NIMHD's mission is to lead scientific research to improve minority health and reduce health disparities.

The NIMHD Research Framework reflects an evolving conceptualization of factors relevant to minority health and health disparities. The framework encourages NIMHDand NIH-supported research that addresses the complex and multifaceted nature of minority health and health disparities. Research under this umbrella covers many different domains (biological, behavioral, physical/built environment, sociocultural environment, and healthcare) and levels of influence (individual, interpersonal, community, and societal) within those domains. This framework also facilitates assessment of progress, gaps, and opportunities in the NIMHD and NIH minority health and health disparities research portfolios. This list of factors is not intended to be exhaustive. Populations of interest and other features of this framework may be adjusted over time.
