NUMBER OF INHABITANTS, BY COUNTIES AND MINOR CIVIL DIVISIONS

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TOTAL POPULATION, INCREASE, AND DISTRIBUTION.

Population of the state.—Illinois was organized as a territory in 1809 and was admitted to the Union as the twenty-first state in 1818. According to the Fourteenth Census, taken as of January 1, 1920, its population is 6,485,280, which represents an increase of 846,689, or 15 per cent, since 1910. During the

same period the population of the United States increased by 14.9 per cent. The following summary shows the population of Illinois from 1810 to 1920, inclusive, together with the number and per cent of increase for each decade, in comparison with the per cent of increase for the United States as a whole:

Counties.—Illinois has 102 counties, of which 46 show increases and 56 decreases as compared with 1910. (See Table 1.) There have been no changes in county boundaries since 1910.

Density of population.—The total land area of the state is 56,043 square miles. The average number of inhabitants to the square mile in 1920 is 115.7 (see Table 1), as against 100.6 in 1910 and 86.1 in 1900.

Minor civil divisions.—The political units into which the counties are divided are collectively termed "minor civil divisions." The counties of Illinois are made up of 1,624 primary divisions, comprising the city of Chicago, 1,434 townships, and 189 election precincts. In 86 counties the townships are the primary divisions, and in the remaining 16 the election precincts are the

primary divisions. The secondary divisions are 1,110 in number, comprising 258 cities, 31 towns, and 821 villages. Each of 13 cities, 1 town, and 2 villages is coextensive with the township or precinct in which located, and each of 46 cities, 2 towns, and 94 villages comprises the whole or parts of 2 or more townships or precincts. (See Table 2.)

Cities.—Illinois has 259 cities, of which Chicago, with a population of 2,701,705, is the largest. (See Tables 3 and 4.)

The summary on the following page shows, for each city, town, or village having 25,000 or more inhabitants in 1920, the population at each census for which figures are available, together with the number and per cent of increase during the preceding decade.

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TOTAL POPULATION, INCREASE, AND DISTRIBUTION.

Population of the state.—Indiana was organized as a territory in 1800 and was admitted to the Union as the nineteenth state in December, 1816. According to the Fourteenth Census, taken as of January 1, 1920, its population is 2,930,390, which represents an increase of 229,514, or 8.5 per cent, over the 1910 figure.

During the same period the population of the United States increased by 14.9 per cent. The following summary shows the population of Indiana from 1800 to 1920, inclusive, together with the number and per cent of increase for each decade, in comparison with the per cent of increase for the United States as a whole:

Counties.—Indiana has 92 counties, of which 28 show increases and 64 decreases as compared with 1910. (See Table 1.)

Density of population.—The total land area of the state is 36,045 square miles. The average number of inhabitants to the square mile in 1920 is 81.3 (see Table 1), as against 74.9 in 1910 and 70.1 in 1900.

Minor civil divisions.—The political units into which the counties are divided are collectively termed "minor civil divisions." The primary divisions of the Indiana counties are the townships, which number 1,017. There are also 490 secondary divisions, com-

prising 98 cities and 392 towns. Each of 14 cities and 24 towns comprises parts of 2 or more townships. (See Table 2.)

Cities.—Indiana has 98 cities, of which Indianapolis, with a population of 314,194, is the largest. (See Tables 3 and 4.)

The summary on the following page shows, for each city having 25,000 or more inhabitants in 1920, the population at each census for which figures are available, together with the number and per cent of increase during the preceding decade.

Urban and rural population.—The Census Bureau defines urban population as that residing in cities and other incorporated places having 2,500 inhabitants or more, and rural population as that residing outside such incorporated places.

The following summary presents, for the last three censuses, figures showing the urban and rural population of the state distributed among places grouped according to specified limits of population. The classification for each census is based upon the population

of the various places as shown by the returns of that census. Consequently the territory comprised within any one class of cities or that designated as urban or as rural does not remain fixed, because any given place may, through the growth or the decline of its population, pass from one class to another at successive censuses. The proportion of the population of Indiana living in places of 2,500 or more increased from 34.3 per cent in 1900 to 42.4 per cent in 1910 and to 50.6 per cent in 1920.

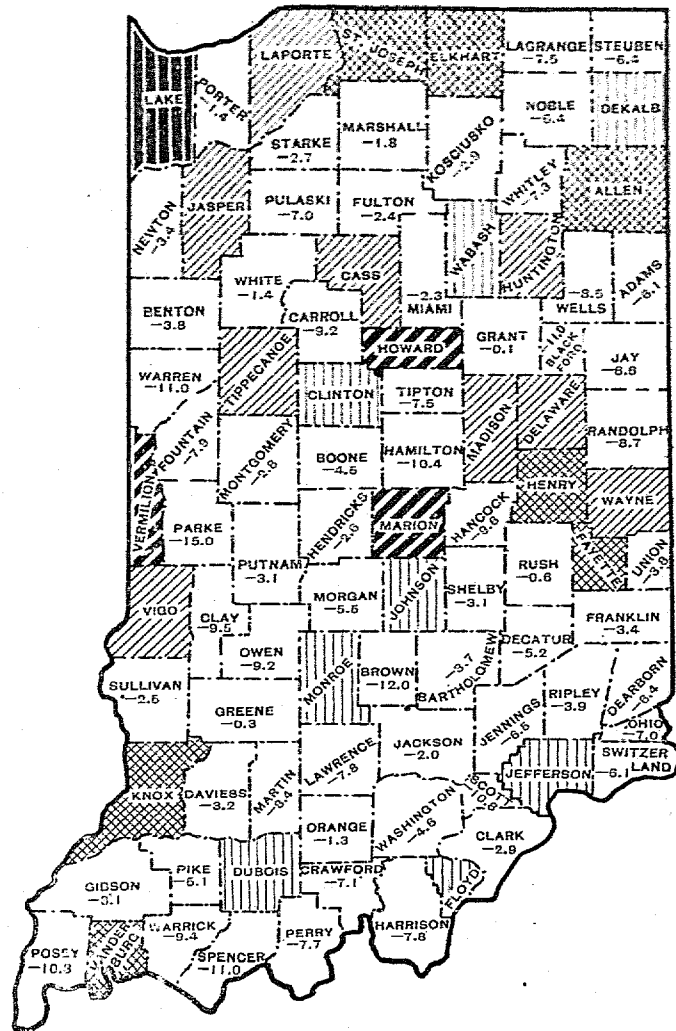

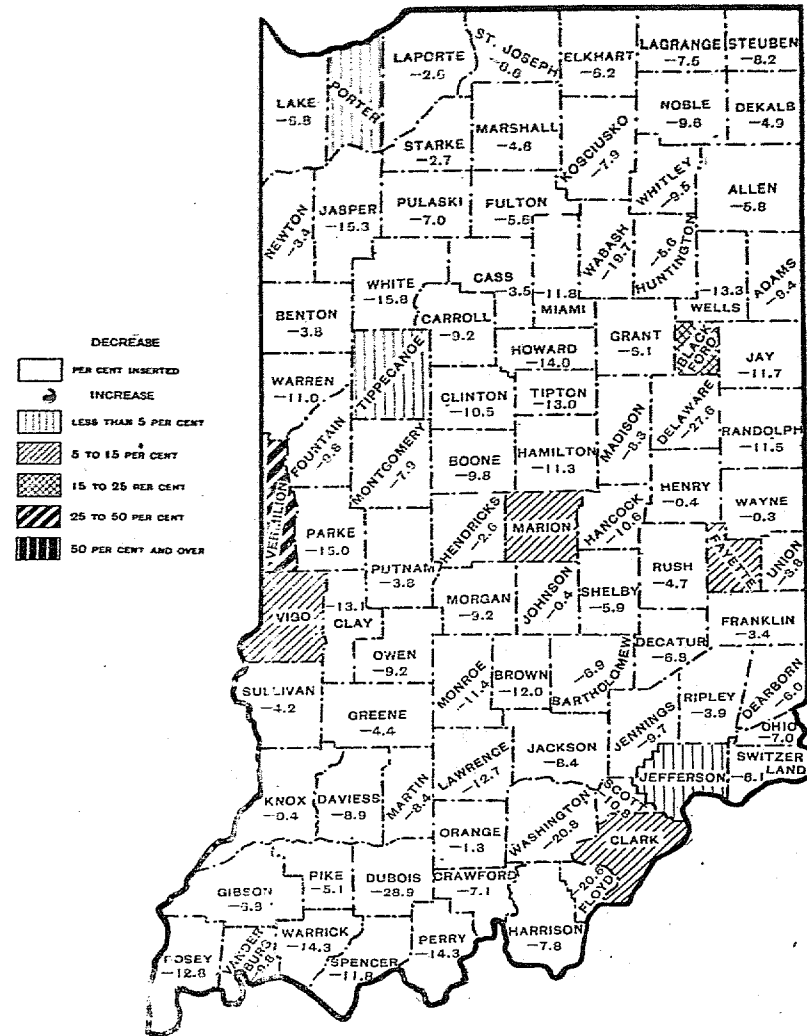
PER CENT OF INCREASE OR DECREASE OF POPULATION OF INDIANA, BY COUNTIES: 1910-1920.

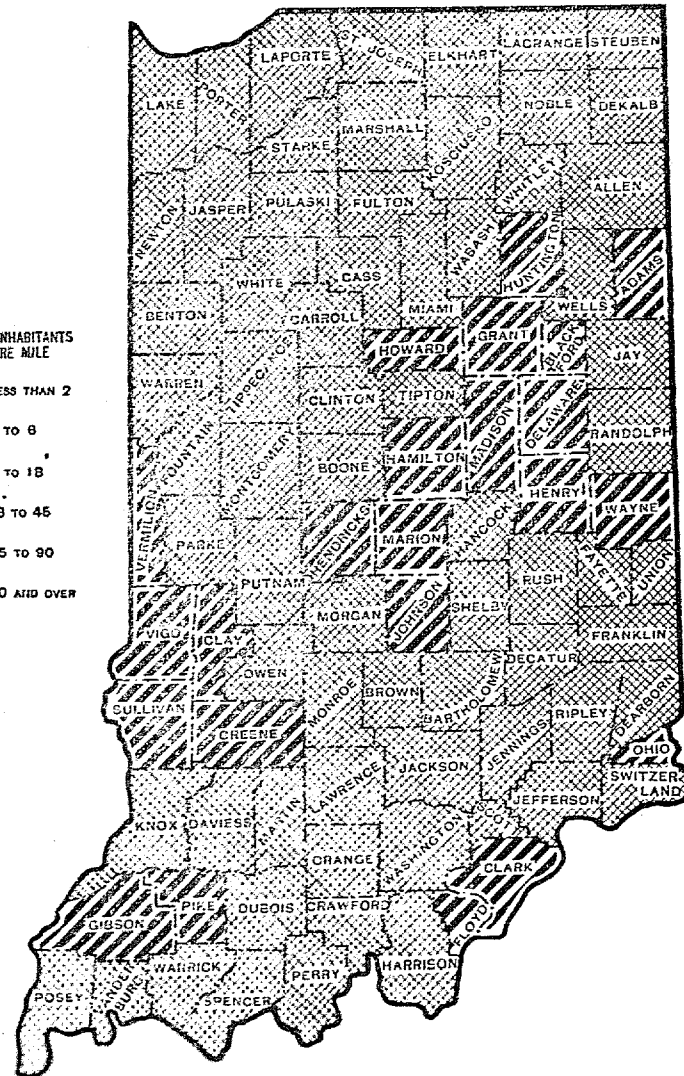
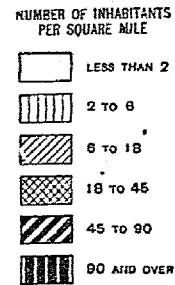
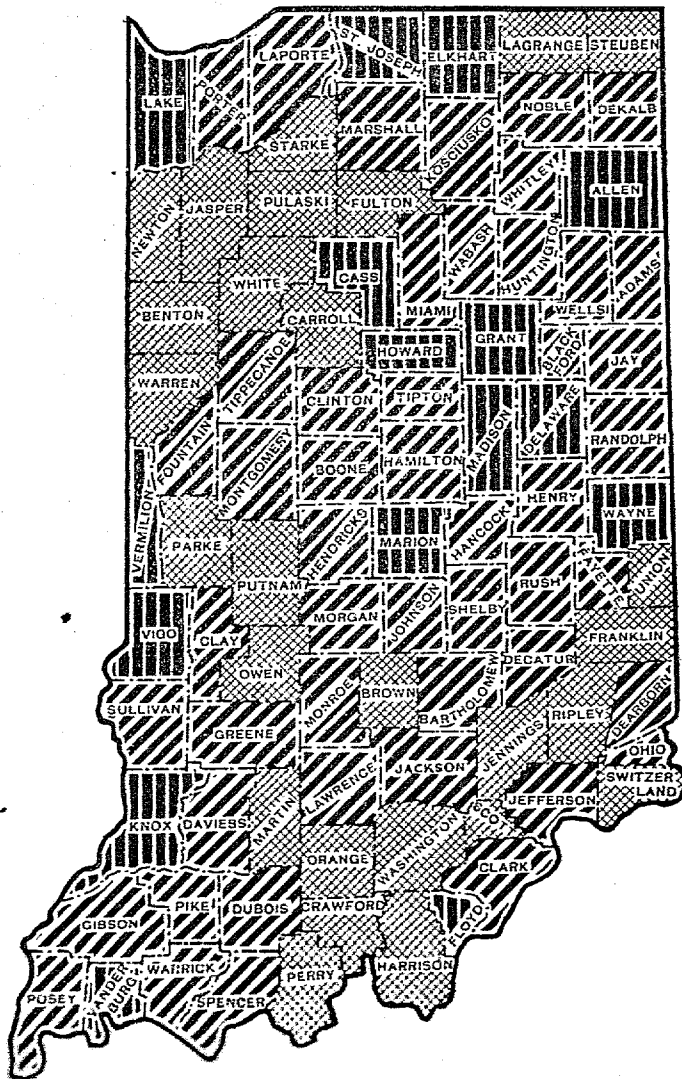


DENSITY OF POPULATION OF INDIANA, BY COUNTIES: 1920.

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TOTAL POPULATION, INCREASE, AND DISTRIBUTION.

Population of the state.—Iowa was organized as a territory in 1838 and was admitted to the Union as the twenty-ninth state in December, 1846. According to the Fourteenth Census, taken as of January 1, 1920, its population is 2,404,021, which represents an increase of 179,250, or 8.1 per cent, since 1910.

During the same period the population of the United States increased by 14.9 per cent. The following summary shows the population of Iowa from 1840 to 1920, inclusive, with the number and per cent of increase for each decade, in comparison with the per cent of increase for the United States as a whole:

Counties.—Iowa has 99 counties, of which 72 show increases and 27 decreases as compared with 1910. (See Table 1.)

Density of population.—The total land area of the state is 55,586 square miles. The average number of inhabitants to the square mile in 1920 is 43.2 (see Table 1), as against 40 in 1910 and 40.2 in 1900.

Minor civil divisions.—The political units into which the counties are divided are collectively termed "minor civil divisions." The primary divisions of the Iowa counties comprise 1,671 townships and 1 independent city, and there are 912 secondary divisions, comprising 104 cities and 808 towns. Each of 42 cities and 14 towns is coextensive with the township

in which located, while each of 13 cities and 102 towns comprises two or more townships or parts of townships. The Sac and Fox Indian Reservation is located within the state. Although this reservation is independent of the county and township organizations, it has been considered, for census purposes, as forming a part of the county in which it is located. (See Table 2.)

Cities.—Iowa has 105 cities, of which Des Moines, with a population of 126,468, is the largest. (See Tables 3 and 4.)

The table on the following page shows, for each city having 20,000 or more inhabitants in 1920, the population at each census for which figures are available, together with the increase during the preceding decade.

Urban and rural population.—The Census Bureau defines urban population as that residing in cities and other incorporated places having 2,500 inhabitants or more, and rural population as that residing outside such incorporated places.

The following summary presents, for the last three censuses, figures showing the urban and rural population of the state distributed among places grouped according to specified limits of population. The classification for each census is based upon the population

of the various places as shown by the returns of that census. Consequently the territory comprised within any one class of cities or that designated as urban or as rural does not remain fixed, because any given place may, through the growth or the decline of its population, pass from one class to another at successive censuses. The proportion of the population of Iowa living in places of 2,500 or more increased from 25.6 per cent in 1900 to 30.6 per cent in 1910 and to 36.4 per cent in 1920.

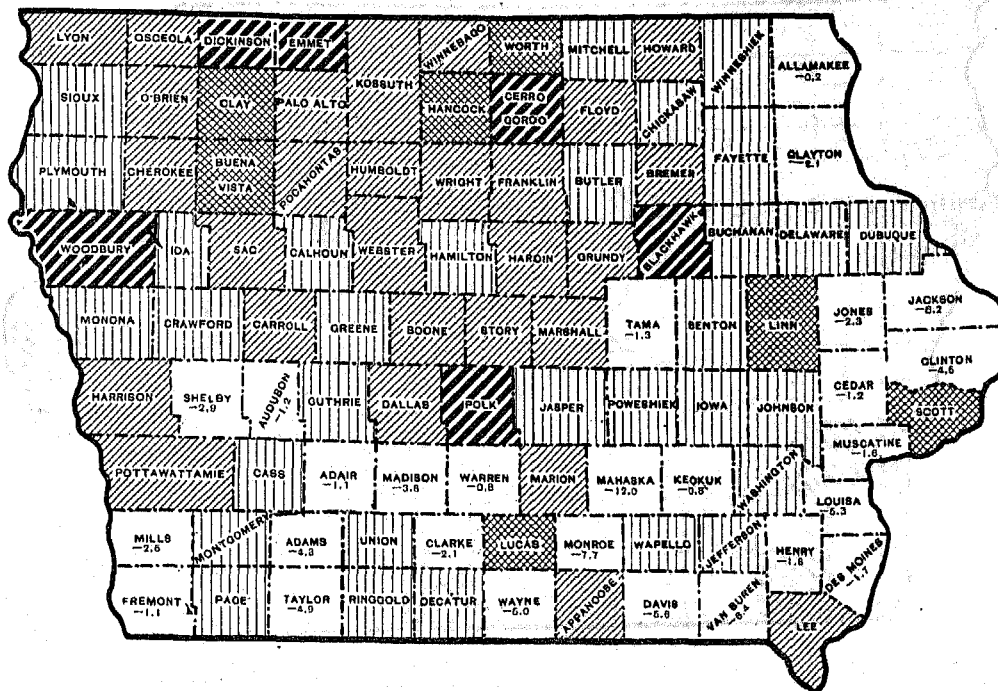

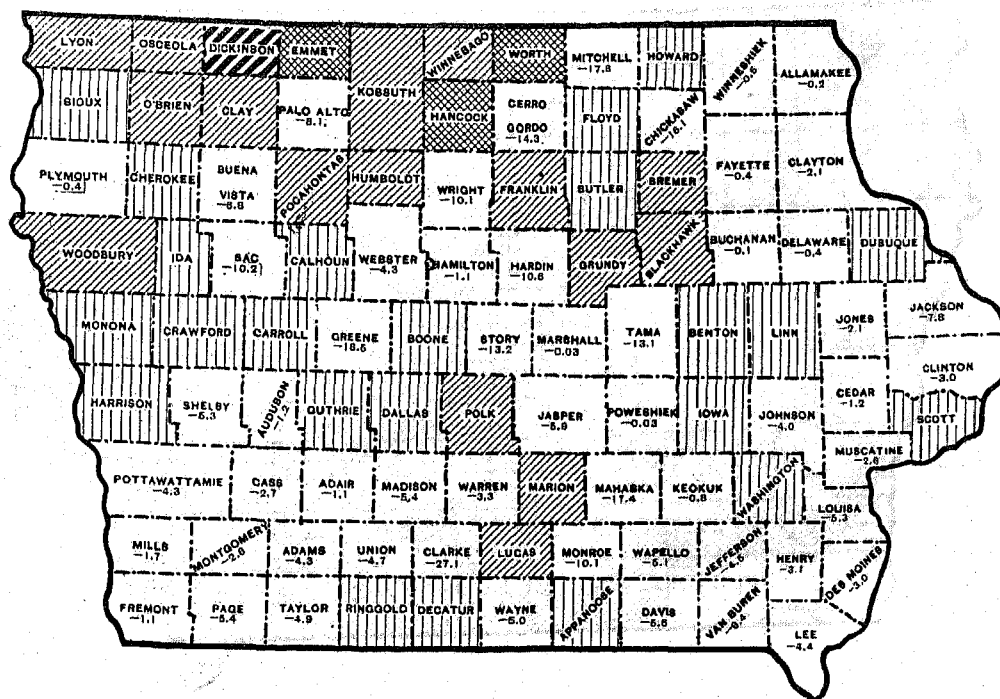
PER CENT OF INCREASE OR DECREASE OF POPULATION OF IOWA, BY COUNTIES: 1910-1920.

TOTAL POPULATION.



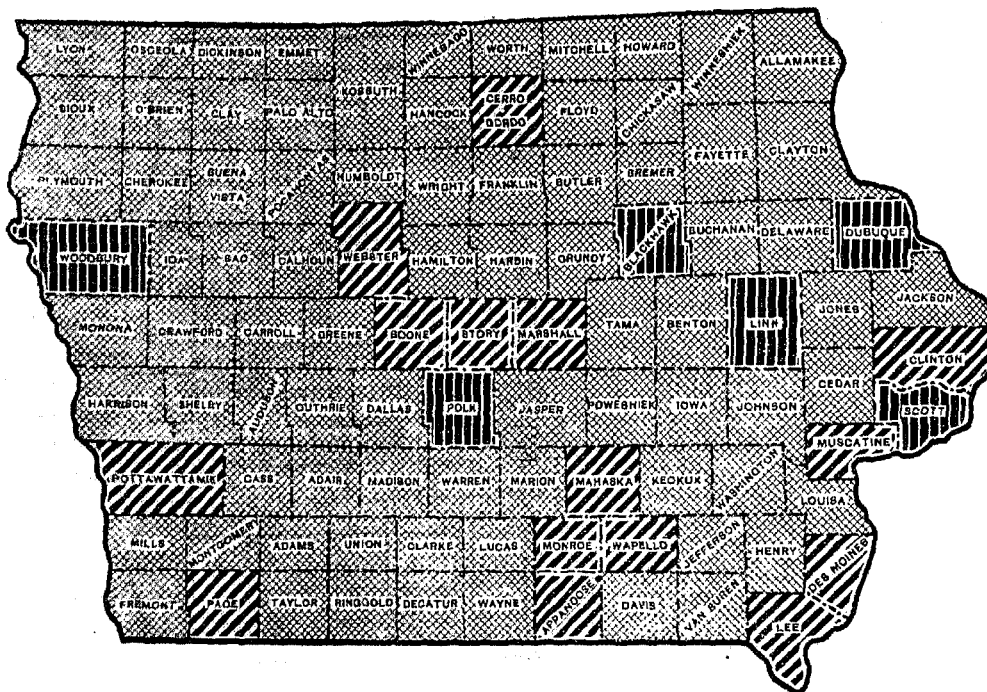
RURAL POPULATION.



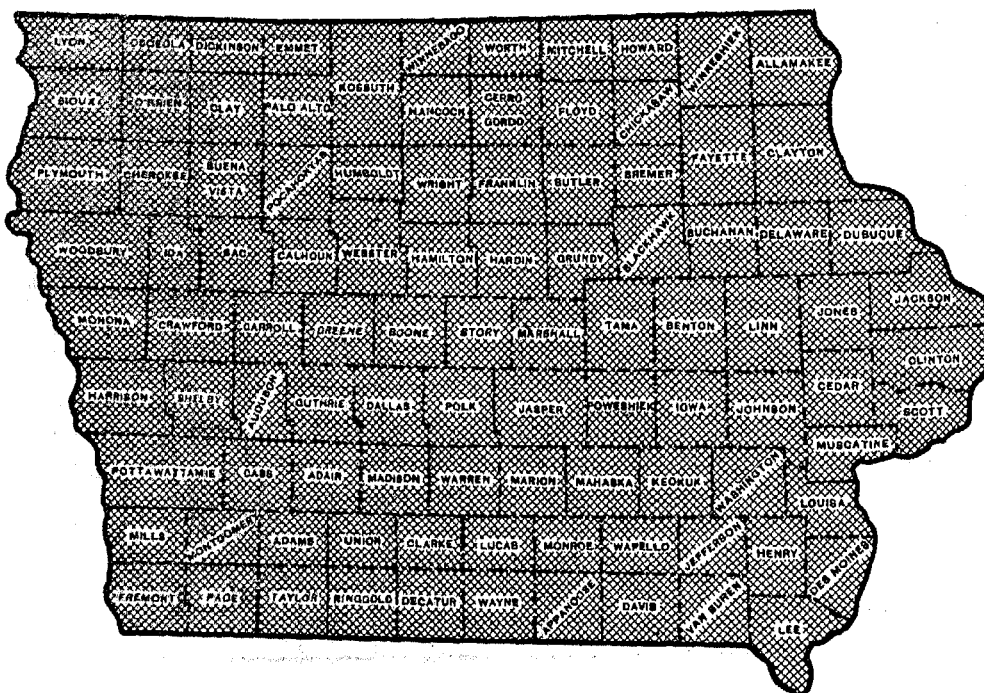
DENSITY OF POPULATION OF IOWA, [BY COUNTIES: 1920.

Rural population is defined as that residing outside of incorporated places having 2,500 inhabitants or more.

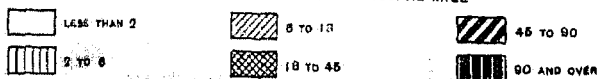

Population of the state.—The area now comprising Kansas and a part of Colorado was organized as the Territory of Kansas in 1854, and in January, 1861, that portion of the territory lying within the present boundaries of Kansas was admitted to the Union as the thirty-fourth state. According to the Fourteenth Census, taken as of January 1, 1920, its population is 1,769,257, which represents an increase of 78,308, or

4.6 per cent, since 1910. During the same period the population of the United States increased by 14.9 per cent.

The following summary shows the population of Kansas from 1860 to 1920, inclusive, together with the number and per cent of increase for each decade, in comparison with the per cent of increase for the United States as a whole:

Counties.—Kansas has 105 counties, of which 48 show increases and 57 decreases as compared with 1910. (See Table 1.) There have been no changes in the county boundaries since 1910.

Density of population.—The total land area of the state is 81,774 square miles. The average number of inhabitants to the square mile in 1920 is 21.6 (see Table 1), as against 20.7 in 1910 and 18 in 1900.

Minor civil divisions.—The political units into which the counties are divided are collectively termed "minor civil divisions." The counties of Kansas are made up of 1,655 primary divisions, comprising 1,533 townships and 122 independent cities. The remaining

cities, 403 in number, constitute the secondary divisions; each of 19 cities is located in 2 or more townships, and each of the remaining 384 cities forms a part of the township in which located. (See Table 2.)

Cities.—Kansas has 525 cities, of which Kansas City, with a population of 101,177, is the largest, and Wichita, with 72,217, is second in size. (See Tables 3 and 4.)

The summary on the following page shows, for each city having 15,000 or more inhabitants in 1920, the population at each census for which figures are available, together with the number and per cent of increase during the preceding decade.

Urban and rural population.—The Census Bureau defines urban population as that residing in cities and other incorporated places having 2,500 inhabitants or more, and rural population as that residing outside such incorporated places.

The following summary presents, for the last three censuses, figures showing the urban and rural population of the state distributed among places grouped according to specified limits of population. The classification for each census is based upon the popula-

tion of the various places as shown by the returns of that census. Consequently the territory comprised within any one class of cities or that designated as urban or as rural does not remain fixed, because any given place may, through the growth or the decline of its population, pass from one class to another at successive censuses. The proportion of the population of Kansas living in places of 2,500 or more increased from 22.5 per cent in 1900 to 29.2 per cent in 1910 and to 34.9 per cent in 1920.

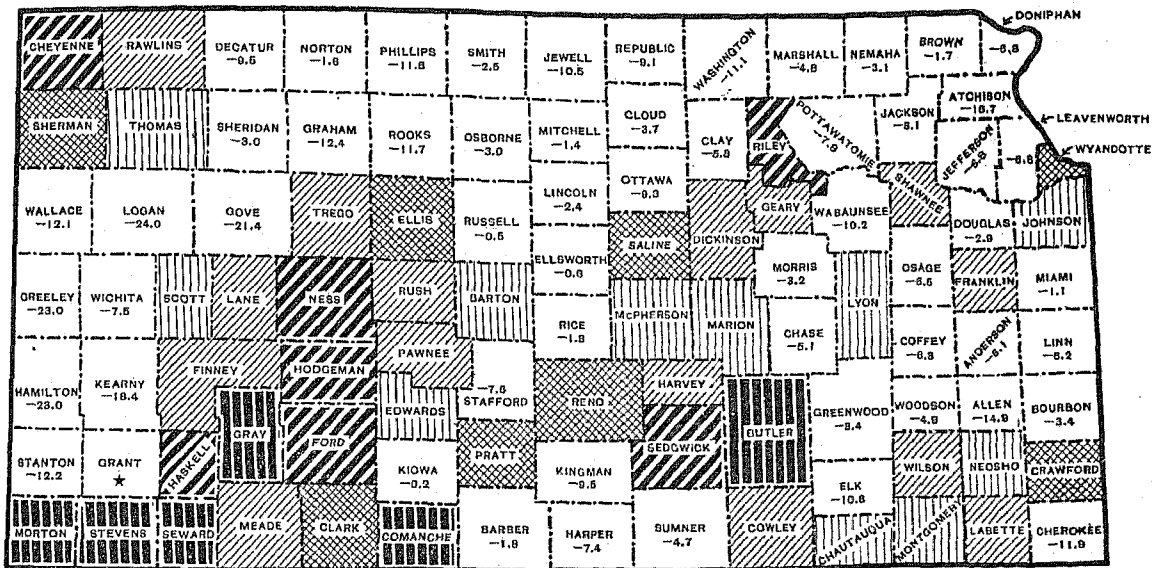

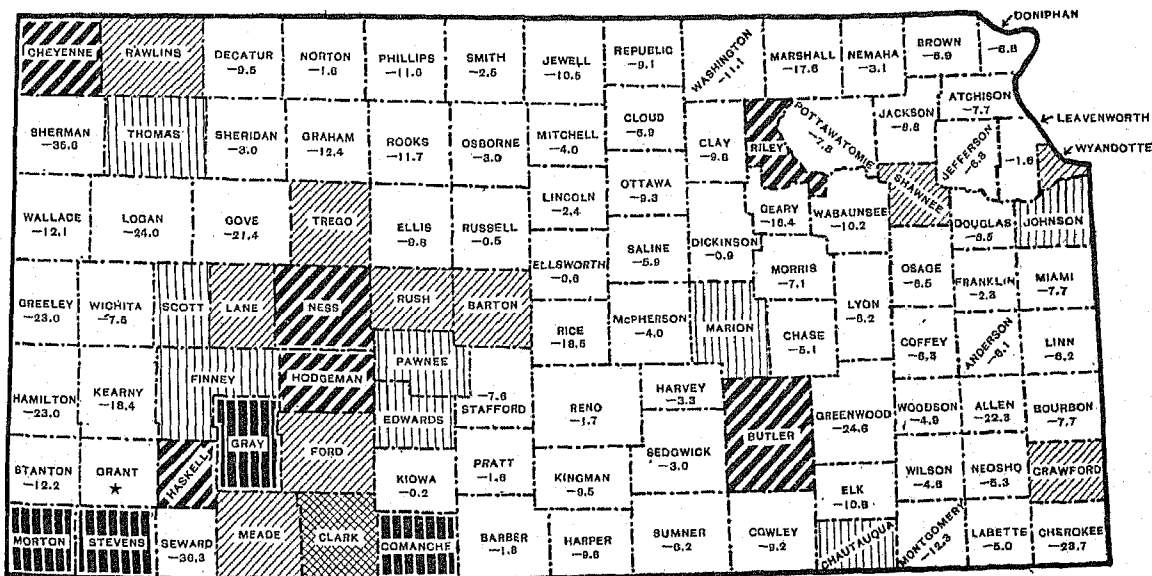
PER CENT OF INCREASE OR DECREASE OF POPULATION OF KANSAS, BY COUNTIES: 1910-1920.

RURAL POPULATION.

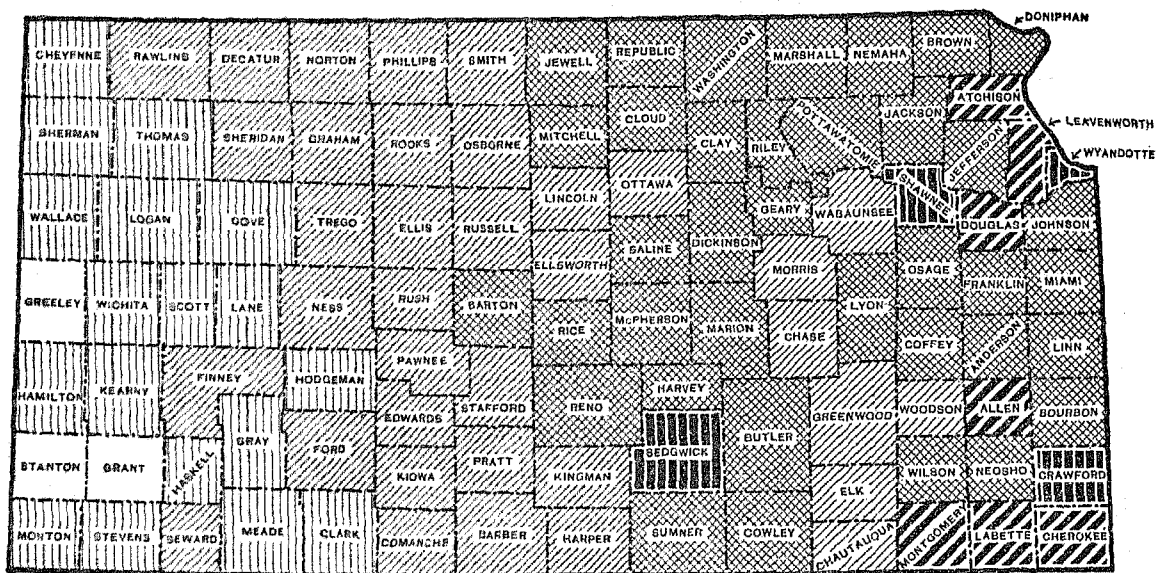

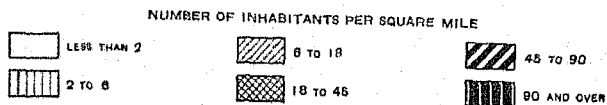
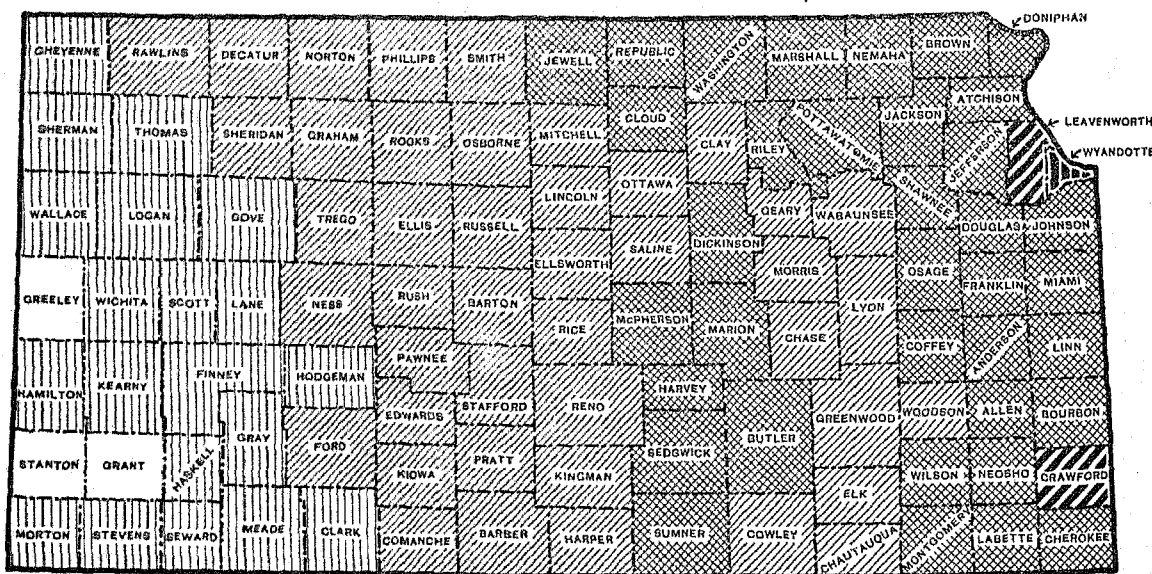
DENSITY OF POPULATION OF KANSAS, BY COUNTIES: 1920.

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TOTAL POPULATION, INCREASE, AND DISTRIBUTION.

Population of the state.—Kentucky, originally a part of Virginia, was admitted to the Union as the fifteenth state in 1792. According to the Fourteenth Census, taken as of January 1, 1920, its population is 2,416,630, which represents an increase of 126,725, or 5.5 per cent, over the 1910 figure. During the same

period the population of the United States increased by 14.9 per cent. The following summary shows the population of Kentucky from 1790 to 1920, inclusive, together with the number and per cent of increase in each decade, in comparison with the per cent of increase for the United States as a whole:

Counties.—Kentucky has 120 counties, of which 64 show decreases as compared with 1910. (See Table 1.)

A new county, McCreary, was organized between 1910 and 1920 from parts of three others, Pulaski, Wayne, and Whitley. It has been necessary, therefore, in preparing the maps on page 3, showing rates of increase or decrease in total and rural population of counties during the past decade, to combine the four counties named.

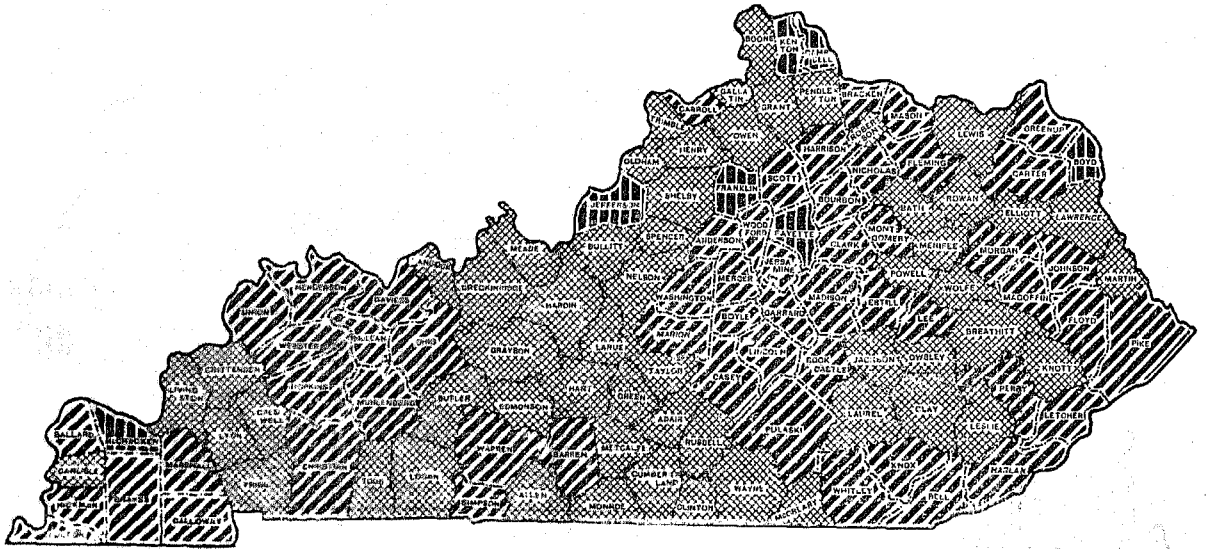
Density of population.—The total land area of the state is 40,181 square miles. The average number of inhabitants to the square mile in 1920 is 60.1 (see Table 1), as against 57 in 1910 and 53.4 in 1900.

Minor civil divisions.—The political units into which the counties are divided are collectively termed "minor civil divisions." The primary divisions of the Kentucky counties are the magisterial districts, which number 755. There are also 391 secondary

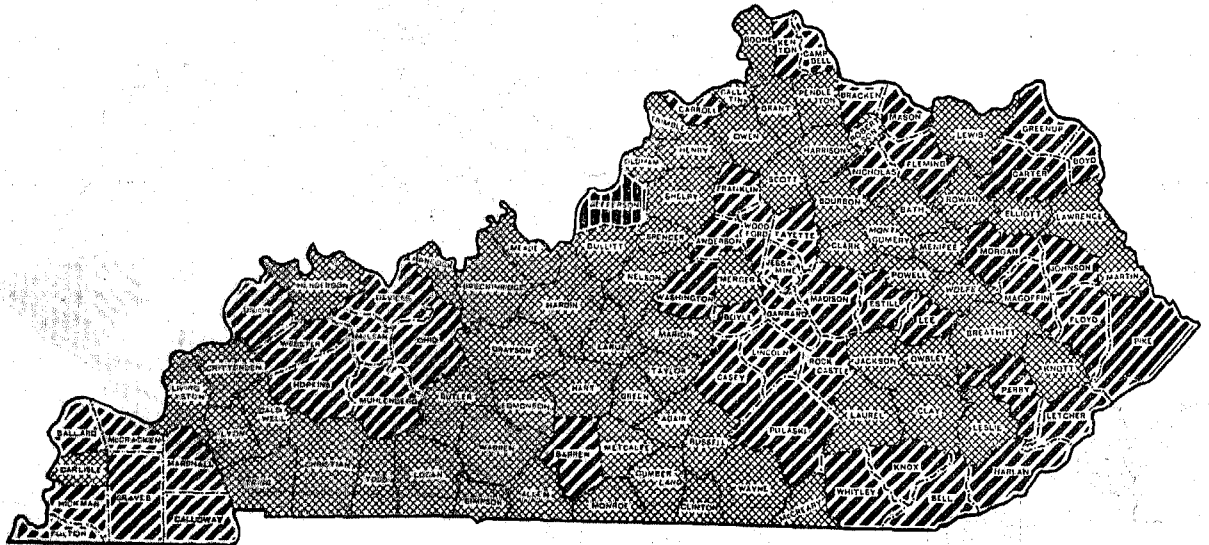
DENSITY OF POPULATION OF KENTUCKY, BY COUNTIES: 1920.

Rural population is defined as that residing outside of incorporated places having 2,500 inhabitants or more.

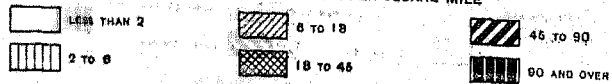
TOTAL POPULATION.

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TOTAL POPULATION, INCREASE, AND DISTRIBUTION.

Population of the state.—The greater part of the area now constituting Louisiana—that part lying west of the Mississippi River—was organized in 1804 as the territory of Orleans, and in April, 1812, it was admitted to the Union as the eighteenth state, under the name of Louisiana. At that time the Baton Rouge district was not included in the new state, but it was added very shortly thereafter, thus giving Louisiana its present extent. According to the Fourteenth Census, taken

as of January 1, 1920, the population of the state is 1,798,509, which represents an increase of 142,121, or 8.6 per cent, since 1910. During the same period the population of the United States increased by 14.9 per cent.

The following summary shows the population of Louisiana from 1810 to 1920, inclusive, together with the number and per cent of increase for each decade, in comparison with the per cent of increase for the United States as a whole:

Parishes.—Louisiana has 64 parishes, 4 of which—Allen, Beauregard, Evangeline, and Jefferson Davis—have been organized from parts of 2 others since 1910. Of the 58 parishes whose boundaries have remained unchanged, 31 show increases and 27 decreases as compared with 1910. (See Table 1.) Because of the territorial changes resulting from the organization of the 4 parishes named, it has been necessary, in preparing the

maps on page 3, showing rates of increase or decrease in total and rural population, to combine Allen, Beauregard, Calcasieu, and Jefferson Davis Parishes, and to combine Evangeline and St. Landry Parishes.

Density of population.—The total land area of the state is 45,409 square miles. The average number of inhabitants to the square mile in 1920 is 39.6 (see Table 1), as against 36.5 in 1910 and 30.4 in 1900.

POPULATION—LOUISIANA.

Minor civil divisions.—The political units into which the parishes of Louisiana (or counties in other states) are divided are collectively termed "minor civil divisions." The Louisiana parishes are made up of 508 primary divisions, comprising 507 police jury wards and the city of New Orleans, which is coextensive with Orleans Parish. The secondary divisions are 202 in number, comprising 16 cities, 114 towns, and 72 villages. One town—Donaldsonville, in Ascension Parish—is coextensive with the police jury ward in which

it is located; and each of four cities, four towns, and four villages comprises parts of two or more wards. (See Table 2.)

Cities.—Louisiana has 16 cities, of which New Orleans, with a population of 387,219, is the largest. (See Tables 3 and 4.) The following summary shows, for each city having 10,000 or more inhabitants in 1920, the population at each census for which figures are available, together with the number and per cent of increase during the preceding decade:

Urban and rural population.—The Census Bureau defines urban population as that residing in cities and other incorporated places having 2,500 inhabitants or more, and rural population as that residing outside such incorporated places.

The following summary presents, for the last three censuses, figures showing the urban and rural population of the state distributed among places grouped according to specified limits of population. The classification for each census is based upon the popu-

lation of the various places as shown by the returns of that census. Consequently the territory comprised within any one class of cities or that designated as urban or as rural does not remain fixed, because any given place may, through the growth or the decline of its population, pass from one class to another at successive censuses. The proportion of the population of Louisiana living in places of 2,500 or more increased from 26.5 per cent in 1900 to 30 per cent in 1910 and to 34.9 per cent in 1920.

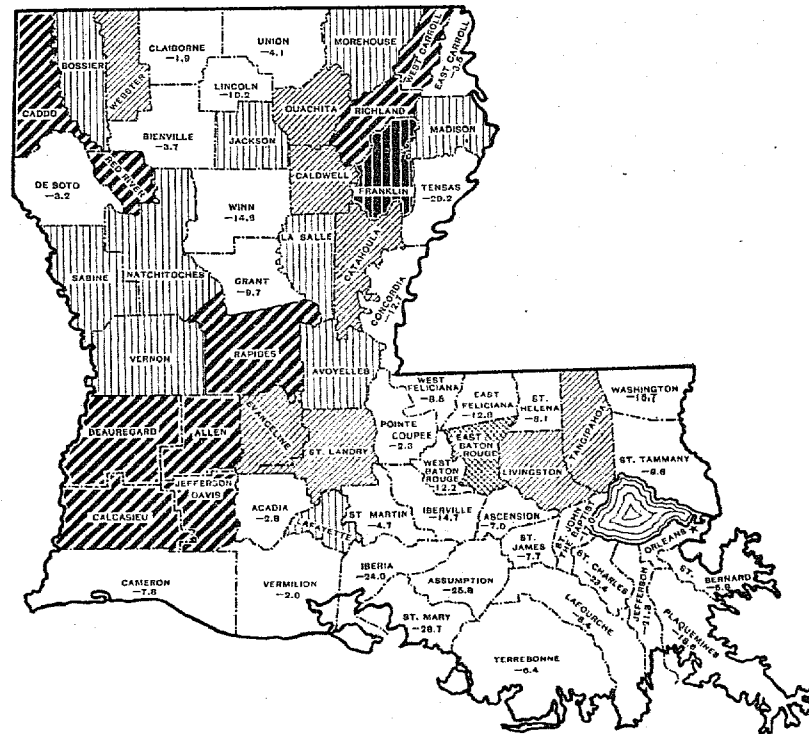
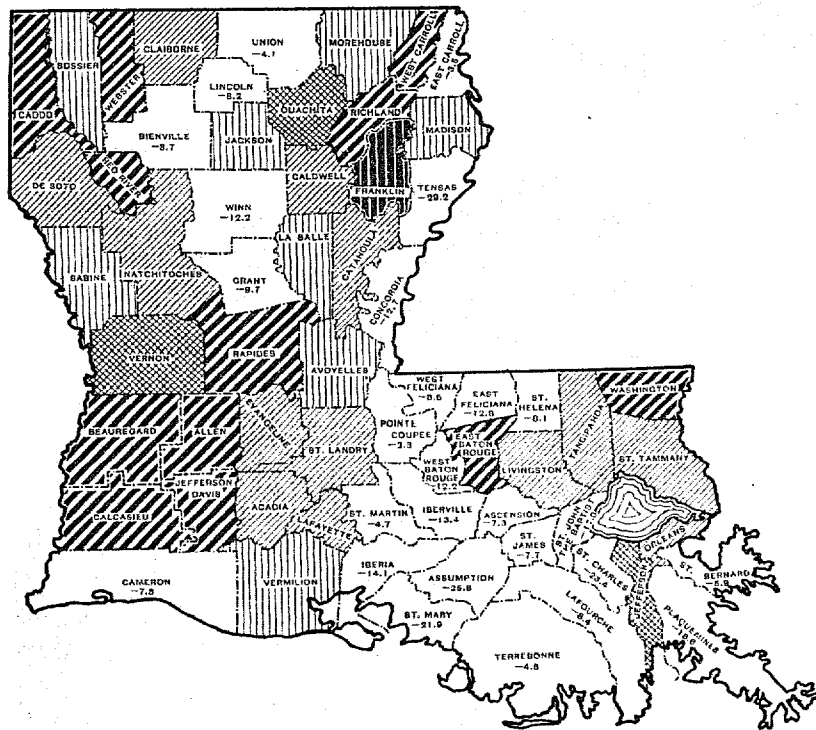

RURAL POPULATION.



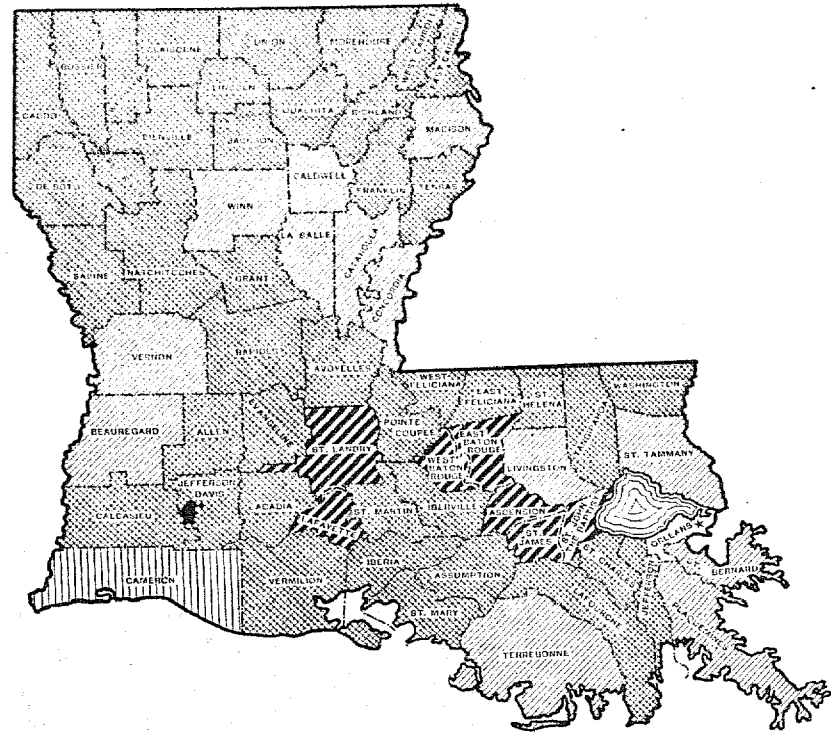
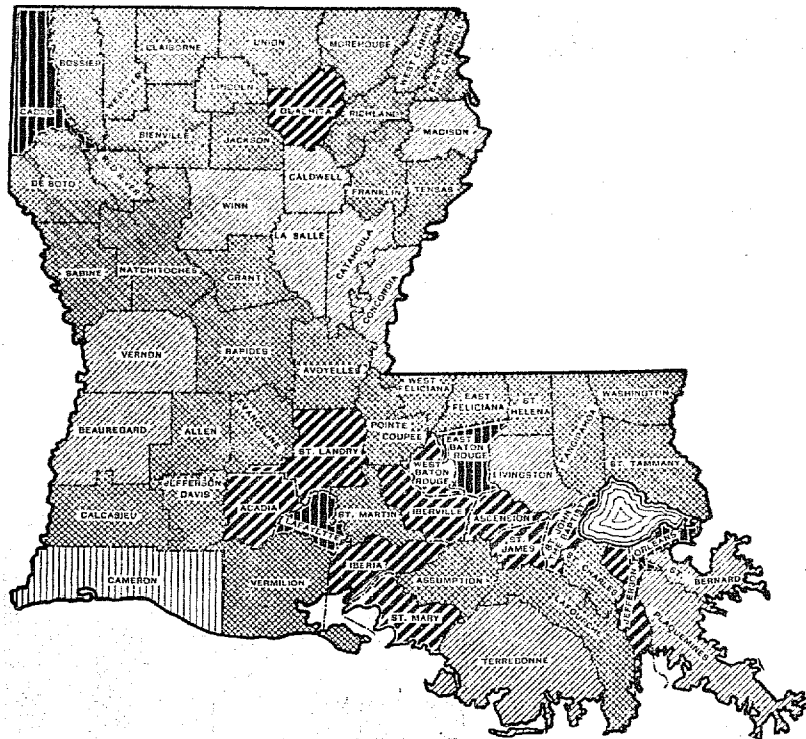

DENSITY OF POPULATION OF LOUISIANA, BY PARISHES: 1920.

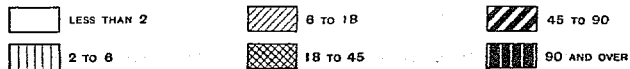

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TOTAL POPULATION, INCREASE, AND DISTRIBUTION.

Population of the state.—Maine, originally a part of Massachusetts, was admitted to the Union as a separate state, the twenty-third, on March 15, 1820. According to the Fourteenth Census, taken as of January 1, 1920, its population is 768,014, which represents an increase of 25,643, or 3.5 per cent, over the 1910 figure. During the same period the

population of the United States increased by 14.9 per cent. The following summary shows the population of Maine from 1790, the year to which the first Federal census related, to 1920, inclusive, together with the number and per cent of increase for each decade, in comparison with the per cent of increase for the United States as a whole:

Counties.—Maine has 16 counties, of which 11 show increases and 5 decreases as compared with 1910. (See Table 1.) Changes in the boundaries of Hancock and Knox Counties were made between the Thirteenth and Fourteenth Census dates.

Density of population.—The total land area of the state is 29,895 square miles. The average number of inhabitants to the square mile in 1920 is 25.7 (see Table 1), as against 24.8 in 1910 and 23.2 in 1900.

Minor civil divisions.—The political units into which the counties are divided are collectively termed "minor

civil divisions." The counties of Maine are made up of 907 primary divisions, comprising 20 cities, 434 towns, 359 townships, 69 plantations, 12 grants, 5 gores, 3 surpluses, 2 tracts, and 3 islands. Of these primary divisions, 182—176 townships, 2 surpluses, 2 grants, 1 gore, and 1 tract—have not been reported as having any inhabitants in the last three censuses. In addition, the minor civil divisions of Maine include 24 villages, or secondary divisions, which form parts of the towns in which they are located. (See Table 2.)

Cities.—Maine has 20 cities, of which Portland, with a population of 69,272, is the largest. Two other cities, Bangor and Lewiston, have over 25,000 inhabitants each, and in 5 cities the population is between 10,000 and 25,000. (See Tables 3 and 4.)

The following summary shows, for each city having 10,000 or more inhabitants in 1920, the population at each census for which figures are available, together with the number and per cent of increase during the preceding decade:

Urban and rural population.—The Census Bureau defines urban population as that residing in cities and other incorporated places having 2,500 inhabitants or more, and rural population as that residing outside such incorporated places.

The following summary presents, for the last three censuses, figures showing the urban and rural population of the state distributed among places grouped according to specified limits of population. The classification for each census is based upon the population of

the various places as shown by the returns of that census. As a result, the figures for each census covered by the table do not relate to exactly the same urban and rural territory, respectively, as those for the other two censuses, since some territory which was rural in a certain census year may have become urban at the next census, or the reverse change may have occurred. The proportion of the population of Maine living in places of 2,500 or more increased from 33.5 per cent in 1900 to 35.3 per cent in 1910 and to 39 per cent in 1920.

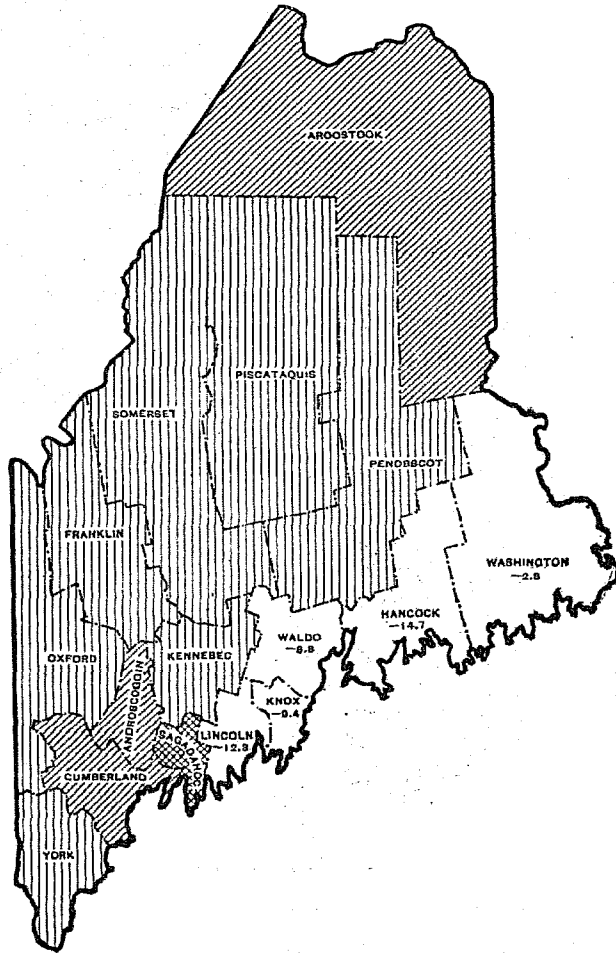

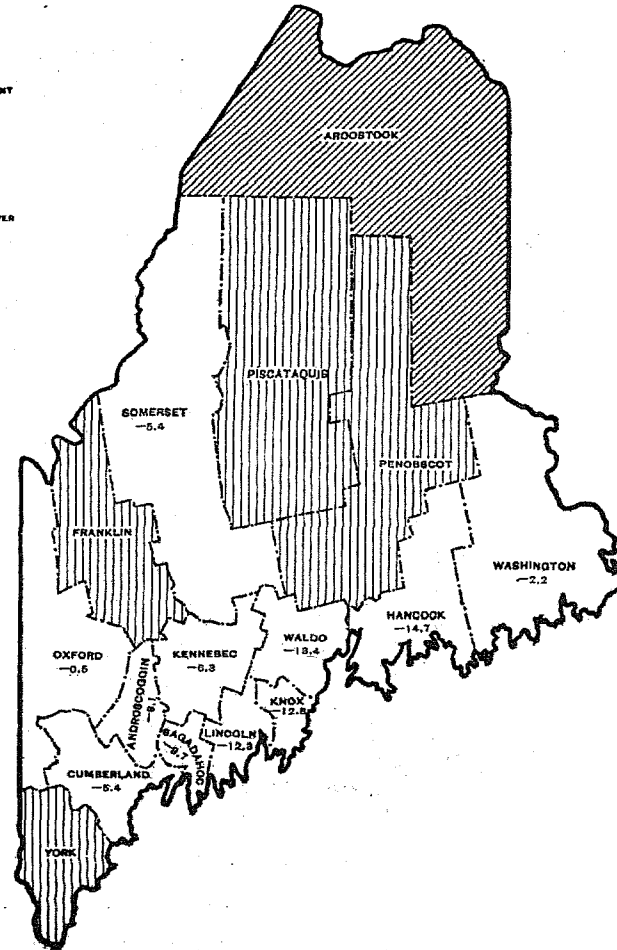
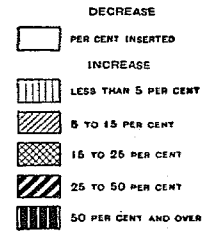
PER CENT OF INCREASE OR DECREASE OF POPULATION OF MAINE, BY COUNTIES: 1910-1920.

RURAL POPULATION.



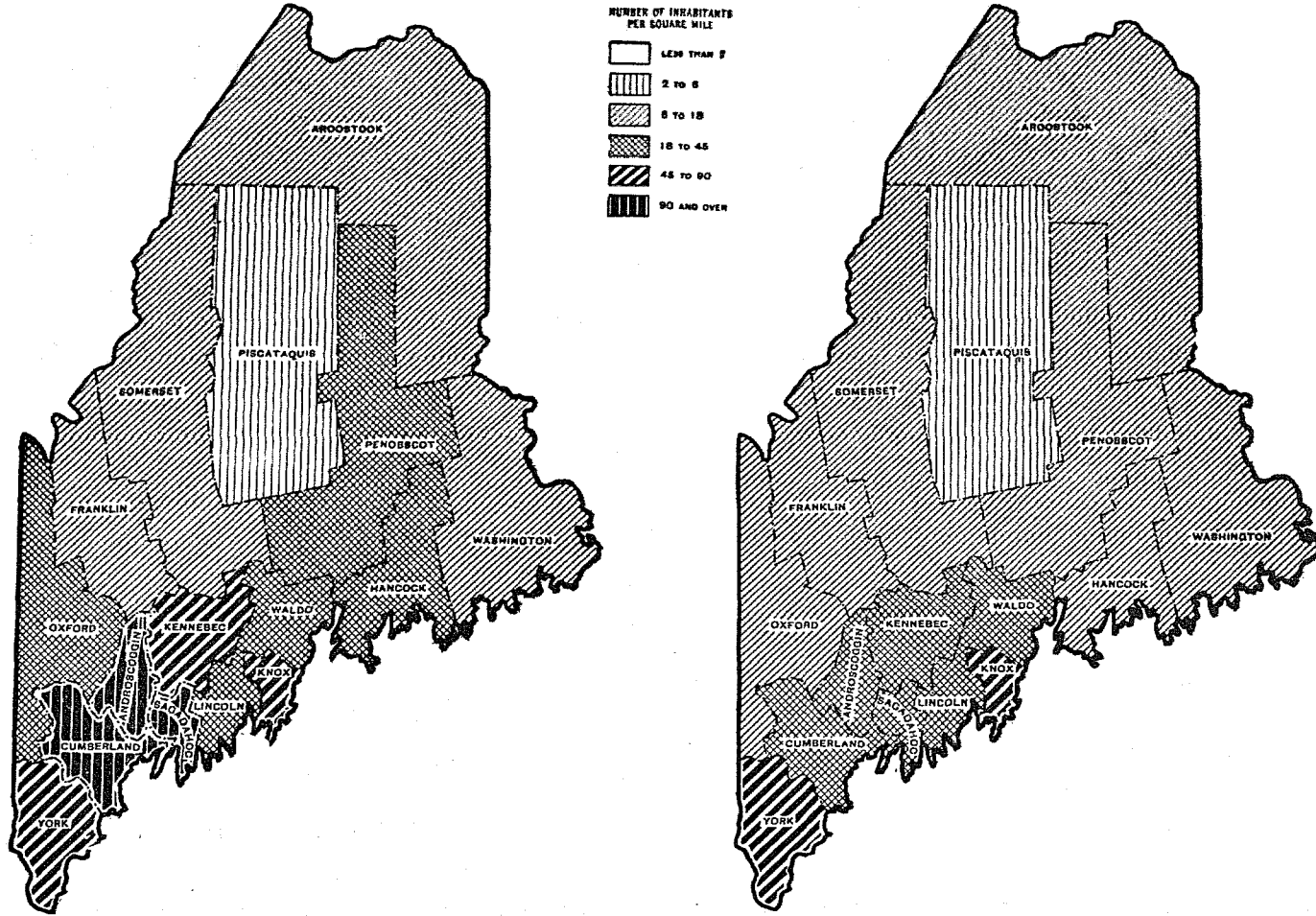

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TOTAL POPULATION, INCREASE, AND DISTRIBUTION.

Population of the state.—Maryland was one of the original thirteen states. According to the Fourteenth Census, taken as of January 1, 1920, its population is 1,449,661, which represents an increase of 154,315, or 11.9 per cent, over the population in 1910. During the same period the population of the United States

increased 14.9 per cent. The following summary shows the population of Maryland from 1790, the first Federal census, to 1920, inclusive, together with the number and per cent of increase in each decade, in comparison with the per cent of increase for the United States as a whole.

Counties.—Maryland has 23 counties, while Baltimore city, which is organized under a separate and independent government with a separate system of courts, occupies the status of a county. Of the 23 counties, 13 show a decrease in population since 1910 (see Table 1). The large decrease in Baltimore County was due to the annexation of part of its territory to Baltimore city in 1919. The decreases in the other counties range from three-tenths of 1 per cent in Frederick County to 11.4 per cent in Kent County. Part of Anne Arundel, as well as part of Baltimore County, was annexed to Baltimore city since 1910, these annexations constituting the only changes in county boundaries during the decade.

Density of population.—The total land area of the state in 1920 is 9,941 square miles, and the average number of persons to the square mile is 145.8 (see Table 1); in 1910 and 1900 the averages were 130.3 and 119.5, respectively.

Minor civil divisions.—The political divisions into which counties are subdivided are collectively termed "minor civil divisions." The 23 counties of Maryland are divided into 290 election districts, for which the population is presented so far as reported separately (see Table 2), while Baltimore city is presented by wards. There are also 121 secondary divisions of the counties, comprising 8 cities, 5 villages, and 108 towns. One city comprises the whole of 1 election district and

parts of 5 others, while 2 cities and 2 towns are co-extensive with the election districts in which located.

Cities.—Maryland has 9 cities—Baltimore, which has the status of a county, and the 8 referred to above as forming secondary divisions of the county. Baltimore, with a population of 733,826, is among the 12 cities of the country having more than a half million inhabitants. The state contains no other large city,

Cumberland, with 29,837 inhabitants, and Hagerstown, with 28,064, being the only other cities with a population of over 25,000. (See Tables 3 and 4.)

The following summary shows the population of the 5 cities in Maryland having 10,000 inhabitants or more in 1920, at each census for which figures are available, together with the increase during each decade:

Urban and rural population.—The Census Bureau defines urban population as that residing in cities and other incorporated places of 2,500 inhabitants or more, and rural population as that residing outside of such incorporated places.

The following summary presents, for the last three censuses, the urban and rural population of the state

distributed among places grouped according to specified limits of population. The classification is based upon the population of each place as it existed at each census. The proportion of the population of Maryland living in places of 2,500 or more increased from 49.8 per cent in 1900 to 50.8 in 1910 and to 60 in 1920, showing a large increase during the last decade.

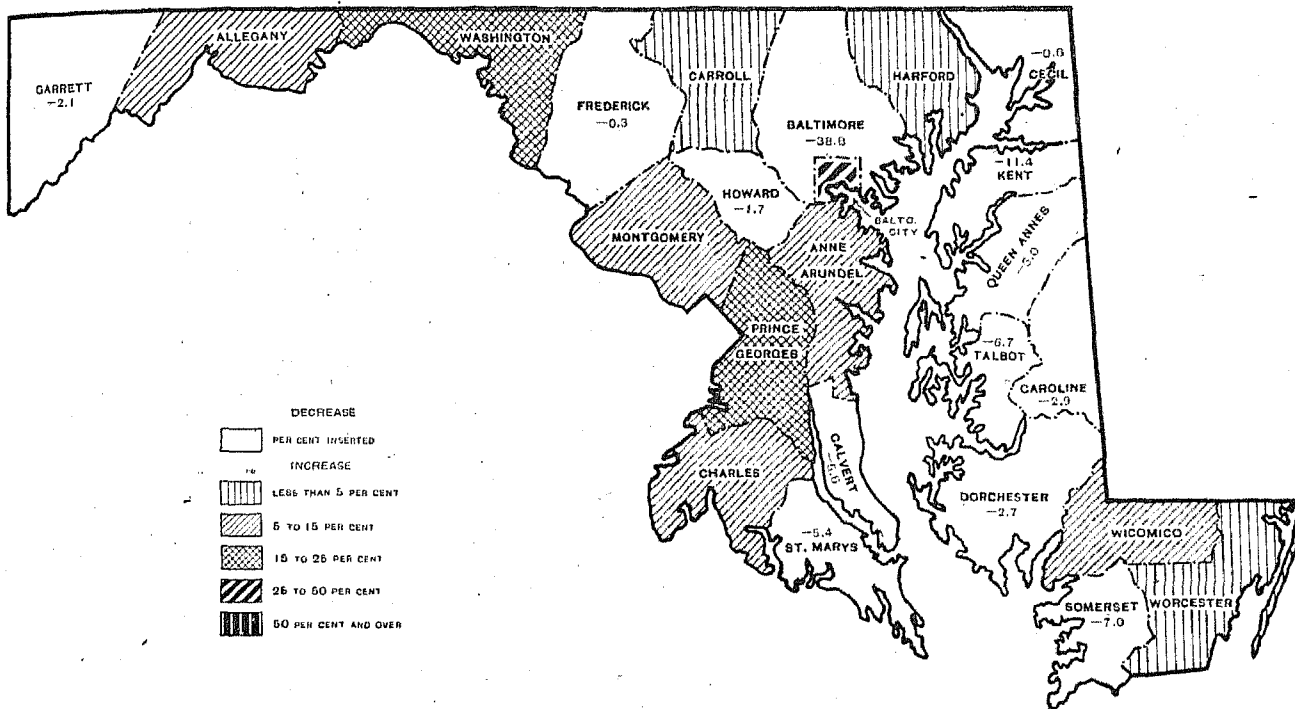

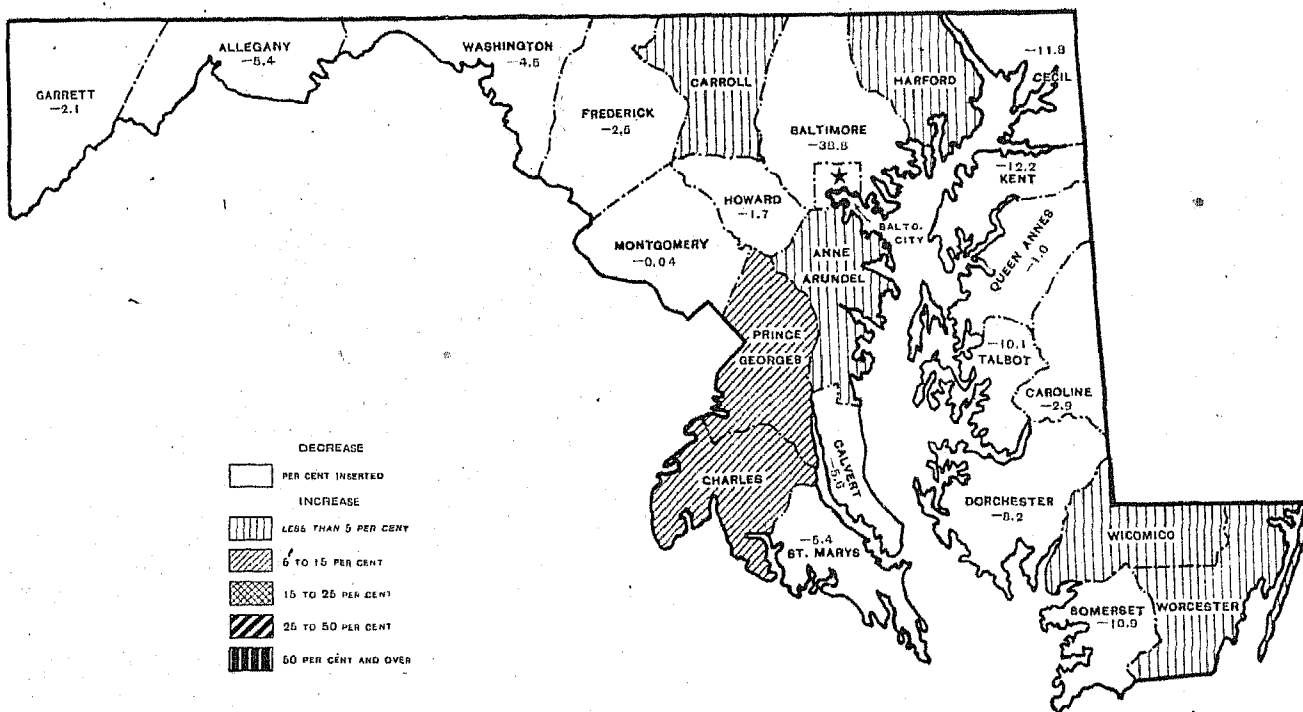
PER CENT OF INCREASE OR DECREASE OF POPULATION OF MARYLAND, BY COUNTIES: 1910-1920.

TOTAL POPULATION.



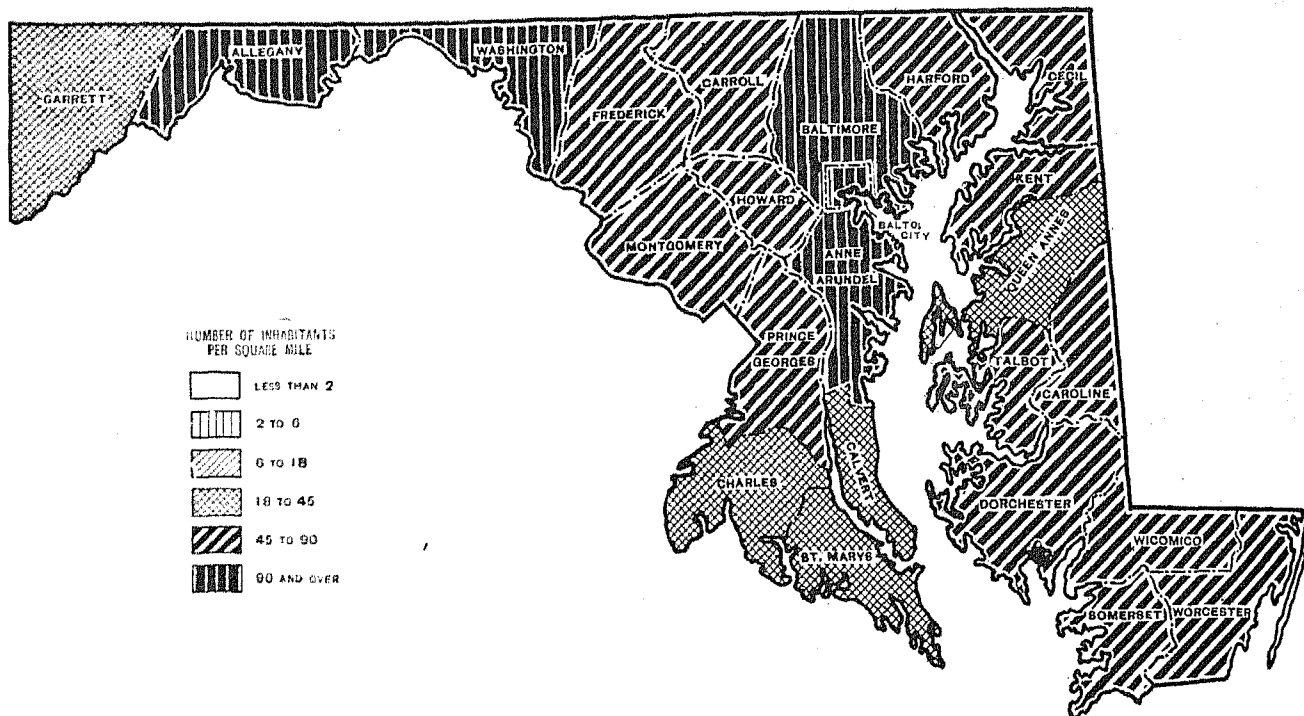
RURAL POPULATION.



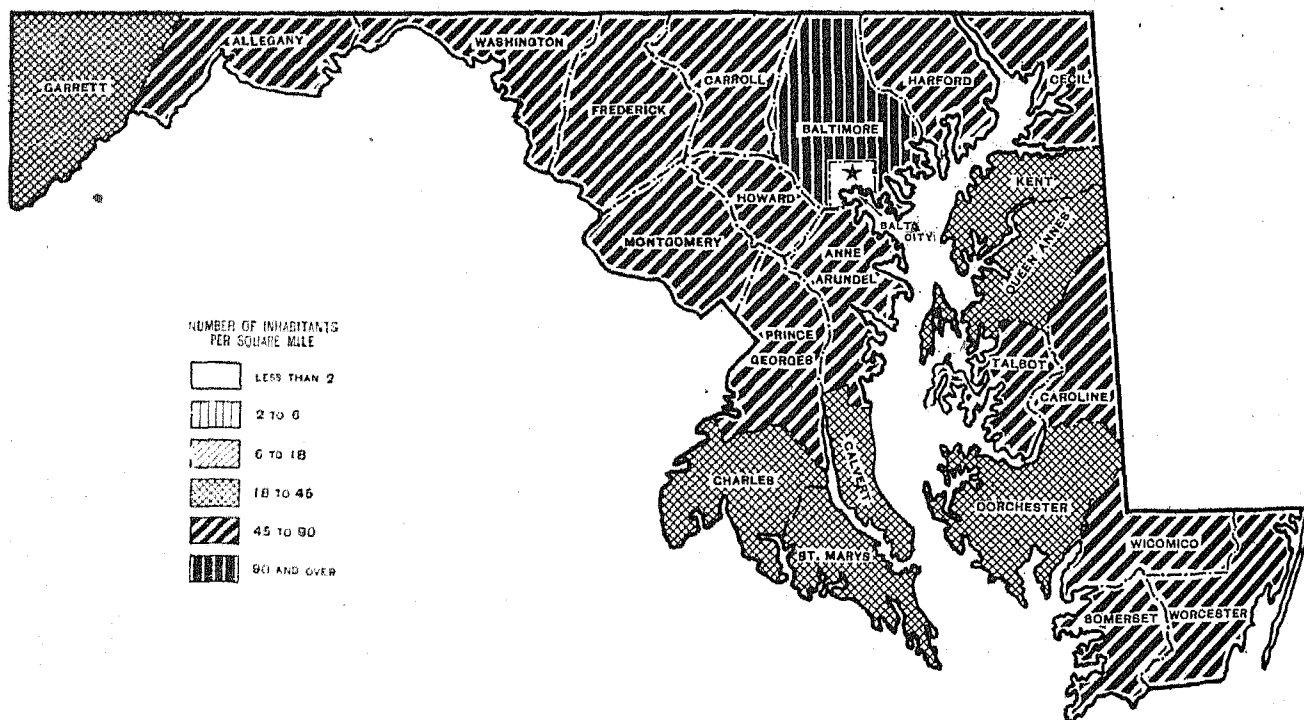
DENSITY OF POPULATION OF MARYLAND, BY COUNTIES: 1920.

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TOTAL POPULATION, INCREASE, AND DISTRIBUTION.

Population of the state.—Massachusetts was one of the original thirteen states. According to the Fourteenth Census, taken as of January 1, 1920, its population is 3,852,356, which represents an increase of 485,940, or 14.4 per cent, over the population in 1910. During the same period the population of the United

States increased 14.9 per cent. The following summary shows the population of Massachusetts from 1790, the first Federal census year, to 1920, inclusive, together with the number and per cent of increase in each decade, in comparison with the per cent of increase for the United States as a whole:

Counties.—Massachusetts has 14 counties, of which 3 (Barnstable, Dukes, and Nantucket) show decreases in population during the last decade. The same counties also showed decreases in the preceding decade, and 2 of them (Barnstable and Nantucket) in the decade from 1890 to 1900. (See Table 1.) There has been only one change in the territorial boundaries of the counties since 1910, Hyde Park town, in Norfolk County, having been annexed to Suffolk County and made a part of Boston city in 1912.

Density of population.—The total land area of the state is 8,039 square miles, and the average number of persons to the square mile in 1920 is 479.2 (see Table 1); in 1910 and 1900 the averages were 418.8 and 349, respectively.

Minor civil divisions.—The political units into which counties are divided are collectively termed "minor civil divisions." In Massachusetts the primary division of the county is the town or city, and in 1920 these number 316 and 38, respectively. (See

Table 2.) Villages are not incorporated as such in this state.

Cities.—Of the 38 cities in Massachusetts, 26 have a population in 1920 of 25,000 or more. Only 1 town (Brookline) has this amount of population. Boston, the capital of the state and the largest city, has a population of 748,060, while Worcester,

Springfield, New Bedford, Fall River, Lowell, and Cambridge, in the order named, have over 100,000 inhabitants each. (See Tables 3 and 4.)

The following summary shows the population of all cities in Massachusetts having 25,000 inhabitants or more in 1920, together with Brookline town, at each census for which figures are available:

Urban and rural population.—The Census Bureau defines urban population as that residing in cities and other incorporated places of 2,500 inhabitants or more. Since it is not the practice in Massachusetts, as in practically all the other states, to have municipal incorporations, such as villages, within the limits of the town, and since no town becomes a city until its population is greatly in excess of 2,500, it has been necessary to include as urban not only the population of cities but that of all towns having over 2,500 inhabitants. The result is that the "urban area" in Massachusetts contains some population which in other states would be classified as "rural," but on account of the density of population of the state as a whole, there is no likelihood that the proportion of urban population is materially overstated.

The rural element, therefore, consists of the population of towns having less than 2,500 inhabitants. The following summary presents, for the last three censuses, the urban and rural population of the state. The classification for each census is based, of course, upon the population of the various places as shown by the returns of that census. As the result, the figures for each census covered by the table do not relate exactly to the same urban and rural territory, respectively, as those for the other two censuses, since, through the growth or decline of its population, some territory which was rural at a certain census may have become urban at the next census, or the reverse of this change may have occurred. The proportion of the population of Massachusetts living in places of 2,500 or more increased from 91.5 per cent in 1900 to 92.8 per cent in 1910 and to 94.8 per cent in 1920.

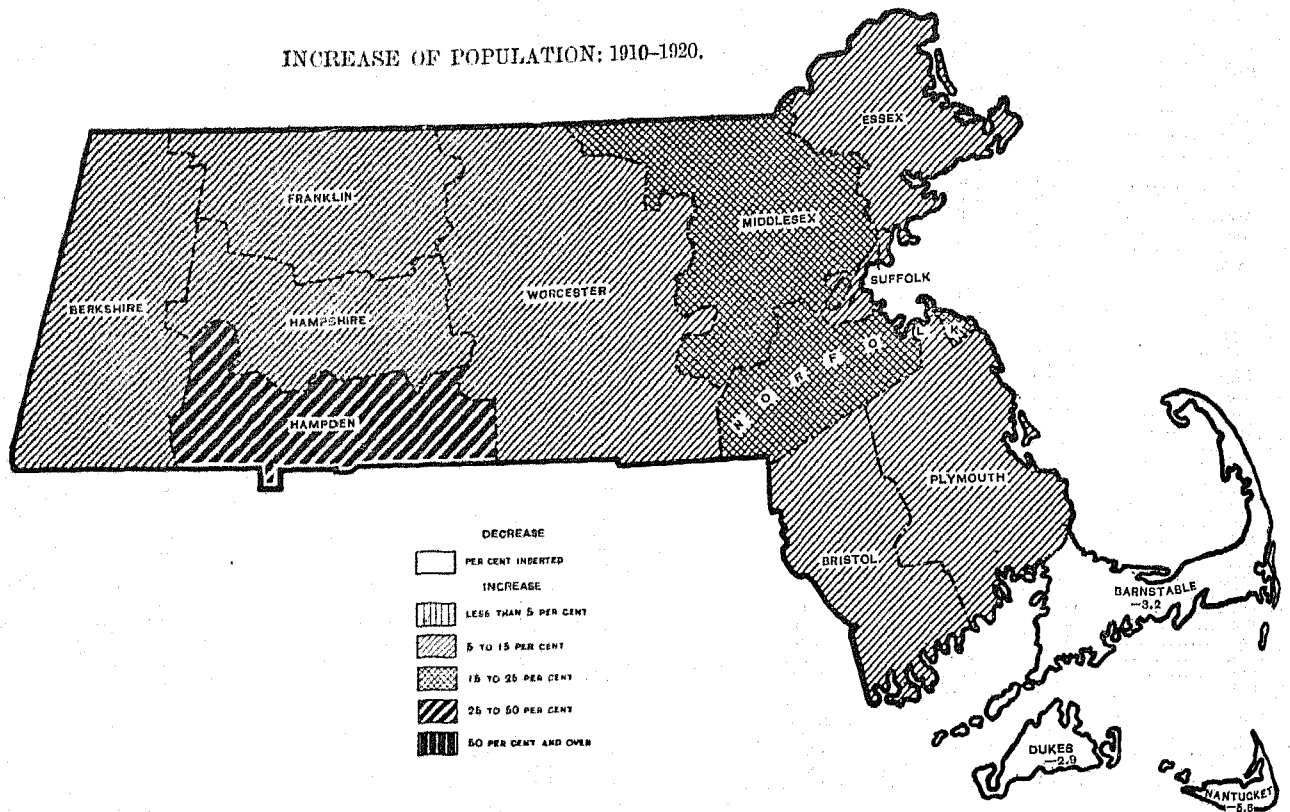

URBAN AND RURAL POPULATION: 1920, 1910, AND 1900.

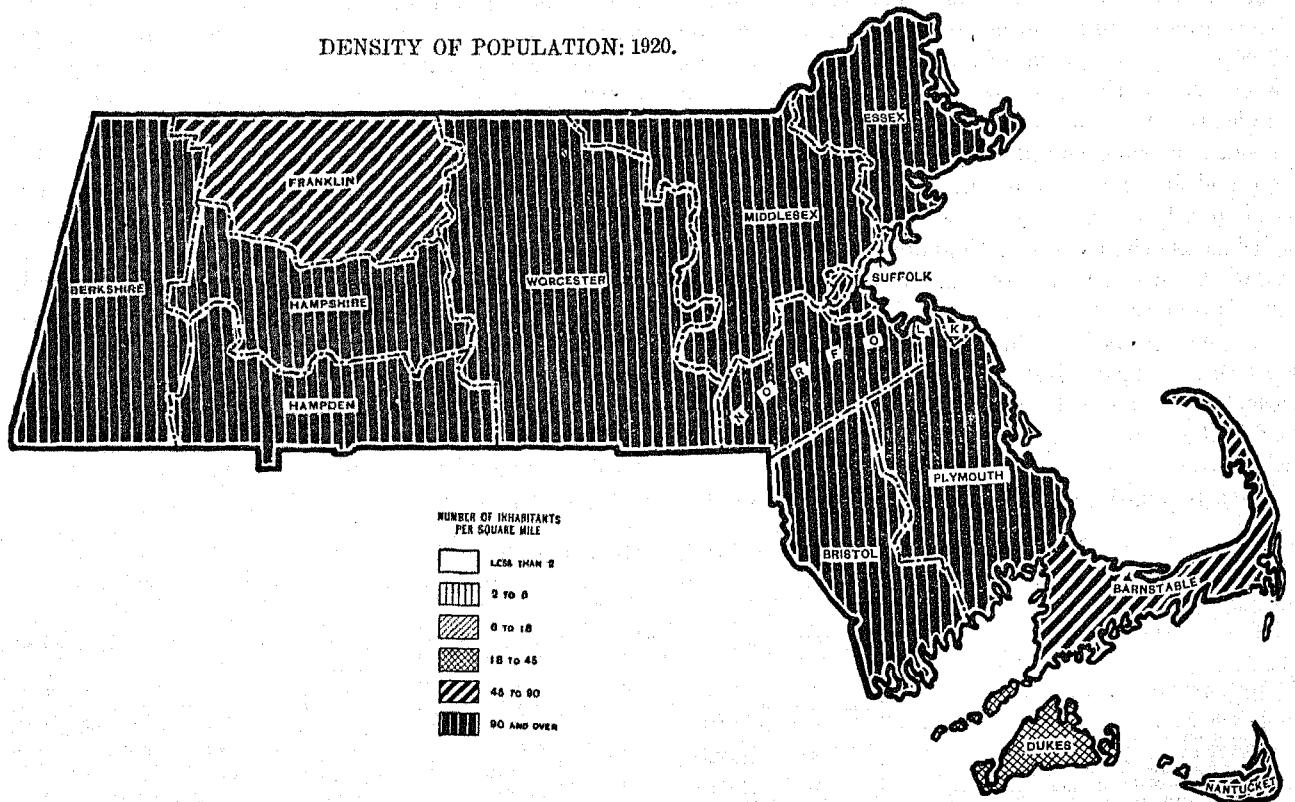
