## ADDITIONAL STATEMENT OF REASONS OF CHAIRMAN ROBERT D. LENHARD, VICE CHAIRMAN DAVID M. MASON AND COMMISSIONERS HANS A. von SPAKOVSKY AND ELLEN L. WEINTRAUB

The Commission previously discussed its reasoning in unanimously dismissing two allegations on which the Office of General Counsel ("OGC") urged the Commission to proceed. *See In re Save American Jobs Ass 'n, Inc.*, Matters Under Review 5672 & 5733, Statement of Reasons ("SOR") of Chairman Lenhard, Vice Chairman Mason & Comm'rs von Spakovsky, Toner<sup>1</sup> & Weintraub at 1 & n.3 (F.E.C. March 13, 2007). We write briefly regarding one additional issue not addressed in the previous SOR. OGC urged the Commission to find reason to believe ("RTB") that Save American Jobs Association, Inc. ("SAJA") violated the Federal Election Campaign Act, 2 U.S.C. § 431 *et seq.*, admonish SAJA, and take no further action based on allegations that SAJA hosted an Internet video.<sup>2</sup> However, in the proper ordering of its
