GENERAL INFORMATION ABOUT THE SURVEY








The survey was conducted by Info Sapiens on the request of the International Organization for Migration (IOM), the UN Migration Agency, Mission in Ukraine with the financial support of the United States Agency for International Development (USAID) in September-October 2021.

The national representative survey was conducted using a method of personal interviews.


Answers were collected from 5,228 respondents, of whom 2,374 men and 2,854 women.

The sampling is representative for the population aged above 14 years old in every oblast of Ukraine and the city of Kyiv, but it does not include residents of the non-Government-controlled areas of Donetsk and Luhansk oblasts, the Autonomous Republic of Crimea and the city of Sevastopol.


SCALE OF EXTERNAL LABOUR MIGRATION




SCALE OF INTERNAL LABOUR MIGRATION



FACTORS INFLUENCING A DECISION ON LABOUR MIGRATION




DESIRED JOB CATEGORIES FOR POTENTIAL MIGRANTS



DESIRED COUNTRIES FOR EMPLOYMENT ABROAD







We do not include those who agreed to work without being formally employed in other settlements of Ukraine, as this represents a rather usual and common practice.








