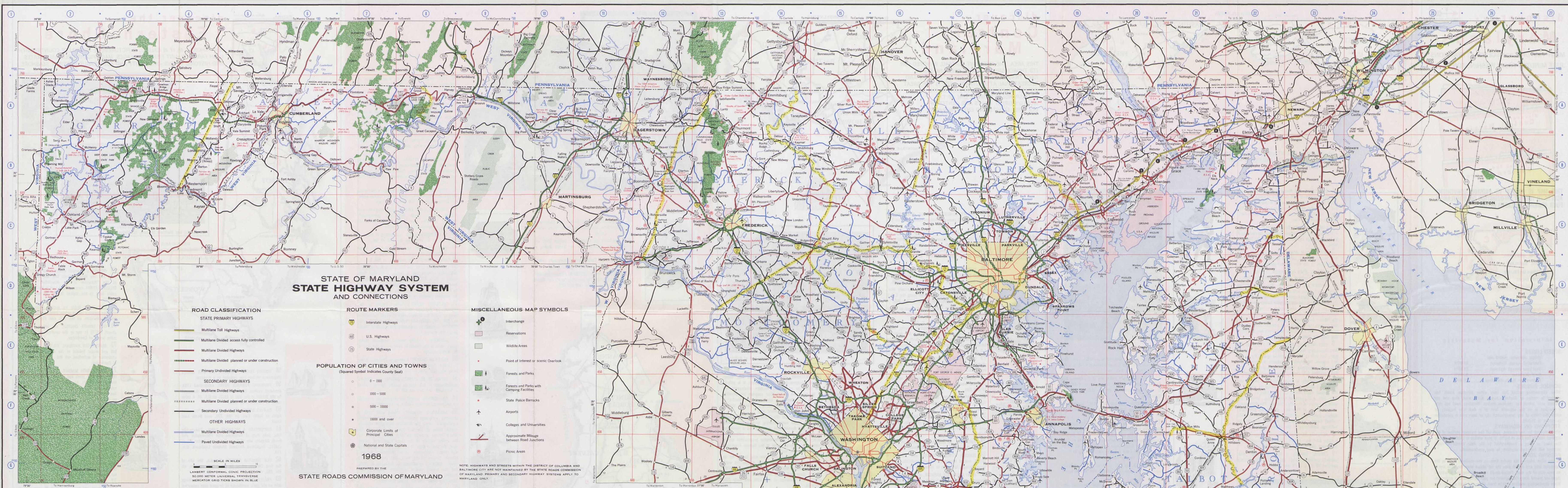
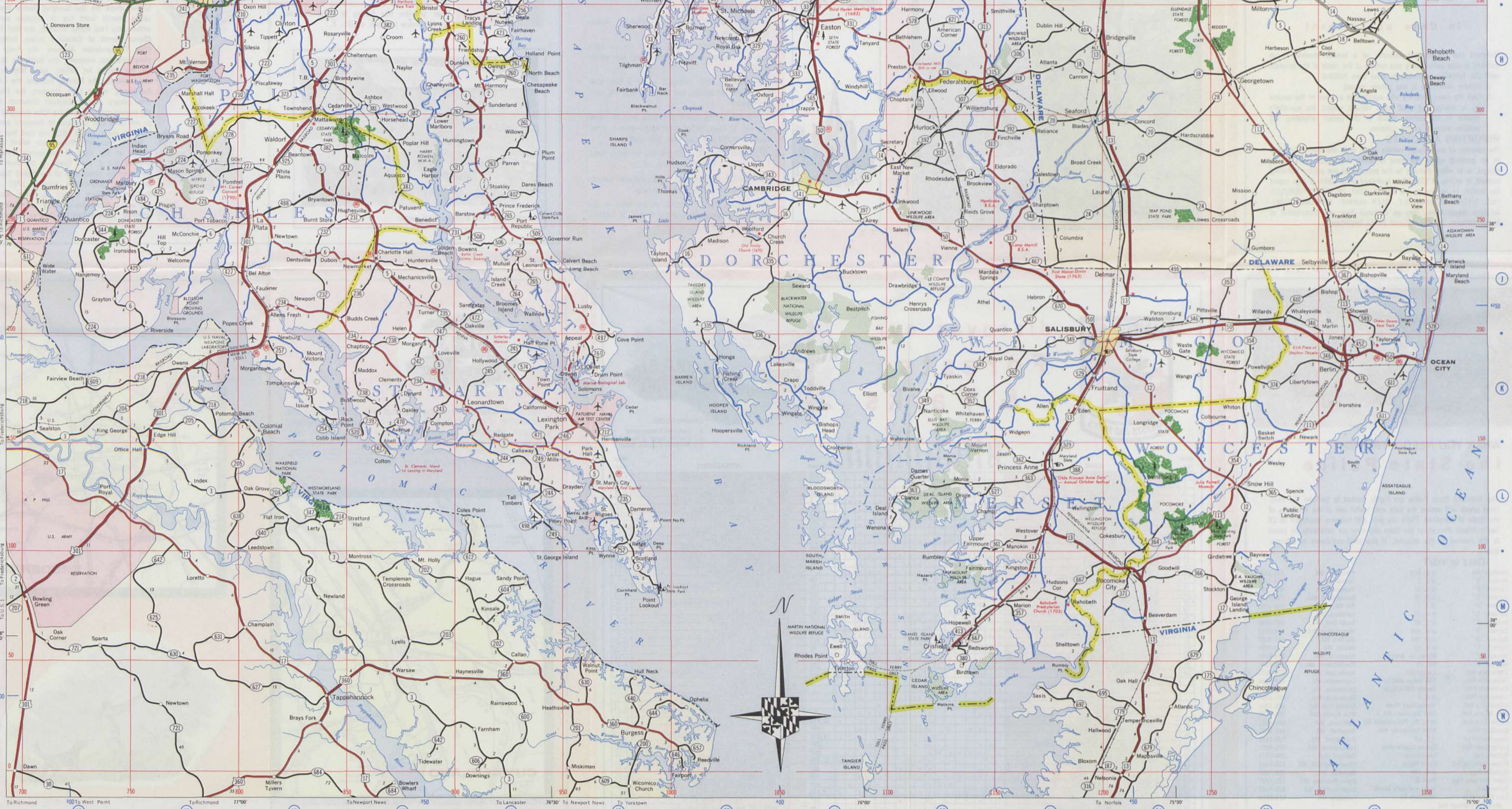
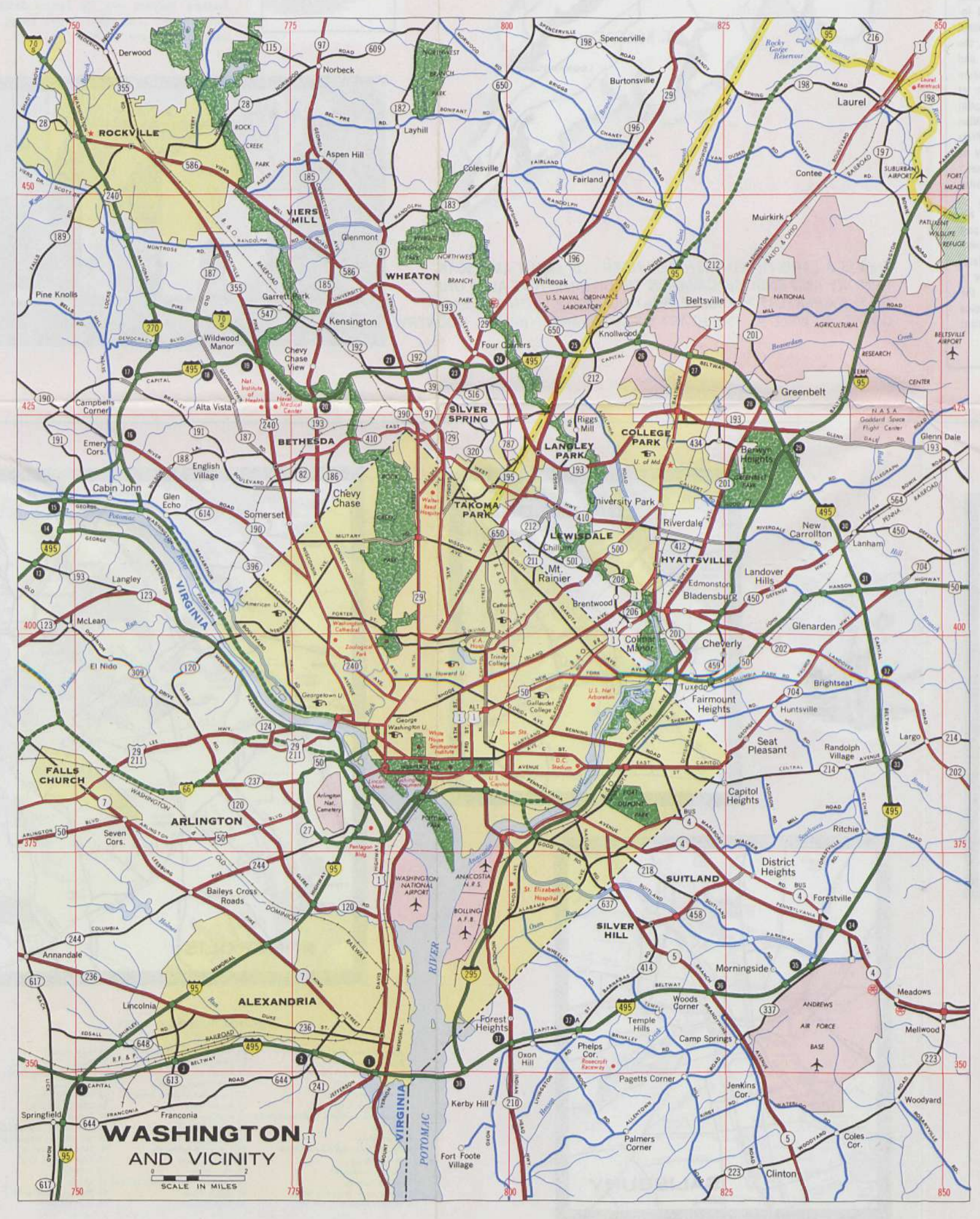
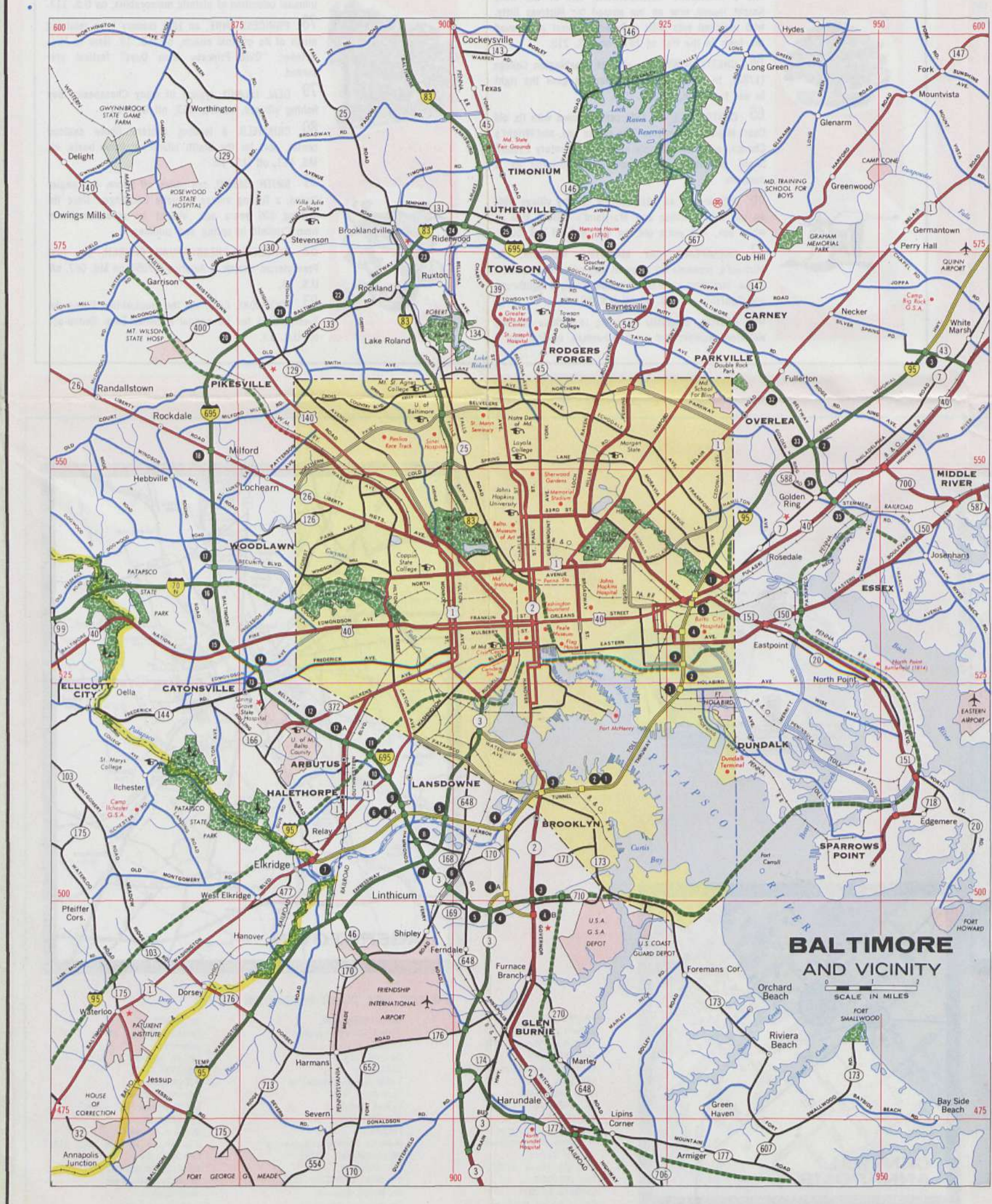

Information for Motorists

SPEED LIMITS

- Unless otherwise posted:
 - Controlled Access Highways 60 MPH
 - Dual Lane Through Highways 55 MPH
 - Rural Highways 50 MPH
 - Business or Residential Area 35 MPH

SCHOOL BUSES

When approaching school bus from either direction which has stopped to receive or discharge pupils, driver must stop and not proceed until school bus resumes motion. Motorists need not stop if the bus is on the opposite lane of a dual lane highway or within the limits of any incorporated city or town with a population in excess of 25,000.

STOPPING ON HIGHWAYS

When stopping for any purpose, park off the traveled portion of the highway outside the line of traffic. If your vehicle is disabled, raising the hood or tying a handkerchief to the door handle and ringing lights will help call attention to your predicament.

PASSING ZONE

As you drive, observe the center lines on the roadway. Keep in the right-hand lane and do not pass the car ahead when the solid line is on your side or the road. Posted speed signs, warning and directional signs are placed along the highway for your guidance and protection. When approaching another vehicle from either the front or rear, dim lights. Remember courtesy promotes safety.

In Case of Accident

Maryland law requires the operator of a vehicle involved in an accident to stop immediately and remain at the scene of the accident until the following requirements have been fulfilled:

- Render assistance to any person injured.
- Give his name, address and registration number of the vehicle he is driving and shall upon request exhibit his operator's license to the person struck or the person attending any vehicles involved in the collision.

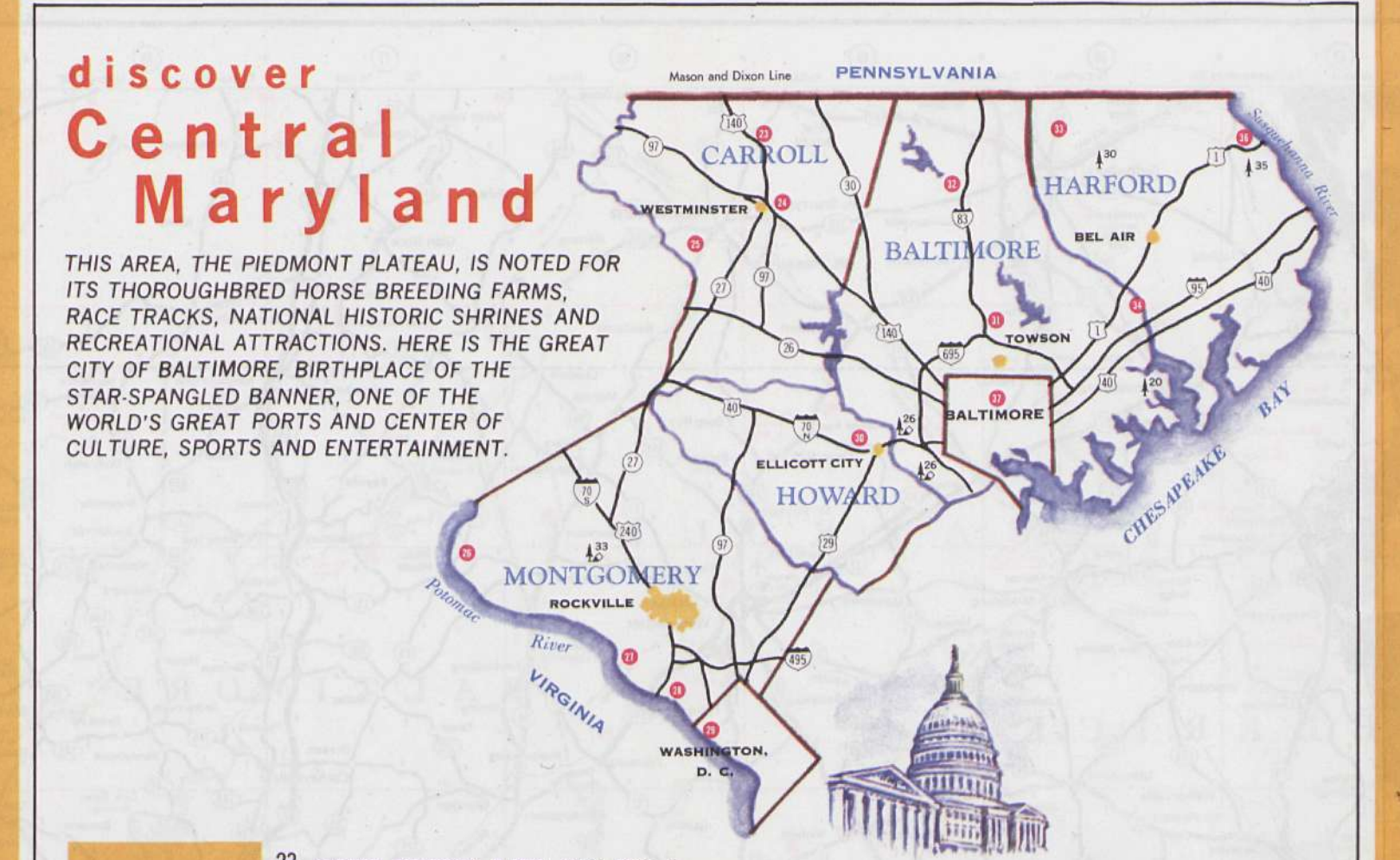
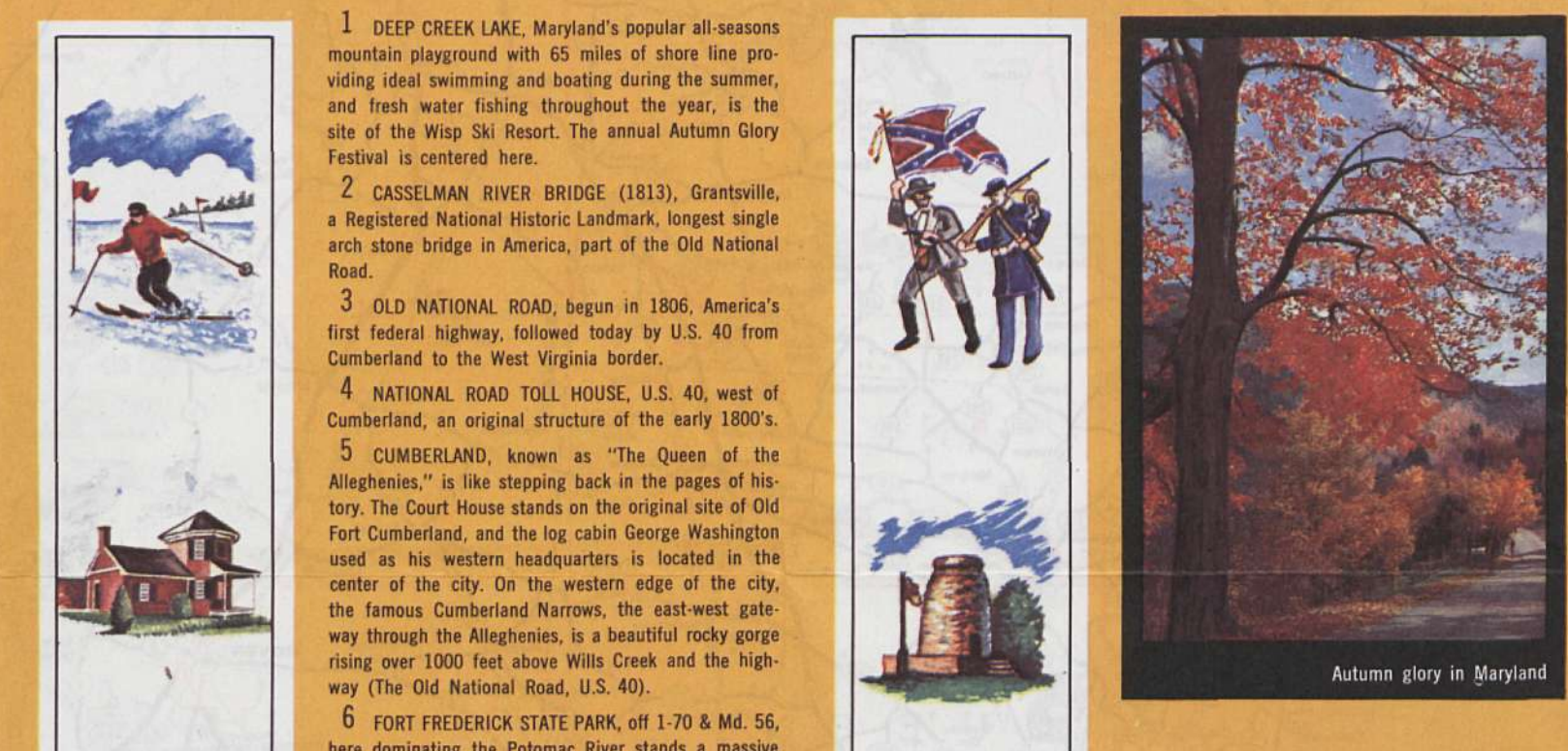
REPORTING ACCIDENTS

The operator of every motor vehicle which is in any manner involved in an accident within the state in which any person is killed or injured, or in which damage to the property of any person including himself, in excess of \$100.00 is sustained, shall within 5 days report the matter in writing to the DEPARTMENT OF MOTOR VEHICLES, 6601 BETHESDA HIGHWAY, N.E., GLEN BURNE, MARYLAND 20861. Accident report forms may be obtained from the Department of Motor Vehicles, State and Local Police Bureau.

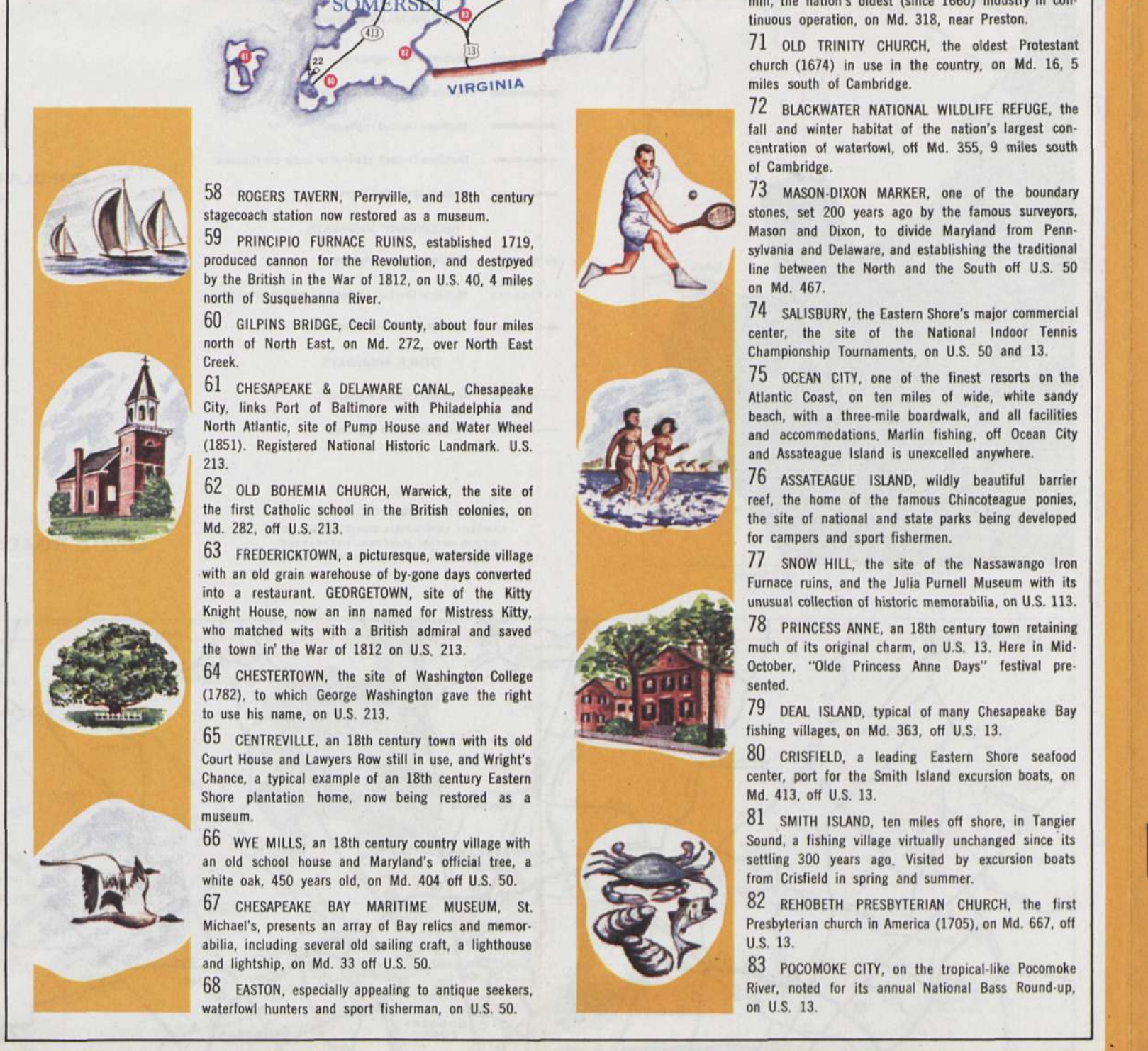
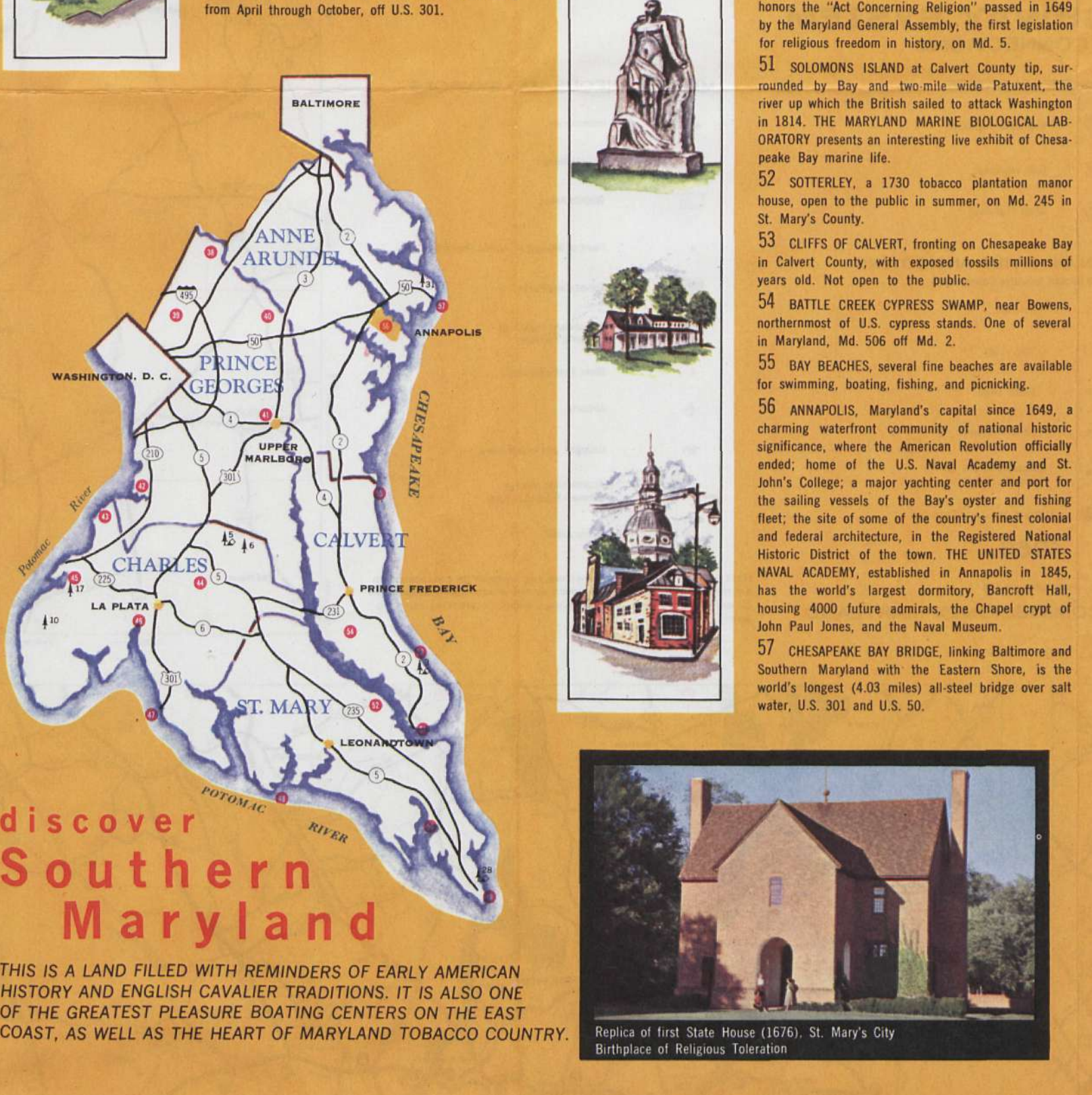

MARYLAND STATE HOUSE
CAPITOL OF THE UNITED STATES
THIS STATE HOUSE BUILT IN 1794 BY GEORGE MONTGOMERY, ARCHITECT, IS THE ONLY STATE HOUSE IN THE CONTINENTAL UNITED STATES WHICH WAS DESIGNED AND CONSTRUCTED BEFORE THE CONTINENTAL CONGRESS RATIFIED THE TREATY OF PARIS TO END THE REVOLUTIONARY WAR. THE HOUSE WAS CONSTRUCTED UNDER THE SUPERVISION OF THE ARCHITECT GEORGE MONTGOMERY, WHO WAS ASSISTED BY HIS BROTHER, THEODORE MONTGOMERY. THE HOUSE WAS BURNED IN 1800 BY THE BRITISH AND WAS REBUILT IN 1815. THE HOUSE IS NOW A NATIONAL HISTORIC LANDMARK.
