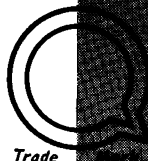

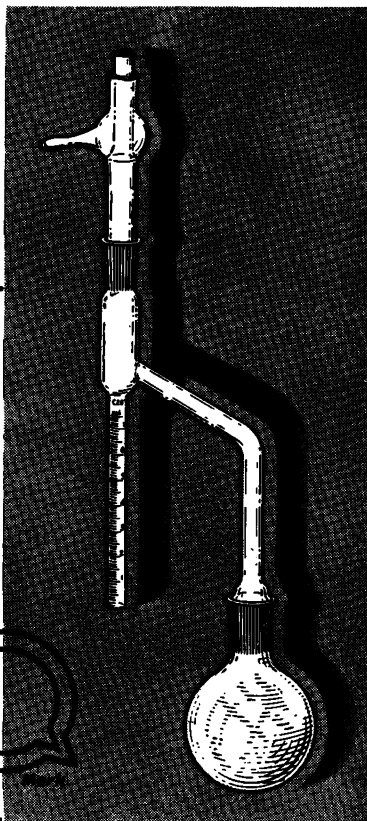

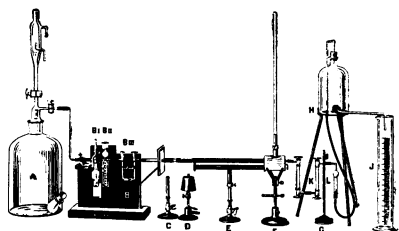

AND HYDROGEN**

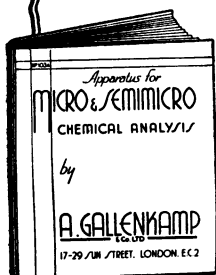

Rats and Premises

The London (G.L.) strain of Wistar Rat has moved again. This, the second move in two years, is to larger premises in a new building at Greenford, in which both biochemical and bacteriological departments of the Glaxo Laboratories are now housed.

The rats have undergone no change but a topographical one. Scrupulous attention is paid to their environment, in which a first-grade diet and extreme cleanliness play the dominant part, and equally careful consideration is devoted to their genetic make-up, which is maintained as nearly homozygous as can be achieved by the brother-sister mating used in the colony for the last thirteen years (some twenty-five generations).

In 1936 we supplied over 4,000 rats to outside investigators (and some 8,000 were used in our own work). We believe this to show that the care taken by us to breed the best type of albino rat for research purposes is widely appreciated—in many European countries besides Great Britain and outside Europe as well. Supplies this year are available as usual to biochemists, but the first-comers must always be the first served.

Paradoxically, though we have moved again, we claim that our colony is built up on the same premises as before—and, we feel certain, on sound ones.
