

When I write this message for each upcoming newsletter it is usually the last piece to be included before everything goes to print. Therein lies both advantages and disadvantages. Certainly I have read and edited all the material for inclusion and I have had a little more time to pick up last minute news and views. On the other hand, the pressure to get the job finished by a deadline has increased. There is a tendency to write as though the final sprint is upon me. Then afterwards, when it is too late, I find there is much I would like to have said and have neglected to say. It will always be thus I suppose...

On this occasion, with both Christmas and a trip to New Zealand coming up it is doubly so and this excitement, I am sure, is shared by the 2300 competitors who will be taking part at Palmerston North and Christ-plus their guests, wives and husbands.

Forty-three countries will be represented, some of whom have never taken part before. It is a triumph that this fourth Veterans Championships will be truly international and not simply a New Zealand/Australian meet with a handful of elite from elsewhere. This triumph belongs to John MacDonald and his organizing committee as well as a tribute to those of you who have made considerable sacrifices to attend. Fears that this might be so were expressed when the choice was made and indeed a few of these fears must have entered everyone's mind. Happily, it will not be so. Well done New Zealand, well done Veterans everywhere.

Of course, we knew from the beginning that some faces, familiar from previous Championships, would be missing. A combination of the cost for those from the Northern Hemisphere with a time slot which has made it impossible for them to attend has forced them to miss out. On the other hand, New Zealanders and Australians have, for so long travelled around the world to take part that at last they will have their chance to stay home and welcome others and that is as it should be. For those who will be there it will be a great thrill both to take part and to visit a beautiful place and meet its fine people.

In addition to the competitive events much else will take place in Christ church which will decide the course of Veteran Athletics during the coming years. A decision will be made on the site of the 1983 and possibly the 1985 Championships. The various continental areas will meet to decide their championship venues for future years too whilst technical committees will consider what changes, if any, should be made to implement weights and hurdle heights or spaces.

In the first issue of the W.A.V.A. newsletter, Peter Mundie published his current world record list. The second issue featured a 37 page insert of 1979 rankings by Gij's Knoppert. This issue begins John Hayward's publication of the all time Veterans ranking lists. A great deal of work goes into these lists. I hope each one of you appreciates the task which these members have undertaken for your interest. Bravo Statisticians, you have done and continue to do a fine job.

For those who are listed in John's all time list, a pat on the back. Surely it is a considerable honour to qualify in such August company. Since this is a first time work we would be interested in feedback. If you send in a claim to a listing be sure to provide dates, locations, weights(if necessary) wind readings, etc.

I would like to appeal once again for material from readers. Anything pertaining to Veteran Activity of a national or international level is useful and pictures are eagerly sought. The latter will be returned following publication. Sadly we have no humorous article this time. Surely someone must have an Athletic experience to raise a chuckle.

May I, on behalf of the executive of the World Association of Veteran Athletes wish you a peaceful and happy Christmas and the best of fortune in 1981.

TOM FLORY
1938 - 1980

As the leading marathoners at the I.G.A.L. Road Championships in Glasgow passed the first lap (14Km) excited voices of spectators shouted encouragement. "Well done Tom" shouted a North England accent to a strong looking runner in the lead pack. "Who's that?" I enquired. "Tom Flory, he replied, he'll do well today". Tom did even better than that and finished a fine eighth place 2 hrs:24Min.19secs. This was the only time I ever saw Tom Flory but I was shocked and saddened by a portion of letter sent by Maurice Morrell the other day.

Tom Flory, 42 year old Middlebrough Harrier collapsed and died immediately after completing a cross country relay leg for his club on 18th October.

A prolific runner for his club, turning out in great style week after week, Tom finished 8th in the World Veterans Marathon Championships in Glasgow on August 24th with a time of 2 hrs. 24min. 19 secs.

Sadly, Tom leaves a wife and four children in somewhat impecunious straits, he died at a time of high unemployment in the North of England. Colin Pickett, a Club colleague has set up an appeal, Colin lives at 11, Castle Wynd, Nunthorpe, Middlesbrough, England should anyone feel like contributing.

Reading Maurice's letter reminded me that fit as most of us may be we are still mortal, we have no contract with God. We should be thankful for what we have now, whether or not we realize our ambitions. I am sure that you share with me this sadness at the loss of a fellow veteran athlete and offer the sincerest condolences to Mrs. Flory and the children.

On a happier note Maurice Morrells' letter also recounts a new World record for veteran club team at 4 x 1 mile.

British Veteran Cross Country champions Wirral Athletic Club set a new mark for the 4 x 1 mile Relay at Birkenhead on 18th July '80. Wirral had previously claimed a World Best in 1978 when they returned a mark of 18 min. 59.8 secs. only to find that West Valley Joggers and Striders had beaten them to it with an unheralded 18 min. 47.2 secs. in May 1978.

On a gravel track in the midst of hundreds of raucous fine-a-side football players, all doing their best to be unhelpful, the Wirral team ran with metronome like precision. Alf Lennon who only took up athletics when he was 42 years of age ran the first stint in 4 min. 22 secs. Leo Carroll, fresh from a great third place at Bruges in the 25k. followed with 4 min. 38 secs. Terry Harper, a British Orienteering champion worked up to 4 min. 41 secs. and Marathon runner Doug Watson brought the team home in 4 min. 41 secs. for a total time of 18 min. 22 secs. Just to make absolutely certain of the record Ted Isaacs, furious at being left out of the side, ran a fifth leg of 4 min. 41 secs.

There is no doubt that this time can be lowered yet further on a Tartan surface - any takers?

Wirral will possibly attempt the 24 hours "Runners World" relay next Summer and welcome any challengers to an actual race or a Postal competition.

John Gilmour (Australia - as if anyone didn't know) took part unofficially in the European championships but was, in fact, first finisher in the 60-64 class in all his events. 800M - 2:18.76, 1500M - 4:51.0, 5000M - 16:33.3 a World Record and then 10000M - 34:42.2 another World Record. Since returning home following the World Road Championships in Glasgow John has run a 2:41:30.4 Marathon (5 secs off the only "flat" World record he doesn't hold in his class from 800M up). For good measure however he has also bested Clive Davies's (USA) former 1 hour track record with a new mark of 16Km 732M.

The World Veteran all-time ranking lists

The publication of veteran ranking lists covering the best performers of 'All Time' will be carried out in sections, for with six age groups being considered in most events there would be over 3000 rankings to look over -- and that is a problem for compiler and reader alike.

London, in 1972, saw the first truly international veterans Track and Field Games. Three years later Toronto staged the first official World (Masters) Veterans Championships in which women's events were included for the first time. Since then there has been staged, at two year intervals, regular Championships in Gothenburg, Hanover and now New Zealand (Christchurch).

Pete Mundle (USA) was the first to take interest in producing statistical information on the older athletes which went into print in a very fine annual publication on Age Records. Then in 1972, John Hayward(GB) compiled ranking lists for a new magazine called Veteris and continued to do so until the end of 1977 when Gys Knoppert (Holland) took over, expanding his work to involve the women's scene. He made the lists fully comprehensive - where as the early Veteris lists were not. The Pole Vault, Hurdles and Steeple Chase being ranked as single 'Open' lists with the over 70s not getting a look in unless they were good enough for the younger groups.

These 'All Time' lists will follow the early Veteris ones, for it is upon them we have to rely for most of the information. As time passes, more comprehensive work will emerge to please all.

Electric times have not been given higher ranking over hand times - although hand timing is now known to be flatter, compared to the former.

To present information of interest, we have averaged out the top twenty in each group - the results are as follows :-

Note - the first line of averages are from the World All Time Lists which indicate the peak years of life - and a base for 1A comparison.

From this analysis it seems that pure speed will drop off about 8% by the time one becomes a veteran, in comparison with younger years. Then - interestingly - speed, allied to stamina, drops more sharply at 200m (11½%) and even more so at 400m (13½%).

Although the difference is not quite so marked in the six veteran classes - on average, the sharper decline is still there, particularly at 400m.

Once one has become a veteran the fall off seems reasonably even at about 4% every five years, until we reach sixty (3A), then it becomes more marked at around 6% every five years. May be with an increase in the ranks of those competing in the older classes, this will not be so obvious.

So why the large percentage difference between the 100m and 400m over ones younger years ? With a longer history of veteran competition and proper physiological research the proper answer maybe found - but at the moment my guess is - training for pure speed fitness that is required to race the **short** sprint is always less painful than **training** for the longer events, particularly the 400m. **Training** to race as fast as possible, while rapidly building up an oxygen debt, can be very painful, physically and mentally - as one gets older, natures mechanism will not allow this severe strain on the body - try as we will, it's a defence mechanism we can't over come.

3000 View Pan-American Championships

SAN JUAN, PUERTO RICO, Sept 1. The best adjective to describe the first official Pan American Championships for Masters is "joyous".

I've attended and participated in every international Championship held within the Masters' program. This meet, by far, was the most fun. The reason was simply the dedication, charm and friendliness of the Puerto Rican people. Starting with a cocktail party the night before the meet, which the Governor of the Island and the Mayor of San Juan attended, through the banquet three days later, there pervaded a genuine concern for the athletes and the true spirit of sportsmanship.

It would take me months to accept all of the invitations I received from my "competitors". The embraces at the end of each event were real. We performed before up to three thousand spectators. They cheered all of the athletes with special emphasis for those that finished last.

The opening ceremonies consisted of a placard display utilizing hundreds of youngsters. There followed a marching band, a parade of the athletes, not by countries, just as a group.

The closing ceremonies consisted of the same athletes appearing before the crowd with both groups applauding each other. Then the athletes mingled with each other, shook hands or embraced. To me, this is what sports should be all about.

Van Alphen's time lowers Canadian Art Taylor's age-50 best of 2:27:17 and breaks the 50-54 age-group world mark of 2:25:19 set in 1972 by Sweden's great Erik Ostbye. The World Masters 45-49 Marathon Champion in 1977, '78, and '79, Van Alphen also owns the age-48 mark of 2:22:40 PR.

Dick Quax, 32, won this year's NIKE/OTC in 2:10:47, breaking his own New Zealand national record. Fellow Kiwi, Lorraine Moller, 25, also broke her own national mark with a scintillating 2:31:40 (equal fourth-fastest ever). But in the opinion of knowledgeable observers—including 40-49 winner John Brennand, 44, of Santa Barbara—Van Alphen's record-breaking run was the outstanding individual performance.

The facilities were excellent, with a 400 meter main track and a 200 meter practice track. The stadium is near the ocean. The meet started in the late afternoon but the temperature on the track was over 90 degrees. When the sun went down it cooled considerably and was quite pleasant. The performances were quite good considering the heat and the fact that most athletes competed in two or more events.

Our Latin-American friends have shown substantial improvement. The Puerto Rican program is a good example. It started when Ruben Diaz, a sprinter, and Miguel Veve, a pole vaulter, came to New York to compete in the Masters Sports Association's 1978 Outdoor Championships. They asked me for suggestions about starting a Masters' program and I was glad to give them some ideas. I was pleasantly surprised when, a year later, I was invited to participate in the First Puerto Rican Masters Championships.

They had over 200 competitors from all over the island. There were no women or race walkers. The population of the island is under three million so that the initial turnout was outstanding. With a few exceptions, the level of performance was not exceptional. In one year, the membership in the Puerto Rican Masters has grown to 400 and the performance level has improved better than anyone expected. In addition, women are taking an active part and they have athletes in all events. The outstanding example of the improvement in their program is Willie Diaz, 40-44, who was voted the outstanding male competitor. Willie won the 100 (11.15); 200 (23.42); and, 400 (52.91) while anchoring the Puerto Rican team to victory in the 4 x 400 relay. Fifteen months ago the only sport Willie was involved in was going to the horse

Appearing fresh at the end, the diminutive Dutchman finished nearly six minutes ahead of Brennand, who clocked a near-PR 2:28:46. Van Alphen not only obliterated Alex Ratelle's over-50 course record of 2:35:24, but also cut 1:38 off Jack Foster's over-40 mark of 2:24:27.





THE INCREDIBLE CAREER of Joyce Smith (see next week's issue for the first part of her story) reached a new peak in Tokyo last Sunday when she won the international women's marathon there for the second year, this time with a new Commonwealth and UK record of 2:30:27. Only Grete Waitz (2:25:42 and 2:27:33) and Patti Catalano (2:29:34) have ever run faster, and those times were recorded on point-to-point course in New York in competition against men. The Japanese race was for women only, the field numbering 44 drawn from eight nations, and started and finished in the Olympic stadium.

Joyce, who turned 43 last month, had a tremendous battle with French-Canadian Jacqueline Gareau, the winner of the Boston and Montreal races this year and for one day holder of the Commonwealth record with 2:31:42. Joyce drew away over the final 4km to win by just over half a minute. "I'm very tired, but very happy I won again", she said, adding: "this was my best marathon". Britain's other representative, Gillian Adams (2:37:56 in New York three weeks earlier) took third place in 2:40:53.

Joyce — who won her first English cross-country title in 1959 and whose honours have included the International CC title and a world record and European bronze medal at 3000m — made her marathon debut at Sandbach in June 1979, shattering the British record by nine minutes with a time of 2:41:37. She improved to 2:36:27 when winning the Avon International at Waldniel in September, and followed up two months later with victory in the inaugural Tokyo International in 2:37:48. Her 1980 campaign started unhappily when she blacked out towards the end of the Orange Bowl race in Miami in January, but there were no bad after effects for at Sandbach in June she ran 2:33:32 in what she regards as a training run. Following illness and injury she shouldn't really have raced in the Avon event in London in August, but she felt obliged to turn out and placed a gritty 7th in 2:41:22. She knew she was capable of 2:30 this year but nothing can ever be taken for granted in marathon running. Her superb time of 2:30:27 in Tokyo was over three minutes inside her own UK record and enabled her to recapture the Commonwealth record, held by Lorraine Moller (NZ) with 2:31:40. Lorraine, incidentally, chose to race a marathon in Rio last weekend, and finished 7th (first woman) in 2:39:10.

The Canadian Masters Track and Field Championships 1980

Meet director Danny Daniels was beset with a host of problems in connection with the site of this meet and finally staged it in two separate Provinces!! Mooney's Bay track in Ottawa, Ontario wasn't ready in time so Danny scheduled most events across the river in Hull, Quebec. The Hull facility lacked a cage for discus and hammer so competitors in these events were shuttled back to the Ontario site. Despite these problems and a late Saturday afternoon rainstorm which upset schedules the meet was a great success.

Individual fine performances were many and 22 Canadian Native and 12 Canadian Open Records fell. Outstanding were George Horton's 45-49 class wins in the two short sprints, Suerre Heitanens wins at everything between 800M and 10,000M in the 60-64 class and Diane Palmasons (W 40-44) proof that although she is best known at longer distances (Hanover medals at 5000, 10000 and Marathon) she can also turn on the speed. Diane won at 200M, 800M and 1500M in addition to 5 & 10 Km. Gord Gilmour (50-54) (no relation to Australia's John) displayed fine all round form with wins at 110M hurdles, 400M hurdles, Javelin, Triple Jump and 3000M S.C. plus a second at Long Jump and a third at 10000M as well. C.M.I.T.T. president Alastair Lynn celebrated his mid-century by finewins at 800M and 1500M. At both events he went out fast and was never threatened.

One of the most remarkable and emotional performances was that of blind 68 year old Ivy Gromstrom of Vancouver. Unlike other blind runners, she doesn't have physical contact with her guide, but runs slightly outside him. He is Paul Hoeberings, himself partly blind. Sometimes in distress that she can't hear him she calls for reassurance which he promptly gives. Ivy ran 8:08.4 for 1500M, 30:09.7 for 5000 and 63:52.8 for 10000M.





1st November--The Brooks Canadian Masters Cross-Country Championships,
Sunnybrook Park, Toronto

One hundred and eleven starters answered the gun for the 7th Annual running of the Canadian Masters Cross-Country Championships. Derek Fernee making his first appearance in Masters Cross-Country running and Bob Daniell the defending champion were obviously strong contenders in the 40-44 class, but a wide variety of well known track and road performers, as well as C.C. devotees made for a most interesting competition. In 45-49 the competition seemed to be between George Milne and Bob Bowman despite the fact that entry numbers made this the largest age class and an unknown quantity graced our ranks in the person of Dr. Denis Friedlander of New Zealand. The 50-54 class brought together those many time rivals Arthur Taylor from Edmonton and Cliff Hall on his home course. Opinion on 55-59 chances was 100% in favour of Bill Cameron whilst opinion on the 60-64 class was divided slightly in favour of Stan Smith over Whitey Sheridan. Alex Woodhouse was an outsider. The best field of women we have ever had also promised some exciting running.

Conditions were ideal, dry with comfortable temperatures. Although there was a north wind, much of the course after the initial circuit is sheltered, so that this was not a factor.

Fernee and Daniell immediately assumed the lead and the first half of the race saw the rest of the pack interchanging behind them as various facets of the course favoured first one and then another. Most age classes seemed to be running true to form except that Arthur Taylor broke away from Cliff Hall earlier than usual and seemed bent on threatening the entire field, Alex Woodhouse seemed to be keeping tag on his favoured rivals better than expected and Christine Walker was going very fast in an effort to reverse the 5km results of a month earlier against Audrey McCabe.

During the second circuit of the lower loop Derek broke away from Bob Daniell and steadily established the lead that would give him a 39-second win. His time of 33:45 was the fastest ever over this exact circuit.* Bob Daniell's 34:24 was the exact same time he ran one year previously in winning the Canada-U.S.A. Match. Bob Christensen was elated to take 3rd position in his first time ever Cross-Country race.

Meantime, hanging on to Arthur Taylor's coattails, George Milne had succeeded in easing away from Bob Bowman and although Arthur won the hard fought duel, George succeeded in taking the crown for the 45-49 class, 35 seconds faster than 1979. Bob was second, bettering last year's time even more substantially. Dave Wallace of the newly formed Markham Centaurs Club took third.

What more can be said of Arthur Taylor? Year after year he dominates his age class but rarely by the margin he produced this time. If his 1979 time was sensational, this year he outpaced it, bettering even his World Championship time of 1975.* Cliff Hall ran his usual fine race for second whilst ever-keen Danny Daniels took the bronze medal.

Bill Cameron did even more than was expected of him, winning the 55-59 class by the remarkable margin of almost 4 minutes!! Sam Groves forgot his poor race at the Ontario Championships and came back with a good one to take second spot whilst Gerry Bakker bearing out his summertime fitness on the track came through for third.

About midway through the race Alex Woodhouse took the lead in the 60-64 battle, nursed it along, keeping an eye on Stan Smith and built it up to a ten-second margin with a strong finish. Ever-game Whitey Sheridan chased Stan home for the third spot. Those marvellous septuagenarians Wesley Miller and Blain Till earned the admiration of the field in the senior race. Both finished full of beans.

The women are running more strongly at this type of competition all the time. Jennifer Stocker came through well in the 35-39, Cheryl and Ria Harting, taking the silver and bronze medals respectively, are improving every time out. Christine Walker and Audrey McCabe ran a sensational race in the 40-44 class, with the former starting fast, holding on to the lead and then turning it on at the last to win. Cecilia Ross ran a well judged race to finish third in this category. In the women's 45-49 class Joanne Castle was a confident first and Anna Burnott, new to Cross-Country, took second.

Judith Kazdan, undefeated in World Class Cross Country, had run the Labatt's Marathon two weeks previously and so elected not to take part. We were thus robbed of a contest between her and rapidly improving Jean Cleator. Jean's very fast time suggests she would have won. It must be remembered, of course, that they would be in different categories at World level. Jean made the trip from B.C. and defeated all but 3 of the women from younger age classes.

Liese Lowe-Whyte has also been doing some homework and knocked almost 4 minutes from last year's time to take the silver. Twin sisters Rhonda Gillis (Toronto) and Rhoda Eaves (Montreal) are normally Cross-Country skiers, but this time turned admirably to running. Hope we see more of you, Rhonda & Rhoda.

In team scoring, University of Toronto overpowered in the 40-49 class, M.T.F.C. in the 50-59 and 60+ men's classes, whilst Credit Valley Marathon Club won the Women's team event.

A banquet followed the race from which everyone went away full of sliced meats, cheese and potato salad, and lashings of sherry trifle. Everyone lost this battle. Thanks again, Brooks, for the great support. Everyone was delighted. A special pat on the back to John Young and his helpers for the fine marking and officiating job and the ladies who helped with the spread. Roll on next year!!

* Roy Fowler's (England) winning time of 32:51 with John MacDonald (New Zealand) 33:44 for second place at the first World Masters Championships (1975) are difficult to compare. Although distances were about

the same, Fowler and MacDonald twice ran a section through the river but not the "finger" behind the pavilion.

** For the above reasons Arthur Taylor's times are hard to compare.

Hambly, Fox Win National 10K Cross- Country

from Tom Sturak

SEATTLE, WASH., November 9. David Hambly and Judy Fox were the overall men's and women's winners in the National Athletics Congress masters 10-kilometer cross-country championships today in 40-degree weather and intermittent rain over a true "English-style course" in Luther Burbank Park on Merced Island.

After a series of runner-up finishes this year, Hambly finally shed his bridesmaid status to win his first

age 7... national masters championship.

Fox just turned 40. As predicted off her smashing runs this year as a 39-year-old, she devoured some of the top women masters in the country, finishing over 2 minutes ahead of her nearest rival while just "cruising," according to one observer.

The race attracted 171 entrants, including 40 women. Half came from California. The well-organized race was sponsored by the Penn Mutual Life Insurance Co. and the Nike Shoe Co. Local Penn agent John Berger helped out with details.

"There was real mud in places," said Tom Sturak, "and several runners slipped and went down. But most of the runners seemed to appreciate the challenge. It was like a true European course."

Sister Marion Irvine, world 50+ distance record-holder who won the W50 division, said: "I've never run on anything like that before."

Hambly's winning time was 35:04. Since Hambly generally runs around 31-32 on the flat, most entrants could mentally subtract 3 or 4 minutes from their time to get a 10k fix.

Following Hambly was Earl Ellis in 35:23, Jerry Schmidt in 35:31 and Dan Conway, who beat Hambly in March

in the national 15k, 4th in 36:34.

Derek Mahaffey finished 5th overall and took the M45 title in 35:54. San Diego's Bill Stock won the M50 in 38:11. Jim O'Neil copped M55 honors in 40:04. John Lafferty, Jerry Satterlee and Norm Bright won their respective M60, 65 and 70 divisions.

Vicki Bigelow was 2nd woman across the line, taking the W45 title in 42:19, giving Dorothy Stock (42:48) one of her infrequent defeats.

Joan Ulyot was 4th woman -- 2nd W40--in 43:12, with Judy Groombridge 3rd W40 in 43:20.

Irvine ran 43:56 to top Anne Johnson (44:19) and Ruth Anderson (45:49) in the very competitive women's 50-54 division. Mary Storey notched 48:06 to win the W55 crown by 14 minutes. Josephine Hess was the W60 victor.

In team competition, the Snohomish Track Club of Seattle won the M40-49 title. The San Diego Track Club took M50-59 and M60+ honors. The women's 40+ crown went to the West Valley Track Club of Northern California.

A couple of snags: the Athletics Congress medals and patches didn't arrive, and the unofficial results, after the 37-minute mark, may be about 12 seconds slow. More details next month.

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The BROOKS Canada VS U.S.A.
Masters Cross Country Match
Ann Arbor, Michigan, U.S.A.
November 16th 1980

This event, the fourth in an annual series had been previously won twice by Canada and once by U.S.A.: Neither team, however, had previously won away from home. A feature of this event is that the scoring is of a more considerable depth than most Cross Country events and all age classes are concerned in the results:

A team of fifty Canadians made the journey, amongst them Derek Fernee, unbeaten by any North American Master and third in the recent Masters' World Marathon Championships in Scotland (2:19:41) as well as Bob Moore, former Canadian international now running his first Masters' race and last years winner of this race, Bob Daniell.

The U.S. squad of 92 was led by three time Springbank winner Brian Harris, now turned 45 and a strong Motor City Striders trio, Larry Heath (2nd in 1979), Don Sleeman and Dave Peelle.

The site of the race was the University of Michigan Golf course. It was a manicured surface, excellent footing, no mud or water, no big hills and to cap it off, the weather was sunny with a cool dry 4°C. It looked enticingly easy and a fast time was expected but the rolling nature of the course on which runners were almost never on the flat proved more difficult than it seemed. In fact, only two runners were to run a faster time than they had two weeks before at the Canadian Championships at Sunnybrook Park in Toronto.

From the gun, Fernee and Moore went to the front setting a pace that no one else could match for very long and they had soon broken clear of the almost 150 runners. Bob Daniell too, was faring well. Last year's champion had to contend with the aforementioned Motor City group in his bid for honours.

In class 45-49 Brian Harris quickly set seal on the premier spot but a surprisingly strong Jerry Gonser (Canada), a runner who has not always received due regard, was heading a strong Canadian contingent in an effort to score highly in this age class.

In the 50-54 class, despite being without Arthur Taylor, Canada looked all powerful. Cliff Hall was on his own but Danny Daniels, Ralph Lang and Jim Morrow also occupied the leading places. Off-setting the fact that Canada would take a penalty in the 70+ group for being without any competitors, Bill Cameron went into a big lead in his new 55-59 class.

It was, however, in the 60-64 class that Canada were putting the "icing on the cake". Stronger U.S. opposition had been expected from the likes of New Yorker Harold Greenberg. Opposition which did not materialize. Conversely, Canadians Alex Woodhouse, Stan Smith

and Whitey Sheridan were full of running.

The women on both teams were running well with Karen Holappa of Michigan U.S. having the best of it but with Christine Walker, Jenny Stocker and Cheryl Hughes (Canada) not far behind. The cheering section from both teams was spread around the course and because of the looping system, we saw and were encouraged by them often. Despite the fact that the course was marked by a continuous white line and was well marshalled there were a few errors coming off the final loop but except in the case of one U.S. competitor who disqualified himself at the end, these errors were minor.

The last 150 metres of the race was uphill and here Derek Fernee with a magnificent finish went to the front triumphing over Bob Moore who himself a scant 10 yards behind felt most pleased with his first race as a Master. Bob Daniell (Canada) won his duels for third spot although ceding the overall third place to Brian Harris's fine win in the 45-49 class. Larry Heath (U.S.A.) would have been closer to Bob had he not taken the wrong turn near the end. Canadians Cliff Hall, Bill Cameron, Alex Woodhouse, Jenny Stoker and the amazing Judith Kazdan all won their respective classes. Judith although now in the 60+ class is never daunted and won the 50+ race by nearly three minutes. She has won gold medals at each World Championships at this event.

Following the race Dr. Ed Kozloff and his helpers put on a meal for all at the clubhouse and a most friendly gathering took place. Congratulations Ed for a well conducted, friendly and exciting competition. Loud applause (by both sides) greeted the presentation of the challenge cup to the Canadian team.

This type of match might work well between many neighbouring countries around the World.
