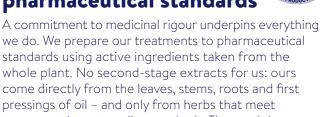

Travel sickness?

Your guide to managing your pet's travel sickness



Travel sickness?

Travel sickness is very unsettling for any pet and also unpleasant for their travelling companions. Like any new situation, a young dog should be introduced to travelling in a vehicle gently, following the 'short but often' rule. Travel sickness can also occur in older animals that often have some negative associations with travel. Travel sickness can be helped by following some basic training tips and using the most appropriate of our herbal supplements.

Some good training tips:

- Accustomise your pet to travel by starting with short journeys to build up confidence 'short but often'
- · Don't give a meal just before travelling
- Desensitise your dog to the car by using the stationary vehicle for play, relaxation and even feeding there occasionally, providing it is safe to do so
- Remember to stop for breaks on a long journey and NEVER LEAVE your pet in a vehicle on warm days

Anxious, salivating, shaking sometimes followed by vomiting

Anxiety, excitability, nervousness or simply apprehension are the most common causes of travel sickness in pets. This can especially affect young dogs and cats for whom travelling is a strange new experience.

If required any of these products can be used in conjunction with each other and with any other conventional medication that the animal may be receiving.

Scullcap & Valerian Tablets

This licensed veterinary herbal medicine relieves anxiety, helps relaxation and reduces excessive salivation. Two doses should be given before travel, one about 12 hours before and again 2 hours before, using the dosage rate of 2 tablets per 5kgs bodyweight for both doses. Use the same regime for subsequent car journeys.

Active ingredients per tablet: Valerian Dry Extract

Ph.Eur 5:150mg, Mistletoe Dry Extract 3:150mg, Scullcap 30mg, Gentian Dry Extract Ph.Eur 2:124mg

Not recommended for pregnant or lactating females.

Organic Valerian Compound

For unexpected trips where time does not allow two doses of tablets to be given, this liquid supplement containing three calming extracts can be used as an alternative to relax dogs and cats and so reduces anxiety. Cats love the aroma of Valerian Compound and so simply putting a few drops on the bedding will calm them during the journey.

Not recommended for pregnant or lactating females.





No apparent anxiety but vomits

This is actually less common than anxiety based travel sickness, although once your pet has been sick a couple of times unfortunately it does soon lead to an anxiety issue as well. So it is imperative to try and resolve the problem quickly. Generally they are quite happy to get into and travel in the vehicle, but suddenly will salivate and vomit.



Digestive Tablets

Containing ginger, slippery elm, rhubarb and valerian these tablets are formulated to settle the stomach and are very comforting for those who are prone to motion sickness. Give the appropriate dose for the animal's weight two hours before a journey commences.

Sometimes a dog or cat can also become anxious because of the expectation that they will be sick on a journey. If this does occur it may be necessary to also use the recommendations for anxious travellers.
