Box 2. The public health triangulation process.

- 1. Identify key questions
- Ensure question(s) are important, actionable, answerable and appropriate for triangulation
- 3. Identify data sources and gather background information
- 4. Refine the questions
- 5. Gather data/reports
- 6. Assess data reliability and make observations from each data set
- 7. Note trends across data sets and hypothesize
- 8. Check (corroborate, refute, modify) hypotheses
- 9. If necessary, identify additional data and return to Step 5
- 10. Summarize findings and draw conclusions
- 11. Communicate results and recommendations
- 12. Outline next steps for public health action
