11-Day Rally Sends Stocks To New High

NEW YORK (AP) - Wall Street's 11-day rally posted gains of some 62 points at the end of trading on Friday as the market overcame an early siege of profit-taking to close at its highest level in more than a year. Trading was active.

At the closing bell, with the New York Stock Exchange tape running one minute late, the Dow Jones average of 30 industrial stocks bounded 7.53 points forward to 816.06. Earlier it had been off more than 3 points. This brought the Dow average

to its highest level since Nov.
