### **DAVE BARRY**

Dave Barry has been a professional humorist ever since he discovered that professional humor was a lot easier than working.

For many years he wrote a newspaper column that appeared in more than 500 newspapers and generated thousands of letters from readers who thought he should be fired. Despite this, Barry won the Pulitzer Prize for commentary, although he misplaced it for several years, which is why his wife now keeps it in a secure location that he does not know about. One of Barry's columns was largely responsible for the movement to observe International Talk Like a Pirate Day every year on September 19. This is probably his most enduring achievement.

Barry has written more than 30 books, including the novels <u>Big Trouble</u>, <u>Lunatics</u>, <u>Tricky Business</u>, and, most recently, <u>Insane City</u>. He has also written a number of books with titles like <u>I'll Mature When I'm Dead</u>, which are technically classified as nonfiction, although they contain numerous lies. Two of Barry's books were the basis for the CBS sitcom <u>Dave's World</u>, which can probably still be seen on cable TV in certain underdeveloped nations.

## **REBECCA DUNN**

Rebecca Walter Dunn, a community volunteer for over forty years, has been immersed in the world of public policy for the past two decades. She began her involvement in public policy by developing community forums in the Tampa Bay area to increase public awareness of national and state public policy issues. She served on the board of the James Madison Institute, a state-level think tank in Florida, for eighteen years and was a member of the Board of Directors of the Foundation for Individual Rights in Education. In 2001, she was appointed to the Florida Judicial Nominating Commission.

Her civic commitments have benefitted the arts, business development, and health care. She has been active on the boards of The H. Lee Moffitt Cancer Center Foundation, University of South Florida Economic Advisory Board, Tampa Bay Performing Arts Center, Wedu Public Broadcasting Station, Community Foundation for Palm Beach and Martin Counties, Palm Beach Symphony, and American Friends of the Uffizi Museum.

## JOHAN NORBERG

Johan Norberg is an author, lecturer, and documentary filmmaker, born in Sweden. He is a Senior Fellow at the Cato Institute in Washington D.C. and at the European Centre for International Political Economy in Brussels. He received his M. A. in the History of Ideas from the University of Stockholm.

He has written books on a broad range of topics, including global economics and popular science. His book In Defense of Global Capitalism has been published in more than 25 countries. His most recent book is Progress: Ten Reasons to Look Forward to the Future, called "a blast of good sense" by The Economist and named a "book of the year" by The Guardian, The Economist, and The Observer. Norberg is Executive Editor at Free to Choose Media and regularly hosts documentaries on Development and Economics for American Public Television, including Free or Equal?, Economic Freedom in Action, Power to the People, and The Real Adam Smith.

For his work, Norberg has received several awards, including the Distinguished Sir Antony Fisher Memorial Award from the Atlas Foundation, the Walter Judd Freedom Award, and the Gold medal from the German Hayek Stiftung.


She started as Reason intern in 2000, and has worked at <u>The Weekly Standard</u> and <u>The New</u> <u>York Times</u>.

# JULIAN SIMON MEMORIAL AWARD



"The main fuel to speed the world's progress is our stock of knowledge, and the brake is our imaginaton."

- Julian Simon

Julian L. Simon (1932-1998) was an economist and business professor known for his optimism about the future of mankind. His groundbreaking research built the case that human ingenuity would allow the environment to support the world's increasing population over the long term, demonstrating that human beings are an asset to the planet, not a liability.

Simon authored the 1981 classic, <u>The Ultimate Resource</u>, which debunked eco-doomsayers' predictions that modern civilization is unsustainable. Over the years, he argued that humans are living longer, that people are better fed and healthier, that resources are becoming ever more abundant, and that environmental quality is improving. To honor Simon's achievements, the Competitive Enterprise Institute established the Julian L. Simon Memorial Award in 2001. The recipient of the prize is an individual whose work continues to promote the vision of man as the ultimate resource.

The award is forged in the shape of a leaf. Simon admired nature and included dried leaves—which die every fall and are renewed every spring—in his correspondence. The veins of the leaf are chromium, copper, nickel, tin, and tungsten, the five metals featured in Simon's famous 1980 bet with environmentalist Paul Ehrlich. Based on his optimistic theory about natural resources, Simon bet Ehrlich the price of the metals would decline over a decade even if the world's population grew. Ten years later, Simon won the bet.
