CITING SOURCES IN CHICAGO STYLE A GUIDE FOR STUDENTS

GIVING CREDIT WHERE IT'S DUE

Using outside sources like books or articles in your assignment demonstrates that your arguments are not just your opinion, but are based on evidence. When you use other people's ideas in your work, you must observe the rules of academic integrity and cite your sources. Citations prevent any confusion over what is original to you and what you are borrowing. Citation styles supply a standard method for identifying sources.

CITING REFERENCES IN THE TEXT: NOTES

Chicago style does not use in-text citations like APA and MLA. In the humanities disiplines, the Chicago Notes-Bibliography (NB) system is used. In the NB system include a note (either footnote or endnote) every time you cite a source (either directly or indirectly). In your text, include a numbered footnote or endnote at the end of the sentence where information or a quote from a source is used. Your word processing program has a function for inserting notes that automatically numbers them consecutively and creates the corresponding space for citations at the bottom of the page (for footnotes)¹ or the end of the paper (for endnotes).

LONG NOTE VS. SHORT NOTE VS. IBID².

If you cite the same source multiple times in a paper, use the long note form the first time, then the short note for each consecutive mention. If you cite the same source and page number *consecutively*, only then use "Ibid."

BIBLIOGRAPHY

Use the title "Bibliography" and make sure it includes all sources cited or referenced in the paper.

CITING A SOURCE WITHOUT AN AUTHOR

If no author is listed, begin each entry using the Title in place of Author Name.

CITING A SOURCE WITHOUT A DATE

If no date is listed, list your access date.
