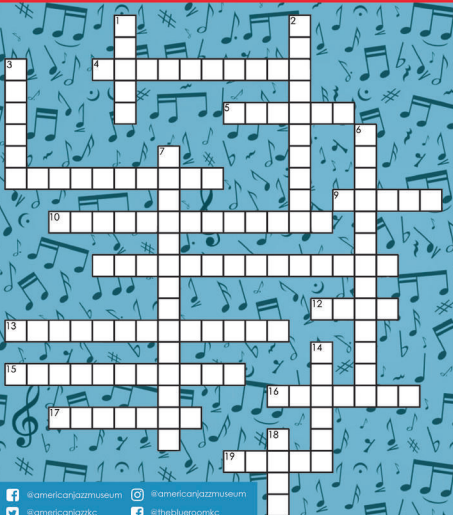

ACROSS

- Nicknamed "Hootie," this musician's piano currently resides in the American Jazz Museum's permanent exhibit.
- A sequence of single notes. This is also known as a song's tune.
- A vocalist sings into this piece of sound technology.
- These instruments include saxophone and clarinet.
- Nicknamed "Yardbird," this Kansas City saxophonist would be 100 years old on August 29th.
- This vocalist was also referred to as the "Queen of Jazz."
- 18th & ____
- Music that's created without preparation. This is a key element to jazz music.
- The name of the American Jazz Museum's jazz club, with local and national talent four nights per week.
- These instruments include upright bass and violin.
- This genre of jazz music was popular in the 1930s. Famous bandleaders include Duke Ellington, Count Basie, and Benny Goodman.
- These instruments include trumpet and trombone.

DOWN

- A large keyboard musical instrument.
- Jazz's all-time best selling album, recorded by Miles Davis in 1959.
- A strong, regular, repeated pattern of sound.
- One of the originators of big band jazz, his orchestra stayed together for over 60 years.
- This trumpeter's most popular hit was "What A Wonderful World."
- The written words of music, made by the songwriter.
- An original American artform.
