

NOT ON MY CAMPUS: No Tolerance for Antisemitism

The Not On My Campus campaign is a call for college and university leaders to commit to No Tolerance for Antisemitism moving forward. The campaign seeks to fundamentally change how colleges and universities protect Jewish students. Not on My Campus empowers parents, alumni and students with the tools to create actionable change on their campus, and seeks to hold universities accountable for inaction.




Antisemitic incidents at US universities and colleges have increased in both number and intensity since October 7.

Prior to 10/7,

2/3 

of Jewish students

said they felt “very” or “extremely” physically safe on campus, compared to less than half (45.5%) post-10/7. Feelings of emotional safety among Jewish students changed even more dramatically – **two-thirds (65.8%) of Jewish students said they felt “very” or “extremely” emotionally safe before 10/7, which fell to a third (32.5%) after 10/7.**

surveyed have experienced or witnessed some form of antisemitism since the beginning of the 2023-2024 school year alone.

A majority of all students – Jewish and non-Jewish – **feel that their campus administration has not done enough to address anti-Jewish prejudice on campus.**

NOT ON MY CAMPUS

The Not on My Campus campaign will bring together a clear call to action for school leaders coupled with tools for stakeholders to utilize to bring about the change needed on their campuses.

The HUB

The ADL Activation HUB is the heart of the Not on My Campus campaign. This centralized action center provides resources to build grassroots campaigns to demand action from campus leadership, lawmakers, and other relevant stakeholders. The HUB allows students, parents, alumni and allies the opportunity to contact college leadership, engage local media and build the collective action necessary to hold colleges and universities accountable.

Asks of Campus Administrators

ADL has released an updated list of key commitments colleges and universities can make, now, to improve the climate for Jewish students on campus. These asks include rigorously enforcing student and faculty disciplinary rules and non-discrimination policies, creating task forces focused on campus antisemitism, updating security protocols, and including antisemitism awareness programming in relevant trainings.

Code of Conduct

ADL has released sample language colleges and universities can use to update their codes of conduct to ensure there is No Tolerance for harassment that creates a hostile environment on campus. Campus leaders must ensure that their codes of conduct are


robust, up-to-date, and outline clear consequences for conduct that crosses the line.

Report Cards

ADL's new tool to evaluate the climate of antisemitism on college campuses will be published annually starting this spring. This will include data regarding incidents on campus, student surveys, and input from campus partners and experts. Ultimately it should provide parents, alumni, admissions counselors and others a comprehensive tool to evaluate how colleges and universities are taking action to combat anti-Jewish hate on their campuses.

CALL Legal Helpline

The Campus Antisemitism Legal Line (CALL) is a free legal protection helpline for any college or university student, family, faculty, or staff member. Just text "CALLhelp" to 51555 to report incidents of antisemitic discrimination, intimidation, harassment, vandalism, or violence that may necessitate legal action. Lawyers will provide pro bono representation for victims who choose to move forward with specific cases and CALL will also provide referrals to social services, mental health counseling services, and other relevant support services.



Jewish students have the right to feel safe, supported and able to thrive during their time at college. It is time to make this a reality and for colleges to take antisemitism seriously and guarantee that all students have the right to learn – free from harassment and discrimination.
