Methodology

Penn, Schoen and Berland Associates, LLC, conducted online interviews on September 17, 2009 among 801 2008 general election voters in the United States. The margin of error for the entire sample is +/- 3.46 at the 95% confidence level.

Note: All numbers cited represent percentages (%). Some percentages add to more or less than 100% due to rounding error.
