DURHAM, N.C. — Duke took advantage of three second-half turnovers to pull away from No. 9 Clemson, 28-7, at Wallace Wade Stadium.

The game marked the first time in Clemson history that the Tigers both rushed and passed for 200 yards and lost. Entering the game, Clemson had been 108-0 — including a 58-0 mark under Dabo Swinney — when reaching 200 yards in both categories. Clemson out-gained Duke, 422-374, and led the Blue Devils in first downs, 29-17, in the defeat.

After two Duke field goals, Wade Woodaz recovered a muffed punt on Duke's 18-yard line, setting up Will Shipley's first career receiving touchdown on a pass from Klubnik for a 7-6 lead the Tigers would carry into halftime.

On the first possession of the second half, Duke quarterback Riley Leonard escaped from the pocket and scored on a 44-yard touchdown run, giving Duke a 13-7 lead. Clemson drove the ensuing possession deep into Duke territory but suffered its second blocked field goal attempt of the evening.

The Tigers again drove deep into Duke's end late in the third quarter and appeared poised to take the lead, but a Mafah fumble on the one-yard line ended the scoring threat. Klubnik saved a touchdown, running nearly 60 yards to track down Jaylen Stinson, but the Blue Devils added a touchdown on the ensuing six-play scoring drive.

Clemson got the ball back on their own 20-yard line with 5:43 left on the clock in search of 14 points. However, a Duke interception on the fourth play of the drive gave the Blue Devils the ball back with a two-possession lead. A 30-yard touchdown run from Jordan Waters sealed a 28-7 Duke victory.

CLEMSON, S.C. — No. 25/21 Clemson scored 45 unanswered points over the final three quarters to defeat Charleston Southern, 66-17, in Clemson's home opener at Memorial Stadium. The Tigers played a school-record 117 players in the contest.

Clemson overcame a couple of critical early mistakes. A Clemson fumble on fourth down in its own territory set up a one-yard Charleston Southern touchdown, and a 67-yard pick six gave the Buccaneers a 14-7 lead late in the first quarter. The game was tied 14-14 after the first quarter despite a 198-6 Clemson advantage in offensive yardage and 12-0 Clemson edge in first downs at the quarter break.

Clemson outscored Charleston Southern, 52-3, over the remaining three quarters. Phil Mafah (two rushing), Antonio Williams (two receiving) and Jay Haynes (one rushing, one receiving) all found the end zone twice during the contest, and Beaux Collins led the Tigers with seven receptions and 137 receiving yards, including a 69-yard catch-and-run for a score. Clemson's 37 third downs were the third-most in school history.

Defensively, Clemson held the Bucs to only 73 total yards and four first downs. Linebacker Wade Woodaz returned his first career interception 35 yards for a score.

The game was Dabo Swinney's 100th home game as head coach, improving him to 92-8 in Death Valley.

CLEMSON, S.C. — Twenty first-quarter points sparked RV/22 Clemson to a 48-14 prime-time win against Florida Atlantic at Memorial Stadium.

Quarterback Cade Klubnik was responsible for four total touchdowns — three passing and one passing. Wide receiver Tyler Brown caught two touchdowns, becoming the first Clemson freshman with two receiving touchdowns in a game since Justyn Ross in the 2018 Cotton Bowl.

Clemson forced four turnovers in the victory. Cornerback Nate Wiggins jumpstarted Clemson and opened the scoring with a 46-yard interception return for touchdown, become the first Tiger with a pick-six in consecutive season since Rex Varn in 1977-78. Khalil Barnes recorded his first career interception later in the quarter, and Wade Woodaz notched his second interception in as many weeks later in the contest, becoming the first Clemson linebacker with a pick in back-to-back games since Isaiah Simmons in 2019.

After Wiggins' opening salvo, the Tigers added four more touchdowns in the first half, including scoring passes from Klubnik to Brown and Jake Briningstool as well as rushing touchdowns by Phil Mafah and Klubnik, giving Clemson a 34-0 lead at halftime.

Both teams added 14 points in the second half. Clemson's 14 second-half points included Brown adding his second touchdown of the game from Klubnik and running back Domonique Thomas rushing for his first touchdown of his NCAA career after walking on from NAIA Union College in Kentucky in 2022.

CLEMSON, S.C. – Despite never trailing until overtime, RV/25 Clemson fell to No. 4/3 Florida State, 31-24, at Memorial Stadium. Clemson outgained Florida State, 429-311, and had a 25-16 edge in first downs in the loss.

Cade Klubnik completed 25-of-38 passes for 283 yards and one touchdown and added a rushing touchdown as well. Will Shipley added a touchdown both on the ground and through the air. Clemson limited Florida State to just 22 yards rushing on 20 carries and registered five tackles for a loss.

Clemson scored first on Jonathan Weitz' first career field goal less than a week after he re-joined the team out of retirement. Clemson and Florida State traded a pair of touchdowns in the second quarter to bring the halftime score to 17-14 in favor of Clemson.

A Florida State field goal on its first possession of the second half tied the game, but Clemson re-claimed the lead on Shipley's one-yard touchdown run in the third quarter. Clemson was in Florida State territory poised to push the lead to two scores, but Kalen DeLoach strip-sacked Klubnik and returned the fumble 56 yards for a touchdown to even the score at 24-24.

Clemson drove 44 yards in 11 plays to the Florida State 12 in the final minutes, but Weitz missed a 29-yard field goal attempt that would have given the Tigers the lead. Clemson then forced a Florida State turnover on downs in the waning seconds of regulation to force overtime.

Florida State opened the extra frame with a 24-yard touchdown pass from Jordan Travis to Keon Coleman on its second play. Clemson's attempt to force a second overtime ended when a Klubnik pass was tipped at the line of scrimmage and fell incomplete on fourth down.

SYRACUSE, N.Y. – A diving interception by Jeremiah Trotter Jr. with 6:45 to play combined with Phil Mafah's 32-yard touchdown run on the ensuing play helped secure Clemson's 31-14 win over previously unbeaten Syracuse at the JMA Wireless Dome. The win was Head Coach Dabo Swinney's 100th career regular season victory in ACC play, as he joined Bobby Bowden as the only coaches to accomplish the feat.

Wide receiver Tyler Brown turned in a magnificent nine-catch, 153-yard receiving effort in his fifth career game. Quarterback Cade Klubnik finished 23-of-37 for 263 yards and a pair of touchdown passes.

Defensively, Clemson recorded five sacks and held Syracuse's offense, which entered the week in the Top 10 nationally in points per game and yards per game, to 14 points and 281 yards of offense.

Clemson set the tone when Justin Mascoll crushed Syracuse quarterback Garrett Shrader for a fumble on Syracuse's opening drive that was recovered by Payton Page. The Tigers jumped out to an early 14-0 lead in the first 10 minutes on the back of a pair of turnovers that resulted in touchdowns for Troy Stellato and Will Shipley.

A 28-yard second-quarter touchdown pass from Shrader to Dan Villari cut the score to 14-7, but Clemson re-extended the lead on a 47-yard touchdown pass from Klubnik to Beaux Collins. Jonathan Weitz added a field goal early in the third quarter to give Clemson a 24-7 advantage.

Syracuse got as close as 10 points in the second half, turning a Jake Briningstool fumble into seven points on a five-play scoring drive to make the score 24-14.

With the Orange driving in search of a comeback, Trotter dove in front of a Shrader pass for an interception on the 32-yard line with 6:45 to play. On the ensuing play, Mafah took a handoff and burst down the left side nearly untouched for the touchdown to set the final margin.

CLEMSON, S.C. – Dabo Swinney tied Frank Howard's Clemson record for career wins with his 165 victory as the Tigers earned a 17-12 win over Wake Forest at Memorial Stadium on Homecoming.

Clemson's defense produced eight tackles for loss, four sacks and a fumble recovery. Additionally, Clemson allowed only two third down conversions on 12 attempts. The Tigers kept Wake Forest out of the end zone for the first 58 minutes of the game.

Cade Klubnik completed 18-of-28 passes to total 131 yards and added 48 rushing yards, including a seven-yard touchdown scamper in the first quarter. Shipley led Clemson in rushing yards with 97 on 19 carries. Defensively, safety R.J. Mickens recorded nine tackles (one for loss) and his first career fumble recovery, while linebacker Wade Woodaz had two of Clemson's four sacks.

Clemson's two touchdowns came on scoring drives of 16 plays and 15 plays, marking Clemson's first time producing multiple 15-play scoring drives since the 2021 Cheez-It Bowl.

Clemson held a 7-3 lead at halftime and the teams traded field goals to bring the score to 10-6 entering the final frame. Shipley scored on a one-yard touchdown run with 5:49 remaining to extend the score to 17-6. Wake Forest mounted an 11-play, 75-yard touchdown drive late in the contest, finishing the drive with a three-yard touchdown run by Demond Claiborne. An attempted two-point conversion by the Demon Deacons failed when a Mitch Griffis pass to Jahmal Banks was ruled out-of-bounds near the goalpost.

Wide receiver Hamp Greene recovered Wake Forest's ensuing inside kick attempt to give Clemson the ball at Wake Forest's 44-yard line. Phil Mafah rushed for 33 yards on four carries on Clemson's final drive to help run out the clock and seal the victory for Clemson.

MIAMI GARDENS, Fla. – Miami overcame a 10-point fourth-quarter deficit to defeat Clemson, 28-20, in double overtime at Hard Rock Stadium. Clemson dropped to 4-3 (2-3 ACC) with the defeat.

Sophomore quarterback Cade Klubnik was 18-for-34 for 314 yards. Klubnik connected with tight end Jake Briningstool five times for 126 yards and two touchdowns. Briningstool's 126 yards broke Clemson's school record for single-game receiving yards by a tight end, surpassing Jordan Leggett's 122 yards against Florida State in 2016.

Turnovers once again played a major role for Clemson, as the Tigers' recorded one takeaway against three giveaways.

Clemson appeared poised to take an early lead, but Miami recovered a Clemson fumble in the Hurricane end zone. On the ensuing play, Miami opened the scoring on an 80-yard touchdown, as Brashard Smith broke free on a rush up the middle, and though Nate Wiggins chased him down and forced a fumble at the one-yard line, Miami's Jacoby George recovered the fumble in the end zone for a touchdown. Klubnik and Briningstool's first scoring connection in the second quarter evened the game at 7-7 at the half.

Clemson added 10 points in the third quarter on a 41-yard Jonathan Weitz field goal and an acrobatic 19-yard touchdown by Briningstool. However, Miami responded with 10 points of its own in the fourth quarter to send the game to overtime.

The teams traded field goals in the first overtime period. After Miami's Ajay Allen rushed for a touchdown and a two-point conversion in double overtime, Miami finished a goal-line stand by chasing down Klubnik on the edge on fourth down to earn the win.

RALEIGH, N.C. - Clemson outscored NC State 10-0 in the fourth quarter but the Tigers' comeback attempt fell short as NC State defeated Clemson, 24-17, at Carter-Finley Stadium.

Clemson's defense held NC State to 202 yards, and the Tigers outgained the Wolfpack, 364-202, but NC State converted two takeaways into 14 points in the Wolfpack's seven-point win.

NC State took advantage of an early Klubnik interception on its own 40-yard line, scoring first after a 50-yard rush set up a nine-yard touchdown reception from Kevin Concepcion with 7:18 to play in the first quarter.

NC State extended the lead to 10-0 on a Brayden Narveson 41-yard field goal in the second quarter. On its ensuing drive, Clemson went 75 yards in nine plays as Phil Mafah punched in his fifth touchdown of the season with 8:24 to play before halftime.

The Wolfpack upped their lead to 17-7 when Payton Wilson returned a deflected Klubnik pass 15 yards for a touchdown. NC State scored again on a 72-yard connection from MJ Morris to Concepcion with 4:35 to play in the third quarter, taking a 24-7 lead.

Early in the fourth quarter, Mafah capped a 10-play 75-yard drive with another one-yard score, which cut the deficit to 24-14. After Clemson's defense forced a pair of three-and-outs, Mafah jump-started another Clemson scoring drive with a 41-yard gain on the first play of a possession to carry the Tigers to the NC State nine-yard line. A 19-yard field goal by Jonathan Weitz at the end of that possession pulled the score to 24-17.

Clemson forced NC State to punt, giving the Tigers the ball back trailing by seven points with 4:23 left to play in the game. An incompleton on 4th-and-19 kept the score at 24-17 and gave NC State the ball and the eventual victory.

CLEMSON, S.C. - Head Coach Dabo Swinney earned his 166th career victory to become Clemson's all-time winningest coach as Clemson earned a 31-23 upset of No. 12 Notre Dame at Memorial Stadium.

Clemson recorded its first penalty-free game on record since the 1952 Gator Bowl. Jeremiah Trotter Jr. led Clemson defensively with 11 tackles, 2.5 tackles for a loss, 2.0 sacks and a pick-six. Phil Mafah rushed for two touchdowns and recorded a career-high 186 rushing yards on a school-record-tying 36 carries.

Notre Dame opened the scoring with a 43-yard field goal. Clemson's scored on its second possession on a 41-yard touchdown run by Mafah. The teams traded field goals, and Tyler Brown later extended Clemson's lead on a nine-yard touchdown reception. On the Irish's next drive, Trotter returned an interception 28 yards for a touchdown, giving Clemson a 24-6 second quarter lead.

Early in the third quarter, an Xavier Watts interception gave Notre Dame the ball on Clemson's two-yard line, setting up an Audric Estime touchdown. Mafah then capped an 11-play, 75-yard drive with a one-yard rushing touchdown to put Clemson up 31-16. Notre Dame again cut the lead though on a 26-yard touchdown run by Hartman.

Kylon Griffin's first career interception gave Clemson the ball in the final two minutes of the game, but a fumble by Mafah gave the ball back with 1:47 remaining. However, Clemson harassed Hartman and forced a turnover on downs, allowing Clemson to run out the clock.

The loss dropped Hartman to 0-5 against Clemson as a starter, becoming the first Power Five starting quarterback to go 0-5 against a single opponent since Florida State's Chris Rix against Miami (Fla.) in the early 2000s.

CLEMSON, S.C. — Clemson's freshmen took center stage and helped the Tigers score 42 consecutive points in a 42-21 win against Georgia Tech at Memorial Stadium.

True freshmen and redshirt freshmen combined for three of Clemson's six touchdowns (Tyler Brown, Josh Sapp and Shelton Lewis) and all four of its interceptions (Khalil Barnes, Avieon Terrell, Kylon Griffin and Lewis). Clemson became the first FBS team since at least 2000 to have four different freshmen record a pick in a single game.

Quarterback Cade Klubnik completed 23-of-34 passes for 205 yards and a career-high tying four touchdown passes in leading the Tigers to victory. After Georgia Tech struck first on a short field, touchdown passes to Beaux Collins and Brown gave Clemson a 14-7 second-quarter lead. The first touchdown came on a drive lasting 9:51, the longest scoring drive (and second-longest drive of any result) in school history. Running back Will Shipley added a 32-yard rushing touchdown late in the second to push the Tigers' halftime advantage to 21-8.

Klubnik added two more touchdowns in the second half, finding tight ends Jake Briningstool and Josh Sapp for touchdowns of five yards and 13 yards, respectively, to take a 35-7 lead early in the fourth quarter.

Less than two minutes after the Briningstool touchdown, Lewis extended the Tiger lead to 35 with a 46-yard pick-six on his first career interception. He also added four pass breakups in the contest, one shy of a school record and the most by a Tiger since Mario Goodrich's four at Syracuse in 2021.

Georgia Tech added two late touchdowns to bring the final score to 42-21. Clemson held Georgia Tech to 254 yards, 142 of which came on the Yellow Jackets' final two drives of the game with the result already decided.

Clemson outscored North Carolina 14-0 in the second frame on a touchdown pass from Klubnik to Jake Briningstool and a touchdown rush by Klubnik as time nearly expired. Phil Mafah extended Clemson's lead to 21-7 with a third-quarter rushing touchdown.

North Carolina cut the lead on a 55-yard rushing touchdown by Hampton, who finished the day with 178 rushing yards. But Shipley both jumpstarted and finished a response drive from Clemson, capping a six-play, 75-yard drive with a 33-yard rushing touchdown to push the lead back to 14. Jonathan Weitz's 21-yard field goal to increased Clemson's lead to 31-14 with 10:28 left to play.

Hampton ran for a three-yard rushing touchdown with 7:03 left in the game, but Andrew Mukuba broke up Maye's pass on a two-point conversion attempt, leaving the score at 31-20.

The teams remained scoreless in their remaining possessions, and Wiggins recorded his third career interception (and second all-time off Maye) to give Clemson the ball back on the 25-yard line with 2:37 left to play. Clemson ran the clock out to earn the 31-20 win.

COLUMBIA, S.C. - Clemson's defense scored a touchdown and held rival South Carolina to 169 yards of offense in a 16-7 victory at Williams-Brice Stadium. The 169 yards of offense were the fewest allowed by a Clemson defense in the series since 1989 (155).

Freshman Khalil Barnes set the tone, becoming the first Clemson player since Brian Dawkins in 1995 to record a takeaway on consecutive plays from scrimmage. On the second snap of the game, he recovered a dropped lateral and returned it 42 yards for a touchdown just 25 seconds into the game, Clemson's fastest score against South Carolina since C.J. Spiller ran back the opening kickoff in 2009. It was also Clemson's school-record-tying fifth defensive touchdown of the season. On South Carolina's next offensive play, Barnes made a diving interception on a deep pass by Spencer Rattler.

After surrendering its only touchdown of the game with 6:39 to play in the first quarter, Clemson's defense forced eight consecutive punts and a turnover on downs over South Carolina's final nine possessions. Clemson allowed just 66 yards on those nine drives. Offensively, the Tigers piled up 219 yards rushing, including 89 from running back Phil Mafah, 80 from running back Will Shipley, and a career-high 52 from quarterback Cade Klubnik.

Placekicker Jonathan Weitz finished 3-for-3 on field goals to account for the final margin of victory in Clemson's nine-point win. He converted field goal attempts of 50, 49 and 42 yards after entering the evening with a career long of 41. His three field goals of 40-plus yards tied a school record set previously by four others.

Weitz' career-long 50-yard field goal in the first quarter was Clemson's longest field goal since a 52-yarder by B.T. Potter in the 2022 ACC Championship Game. The 50-yarder came in the same stadium as the first 50-yard field goal in Clemson history, a 52-yarder by Eddie Seigler against South Carolina in 1971.

JACKSONVILLE, Fla. - Running back Phil Mafah ran for a TaxSlayer Gator Bowl-record four touchdowns, including three in the fourth quarter to earn game MVP honors, as Clemson came back from an 11-point fourth-quarter deficit for a 38-35 win over Kentucky (7-6) at EverBank Stadium in Jacksonville, Fla. The Tigers (9-4) finished the season on a five-game winning streak and boasting a postseason victory in an FBS-record 13 straight seasons.

Clemson trailed 21-10 entering the fourth quarter and exploded for a school-record-tying 28 fourth-quarter points and the defense forced four turnovers in the final frame to lead the Tigers to a fifth Gator Bowl victory in school history.

The Tigers tallied 367 yards of offense, including 264 through the air and 103 on the ground. Mafah scored touchdowns on four of his 11 carries, finishing with 71 yards. Sophomore quarterback Cade Klubnik completed 30-of-41 passes, including going 8-for-8 on the game-winning drive that ended with Mafah's fourth score with 17 seconds remaining. The game featured five lead changes in the game's final 6:45.

Clemson scored on its opening possession, fueled in part by a 34-yard kickoff return by Shipley and a Wildcat personal foul penalty on the first play from scrimmage. Weitz nailed a 39-yard field goal, giving the Tigers the 3-0 lead.

Kentucky got in the end zone on its second possession as Barion Brown scored off of a 22-yard touchdown run and gave the Wildcats a 7-3 first-quarter lead. Clemson's defense did not let Kentucky gain any yardage on its next possession and only allowed two yards on the following, resulting in back-to-back three-and-outs.

A 28-yard completion to Jake Briningstool set up Phil Mafah to push his way one yard through traffic for a Clemson touchdown, giving the Tigers a 10-7 lead with 10:17 left in the first half. Kentucky responded quickly with a 58-yard completion to Dane Key followed by a

five-yard touchdown pass to Key, bringing the score to 14-10 in favor of Kentucky with 7:44 remaining in the second quarter. Kentucky maintained that four-point advantage heading into halftime.

The Wildcats opened the second half with a 100-yard kickoff return for a touchdown by Brown, extending the score to 21-10. Though NCAA recordkeeping limits returns to 100 yards, the return unofficially covered 102 yards.

Clemson drove 70 yards on 14 plays as Mafah found his way into the end zone for a second time from a yard out. The drive covered 6:43, and Mafah's score came on the first play of the fourth quarter. Klubnik's two-point pass attempt was knocked down at the goal line, leaving Clemson a 21-16 deficit with 14:56 to play.

Clemson's defense then continued to build momentum as Justin Mascoll recovered a loose ball after an Xavier Thomas sack forced Devin Leary to fumble, giving Clemson's offense the ball back on Kentucky's 25-yard line. On Clemson's first play following the turnover, Klubnik got hit as he threw a deep ball which allowed Jordan Lovett to pick it off and give the ball right back to Kentucky.

However, Kentucky wouldn't have the ball for long as on its third play, Barrett Carter batted Leary's pass up to himself and caught the ball for the interception. After driving 26 yards down the field, Weitz made a 28-yard field goal to draw the Tigers to within two at 21-19.

On Kentucky's next offensive play, Khalil Barnes knocked the ball out of Barion Brown's hands and once again Carter was there to recover the loose ball. Clemson capitalized immediately with Mafah running 29 yards for the touchdown. A short completion to Tyler Brown gave Clemson two more points to give the Tigers a 27-21 lead with 6:45 left in the game.

Just 33 seconds later, Leary found Brown for a 60-yard touchdown pass to return the advantage to Kentucky. The Wildcats' lead would not last long as Weitz kicked a dramatic career-long and Gator-Bowl-record 52-yard field goal that bounced off the crossbar and through the uprights to give Clemson a 30-28 lead with 4:20 left to play.

Kentucky then produced another quick touchdown drive which started with a 72-yard gain from Jordan Dingle and finished with a one-yard touchdown run from Ray Davis to return the lead to the Wildcats.

Clemson got the ball back with 1:41 left in the game and all three timeouts. A five-yard run from Mafah kept

the drive alive on a crucial 4th-and-2. Two plays later, Klubnik found Briningstool for 15 yards and then Mafah finished the job with a three-yard touchdown run to give Clemson a 38-35 lead.

Freshman cornerback Shelton Lewis sealed the victory for the Tigers with an interception — Clemson's fourth turnover of the quarter — with nine seconds left. It represented Clemson's first time recording four takeaways in a quarter since 2000 against Missouri.
