



Such charming results, too, for the flower-like forms are joined together into patterns with tendrils and stems, making designs of unexpressible daintiness. Worked in threads of exquisite fineness, the lace looks almost like a cobweb that has caught flowers and leaves in its meshes—lovely lace to hand down as an heirloom

Illustrated on this page are the basic backgrounds of Irish Crochet—from the most simple mesh to the typical picot design.




A... Make a chain slightly longer than desired length.


1st row: S c in 10th ch from hook, \* ch 6, skip 3 ch, s c in next ch. Repeat from \* across. Ch 9, turn.

2nd row: \* S c in next loop, ch 6. Repeat from \* across, ending with ch 6, s c in last loop. Ch 9, turn.


Repeat 2nd row for desired length. Fasten off.




C... Make a chain slightly longer than desired length. 1st row: S c in 3rd st from hook (p), ch 2, s c in 10th ch from p, \* ch 5, p, ch 2, skip 4 ch, s c in next ch (a p-loop). Repeat from \* across. Ch 10, turn. 2nd row: P, ch 2, s c in next loop, \* a p-loop, s c in next loop. Repeat from \* across. Ch 10, turn. Repeat 2nd row for desired length. Fasten off.



**B...** Make a chain slightly longer than desired length. **1st row:** Ch 3, s c in 3rd st from hook (p); ch 1, p, ch 1, s c in 4th ch from 1st p; \* ch 1, p, ch 1, p, ch 1, skip 3 ch, s c in next ch (a p-loop). Repeat from \* across. Ch 4, turn. **2nd row:** \* P, ch 1, p, ch 1, s c between p's of next loop, ch-1. Repeat from \* across, ending with s c between p's of last loop. Ch 4, turn. Repeat 2nd row for desired length. Fasten off.



**D...** Make a chain slightly longer than desired length. **1st row:** In 15th ch from hook make s c, ch 4, s c; \* ch 10, skip 6 ch; in next ch make s c, ch 4, s c. Repeat from \* across; turn. **2nd row:** Sl st to center of ch-4 loop, ch 13, \* in next loop make s c, ch 4, s c; ch 10. Repeat from \* across, ending with ch 10; make s c, ch 4, s c in last loop; turn. Repeat 2nd row for desired length. Fasten off.




# Simple Crochet Motifs

No. 8415-A Rosette... Starting at center, ch 8, join with sl st. 1st rnd: Ch 6, \* d c in ring, ch 3. Repeat from \* 4 more times. Join to 3rd st of ch-6 first made. 2nd rnd: In each sp make s c, half d c, 3 d c, half d c, s c (6 petals). 3rd rnd: \* Ch 5, s c between s c's of next 2 petals. Repeat from \* around. 4th rnd: In each sp make s c, half d c, 5 d c, half d c, s c. 5th rnd: \* Ch 7, s c between s c's of next 2 petals. Repeat from \* around. 6th rnd: In each sp make s c, half d c, 7 d c, half d c, s c. Sl st in 1st s c made. Fasten off.

No. 8415-B Shamrock... Starting at center, ch 16. 1st rnd: In 16th ch from hook make s c, ch 15, s c, ch 15, s c. 2nd rnd: 22 s c in each loop. 3rd rnd: S c in each s c, skipping 1st and last s c on each petal. Ch 25, turn (thus starting stem). Next row: S c in 2nd ch from hook, s c in each ch across. Sl st in 1st s c on next petal. Fasten off.

No. 8415-C Plain Shamrock... Starting at center, ch 10, join with sl st. 1st rnd: Working over a cord (or 4 strands of same thread), make 19 s c in ring. Join. Let cord hang. 2nd rnd: S c in sl st, \* ch 20, skip 5 s c, s c in each of next 2 s c. Repeat from \* 2 more times. Sl st in 1st s c made. 3rd rnd: Working over cord, \* make 30 s c in next loop, s c between 2 s c's at base of next 2 petals. Repeat from \* 2 more times, ch 20 for stem, pull cord along side of chain, turn; working over cord, make s c in each ch across, sl st between next 2 s c at base of stem. Fasten off.

No. 8415-D Leaf... Starting at tip, ch 15. 1st row: S c in 2nd ch from hook, s c in each ch to within last ch, 3 s c in last ch, s c in each ch along opposite side of foundation; s c in same place as last s c. Hereafter pick up only the back loop of each s c. S c in each s c to within 4 s c from center s c at tip of leaf. Ch 1, turn. 2nd row: S c in each s c to within center s c of 3-s c group. In next s c make s c, ch 1, s c; s c in each s c on other side to within 4 s c from center s c at tip of leaf. Ch 1, turn. 3rd row: S c in each s c to within ch-1; in ch-1 make s c, ch 1, s c; s c in each s c to within ch-1; in ch-1 make s c, ch 1, turn. 4th and 5th rows: Same as 3rd row, making ch-7 instead of ch-1 on 5th row. 6th row: S c in each s c to within ch-7; in ch-7 loop make 2 s c, ch 5, 3 s c, ch 5, 3 s c, ch 5, 2 s c. S c in each s c on other side of leaf to within last 3 sts. Fasten off.

No. 8415-E Triple Leaf... Starting at tip of leaf, ch 15. Hereafter work over a cord, or 4 strands of same thread. 1st row: S c in 2nd ch from hook, s c in each ch to within last ch, 5 s c in last ch, s c in each ch along opposite side of foundation, 3 s c over cord only. Hereafter pick up only the back loop of each s c. S c in each s c to within 4 s c from center s c at tip of leaf. Ch 1, turn. 2nd row: S c in each s c to within center of 3 s c (over cord), 3 s c in center s c, s c in each s c on other side to within 4 s c from center s c at tip of leaf. Ch 1, turn. 3rd row: S c to within center of 3-s c group, 3 s c in center s c, s c on other side to within last 3 sts. Ch 1, turn. 4th, 5th and 6th rows: Same as 3rd row. Fasten off. Make 2 more leaves like this. Sew together sides of leaves, as in illustration, with over-and-over stitches.


**No. 8415-F** Flower... Work 4 petals as for shamrock No. 8415-G, but make 8 s c in ring and omit stem. Cut cord only. SI st in 1st st; keeping work flat, s c across to corner, ch 4, sI st in top of last s c (ch-4 p), s c across to middle of top of petal, make a ch-4 p, ch-6 p, ch-4 p, s c to next corner, ch-4 p, s c along other side of petal, omitting last st; skip 1st st of next petal and s c around all petals as for 1st petal.


Center... Attach thread at center loop of 1st loop row of a petal, ch 5, s c in corresponding point on next petal, make 3 more loops in this manner; join. In each loop around make half d c, 7 d c, half d c. Fasten off.

No. 8415-G Shamrock...Ch 6, join. 1st rnd: Over a cord (or 4 strands of same thread), make 10 s c in ring. Join and let cord hang. 2nd row: Ch 3, s c in same s c as joining; (ch 3, s c in same st) twice. Ch 3, turn. 3rd to 6th rows incl: \*S c in next loop, ch 3. Repeat from \* twice, turn. Fasten off after 6th row (a petal completed). Skip 1 s c on ring, attach thread at next s c, and make another petal. Skip next s c on ring and make a 3rd petal. Attach thread to s c preceding 1st petal made; working over cord, make s c in same st, sl st in next st at base of petal; make s c (over cord) all around petal (keeping work flat and making ch-1 at corners of petal); sl st at base of petal, s c in s c between petals and continue thus around all petals, sl st in next 2 s c on ring. Do not fasten off.

**Stem...**Ch 15; pull cord out to last ch (thus doubling cord and forming a loop), sl st in loop. Working over double cord, make s c in each ch across, sl st (on ring) in s c preceding 1st petal, sl st at base of petal. Fasten off.



### Advanced Crochet Motifs

No. 8416-A Shamrock... Starting at center, ch 15, join with sl st. 1st rnd: Working over a cord (or 4 strands of same thread), make 27 s c in ring. 2nd rnd: S c in each s c around. SI st in 1st s c made. Let cord hang. 3rd rnd: \* Ch 25, s c in each of next 9 s c. Repeat from \* 2 more times. 4th rnd: Working over cord, \* make 34 s c in next loop, s c in each of next 9 s c. Repeat from \* 2 more times; join. Cut off cord. 5th rnd: SI st in next s c on loop, \* s c in next s c, \*\* ch 4, skip 2 s c. Repeat from \* 9 more times, sl st in each s c to within 2nd s c of next loop. Repeat from \*\* 2 more times. 6th rnd: SI st to center of next ch-4 loop, \* 2 s c in same loop, in each of next 8 loops make 2 s c, ch 3 and 2 s c; 2 s c in next loop. SI st to center of 1st loop on next petal. Repeat from \* around, ending with 2 s c in last loop on last leaf of shamrock, sl st to center of section between petals. Now ch 25 (for stem), turn; sl st in each st across, turn and, working over cord, s c in each st across, turn, sl st in each st across, sl st in next st at base of stem and in each of remaining sts of section between petals. Join. Fasten off.

No. 8416-B Petals (Make 7)... Starting at base, ch 21. 1st row: D c in 6th ch from hook, \* ch 2, skip 2 ch, d c in next ch. Repeat from \* 4 more times. Ch 1, turn. 2nd row: 3 s c in each of 5 sps, 10 s c in end sp, 3 s c on other side of each sp. Ch 3, turn. 3rd row: D c in each s c. Ch 1, turn. 4th row: \* S c in each of next 4 sts; in next st make s c, ch 3, s c. Repeat from \* across. Fasten off. Overlap petals at base and sew, leaving an opening 1/2 inch in diameter at center. Center... Ch 12, join with sl st. Hereafter work is done over a cord (or 4 strands of same thread). 1st rnd: 22 s c in ring. Join. 2nd rnd: Make 10 s c over cord, turn; \* s c in 2nd s c from hook, s c in each s c across, s c in each of next 2 s c on ring (1 stamen completed), turn; skip 2 s c, s c in next s c (1st s c of stamen), s c in each of next 2 s c, 7 s c over cord only, turn. Repeat from \* around until 11 stamens are completed. S c in last s c on ring and break off, leaving a 6-inch length of thread. Thread a needle with this thread and sew together first and last stamens at base. Place this center over petals, and sew in place (see illustration).

No. 8416-C Flower... Starting at center, ch 20, join with sl st. 1st rnd: Ch 3, 47 d c in ring; join. 2nd rnd: D c in each d c around. Do not break off, but work petals as follows: 1st row: \* Ch 5, skip 1 st, s c in next st. Repeat from \* 2 more times. Ch 7, turn. 2nd to 6th rows incl: S c in next loop, \* ch 5, s c in next loop. Repeat from \* once more. Ch 7, turn. Do not ch 7 at end of 6th row. 7th row: Sl st to center of next loop, ch 5, s c in next loop, ch 5, s c in next loop; turn. 8th row: Sl st to center of next loop, ch 8, s c in next loop. Fasten off. \* Skip 2 d c at base of petal, attach thread in next st and work another petal. Repeat from \* until 6 petals are made. Attach thread between 2 free d c's between petals and work over a cord (or 4 strands of same thread) as follows:



Repeat from \* 8 more times; 3 s c in 3rd sp of next petal and work thus around. Join. Fasten off.





No. 8417-A Rosette Motif ... Starting at center, ch 8, join with sl st. 1st rnd: Ch 6, \* d c in ring, ch 3. Repeat from \* 4 more times. Join to 3rd st of ch-6 first made. 2nd rnd: In each sp make s c, half d c, 3 d c, half d c, s c (6 petals). 3rd rnd: \* Ch 5, s c between s c's of next 2 petals. Repeat from \* around. 4th rnd: In each sp make s c, half d c, 5 d c, half d c, s c. 5th rnd: \* Ch 7, s c between s c's of next 2 petals. Repeat from \* around. 6th rnd: In each sp make s c, half d c, 7 d c, half d c, s c. 7th rnd: \* Ch 5, s c in 3rd ch from hook (p), ch 2, p, ch 2, s c at tip of next petal (a p-loop), make another p-loop, s c between s c's of next 2 petals. Repeat from \* 6 more times, ending with a p-loop, sl st in last s c of last petal (12 p-loops). 8th rnd: SI st to center of next p-loop (between p's), \*\* ch 8, s c between p's of next p-loop, turn, sl st in loop, ch 3, 9 d c in loop, d c in s c, ch 4, turn, \* skip 1 d c, d c in next d c, ch 1. Repeat from \* 3 more times, d c in 3rd st of turning ch (a corner block), ch 2, p, ch 2, s c between p's of same p-loop as last s c was made, \* p-loop, s c in next loop. Repeat from \* once more. Now repeat from \*\* around, ending with sl st in 1st s c made. 9th rnd: SI st to 3rd st of turning ch on next corner bl, s c in sp, \* a p-loop, skip next sp, s c in next sp, p-loop, skip 2 sps, s c in next half loop, p-loop, s c in next loop, p-loop, s c in next loop, p-loop, s c in 1st sp on next corner bl. Repeat from \* around, ending with p-loop, sl st in 1st s c made. 10th to 13th rnds incl: Repeat 8th and 9th rnds alternately, having 1 additional loop on each side of each rnd. Fasten off.







Each motif measures about 31/2 inches in diameter. First Motif... Starting at center, ch 8, join with sl st. 1st rnd: Ch 4 (to count as d c and ch-1), \* d c in ring, ch 1. Repeat from \* 10 more times, join to 3rd st of ch-4 first made (12 sps). 2nd rnd: S c in each sp and in each d c around; join. 3rd rnd: Ch 6 (to count as d c and ch-3), \* d c in s c above next d c of 1st rnd, ch 3. Repeat from \* around (12 sps); join. 4th rnd: In each sp make: s c, half d c, 5 d c, half d c, s c; join. SI st between 1st and last shells made, at base of back. 5th rnd: Ch 8 (to count as d c and ch-5), d c between 1st and 2nd shells made (at back), ch 5, d c between 2nd and 3rd shells at back. Continue in this manner around; join. 6th rnd: Sl st in 1st sp, ch 3, 4 dc in same sp, \* ch 3, 5 dc in next sp. Repeat from \* around, ending with ch 3; join. 7th rnd: Ch 3, d c in same place as sl st, \* d c in each of next 3 d c, 2 d c in next d c, ch 3, 2 d c in next d c. Repeat from \* around, ending with ch 3; join. 8th rnd: Ch 3, d c

in each d c around, with ch-5 between d c-groups; join. 9th rnd: SI st to 2nd d c, ch 4; tr in each of next 4 d c, holding back last loop of each tr on hook; thread over and draw through all loops on hook, ch 1 tightly (5-tr cluster). \* Ch 5, d c in ch-5 sp, ch 5, tr in each of center 5 d c of next group, holding back last loop of each tr; complete cluster. Repeat from \* around, ending with ch 5, d c, ch 5; join. 10th rnd: SI st in each of 1st 2 ch, s c in loop, \* ch 7, s c in next loop. Repeat from \* around; join. 11th rnd: SI st in each of 1st 2 ch, ch 3; in same loop make d c, ch 2, 2 d c; \* ch 8, \*\* s c in next loop. Repeat from \* twice, ch 8, in next loop make 2 d c, ch 2, 2 d c (shell); ch 8. Repeat from \*\* around; join. 12th and 13th rnds: SI st to ch-2, ch 3 and complete shell, \*\* ch 4, \* s c in next loop, ch 8. Repeat from \* to loop preceding next shell, ch 4, shell in next shell. Repeat from \*\* around, ending with ch 4; join. Fasten off. 14th row: (This row goes partly around, to allow for joining at incompleted section.) Skip a ch-4 and a ch-8 after any shell, attach thread to center ch of following ch-8; work as for previous rnd until 3 shells are made, ch 4, s c in ch-4 loop below, \* ch 8, s c in next loop. Repeat from \* twice. Fasten off.



# Dainly Crochet Edgings

No. 8409 First Rosette...Ch 6, join with sl st. 1st rnd: 12 s c in ring. Join. 2nd rnd: Ch 5, \* d c in next s c, ch 2. Repeat from \* around; join to 3rd st of ch-5 first made. 3rd rnd: In each sp make: s c, half d c, d c, half d c, s c (a petal). 4th rnd: Insert hook from wrong side of work in last sp, and bring it out of next (1st) sp, thread over and complete an s c, \* ch 5, insert hook over next d c-bar and complete an s c as before. Repeat from \* around. 5th rnd: Sl st to center of next loop, \* ch 5, s c in next loop. Repeat from \* around. Now work in rows as follows: 1st row: \* Ch 5, s c in next loop, ch 5, s c in next loop. Ch 7, turn. 2nd row: S c in 1st loop, ch 5, s c in 2nd loop. Ch 7, turn. Repeat the 2nd row 5 more times, omitting ch-7 at end of 7th row. Fasten off.

Second Rosette... Work 1st 4 rnds as for first rosette. 5th rnd: SI st to center of next loop, s c in same loop, ech 5, s c in next loop. Repeat from 5 more times, ech 2, sI st in 1st loop of last row of completed section, ch 2, s c in next loop on rosette in work. Repeat from ech once more; make 4 more ch-5 loops. Now work 7 rows as for 1st section. Fasten off.

Work in this manner for desired length, omitting the 7 rows of last section. Attach thread to 4th free loop of 1st rosette, and work as follows: \*\* ch 3, s c in next loop. Repeat from \*\* 2 more times, ch 3, d c in 1st loop of 1st row of loops, \* ch 3, d c in next loop. Repeat from \* 2 more times, ch 3, s c in 1st free loop of next rosette, ch 3, s c in next loop, and continue thus across, turn. Next row: In each sp make s c, half d c, d c, half d c and s c. Fasten off. Work in same manner along opposite edge.

No. 8276 Starting at short end, ch 6; s c in 1st ch made. \*\*\* Ch 5, turn. S c in loop, ch 4 (to count as d c and ch-1), turn, d c in loop, \* ch 1, d c in loop. Repeat from \* 3 more times, turn. \*\* Ch 3, s c in next sp. Repeat from \*\* 4 more times. Ch 5, turn. S c in 1st loop. Repeat from \*\*\* for length desired.

No. 8408 Starting at narrow end, ch 12. 1st row: D c in 7th ch from hook, ch 5, d c in same ch, skip 3 ch, d c in next ch. Ch 3, turn. 2nd row: In ch-5 loop make 4 d c, ch 5, s c in 4th ch from hook (p), ch 1, 4 d c in same loop, d c in next sp. Ch 3, turn. 3rd row: D c in center sp at right of p, ch 5, d c in same sp at left of p, skip 4 d c, d c in next sp. Ch 3, turn. Repeat the 2nd and 3rd rows alternately for desired length. Do not break off, but work along one long side as follows: \* Ch 5, s c in next sp. Repeat from \* across. Fasten off. Attach thread at 1st sp on opposite side and work across in same way. Fasten off.





Repeat from \* around, ending with d c in same place as last d c of last petal (5 petals). 3rd rnd: \* Ch 5, s c in 3rd ch from hook (p), ch 2, ch-3 p, ch 2, s c at tip of next petal (a p-loop); make another p-loop, s c between center d c's of next petal, a p-loop, s c at left tip of same petal. Repeat from \* around. Now work in rows as follows: 1st row: SI st to between p's of next p-loop, \* make a p-loop, s c between p's of next p-loop. Repeat from \* 2 more times, turn. 2nd row: Ch 2, p, \* ch 2, p, ch 2, p, ch 2, s c in next loop. Repeat from \* 2 more times. Repeat 2nd row 2 more times. 5th row: Ch 2, p, ch 2, p, ch 2, p, ch 2, s c between p's of 1st loop, ch 7, s c between p's of next loop, turn; sl st in loop, 7 s c in same loop, ch 5 (to count as d c and ch-2), turn; make d c in each of 6 s c with ch-2 between each d c (a fan); ch 2, p, ch 2, s c between p's of last p-loop; turn. 6th row: Ch 2, p, ch 2, p, ch 2, p, ch 2, s c in front of 1st d c-bar of fan, s c in next ch-2 sp, ch 3, s c in same sp. Repeat from • 5 more times, ch 2, p, ch 2, s c between 1st 2 p's of last loop; turn. 7th row: Ch 2, p, ch 2, p, ch 2, p, ch 2, s c in 1st ch-3 loop of fan, p-loop, skip 3 loops of fan, s c in next loop, p-loop, s c between p's of next loop; turn. 8th and 9th rows: Same as 2nd row. Fasten off.

Second Section... Work as for 1st section to within last row. Last row: Ch 2, p, ch 2, p, ch 1, skip 4 free p-loops on right side of rosette of 1st section, s c between p's of next p-loop, ch 1, p, ch 2, s c in 1st loop on 2nd section, ch 2, p, ch 1, s c between p's of next p-loop on rosette of 1st section, and continue thus across. Make necessary number of sections, joining in same way.

Heading... Attach thread to 4th free p-loop of 1st rosette. 1st row: Ch 8, \*\* s c in next loop, ch 5, s c in next loop, ch 5, d c in next loop, \* ch 5, tr in end loop of next row. Repeat from \* to within next free p-loop on next rosette, ch 5, d c in next p-loop, ch 5. Repeat from \*\* across. Ch 1, turn. 2nd row: Make 7 s c in each sp. Fasten off.

Scalloped Edge... Attach thread to 4th free petal of 1st rosette. 1st row: \* Ch 5, s c in next loop. Repeat from \* across. 2nd row: Sl st to center of 1st loop, \*\*\* ch 7, s c in next loop, ch 3, turn; 14 d c in loop,

ch 3, turn; d c in each of 14 d c, turn; \* ch 5, skip 1 d c, s c in next d c. Repeat from \* 6 more times; turn. \*\* Ch 5, s c in next loop. Repeat from \*\* 6 more times, s c in next loop (on 1st row of scalloped edge), ch 7, s c in next loop. Repeat from \*\*\* across. 3rd row: Sl st to center of next loop; s c in 1st loop, \* ch 5, s c in next loop. Repeat from \* 6 more times. Work each scallop in same way. Fasten off.

INSERTION 8268-B... Work as for edging, making heading on both long sides (see illustration).



(p), ch 4, s c in 3rd ch from hook (another p), ch 1, s c in 10th ch of foundation (counting back from 1st p made), ch 4, \* make a p, ch 4, p, ch 1, skip 4 ch of foundation, s c in next ch, ch 4. Repeat from \* across (52 loops). Ch 5, turn. 2nd row: Make a p, ch 4, p, ch 1, s c in loop between 2 p's of previous row, ch 4. Repeat from \* across. Ch 5, turn. Repeat 2nd row, increasing 4 loops at equal distances apart on next row and every other row thereafter until there are 74 loops in the row-to increase, make 2 loops in I loop. Do not have increases fall directly over those of previous increase row. Work straight until piece measures 21/2 inches. Next row: Work in pattern across 1st 15 loops, ch 5, turn. Hereafter dec. 3 loops at end of each row until 3 loops remain-to decrease. omit the last 3 loops. Break off. Attach thread at opposite side and work to correspond. Attach thread at beginning of foundation chain and work an edging around outer edges as follows: Ch 3, 2 d c in next loop, ch 2, 3 d c in same loop (shell), \* ch 2, s c in next loop, ch 2; in next loop make: 3 d c, ch 2, 3 d c (shell). Repeat from \* across to foundation chain at opposite side. Break off.

4 more times, joining last ch-3 to 3rd st of ch-6 first made (6 sps). 2nd rnd: Into each ch-3 loop make: 1 s c, 1 half d c, 3 d c, 1 half d c, 1 s c. 3rd rnd: Ch 5, \* s c in 1st d c of 1st rnd, ch 5. Repeat from \* around. 4th rnd: Into each ch-5 loop make: 1 s c, 1 half d c, 5 d c, 1 half d c, 1 s c. 5th rnd: Ch 7, \* s c in s c between petals of 3rd rnd, ch 7. Repeat from around. 6th rnd: Into each ch-7 loop make: 1 s c, 1 half d c, 7 d c, 1 half d c, 1 s c. Break off.

Shamrock...Starting at center, ch 20, s c in 1st ch, \* ch 20, s c in same place as last s c. Repeat from \* once more. 1st rnd: Make 24 s c in each ch-20 loop. 2nd rnd: S c in each s c of previous rnd. Then ch 24. turn, and work s c in each ch across, thus forming stem. Break off.

Make 12 rosettes and 2 shamrocks. Place rosettes around outer edge of collar as in illustration, and sew in place. Then place a shamrock between 2 rosettes at each end of collar and sew in place.

MILWARD'S steel crochet No. 12.

The back of hand and the palm side are worked separately in two flat pieces. Then these two pieces are joined around the sides of hand and fingers.

Left Hand...Beginning at wrist end, ch 67. 1st row: S c in 12th ch from hook, \* ch 6, skip 4 ch of foundation, s c in next ch, repeat from \* across (12 loops). Ch 3, turn. 2nd row: D c in 1st loop, \* ch 6, sl st in 4th ch from hook (1 ch-3 p made), ch 1, 2 d c in next loop. Repeat from \* across, ending row with 2 d c. Ch 3, turn. 3rd row: D c in d c, ch 3, s c in 1st loop, \* ch 6, s c between the 2 d c made together. Repeat from \* across, ending row with ch 3, d c in each of last 2 d c (11 ch-6 loops and 1 ch-3 loop at each end). Ch 3, turn. 4th row: D c in d c, ch 6, skip ch-3 loop, s c in next loop, ch 6, \*\* 1 cluster in next loop-to make a cluster, \* thread over, insert book in next loop and draw out a loop, repeat from " until there are 9 loops on book. Then thread over and draw through 8 loops, leaving 2 loops on book. Thread over and draw through the 2 loops-ch 1, cluster in same loop, ch 1, cluster in same loop, ch 6, s c in next loop, ch 6, 2 d c in next loop, ch 6, s c in next loop, ch 6. Repeat from \*\* across, ending row with s c in last ch-6 loop, ch 6, skip ch-3 loop, d c in next d c, d c in turning ch. Ch 3, turn. 5th row: D c in d c, \* ch 1, p, ch 1, d c in each of next 2 loops, ch 1, p, ch 1, s c in each ch-1 sp of clusters, ch 1, p, ch 1, 1 d c in each of next 2 loops, ch 1, p, ch 1, 2 d c between next 2 d c. Repeat from \* across, ending with 2 d c. Ch 3, turn. 6th row: D c in d c, ch 6, s c between 2-d c made together, \* ch 6, s c in 2nd s c above clusters, ch 6, s c between next 2-d c, ch 6, s c between next 2-d c, ch 6, s c between next 2-d c. Repeat from across, ending row with 2 d c. Ch 3, turn. 7th row: Dc in dc, ch 3, sc in next loop, \* ch 6, s c in next loop, repeat from \* across, ending with ch 3, 2 d c (11 ch-6 loops and 2 ch-3 loops). Ch 3, turn. 8th row: D c in d c, ch 6, skip ch-3 loop, \* s c in next loop, ch 6, 2 d c in next loop, ch 6, s c in next loop, ch 6, in next loop make 3 clusters separated by ch-1 (as in 4th row), ch 6. Repeat from across, ending row with ch 6, 2 d c. Ch 3, turn. 9th row: D c in d c, \* ch 1, p, ch 1, d c in each of next 2 loops, ch 1, p, ch 1, 2 d c between next 2-d c, ch 1, p, ch 1, d c in each of next 2 loops, ch 1, p, ch 1, s c in each ch-1 between clusters. Repeat from \* across. Ch 3,

turn. 10th row: D c in d c, • ch 6, s c between next 2-d c, ch 6, s c in 2nd s c above clusters. Repeat from • across. Ch 3, turn. 11th row: Repeat 7th row. The last 8 rows (4th to 11th rows incl.) constitute the pattern. 12th to 39th rows incl: Repeat the last 8 rows. The 39th row brings work to the base of fingers. Ch 3, turn.

Forefinger...lst row: D c in d c, ch 1, d c in same place, ch 1, p, ch 1, skip 1st ch-6 loop of previous row, 2 d c in next loop, ch 1, p, ch 1, d c in next loop, ch 1, 2 d c in same loop. Ch 3, turn. 2nd row: D c in ch-1 sp between 2-d c, ch 1, d c in same place, ch 6, s c between the 2-d c made together, ch 6, d c in ch-1 between next 2-d c, ch 1, d c in same place, d c in turning ch-3. Ch 3, turn. 3rd row: D c in ch-1 between 2-d c, ch 1, d c in same place, ch 6, s c in next loop, ch 6, s c in next loop, ch 6, d c in ch-1 between next 2-d c, ch 1, d c in same place, d c in turning ch-3. Ch 3, turn. 4th row: D c in ch-1 between next 2-d c, ch 1, d c in same place, ch 1, p, ch 1, 2 d c in center loop, ch 1, p, ch 1, d c in ch-1 between next 2-d c, ch 1, d c in same place, d c in turning ch-3. Ch 3, turn. Repeat the last 3 rows until work measures same as your forefinger. Break off.

Middle Finger... Attach thread to 1st free loop of 39th row at base of forefinger. 1st row: Ch 3, d c in same loop, ch 1, d c in same loop, ch 1, p, ch 1, 2 d c in next loop, ch 1, p, ch 1, d c in next loop, ch 1, 2 d c in same loop. Ch 3, turn. 2nd and subsequent rows: Work as for forefinger for necessary length. Break off.

Ring Finger... Work as for middle finger. Break off.

Little Finger . . . Work as for middle finger. Break off.

Palm Side... (Made vertically—rows running from finger tips to edge of wrist.) Ch 121, turn. 1st row: D c in 5th ch from hook, \* ch 2, skip 3 ch sts, d c in next ch, ch 2, d c in same ch, repeat from \* across (30 groups). Ch 5, turn. 2nd row: Skip 1st group, \* make d c, ch 2 and d c in next sp. Ch 2, skip next group, repeat from \* across, ending row with 1 group in turning ch. Ch 5, turn. 3rd to 8th rows inel: Same as 2nd row. Break off. This strip forms the underside of thumb and inside of forefinger. Make a similar strip, starting with ch 101 (25 groups).

Thumb...Place second strip over first strip in position, so that foundation chains of both strips touch each other. Place a pin at one end to hold strips together. From the end with the pin, count 10 groups along foundation chain, attach thread in next sp, and work back over these 10 groups as follows: \* Ch 2, skip next group, s c in next sp, working s c through the two strips in order to join them to make thumb. Repeat from \* along the 10 groups, then across the end and continue up on other side along 10 groups. Break off. This completes the thumb. Try thumb on left hand, having the shorter strip extend toward the wrist to form inside of hand.

Use one of the following threads in size 50, White: CLARK'S O.N.T. MERCERIZED CROCHET, 2 balls for Cap, 6 balls for Sacque, 2 balls for Bootees.

J. & P. COATS BIG BALL BEST SIX CORD MERCER-IZED CROCHET, 1 ball for Cap and Bootees, 3 balls for Sacque.

MILWARD'S steel crochet hook No. 12.

3 yds. ribbon, ½ inch wide (1½ yds. for Cap, 1 yd. for Sacque, ½ yd. for Bootees).

2 ribbon rosettes for Cap.

GAUGE: 7 loops make 2 inches; 7 rows make 1 inch.

#### CAP 544-A See diagram Page 29

Starting at front edge, ch 218 (to measure about 13 inches). **1st row:** S c in 3rd ch from hook (1 p), ch 4, s c in 3rd ch from hook (another p), ch 1, s c in 10th ch of foundation (counting back from 1st p), \* ch 4, make a p, ch 4, another p, ch 1, skip 4 ch of foundation, s c in next ch. Repeat from \* across (42 loops). Ch 5, turn. **2nd row:** \* Make a p, ch 4, make another p, ch 1, s c in next loop between 2 p's of previous row. Ch 4, repeat from \* across. Ch 5, turn. Repeat 2nd row, increasing 1 loop at both ends of

every 8th row, 3 times (48 loops). To increase 1 loop at beginning of row, make a loop as before, then make s c in 1st p of 1st loop, make another loop, making the s c in next p of same 1st loop, continue in pattern across increasing 1 loop at end of row in the same way as for beginning until work measures  $4\frac{1}{2}$  inches in all. To shape center back of cap, decrease 1 loop at both ends of each of next 2 rows—to decrease, omit the last loop at each end. Then decrease 1 loop at end of each row until 38 loops remain. On next row work in pattern across 1st 16 loops, turn. Work over these 16 loops, decreasing 1 loop at both ends of each row until 1 loop remains. Break off. Attach thread to the 6th loop at center and work opposite side to correspond.

Insertion... Ch 12, turn. 1st row: D c in 4th ch from hook, d c in same ch, ch 2, 3 d c in same ch (1 shell), ch 2, skip 3 ch, s c in next ch, ch 2, skip 3 ch, in last ch make 3 d c, ch 2, and 3 d c (another shell). Ch 4, turn. 2nd row: Shell in 1st ch-2 (shell over shell), ch 4, shell over next shell. Ch 4, turn. 3rd row: Shell over shell, ch 2, s c under ch-4, ch 2, shell over shell. Ch 4, turn. Repeat these 2 rows alternately until work measures same length as center back (see diagram). Place insertion over both edges of center back of cap and sew in place leaving the shell edges free on outside. Run a thread around curved edge and pull tightly, making gathers for crown to fit. Attach thread to foundation ch and, working across lower edge

of cap, make \* 1 shell in next loop, ch 2, s c in next loop, ch 2. Repeat from \* across. Break off.

Front Ruffle...Across front edge, work ruffle. 1st row: Attach thread to foundation chain, \* ch 4, s c in next loop, ch 4, s c in next loop, ch 4, s c in next loop, ch 4, s c in same loop (1 loop increased in every 3rd loop). Repeat from \* around all sides. Ch 5, turn. 2nd row: Sc in 1st loop, \* ch 4, sc in next loop, repeat from \* across. Ch 5, turn. 3rd row: \* S c in next loop, ch 4, s c in next loop, make 3 more loops, then ch 4, 4-d c cluster in next loop, ch 4, 4-d c cluster in same loop, ch 4, repeat from \* across, ending with 5 loops. Ch 5, turn. 4th row: Work as for 3rd row, making three 4-d c clusters with ch 4 between clusters, between the 2 clusters of previous row. There will be 7 loops between cluster groups. Ch 5, turn. 5th row: Work a row of loops. 6th row: Work as for 3rd row, making cluster groups in center loop (thus starting a new cluster group between clusters made previously). Ch 5, turn. 7th row: Same as 4th row. Ch 5, turn. 8th to 12th rows incl: Same as 5th row. Break off.

Rosette... Starting at center, ch 8, join to form ring. 1st rnd: Ch 6, \* d c in ring, ch 3, repeat from \* 4 more times, joining last ch 3 to 3rd st of ch-6 first made. 2nd rnd: Over each loop work: 1 s c, 1 half d c, 3 d c, 1 half d c, 1 s c. 3rd rnd: Ch 5, \* s c in 1st d c of 1st rnd, ch 5, repeat from \* around. 4th rnd: Over each loop work: 1 s c, 1 half d c, 5 d c, 1 half d c, 1 s c. 5th rnd: Ch 7, \* s c in s c between petals of 3rd rnd, ch 7. Repeat from \* around. 6th rnd: Over each loop work: 1 s c, 1 half d c, 7 d c, 1 half d c, 1 s c. Break off. Make 2 more rosettes.

Shamrock...Ch 20, s c in 1st ch, \* ch 20, s c in same place as last s c, repeat from \* once more. 1st rnd: Make 24 s c in each loop. 2nd rnd: S c in each s c. Ch 26, turn and work 1 s c in each ch across, thus forming stem. Break off. Make 1 more shamrock.

Sew on shamrocks and rosettes across front. Draw a narrow ribbon through insertion and finish off with a bow at top. Sew a ribbon at each side for ties.

#### **SACQUE 544-B**

Right Front... Starting at bottom, ch 103 (to measure about 6 inches). 1st row: S c in 3rd ch from hook (1 p), ch 4, s c in 3rd ch from hook (another p), ch 1, s c in 10th ch of foundation, \* ch 4, make a p, ch 4, p, ch 1, skip 4 ch of foundation, s c in next ch. Repeat from \* across (19 loops). Ch 23, turn. 2nd row: Make 3 loops as before across ch-23, then \* p, ch 4, p, ch 1, s c in next loop between 2 p's of previous row. Ch 4, repeat from \* across. Ch 5, turn. 3rd row: \* Make a p, ch 4, p, ch 1, s c in next loop between 2 p's of previous row. Ch 4, repeat from across, increasing 1 loop at end of row-to increase I loop at end of row, make a loop as before, making the s c in 1st p of last loop, make another loop, making the s c in last p of last loop. Ch 5, turn. 4th row: Work straight. Ch 5, turn. Repeat 3rd and 4th rows alternately until there are 28 loops in a row. On next row and every 5th row thereafter decrease 1 loop at underarm side (underarm side is the side with no increases), until 24 loops remain (to decrease, omit the last loop). Work straight until work measures 5½ inches at center, ending at underarm side, then ch 45, turn. Work 8 loops over ch-45 (this is sleeve) and continue in pattern across (32 loops in all). Hereafter work in pattern until work measures 9 inches in all. On next row decrease 2 loops at center front edge, thus starting neck shaping. Hereafter work in pattern, decreasing 1 loop at neck edge every row until 6 loops in all are decreased. Work straight until work measures 1¾ inches from 1st row of neck shaping. Then increase 1 loop every other row at neck edge, 3 times (29 loops). Break off.

Left Front...Make another piece same as right front, ending at neck edge, then ch 50, and sl st to neck edge of right front. Break off.

Back...Attach thread at sleeve edge of right front and work in pattern across (68 loops). Ch 5, turn. Continue to work in pattern until sleeves measure 10 inches. To shape sleeves, decrease 8 loops at end of each of the next 2 rows. Work straight for 1½ inches. Then increase 1 loop at both ends of next row and every 5th row thereafter 3 more times (60 loops). Work straight until underarm measures same as underarm of front. Break off. Sew up underarm and sleeve seams.

To make edging, attach thread at lower edge of underarm, ch 3, make 2 d c in 1st loop, ch 2, 3 d c in same loop (1 shell made), \* ch 2, s c in next loop, ch 2, in next loop work 3 d c, ch 2, 3 d c. Repeat from \* around all edges. Finish sleeves in same way. Sew a narrow ribbon to sacque at each side of neck edge and tie.

Rosettes and Shamrocks...Make 4 rosettes and 4 shamrocks as for Cap. Sew a group of 2 shamrocks and 1 rosette at each lower front edge; sew a rosette at neck edge.

#### **BOOTEES 544-C**

Upper... Starting at bottom, ch 88 (to measure about 4½ inches). 1st row: S c in 3rd ch from hook (1 p), ch 4, s c in 3rd ch from hook (another p), ch 1, s c in 10th ch of foundation, \* ch 4, make a p, ch 4, p, ch 1, skip 4 ch of foundation, s c in next ch. Repeat from \* across (16 loops). Ch 5, turn. 2nd row: \* Make a p, ch 4, p, ch 1, s c in next loop between 2 p's of previous row. Ch 4, repeat from \* across. Ch 5, turn. Repeat 2nd row until work measures 1½ inches. On next row work across 1st 6 loops, ch 58, turn. Work in pattern across (16 loops), and continue as before until work measures 1½ inches from ch-58. Break off. Sew up seam at center back.

Soles...To begin, ch 88. Work as for upper (16 loops), for  $1\frac{1}{2}$  inches. Place sole against upper and work a row of s c all around (thus joining sole).

Cuff... Starting at ankle, ch 108 (to measure about 5½ inches). Work in pattern for 1 inch. Ch 4, turn. To make edging. \* S c in next loop, ch 4, s c in next loop, ch 4, s c in next loop, ch 4, s c in same loop, ch 4. Repeat from \* across. Ch 4, turn. 2nd row: S c in 1st

1st row: Attach thread to end of 8th row of this strip and work in pattern to joining at thumb and across 8th row of second strip to the base of forefinger (base of forefinger can be determined by placing this piece of work over previous piece which has already been completed). Then make a chain to reach the tip of middle finger (thus starting middle finger), turn. 2nd row: Work in pattern across chain and over pattern to end of previous row. Ch 5, turn. 3rd row: Work in pattern to end of row. Ch 5, turn. 4th row: Work in pattern to within 11 groups from wrist edge, ch 2, sl st in next sp, ch 3, turn. 5th row: Skip 1st group, make d c, ch 2 and d c in next sp, and continue in pattern across. Ch 5, turn. 6th row: Work in pattern across previous row and across 4th row, to wrist edge. Ch 4, turn. 7th row: Work in pattern to within 13 groups from wrist edge, ch 2, sl st in next st, ch 3, turn. 8th row: Skip 1st group, make d c, ch 2 and d c in next sp, and continue in pattern to base of next finger (determine this point as before), make a chain to reach the tip of ring finger (thus starting ring finger), turn. 9th row: Work in pattern across chain, across previous row and across 8th row to wrist edge. Ch 3, turn. 10th to 15th rows incl: Work in pattern across. Ch 5, turn. 16th row: Work in pattern, starting little finger as other fingers were started. Then work 5 more rows in pattern and break off.

**Joining...** Place one piece over the other, so that fingers correspond. Attach thread  $1\frac{1}{2}$  inches from wrist edge and join the two pieces with ch 2, and s c (as in thumb) around fingers, having  $1\frac{1}{2}$  inches open at opposite side of wrist. Then work a row of s c closely all around edges.

**Right Hand...**Since there is no right and wrong side to this work, make the two pieces exactly as for left hand, but join to correspond with right hand.

Edging... Make ch-8 loops to within ch-4 preceding shell, ch 8, s c in center of shell, ch 8, s c in next ch-8 loop. Continue thus around motif. Ch 8, s c in next free loop on next motif. Continue thus all around. Join, sl st in each of 1st 2 ch of 1st loop made. Next rnd: Ch 3, 3 d c in loop, \* ch 7, s c in 3rd ch from hook (p), ch 4, 4 d c in next loop, ch 2, ch-3 p, ch 3, ch-3 p, ch 3, ch-3 p, ch 2, 4 d c in next loop. Repeat from \* around this motif, ending with ch 4, p, ch 4, 4 d c in next loop; 4 d c in next free loop on next motif, continue around remaining motifs. Fasten off.

Fill-in Lace... Attach thread to 1 of the 6 free loops between joinings; in each of remaining 5 loops make tr tr, holding back last loop of each st on hook; thread over and draw through all loops on hook. Fasten off.

Join to 3rd st of ch-6 first made (6 sps). 2nd rnd: In each sp make: s c, half d c, d c, 3 tr, d c, half d c, s c (6 petals). SI st in 1st s c of 1st petal. 3rd rnd: Ch 5, \* s c in next d c, ch 5, skip 3 tr, s c in next d c, ch 5. Repeat from \* around, ending with s c in 1st loop (13 loops). 4th rnd: \* Ch 5, s c in next loop, turn, sl st in loop, 6 s c in same loop, ch 3, turn; d c in each of 5 s c (a corner block), ch 5, s c in same loop as last s c, ch 5, s c in next loop, ch 5, s c in next loop. Repeat from \* around, ending with ch 5, s c at upper right tip of next block. 5th rnd: \*\* Ch 5, skip 2 d c, s c in next d c, \* ch 5, s c in next loop. Repeat from \* 2 more times, ch 5, s c at right tip of next block. Repeat from \*\* around, ending with ch 5, s c in 1st loop over block. 6th rnd: \* Ch 5, s c in next loop, turn, sl st in loop, 6 s c in same loop, ch 3, turn; d c in each of 5 s c (a corner block), ch 5, s c in same loop as last s c; make 4 ch-5 loops. Repeat from \* around, ending with ch 5, s c at tip of 1st block. 7th rnd: \* Ch 5, skip 2 d c, s c in next d c; make 5 ch-5 loops, ch 5, s c at right tip of next block. Repeat from \* around, ending with ch 5, s c in 1st loop made. Fasten off.

Shamrock Motif...Starting at center, ch 16; in 16th st from hook, make s c, ch 15, s c, ch 15, s c. 1st rnd: Working over a cord (or 4 strands of same thread), make 22 s c in each of 3 loops. 2nd rnd: S c in each s c to within last 2 s c of 1st loop, skip these 2 s c and 2 s c of next loop; s c in each s c to within last 2 s c of loop; skip these 2 s c and 2 s c of next loop; s c in each of remaining s c of last loop. SI st in 1st s c of 1st loop. 3rd rnd: \* Ch 5, skip 3 s c, s c in next s c. Repeat from \* 3 more times, ch 5, skip 3 s c of this loop and 2 s c of next loop, s c in next s c, \*\* ch 5, skip 3 s c, s c in next s c. Repeat from \*\* 2 more times, ch 5, skip 2 s c of this loop and 3 s c of next loop, s c in next s c, \*\*\* ch 5, skip 3 s c, s c in next s c. Repeat from \*\*\* 2 more times, ch 5, s c in 1st loop made. 4th, 5th, 6th and 7th rnds: Like last 4 rnds of rosette motif. Do not break off. Join motif to previous one as follows:

Ch 3, s c in 1st loop on one side of 1st motif, \* ch 3, s c in next loop on second motif, ch 3, s c in next loop on 1st motif. Repeat from \* across. Fasten off.

Make necessary number of motifs, alternating them for length desired, and joining as before. Be careful to have shamrocks and rosettes placed in same position throughout (see illustration).

Heading... Attach thread to end loop at right and work along one long side as follows: 1st row: Ch 6, \*d c in next loop, ch 3. Repeat from \* across, ending with d c in last loop. Ch 6, turn. 2nd row: D c in 1st sp, \* ch 3, d c in next sp. Repeat from \* across. Fasten off. Work opposite side in same way.

EDGING 8267-B...Motifs...Work as for Insertion to last rnd incl. Do not break off, work scallop along next side only as follows: 1st row: \* Ch 5, s c in next loop. Repeat from \* across (7 loops), turn. 2nd row: Sl st to tip of next loop, s c in loop, \* ch 5, s c in next loop. Repeat from \* across. Repeat the 2nd row until 1 loop remains. Join motifs on last rnd as for Insertion, alternating motifs as before.

Lower Edge... With wrong side of work toward you, attach thread to 1st loop of 1st scallop and work as follows: 1st row: 4 s c in each sp of each scallop, making 8 s c in sp at tip of each scallop and ch-3 between scallops. Ch 1, turn. 2nd row: \* S c in each of 7 s c, ch 4, s c in 4th ch from hook (p), s c in each of next 4 s c, ch 10, turn; s c in 4th s c from p, turn; in ch-10 loop make: 3 s c, ch-4 p, (s c, p) 3 times, 3 s c. Repeat from \* once more. Now work over tip of scallop as follows: S c in each of next 6 s c, p, s c in each of next 3 s c, ch 10, turn; s c in 3rd s c from p, turn and work over ch-10 loop as before; s c in each of next 7 s c and work other side of scallop to correspond, s c in ch-3 between scallops, s c in 7 s c of next scallop, and continue thus across. Fasten off. Work heading along opposite side as for Insertion.

Edging is made of rosette and shamrock motifs, joined while working.

Shamrock Motif... Starting at center, ch 16; in 16th st from hook make s c, ch 15, s c, ch 15 and s c. **1st rnd:** Working over a cord (or 4 strands of same thread), make 22 s c in each of 3 loops. 2nd rnd: S c in each st to within last 2 s c of 1st loop, skip 2 s c of this loop and 2 s c of next loop; s c in each s c to within last 2 s c of loop, skip these 2 s c and 2 s c of next loop; s c in each of remaining s c of last loop. SI st in 1st s c of 1st loop. 3rd rnd: Ch 5, skip 3 s c, s c in next s c, \* ch 5, s c in 3rd st from hook (p), ch 2, ch-3 p, ch 2, skip 3 s c, s c in next s c (thus completing a p-loop). Repeat from \* 2 more times, make another p-loop, skip 3 s c of this loop and 2 s c of next loop, s c in next s c, \*\* make a p-loop, skip 3 s c, s c in next s c. Repeat from \*\* 2 more times, make a p-loop, skip 2 s c of this loop and 3 s c of next loop, s c in next s c; \*\*\* make a p-loop, skip 3 s c, s c in next s c. Repeat from \*\*\* 2 more times, make a p-loop, s c in 1st loop made (12 p-loops). 4th rnd: \*\* Ch 5, s c between p's of next loop, turn, sl st in loop, 8 s c in same loop, ch 3, turn; d c in each of 7 s c (a block); ch 2, p, ch 2, s c in same place as last s c, \* make a p-loop, s c between p's of next loop. Repeat from \* once more. Now repeat from \*\* around, ending with a p-loop, s c at right upper tip of 1st block made. 5th rnd: \*\* Make a p-loop, skip 3 d c, s c in next d c, p-loop, s c in front of p of next loop, \* p-loop, s c between p's of next p-loop. Repeat from \* once more, p-loop, s c at tip of next block. Repeat from \*\* around, ending with p-loop, s c between p's of 1st p-loop over 1st block. 6th, 7th and 8th rnds: Repeat 4th, 5th and 4th rnds, having 4 additional p-loops on each rnd. Fasten off.

Rosette Motif... Starting at center, ch 8, join with sl st. 1st rnd: Ch 5, \* d c in ring, ch 2. Repeat from \* 4 more times. Join to 3rd st of ch-5 first made. 2nd rnd: In each sp make: s c, half d c, 2 d c, half d c, s c (6 petals). Sl st in 1st s c of 1st petal. 3rd rnd: \* Ch 5, s c between s c's of next 2 petals. Repeat from \* around, ending with ch 5, s c in sl st. 4th rnd: In each loop make: s c, half d c, d c, 3 tr, d c, half d c, s c. Sl st in s c of 1st petal. 5th rnd: Ch 5, \* s c in next d c, p-loop, skip 3 tr, s c in next d c, p-loop. Repeat from \* around, ending with a p-loop, s c in 1st ch-5 loop (12 p-loops). Now work as for shamrock motif to last rnd incl. Do not break off, but turn, sl st to center of next p-loop (between p's) and work along one side only as follows:

- J. & P. COATS BIG BALL BEST SIX CORD MERCERIZED CROCHET, 3 balls of White or Ecru.

MILWARD'S steel crochet hook No. 12 or 13.

Measurements After Blocking... Bust-36½ inches. Length of underarm seam-5 inches.

GAUGE: 3 loops make 1 inch; 5 rows make 1 inch.

Back...Starting at point at lower edge of Back, ch 28. 1st row: S c in 3rd st from hook (1 p made), ch 2, s c in 10th ch from p, \* ch 5, ch-3 p, ch 2, skip 4 ch, s c in next ch. Repeat from \* 2 more times (4 loops). Ch 33, turn. 2nd row: P, ch 2, s c in 10th ch from p, \* ch 5, p, ch 2, skip 4 ch, s c in next ch. Reacross chain (5 loops inpeat from \* creased); \*\* ch 5, p, ch 2, s c under ch-5 of next loop. Repeat from \*\* across. Ch 33, turn. Repeat the last row until there are 24 loops in the row. Ch 38, turn. Work across chain (6 loops increased) and across row. Ch 38, turn. Repeat this last row until there are 48 loops in the row. Ch 7, p, ch 2, turn. Next row: \* S c under ch-5 of next loop, ch 5, p, ch 2. Repeat from \* across. Ch 7, p, ch 2, turn. Repeat this last row, increasing 1 loop at both ends of every 7th row 3 times in all-to inc., make 2 loops in 1 loop, by inserting book in p for 1st loop, and under ch-5 for 2nd loop. Then work without increasing until underarm measures 5 inches. Do not make a chain to turn after the last row.

TO SHAPE ARMHOLES: 1st row: Sl st to center of 1st loop, ch 3, s c in next loop, ch 5, p, ch 2; continue in pattern to within last 2 loops, d c in next loop, turn (2 loops decreased at both ends). 2nd row: SI st to center of 1st loop, ch 5, p, ch 2 and continue across to within last loop, d c in last loop; turn. Repeat the last row until 40 loops remain. Work straight until piece measures 31/2 inches from 1st row of armhole shaping. Then inc. 1 loop at both ends of every other row until there are 50 loops in the row. Work 4 rows without increasing. To shape shoulders, dec. 2 loops (as for armhole) at both ends of each row until 26 loops remain; then dec. 1 loop at both ends of each row until 18 loops remain. Fasten off.

Right Front...Starting at bottom, ch 138 to measure about 9½ inches. Work as for Back (26 loops), increasing 1 loop at one side only (underarm) every 2 inches twice. Work straight until underarm measures 5 inches.

TO SHAPE ARMHOLE: Starting at underarm, dec. 2 loops and continue in pattern across. Then dec. 1 loop at armhole edge every other row 4 times in all; at the same time, dec. 1 loop at opposite edge one row every inch 3 times in all (19 loops). Work straight until piece measures 31/2 inches from 1st row of armhole shaping. Then inc. I loop at armhole edge on next row and every other row thereafter 6 times in all; at the same time, continue to dec. 1 loop at opposite edge on one row every inch 5 more times (20 loops). To shape shoulder dec. 2 loops at armhole edge each row until 2 loops remain. Fasten off.

Left Front...Work to correspond with Right Front. Sew up underarm and shoulder seams. Make sufficient Edging No. 8271 (see pages 10, 11) to go all around edges, including armholes, and sew on with neat over-and-over stitches. Make 6 Flowers No. 8422-A (see pages 7, 28), and 6 Scrolls No. 8422-B (see pages 6, 28), and sew on as in illustration.

#### Materials:

Use one of the following threads in size 30:

- CLARK'S O.N.T. MERCERIZED CRO-CHET, 3 balls of White or Ecru, or 4 balls of any color.
- J. & P. COATS MERCERIZED CRO-CHET, 3 balls of White, Ecru or any color.
- J. & P. COATS BIG BALL BEST SIX CORD MERCERIZED CROCHET, 2 balls of White, Ecru or any color. MILWARD'S steel crochet hook No. 10. 1/4 yd. lining material.

A 5-inch zipper.

GAUGE: 3 loops make 1 inch; 8 rows make 1 inch.

Starting at bottom, ch 87 (27 chain sts to 2 inches). **1st row:** S c in 10th ch from hook, \* ch 3, s c in next ch, ch 5, skip 2 ch, s c in next ch. Repeat from \* across (20 loops), ending row with ch 3,

s c in last ch, ch 1, turn. 2nd row: S c in ch-3 loop, \* ch 5, s c in next ch-5 loop, ch 3, s c in same loop. Repeat from \* across; turn. Repeat 2nd row until piece measures 534 inches. Fasten off. Make another piece like this. Then make 2 more pieces, each 114 inches deep.

Motifs (Make 12)...Cut off 5 strands of thread, each 8 inches long, to be used for cord. Starting at center, ch 6, join with sl st to form a ring. Holding cord around top of ring and working over it, make 12 s c in ring. 2nd rnd: Working over cord, make 2 s c in each s c around. 3rd rnd: "Over cord make 2 s c in next s c, s c in next s c. Repeat from " around. Repeat 3rd rnd until there are 42 s c in the rnd. Cut off cord. Sl st in each of next 2 s c. Fasten off.

Gusset...Starting at one end, ch 2. 1st row: 3 s c in 2nd ch from hook. Ch 1, turn. 2nd row: 2 s c in 1st s c, s c in each s c across, 2 s c in last s c. Ch 1, turn. 3rd row: S c in each s c across. Ch 1, turn. 4th, 5th and 6th rows: Repeat 2nd row. 7th and 8th rows: Repeat 3rd row. 9th to 12th rows incl: Repeat 2nd and 3rd rows alternately. 13th and 14th rows: Repeat 2nd row. 15th row: S c in each s c. Ch 1, turn. Repeat the last row until piece measures 51/4 inches. Then work to correspond with opposite end, decreasing instead of increasing-to dec., work off 2 s c as 1 s c-until 3 s c remain. Fasten off.

Handle...Make a chain 1/8 inch long. 1st row: S c in 2nd ch from hook, s c in each ch across. Ch 1, turn. 2nd row: S c in each s c across. Ch 1, turn. Repeat 2nd row for 9 inches. Fasten off.

Block all pieces. Sew 6 motifs together with neat over-and-over stitches on wrong side. Then sew one large piece to edge of motifs, easing in the extra fullness. Sew a small piece to center of motifs on wrong side, easing in extra fullness, to form a frill. This completes one side of bag. Finish other side in the same way. Then sew side seams, leaving frill open. Sew gusset in place across bottom of bag. Sew zipper across motifs, at top.

Foundation Lining...Cut a piece of flexible cardboard the exact size of gusset. Cut 2 pieces of lining material slightly larger than gusset. Place these 2 pieces together and machine stitch around edges, leaving a space to insert cardboard. Insert cardboard and sew remaining edges together neatly. Cut 2 pieces of lining material, 7 inches square. Make a French seam across 2 sides and a very narrow hem around lower edge. Sew gusset to lower edge. Then insert lining foundation inside of crocheted piece. Tack gusset in place. Turn under 1/4 inch of lining foundation at top and sew to inside of zipper, easing in the extra fullness evenly around. Sew handle to pull of zipper.

Use one of the following threads in size 50:

CLARK'S O.N.T. MERCERIZED CRO-CHET, 4 balls of White or Ecru, or 5 balls of any color.

J. & P. COATS MERCERIZED CRO-CHET, 3 balls of White or Ecru, or 4 balls of any color.

J. & P. COATS BIG BALL BEST SIX CORD MERCERIZED CROCHET, 2 balls of White or Ecru.

MILWARD'S steel crochet hook No. 12 or 13.

4 small buttons.

GAUGE: 8 sps make 1 inch; 7 rows make 1 inch.

Left Hand...Starting at wrist, ch 147 (24 ch sts to 1 inch). Join with sl st. 1st row: Ch 5, \* skip 2 ch, d c in next ch, ch 2. Repeat from \* around (49 sps). Do not join, but ch 5, turn. 2nd, 3rd and 4th rows: \* D c in next sp. ch 2. Repeat from \* across. Ch 5, turn. Fasten off.

Insertion...Starting at center of rosette, ch 10, join with sl st. 1st rnd: 24 s c in ring. Join. 2nd rnd: Ch 5, \* skip 1 s c, d c in next s c, ch 2. Repeat from \* around. Join to 3rd st of ch-5 first made. 3rd rnd: In each sp make s c, half d c, d c, half d c, and s c. Join. 4th rnd: Make an s c around bar of d c on previous rnd, \* ch 5; s c around bar of next d c of previous rnd, inserting hook at back of work. Repeat from \* around. Ch 5, join to 1st s c made. 5th rnd: SI st in each of next 2 ch, s c in loop, s c in next loop, ch 3, s c in next loop, ch 3, s c in next loop, \* ch 5, sl st in 3rd ch from hook (ch-3 p), ch 2, p, ch 2, s c in next loop. Repeat from \* once more (2 p-loops made); s c in next loop, ch 3, s c in next loop, ch 3, s c in each of next 2 loops; make 2 more p-loops, joining last loop with sl st to 1st s c made. Fasten off. This completes one motif. Make another motif, working to within 1st 2 p-loops on 5th rnd. Then join to 1st motif as follows: \* Ch 2, p, ch 1, s c between 2 p's on 1st motif, ch 1, p, ch 2, s c in next loop back on 2nd motif. Repeat from \* once more. Then complete 5th rnd as for 1st motif. Make 8 motifs in all, joining in this manner.

Attach thread to 1st p-loop and work along long side as follows: S c in same loop, \* ch 4, 2 s c in next loop, s c in next s c, 2 s c in next loop, ch 4, s c in next loop, ch 4, s c in next loop, ch 4, s c in next loop. Repeat from \* across. Fasten off. Attach thread to 1st loop on opposite long side and work to correspond. Sew insertion with

Repeat from \* across (49 sps). Ch 5, turn. 2nd row: \* D c in next sp, ch 2. Repeat from \* until 8 sps are made; ch 2; in next sp make d c, ch 1 and d c. Then make 4 more sps, ch 2; in next sp make d c, ch 1 and d c (thus increasing for thumb). \*\* Ch 2, d c in next sp. Repeat from \*\* across. Ch 5, turn. 3rd row: Sp over sp to within 1st increase, ch 2, in ch-1 between 2 d c make d c, ch 1 and d c. Ch 2, sp over sp to within next increase, ch 2; in ch-1 make d c, ch 1 and d c. Repeat the 3rd row once more, having an additional sp between increases. Join to 3rd st of ch-5 first made (joining indicates center of palm). Hereafter work in rnds.

1st rnd: Ch 5, \* d c in next sp, ch 2. Repeat from \* around, making increase over each increase and having one more sp between increases. Repeat this rnd until 18 sps are increased for thumb, having 1 more sp between each increase in each rnd. On next rnd, work to within 1st increase, ch 2, d c in ch-1 sp, ch 6, d c in next ch-1 sp, ch 2 and continue around. Hereafter work in rnds (60 sps) until glove, when tried on, reaches to the base of your fingers. Put glove on and mark fingers by putting safety pins on palm and back of hand between each finger, having 14 sps for Little Finger, 15 sps for Ring Finger, 16 sps for Middle Finger, and 15 sps for Forefinger.

Little Finger... Work sps around until 7 sps are made on palm side at Little Finger, ch 6, d c in 7th sp on back of hand. Continue to work in rnds, making 3 sps over ch-6 (17 sps). Then work straight until glove, when tried on, reaches ½ inch from fingertip. On next 2 rnds dec. 2 sps in each rnd—to dec., omit the ch-2 and make 1 d c in



each of 2 sps, working them off as 1 d c. On next rnd make only 1 ch between each d c (instead of 2 ch). Following rnd: D c in each sp around. Next rnd: S c in every other d c around. Following rnd: S c in every other s c until no sts remain.

Ring Finger... Attach thread to top of d c on 1st rnd of Little Finger on palm side, work sps all around palm and back of hand, then make a sp in each of 3 sps of Little Finger (between fingers). Work across next 7 sps on palm side, ch 6 and make d c in 8th sp from Little Finger on back of hand and continue as for Little Finger.

Middle Finger...Like Ring Finger.
Forefinger...Like Little Finger.

**Thumb...** Attach thread to underside of thumb, ch 5 and work in rnds as for fingers, decreasing on underside of thumb if necessary.

Cuff...lst rnd: Attach thread to d c below opening of cuff. Ch 3, \* 2 d c in next sp, d c in next d c. Repeat from ' until 20 d c are made, \*\* ch 2, d c in next d c, 20 more d c as before. Repeat from \*\* around, ending with ch 2. Join to 3rd st of ch-3 first made. 2nd rnd: SI st in next d c, ch 3, d c in each of next 18 d c, \* ch 2, in ch-2 sp make d c, ch 2 and d c; ch 2, skip 1 d c, d c in each of next 19 d c. Repeat from ' around, ending with ch 2; join. 3rd rnd: SI st in next d c, ch 3, d c in each of next 16 d c, \* ch 2, d c in next sp, ch 2; in next sp make d c, ch 2 and d c; ch 2, skip 1 d c, d c in each of next 17 d c. Repeat from \* around, ending with ch 2; join. 4th rnd: SI st in next d c, ch 3, d c in each of next 14 d c, \* ch 2, d c in next sp, ch 2, d c in next sp, ch 2; in next sp make d c, ch 2 and d c; 2 more sps, ch 2, skip 1 d c, d c in each of next 15 d c. Repeat from \* around, ending with ch 2; join. Continue in this manner, always making 2 d c less in each d c-group and having 2 more sps between d c-groups on each rnd until 3 d c remain in each group. Next rnd: SI st in next d c, ch 5, \* d c in next sp, ch 2. Repeat from \* around. Join to 3rd st of ch-5 first made. Following 2 rnds: SI st in sp, ch 5, \* d c in next sp, ch 2. Repeat from \* around; join. Next rnd: S c in next sp, ch 6, s c in 3rd ch from hook (p); \* d c in next sp, ch 3, ch-3 p. Repeat from \* around. Fasten off. Work a row of s c closely all around opening, making 2 ch-10 buttonloops on right side. Sew on buttons to correspond with buttonloops.

Right Hand...Work to correspond with left hand.

Scalloped Edge...With wrong side of work toward you, attach thread to 4th free loop on 3rd rnd of 1st flowerette. 1st row: \* Ch 7, s c in next loop. Repeat from \* across. Ch 1, turn. 2nd row: 8 s c in each loop. Fasten off.

For tray mat, cut linen 10 x 16 inches; make narrow hem all around, and sew lace on neatly.

For luncheon set, make 4 place mats as for tray mat; for center mat, cut linen 16 x 34 inches and finish in same way.

3rd rnd: S c in each s c around. 4th and 5th rnds: S c in 1st s c, \* 2 s c in next s c.

Repeat from \* around until there are 36 s c in the rnd. 6th rnd: \* Ch 8, sl st in 5th ch from hook (1 p made). Repeat from \* once more. Then ch 3, skip 2 s c, s c in next s c. Continue in this manner around (12 p-loops). Join last p-loop with sl st to base of first p-loop made. Break off. 7th rnd: Attach thread

at center of 1st p-loop and work as for 6th rnd, making s c in center of each loop (instead of in s c). Break off.

Second Motif...Work as for first motif to 5th rnd incl. Then join to first motif as follows: 6th rnd: \* Ch 8, p, ch 2, s c in center of p-loop of first motif, ch 7, p, ch 2, skip 2 s c on second motif, s c in next s c. Repeat from \* once more, and complete rnd as 6th rnd of first motif was completed. Break off.

Third Motif...Work as before to 5th rnd incl. Then join first 2 loops to next 2 loops of first motif as second motif was joined to first. Ch 8, p, ch 6, sl st in center of p-loop on second motif (next to joining), turn. Work 8 s c over ch-6 just made, ch 6, p, ch 2, skip 2 s c of third motif, s c in next s c. Starting at lower edge of one side, ch 268 to measure about 16 inches. 1st row: S c in 3rd ch from hook (a p made), ch 4, s c in 3rd ch from hook (another p made), ch 1, s c in 10th ch of foundation (counting back from 1st p made); \* ch 4, make a p, ch 4, make another p, ch 1, skip 4 ch of foundation, s c in next ch. Repeat from \* across (52 loops). Ch 6, turn. 2nd row: \* Make a p as before, ch 4, make another p, ch 1, s c in next loop between 2 p's of previous row, ch 4. Repeat from \* across. Ch 5, turn. Ch 2, turn. 3rd row: 4 s c in next loop, ch 8, turn, \* s c in 4th s c from hook, turn, 4 s c in loop just made, ch 4, 4 s c in same loop, 4 s c in incompleted loop, 3 s c in next loop, ch 8, turn. Repeat from \* across. Fasten off. Attach thread to a loop at lower edge, and work a rnd of s c closely together, keeping work flat. Break off.

Make 4 motifs No. 8420-A (see page 7), and sew them in place on both sides, as in illustration.

Padding and Lining...Fold lining material so that there are 4 layers and a double fold. Place lower edge of crocheted piece against the double fold. Cut material to same shape as crocheted piece, allowing 1/2 inch extra for seams. Open one fold, thus forming an oval. Baste the outer edges of one half of oval together, and stitch on sewing machine. Make another row of stitching 21/2 inches in from previous row. Place 2 layers of cotton batting on both sides of this stitched section, and make another row of stitching 1/2 inch in from top edge and 2 inches along center fold at both sides. Make one row of stitching 1/2 inch in from edge on other half of oval, leaving 10-inch opening at top. Pull unpadded material over padded piece; sew opening together neatly. Place crocheted piece over padding.

When completed, chair back measures about 15 x 16 inches, and each arm piece about 9 x 12 inches.

GAUGE: 7 loops make 2 inches; 7 rows make 1 inch.

Chair Back... Starting at top, ch 253 (to measure about 15 inches). 1st row: S c in 3rd ch from hook (1 p made), ch 4, s c in 3rd ch from hook (another p made), ch 1, s c in 10th ch of foundation (counting back from 1st p made), \* ch 4, make a p, ch 4, make another p, ch 1, skip 4 ch of foundation, s c in next ch. Repeat from \* across (49 loops). Ch 5, turn. 2nd row: \* Make a p as before, ch 4, make another p, ch 1, s c in next loop between 2 p's of previous row. Ch 4, repeat from \* across. Ch 5, turn. Hereafter, repeat 2nd row until piece measures 9 inches in all. On next row, work in pattern across 1st 7 loops. Ch 5, turn. Work over these 7 loops only until piece measures 11 inches. Break off. \*\* Skip 7 loops, attach thread to next loop and work across

next 7 loops for 4 more inches. Break off. Repeat from \*\* once more. Skip 7 loops and work across remaining 7 loops for 2 inches. Break off.

Clover Motifs...Starting at center, ch 10, join with sl st to form ring. 1st rnd: 16 s c in ring. Join. 2nd rnd: S c in each of 2 s c, ch 9, \* skip 2 s c, s c in each of next 2 s c, ch 9. Repeat from \* around. Join last ch-9 with sl st to 1st s c. 3rd rnd: Ch 5, \* d c in ch-9 loop, ch 5, s c between next 2 s c, ch 5. Repeat from \* around. Join last ch-5 with sl st. 4th rnd: \* 7 s c and 1 half d c in ch-5 loop, d c in d c, 1 half d c and 7 s c in next loop. Repeat from \* around. Join. Break off. Make 69 more motifs. Place motifs all around edges of chair back and sew together on wrong side. Then sew to edges of chair back (see illustration).

Arm Pieces...Starting at top, ch 113 (to measure about 7 inches) and work as for chair back until piece measures 8 inches (21 loops). On next row work across 1st 7 loops, ch 5, turn. Work over these 7 loops only for 2 more inches. Break off. Skip 7 loops and work over remaining 7 loops for 2 more inches. Break off. Work 37 clover motifs for edging of each arm piece.

Flower...Starting at base of stem, ch 45, s c in 20th ch from hook (this forms center). Working over cord, s c in each ch of stem, 5 s c in last ch. Working over cord along opposite side, make s c in each ch, turn, \*\* 21 s c over cord only, s c in 7th s c of stem, turn, s c in 2nd s c from hook, s c in next 3 s c, \* ch 5, s c in next 4 s c. Repeat from \* 3 more times. Over cord and ch of ring, make 2 s c, ch 5, 2 s c; turn. Repeat from \* 5 more times, joining last s c on 1st row of each petal to 3rd p from tip of previous petal. Fasten off. Sew last p of last petal of flower to stem as in illustration. Sew base of flower stem to main stem.

Rose...Starting at base of stem, ch 35, s c in 20th ch from hook (this forms center). Working over cord, s c in each ch, 5 s c in last ch; s c in each ch along opposite side, \* turn, 21 s c over cord only, turn, s c in each s c across, 2 s c in ring (1 petal). Repeat from \* 5 more times, joining last s c on 1st row of each petal to 7th s c (from ring) of preceding petal. Sew 7th s c of last petal to 7th s c of stem. Sew flower and rose to main stem at base of side stem.

Join to 3rd st of ch-4 first made (26 sps). 3rd rnd: 2 s c in each sp around. Join (52 s c). 4th rnd: D c in each s c around, increasing 8 d c in the rnd-to inc., make 2 d c in 1 st. Join (60 d c). 5th rnd: S c in same place as sl st, \* ch 2, skip 2 sts, tr in next st, ch 2; d tr in each of next 5 sts, with ch-2 between; ch 2, tr in next st, ch 2, skip 2 sts, s c in next st. Repeat from \* around (5 fans). 6th rnd: 2 s c in next sp; in each of next 6 sps make 2 s c, ch 3, 2 s c; 2 s c in next sp. Repeat from \* around; sl st in 1st s c made. Break off.

No. 8415-J Stem...1st row:

\* Ch 10; in 5th ch from hook make s c, ch 4, s c, ch 4, s c. Repeat from \* for desired length. Ch 5, turn. 2nd row:

Working along opposite side of foundation chain and over a cord (or 4 strands of same thread), make s c in each st across. Ch 1, turn. 3rd row:

S c (over cord) in each of next 5 s c, \* ch 5; in 5th st from hook make s c, ch 4, s c, ch 4 and s c; s c in next 6 s c. Repeat from \* across. Fasten off.

No. 8415-K Petal Shamrock... Starting at center, ch 8, join with sl st. 1st rnd: 12 s c in ring; join. 2nd rnd: \* Ch 3 (to count as d c), d c at base of ch-3, d c in each of next 2 s c, 2 d c in next s c, ch 3, turn; d c in 1st d c, d c in each d c to within turning ch, 2 d c in 3rd st of turning ch. Ch 3, turn; d c in 1st d c, d c in each d c and in 3rd st of turning ch (a petal), ch 3; working along side of petal, make s c in same place as last d c, ch 2, s c at base of next d c, ch 2, s c in next s c on ring. 

Cut off cord. SI st in next st. 7th rnd: S c in same place as sl st, \* ch 5, skip 1 s c, s c in next s c. Repeat from \* around (24 loops). 8th and 9th rnds: SI st to tip of next loop, s c in loop, \* ch 5, s c in next loop. Repeat from \* around. 10th rnd: Sl st to tip of next loop, \* ch 10, skip 1 loop, s c in next loop. Repeat from around. 11th rnd: Working over a cord, make 15 s c in each loop. Cut off cord. 12th rnd: \* S c in each of next 7 s c, ch 3, s c in next s c, ch 5, s c in same s c as last s c, ch 3, s c in each of next 7 s c. Repeat from \* around. Fasten off.

No. 8415-N Large Petal...Ch 15. 1st rnd: Working over cord (or 6 strands of same thread), make s c in 2nd ch from hook and in each ch across, 3 s c in last ch; working along other side of foundation, make s c across. Ch 1, turn. 2nd and 3rd rnds: Over cord, picking up back loop only, make s c in each s c around, making 3 s c in each of 3 sts at tip. Fasten off.

Small Petals...Ch 8, s c in 2nd ch from hook and in each ch across. Do not reverse work, but work around over cord as for 1st rnd of large petal; sl st at beginning of rnd to draw base close. Do not fasten off. Ch 10 (to allow 2 ch free between petals); working over same cord, make 2 more petals like this, joining with sl st to base of previous petals. Do not fasten off.

Stem...Ch 35 (let cord hang), s c in 2nd ch from hook and in each ch across, join with sl st to base of small petals (so that wrong side of sts is on top). Ch 1, turn. Then work over cord as for 1st rnd of large petal. Join to base of petals so that right side of row is on top. Fasten off, leaving a 6-inch length of thread, and sew to large petal as in illustration.



### Crochet Stitches

- 1... Chain (ch): Make loop in thread, insert hook in loop, and draw main length of thread through. Continue to draw thread through each new loop formed for length desired.
- 2...Single Crochet (s c): Insert hook under 2 loops of st, draw thread through st (2 loops on hook), thread over hook, draw through the 2 loops.
- 3...Half Double Crochet (half d c): Make like d c until there are 3 loops on hook; then thread over and draw through all 3 loops.
- 4...Double Crochet (d c): Thread over hook, insert hook in st, and draw thread through (3 loops on hook), thread over hook, draw through 2 loops, thread over, draw through 2 remaining loops.
- 5...Treble (tr): Thread over hook twice, insert hook in st and draw thread through st (4 loops on hook), thread over, draw through 2 loops, thread over, draw through 2 loops, thread over, draw through remaining 2 loops. For a Double Treble (d tr), thread over hook 3 times; and for a Triple Treble (tr tr), thread over hook 4 times, taking off 2 loops at a time as in the tr.
- **6...Slip Stitch (sl st):** Insert hook through st, catch thread, and, with one motion, draw through both the st and the 1 loop on hook. The sl st is used for joining, or when an invisible st is required.
- 7...Popcorn Stitch (pc st): Ch 1, 5 d c in next st, drop st from hook, insert hook

back in ch-1 and draw loop through the one on hook.

- 8...Block (bl) and Space (sp): Make 4 d c over 4 sts of preceding row (this forms 1 bl), ch 2, skip 2 sts, make 1 sp. The bl and sp are used in Filet Crochet.
- 9...Picot (p): Make a ch of 3, 4, or 5 sts, according to length of p desired, and s c in the foundation, or in 1st st of ch.
- 10...Cross Stitch: Thread over twice, insert hook in st and draw thread through as for a tr (4 loops on hook), thread over, and draw through 2 loops, thread over, skip 2 sts, insert hook in next st, draw thread through (5 loops on hook), thread over and draw off 2 loops at a time 4 times, ch 2, 1 d c in the center point of the cross, thus completing the cross.
- 11...Cluster: Make 3 or more tr in the same st, always holding the last loop of each tr on the hook; then, thread over hook and take off all remaining loops. Then make a tight ch to fasten the cluster.
- 12... Knot Stitch: Draw a loop on hook out ½ inch, draw thread through, making a ch st of it. Put hook between loop and single thread of this ch and make an s c. Work another similar knot st, skip 4 sts of preceding row, 1 s c in next. Repeat from beginning to end of row. Make two ¾-inch knot sts to turn, 1 s c over double loop at right of 1st center knot of preceding row, 1 s c over double loop at left of same knot, 2 knot sts and repeat.



#### GENERAL INFORMATION

**GAUGE...**The gauge of articles is based on the average worker's tension. Before starting your work, make a small swatch and compare your tension with the specified gauge. If your gauge is looser, use a finer needle; if it is tighter, use a heavier one.

LAUNDERING...Notate all important

measurements before laundering. Use neutral soap or soap flakes in lukewarm water. Rinse article thoroughly in clear water. Roll in Turkish towels to absorb excess moisture; then pin to notated measurements, on flat surface, and allow to dry. Press carefully through a damp cloth, if necessary.
