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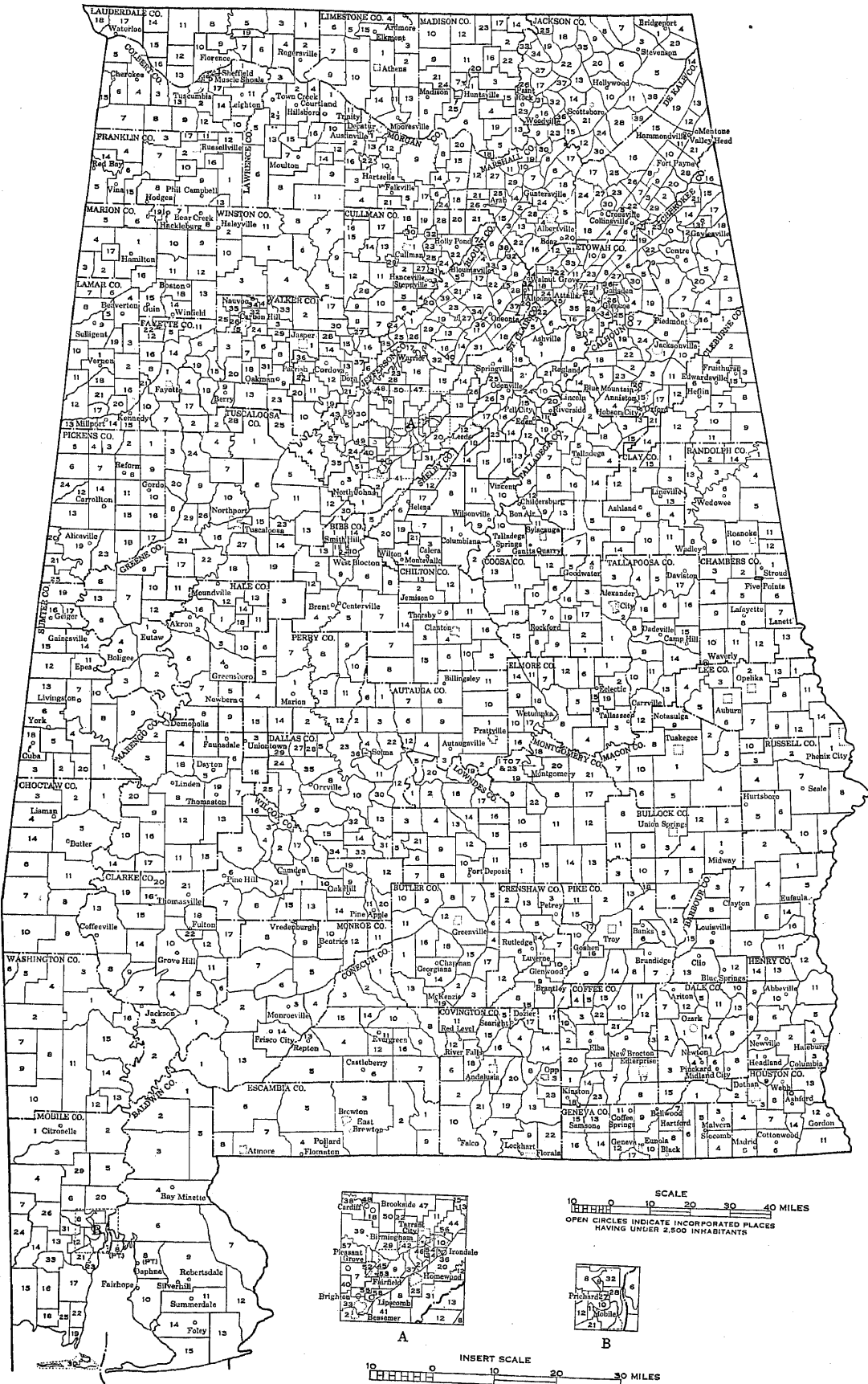

## NUMBER OF INHABITANTS

**Population of the State.**—Alabama was organized as a Territory in 1817 and was admitted to the Union as the twenty-second State in 1819. Its population on April 1, 1940, according to the Sixteenth Census, was 2,832,961, which represents an increase of 186,713, or 7.1 percent, as compared with the population on April 1, 1930. The total land area of the State, as shown in table 3, is 51,078 square miles. The average number of inhabitants per square mile in 1940 was 55.5, as compared with 51.8 in 1930.

Table 1 shows the population of Alabama from 1820, the year in which its area was first separately enumerated, to 1940, together with the increase during each

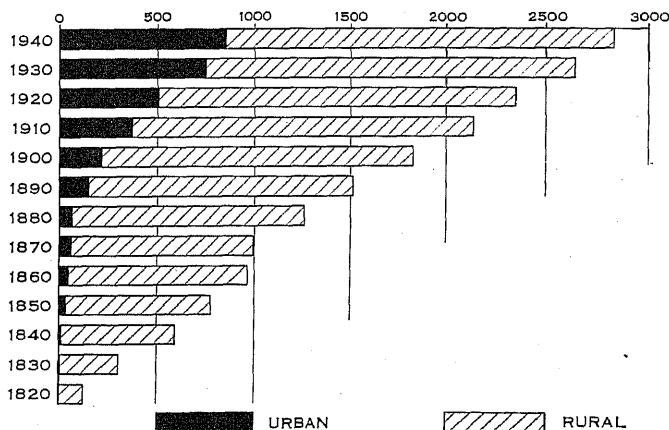
decade. The urban and rural population of the State at each census is presented in this table and is also shown graphically in the accompanying chart. The urban population of Alabama consists of those persons living in incorporated places of 2,500 or more, the remainder of the population being classified as rural. The urban and rural areas are not necessarily constant from one census to the next, since new places are added to the urban list from time to time as they attain a population of 2,500 or more. Places are likewise taken off the urban list when, through decline in population, they fall below this limit. For example, Elba qualified as urban in 1930 but not in 1920 or 1940.

**Geographic subdivisions.**—In tables 2 to 5 the population of Alabama is shown by counties, election precincts, cities, and towns, with some comparative figures from previous censuses. Table 6 gives the population of cities by wards. Data for the metropolitan districts are presented in tables 7, 7-A, and 7-B, and for the census tracts of Birmingham, in table 8.

**Cities of 10,000 or more.**—There are 14 cities in the State that had a population of 10,000 or more in 1940. Table 2 shows the population of these cities at each census for which figures are available, together with the increase or decrease during each decade. Birmingham, the largest city, had a population in 1940 of 267,583; and Montgomery, the capital of the State, had a population of 78,084.

Counties.—Table 3 shows the population of the 67 counties of Alabama from 1920 to 1940, together with the land area of each county and its population per square mile in 1940. The land areas given here are the result of new measurements recently compiled and differ somewhat from those published in earlier census reports. Of the 63 counties whose boundaries remained unchanged since 1930, 45 increased in population between 1930 and 1940, and 18 decreased. Part of Cherokee County was annexed to Etowah County in 1931; part of Lee County was annexed to Russell County and part of Russell County was annexed to Lee County, in 1932. This table also presents the urban and rural population of each county for 1940 and 1930.

**Minor civil divisions.**—To the primary political divisions into which the counties are subdivided the Census Bureau applies the general term "minor civil divisions." The primary divisions of the counties in Alabama are called election precincts except for the city of Mobile, which is independent of any precinct organization. The incorporated cities (except Mobile) and towns form secondary subdivisions of the minor civil divisions in which they are located. There are 64 cities and 215 towns. Ordinarily, each of the secondary divisions forms a part of some election precinct (or precincts).

Table 4 shows the population of each county by election precincts, cities, and towns for the last three

censuses. The population of the cities (except Mobile) and towns is shown in *italics* under the population of the primary divisions in which the places are respectively located. Where an incorporated place is located in two or more election precincts in the same county, the total population of the place is given in connection with the presentation for the first precinct. Where the place is situated in two or more counties, the total population is given in connection with each county. The population of Montgomery, which comprises several entire election precincts, is presented in roman type, followed by the precinct population in *italic* type.

**Metropolitan districts.**—Metropolitan districts have been set up for use in the 1940 Census of Population in connection with each city of 50,000 or more, two or more such cities sometimes being in one district. The general plan is to include in the district, in addition to the central city or cities, all adjacent and contiguous minor civil divisions having a population of 150 or more per square mile. In some metropolitan districts a few less densely populated contiguous divisions are included on the basis of special qualifications. A metropolitan district is thus not a political unit but rather an area including all the thickly settled territory in and around a city or group of cities. It tends to be a more or less integrated area with common economic, social, and, often, administrative interests. The following tables give data for the three metropolitan districts with their central city in Alabama. Part of the Columbus district is also situated in Alabama; data for this district are presented in the bulletin for Georgia.

Table 7 shows the population of the Birmingham metropolitan district and its constituent political units in 1940 and 1930, together with the increase or decrease during the decade. In 1940 the Birmingham metropolitan district had 407,851 inhabitants, whereas in 1930 the district as then constituted had a population of 382,792. All of precincts 22, 38, and 44, and that part of precinct 51 that was annexed to precinct 33 in 1940 were included in the metropolitan district in 1940 for the first time. That part of precinct 8 that was annexed to precinct 41 in 1939 was not included in the metropolitan district in 1940 although it was included in the district in 1930. Since the 1930 population of these parts of precincts 8 and 51 is not obtainable, the total population in 1930 cannot be given for either the new area or the area now omitted.

Table 7-A shows the population of the Mobile metropolitan district and its constituent political units in 1940. This district was defined for the first time in 1940. In 1940 the Mobile metropolitan district had 114,906 inhabitants. Comparative figures for 1930 are not available because of the redistricting<sup>13</sup> of Mobile County into new minor civil divisions.

Table 7-B shows the population of the Montgomery metropolitan district and its constituent political units in 1940. This district was defined for the first time in 1940. For comparison the 1930 population of the units comprising the present district is also shown, together with the increase between 1930 and 1940. In 1940 the Montgomery metropolitan district had 93,697 inhabitants, whereas in 1930 the same area had a population of 78,389.

Census tracts.—Census tracts are small areas into which certain large cities are subdivided for statistical and local administrative purposes, through cooperation with a local committee in each case. The tracts are permanently established, so that comparisons may be

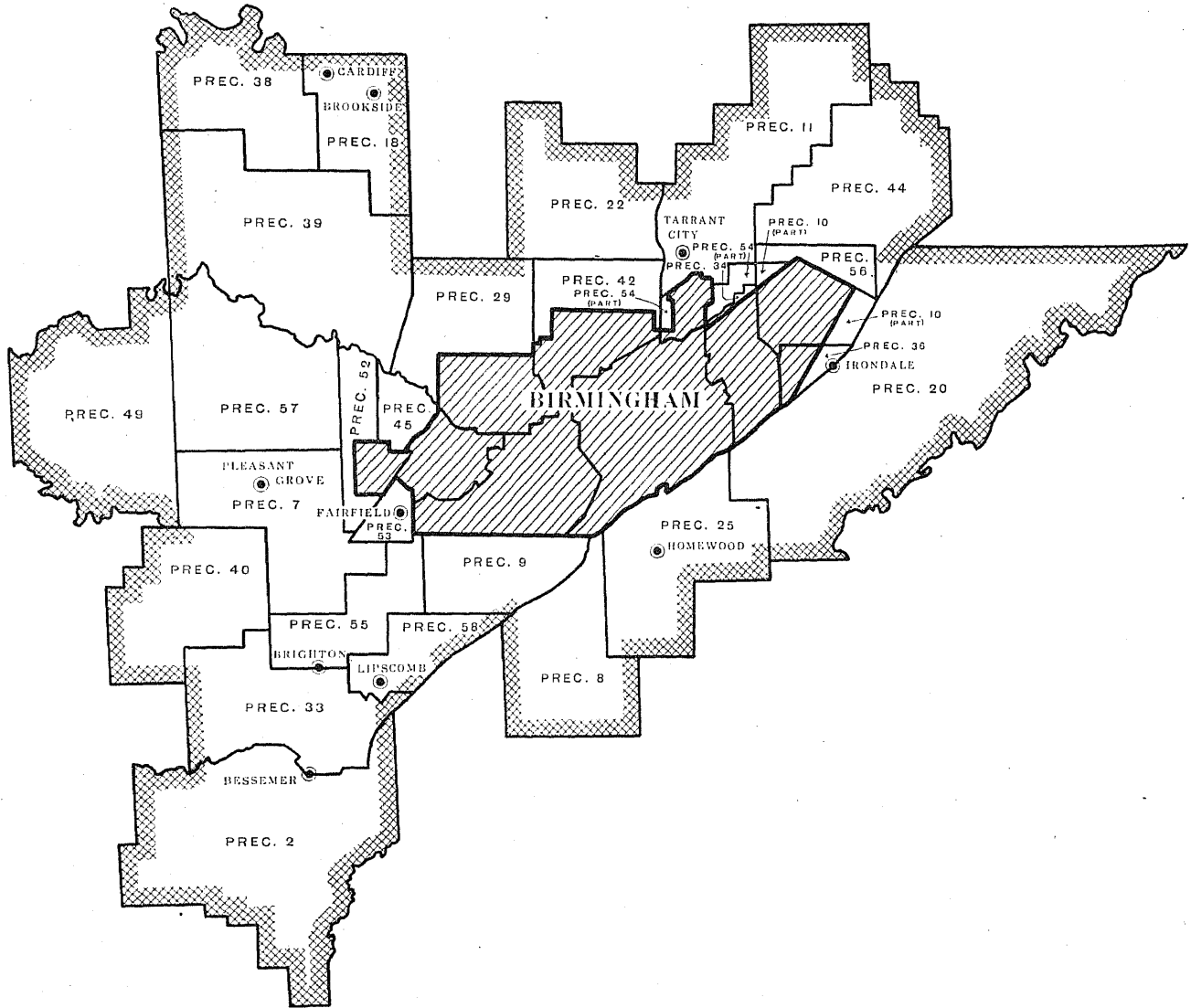
made from census to census; they are laid out with a view to approximate uniformity in population and with some regard for uniformity in area; and each is designed to include an area fairly homogeneous in population characteristics. In table 8 the 1940 population of Birmingham is shown by census tracts. Since these tracts were not established until after 1930, there are no comparative figures for earlier censuses. The census tracts for Birmingham are shown on the accompanying map.

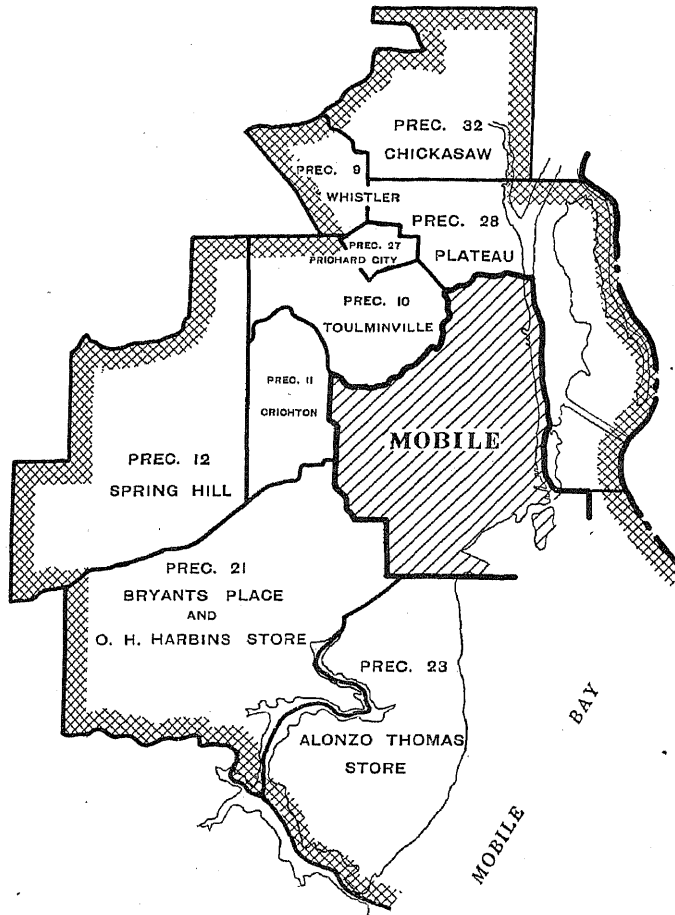

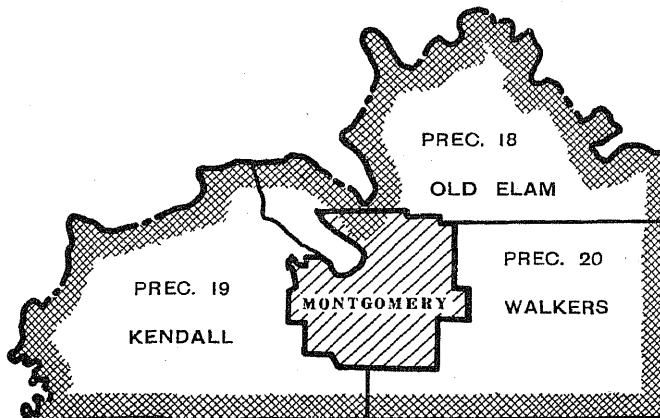
BIRMINGHAM METROPOLITAN DISTRICT

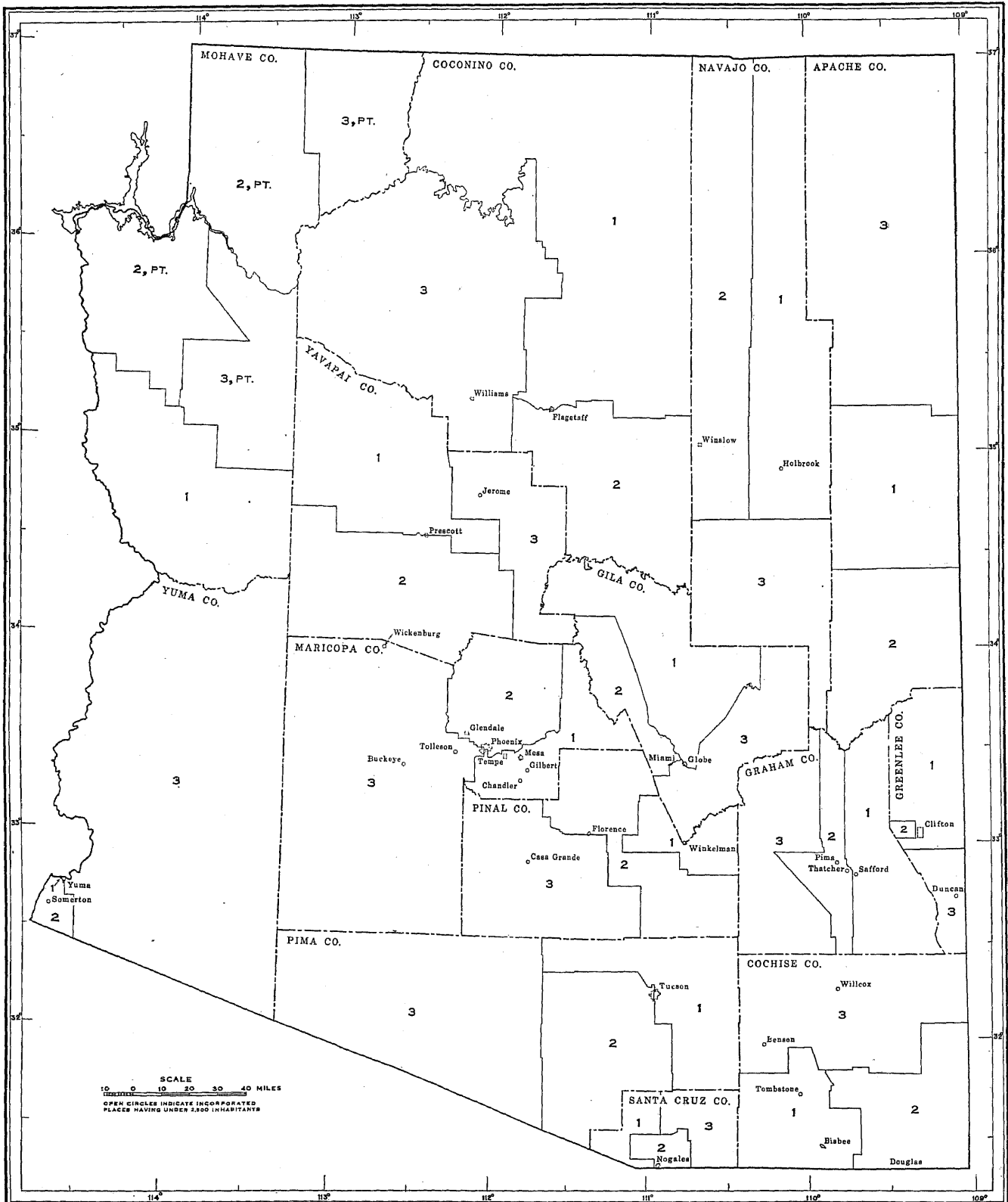

## NUMBER OF INHABITANTS

**Population of the State.**—Arizona was organized as a Territory in 1863 and was admitted to the Union as the forty-eighth State in 1912. Its population on April 1, 1940, according to the Sixteenth Census, was 499,261, which represents an increase of 63,688, or 14.6 percent, as compared with the population on April 1, 1930. The total land area of the State, as shown in table 3, is 113,580 square miles. The average number of inhabitants per square mile in 1940 was 4.4, as compared with 3.8 in 1930.

Table 1 shows the population of Arizona from 1870, the year in which its area was first separately enumerated, to 1940, together with the increase during each

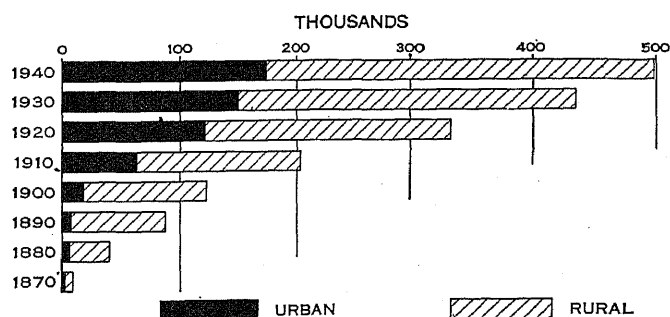
decade. The urban and rural population of the State at each census is presented in this table and is also shown graphically in the accompanying chart. The urban population of Arizona comprises all persons living in incorporated places of 2,500 or more, the remainder of the population being classified as rural. The urban and rural areas are not necessarily constant from one census to the next, since new places are added to the urban list from time to time as they attain a population of 2,500 or more. Places are likewise taken off the urban list when, through decline in population, they fall below this limit. For example, Clifton qualified as urban in 1920 and 1940 but not in 1930.

**Geographic subdivisions.**—In tables 2 to 5 the population of Arizona is shown by counties, supervisorial districts, cities, and towns, with some comparative figures from previous censuses. Table 6 gives the population of cities by wards, and table 7 presents data for the Phoenix metropolitan district.

**Cities of 10,000 or more.**—There are two cities in the State that had a population of 10,000 or more in 1940. Table 2 shows the population of these cities at each

census for which figures are available, together with the increase or decrease during each decade. Phoenix, the capital and largest city, had a population in 1940 of 65,414.

Counties.—Table 3 shows the population of the 14 counties of Arizona from 1920 to 1940, together with the land area of each county and its population per square mile in 1940. The land areas given here are the result of new measurements recently compiled and differ somewhat from those published in earlier census re-

ports. Nine of these counties increased in population between 1930 and 1940, and five decreased. No new counties have been organized, and there have been no changes in county boundaries since the census of 1930. This table also presents the urban and rural population of each county for 1940 and 1930.

Minor civil divisions.—To the primary political divisions into which the counties are subdivided the Census Bureau applies the general term "minor civil divisions." The primary divisions of the counties in Arizona are called supervisorial districts. The incorporated cities and towns form secondary subdivisions of the minor civil divisions in which they are located. There are 15 cities and 19 towns. Ordinarily, each of these secondary divisions forms a part of some district (or districts).

Table 4 shows the population of each county by districts, cities, and towns for the last three censuses. The population of the cities and towns is shown in *italics* under the population of the primary divisions in which the places are respectively located. Where an incorporated place is located in two or more districts the total population of the place is given in connection with the presentation for the first district.

**Metropolitan districts.**—Metropolitan districts have been set up for use in the 1940 Census of Population in connection with each city of 50,000 or more, two or more such cities sometimes being in one district. The general plan is to include in the district, in addition to the central city or cities, all adjacent and contiguous minor civil divisions having a population of 150 or more per square mile. In some metropolitan districts a few less densely populated contiguous divisions are included on the basis of special qualifications. Only a portion of a minor civil division is included if the minor civil division has a large area and practically all of the population is concentrated in a small section near the central city with the more remote sections being very sparsely settled. In such cases, the unit considered was not the minor civil division but component enumeration districts. (For example, not all of the enumeration districts in supervisorial districts 1, 2, and 3 of Maricopa County are included in the Phoenix metropolitan district.) A metropolitan district is thus not a political unit but rather an area including all the thickly settled territory in and around a city or group of cities. It tends to be a more or less integrated area with common economic, social, and, often, administrative interests.

The Phoenix metropolitan district is the only one in Arizona. This district was defined for the first time in 1940.

Table 7 shows the population of the Phoenix metropolitan district and its constituent political units in 1940. In 1940 the Phoenix metropolitan district had 121,828 inhabitants. Comparative figures for 1930 are not available because of the redistricting of the counties into new minor civil divisions.

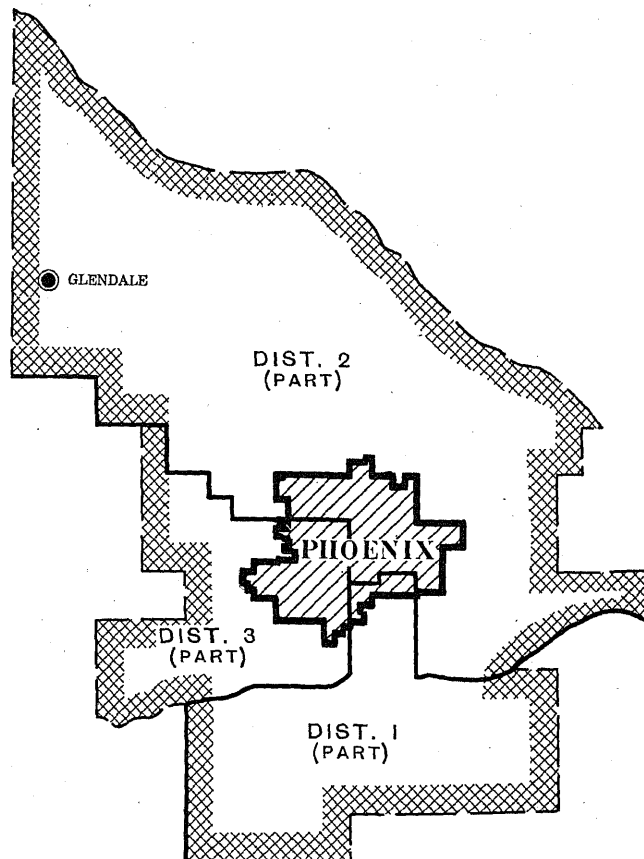

PHOENIX METROPOLITAN DISTRICT



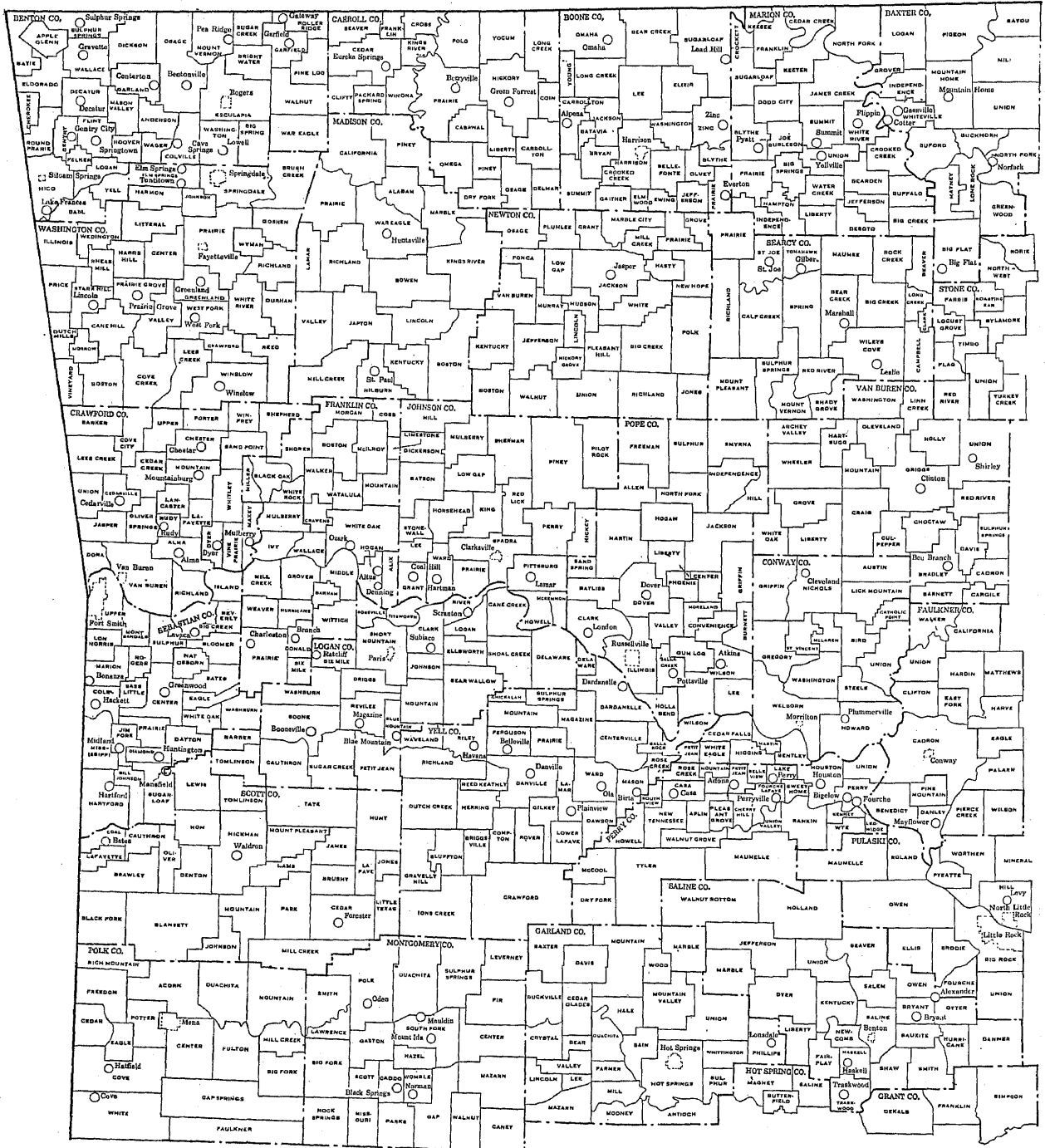

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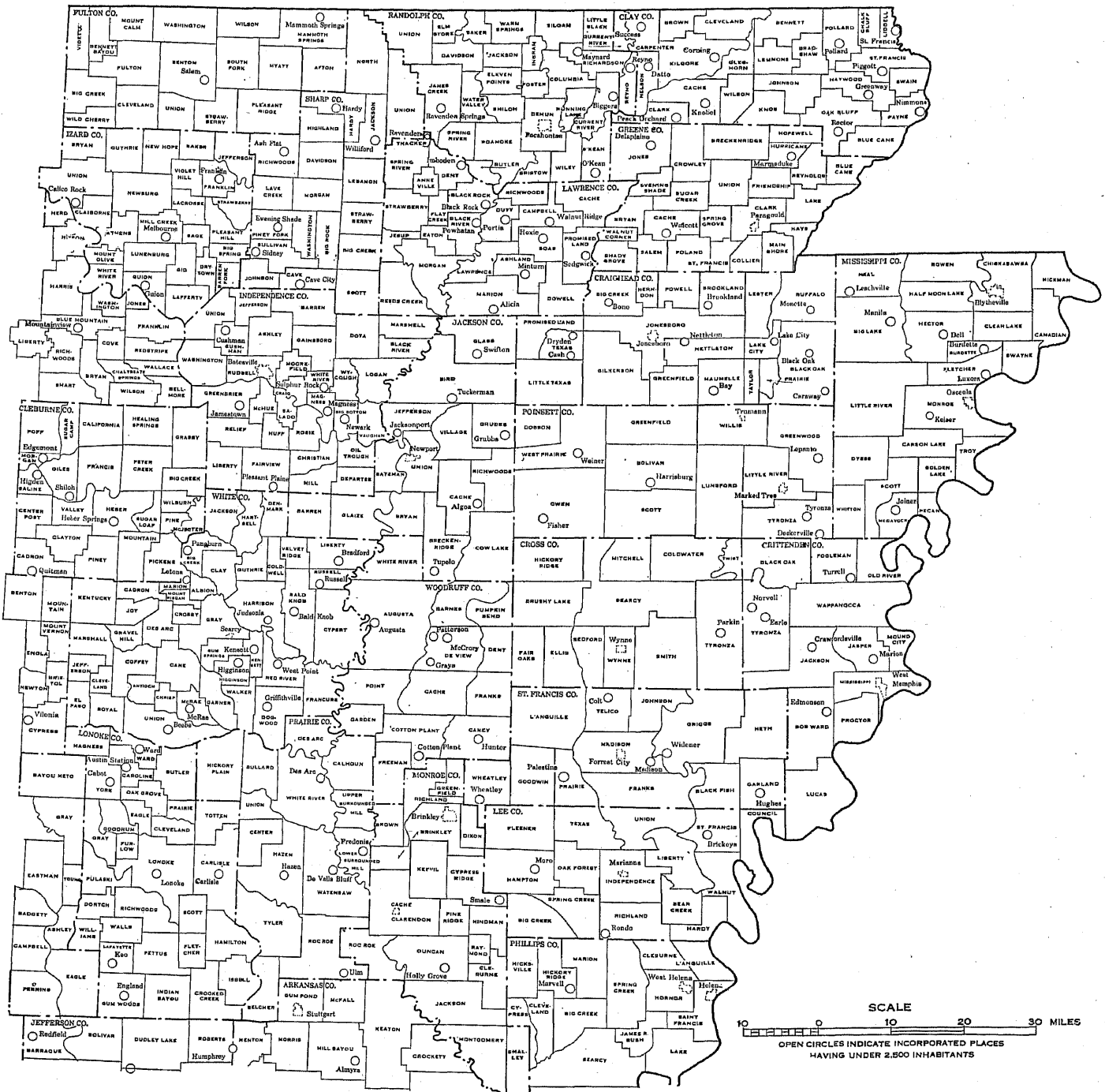
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ARKANSAS—NORTHWESTERN PART

MINOR CIVIL DIVISIONS—TOWNSHIPS

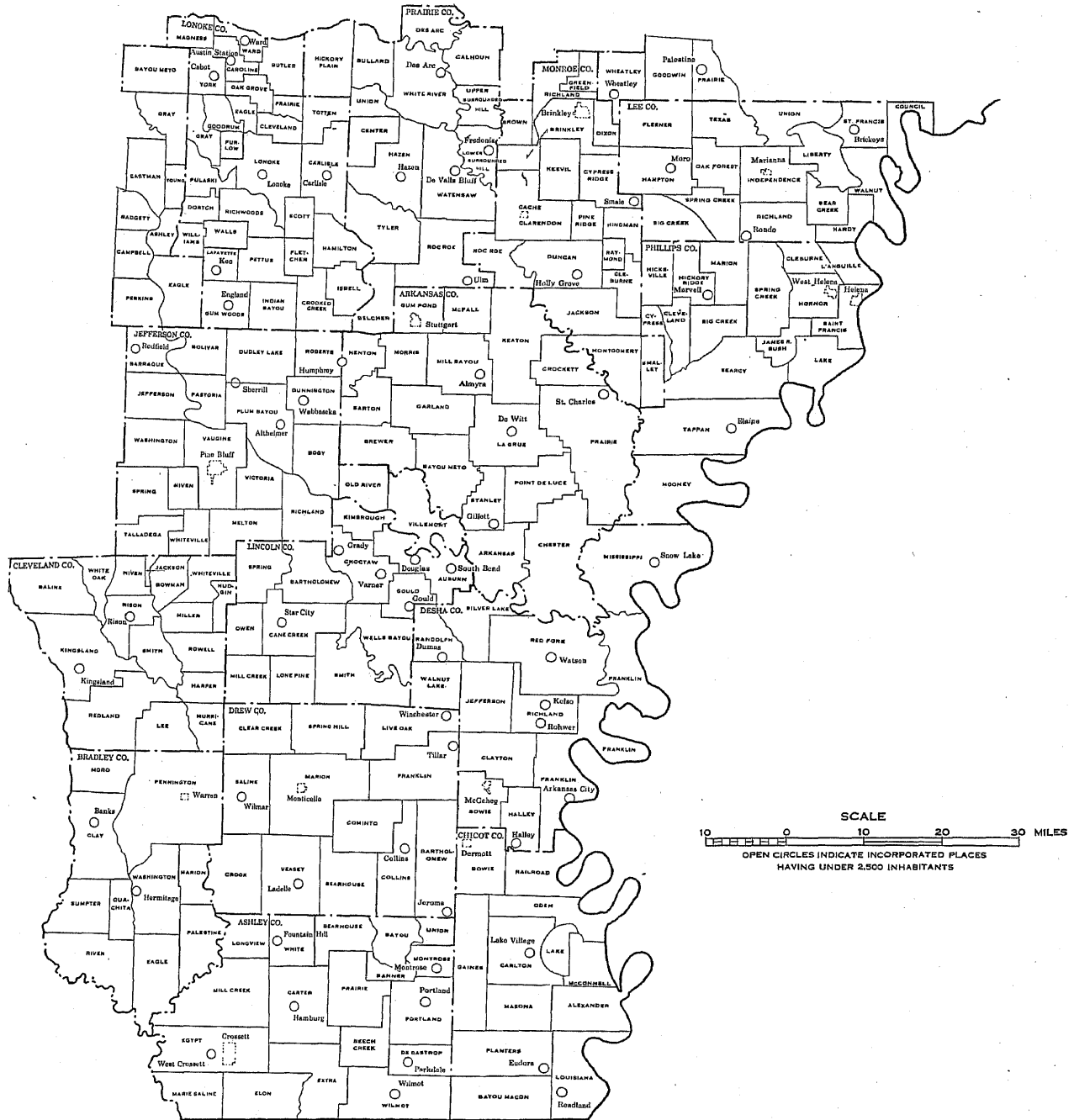

# ARKANSAS

## NUMBER OF INHABITANTS

**Population of the State.**—Arkansas was admitted to the Union as the twenty-fifth State in 1836 with boundaries substantially as at present. It was organized as a Territory in 1819, including then most of the present area of Oklahoma. Its population on April 1, 1940, according to the Sixteenth Census, was 1,949,387, which represents an increase of 94,905, or 5.1 percent, as compared with the population on April 1, 1930. The total land area of the State, as shown in table 3, is 52,725 square miles. The average number of inhabitants per square mile in 1940 was 37.0, as compared with 35.2 in 1930.

Table 1 shows the population of Arkansas from 1810, the year in which the area was first separately enu-

merated, to 1940, together with the increase during each decade. The urban and rural population of the State at each census is presented in this table and is also shown graphically in the accompanying chart. The urban population of Arkansas consists of all persons living in incorporated places of 2,500 or more, the remainder of the population being classified as rural. The urban and rural areas are not necessarily constant from one census to the next, since new places are added to the urban list from time to time as they attain a population of 2,500 or more. Places are likewise taken off the urban list when, through decline in population, they fall below this limit. For example, Clarendon qualified as urban in 1920 and 1940 but not in 1930.

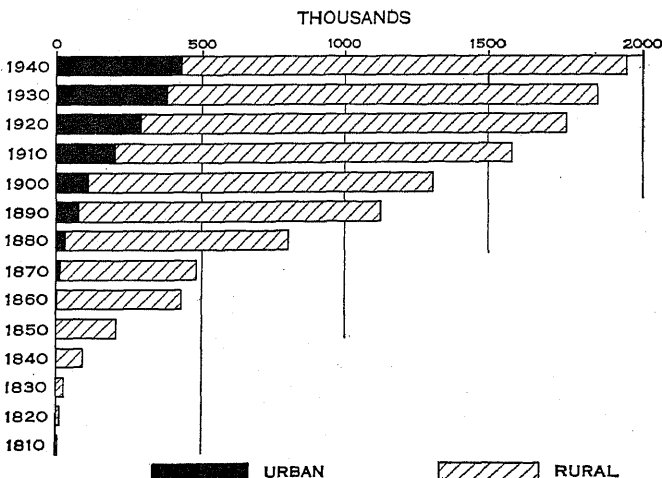

**Geographic subdivisions.**—In tables 2 to 5 the population of Arkansas is shown by counties, townships, cities, and towns, with some comparative figures from previous censuses. Table 6 gives the population of cities by wards, and table 7 presents data for the Little Rock metropolitan district.

**Cities of 10,000 or more.**—There are nine cities in the State that had a population of 10,000 or more in 1940. Table 2 shows the population of these cities at each census for which figures are available, together with the increase or decrease during each decade. Little Rock, the capital and largest city, had a population in 1940 of 88,039.

Counties.—Table 3 shows the population of the 75 counties of Arkansas from 1920 to 1940, together with the land area of each county and its population per square mile in 1940. The land areas given here are the result of new measurements recently compiled and differ somewhat from those published in earlier census reports. Of the 73 counties whose boundaries remained unchanged since 1930, 47 increased in population between 1930 and 1940, and 26 decreased. Part of Desha County was annexed to Chicot in 1931. This table also presents the urban and rural population of each county for 1940 and 1930.

Minor civil divisions.—To the primary political divisions into which the counties are subdivided the Census Bureau applies the general term "minor civil divisions." The primary divisions of the counties in Arkansas are the townships. The incorporated cities and towns form secondary subdivisions of the minor civil divisions in which they are located. There are 76 cities and 336 towns. Ordinarily, each of these secondary divisions, or incorporated places, forms a part of some township (or townships).

Table 4 shows the population of each county by townships, cities, and towns for the last three censuses. The population of the cities and towns is shown in *italics* under the population of the primary divisions in which the places are respectively located. Where an incorporated place is located in two or more townships in the same county, the total population of the place is given in connection with the presentation for the first township. Where the place is situated in two or more counties, the total population is given in connection with each county.

**Metropolitan districts.**—Metropolitan districts have been set up for use in the 1940 Census of Population in connection with each city of 50,000 or more, two or more such cities sometimes being in one district. The general plan is to include in the district, in addition to the central city or cities, all adjacent and contiguous minor civil divisions having a population of 150 or more per square mile. In some metropolitan districts a few less densely populated contiguous divisions are included on the basis of special qualifications. A metropolitan district is thus not a political unit but rather an area including all the thickly settled territory in and around a city or group of cities. It tends to be a more or less integrated area with common economic, social, and, often, administrative interests.

Table 7 shows the population of the Little Rock metropolitan district and its constituent political units in 1940 and 1930, together with the increase during the decade. In 1940 the Little Rock metropolitan district had 126,724 inhabitants, whereas in 1930 the district had a population of 113,137. The metropolitan district in 1940 consisted of exactly the same political units as in 1930.

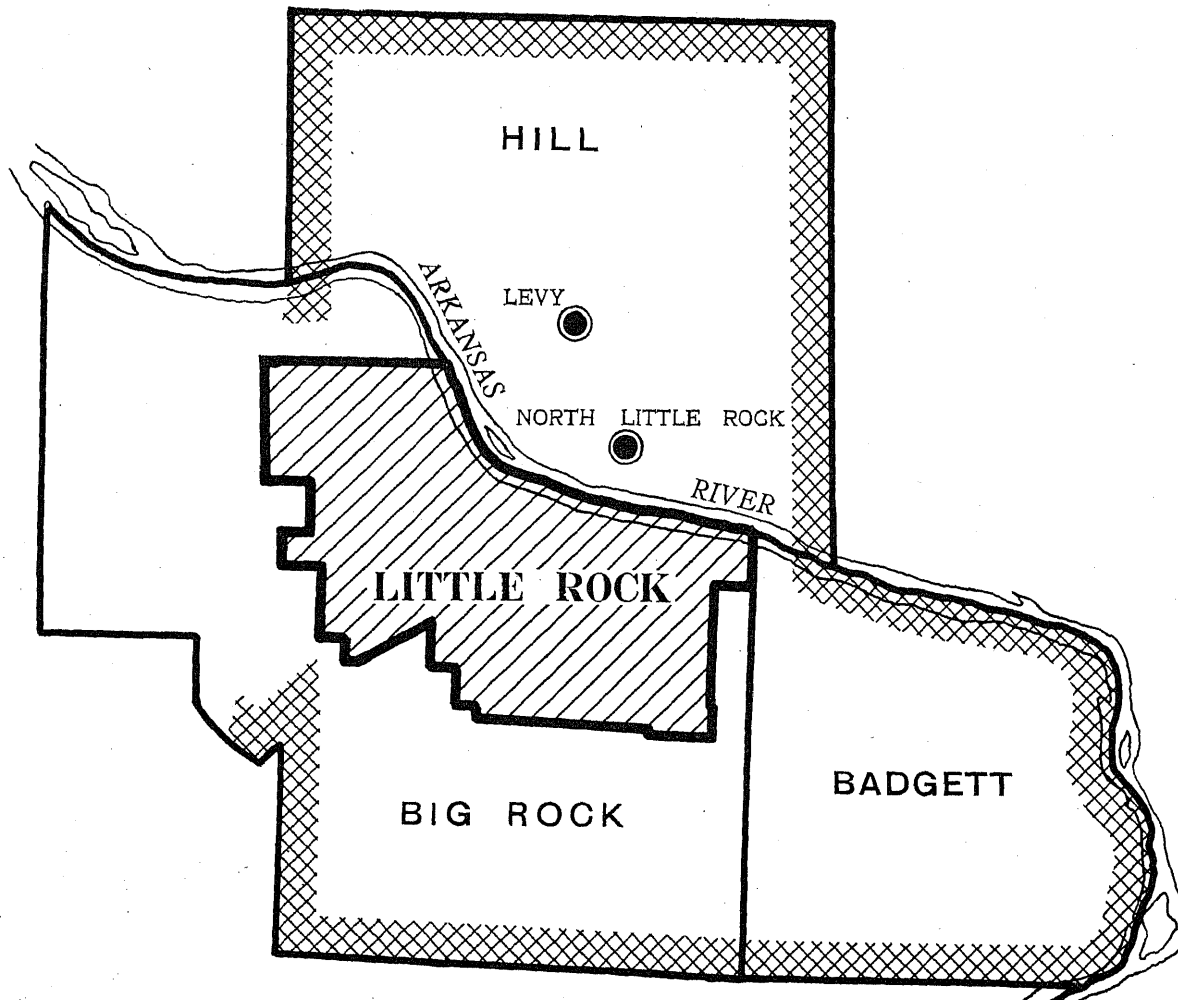
Part of the Memphis metropolitan district is situated in Arkansas. Data for this metropolitan district are presented in the bulletin for Tennessee.

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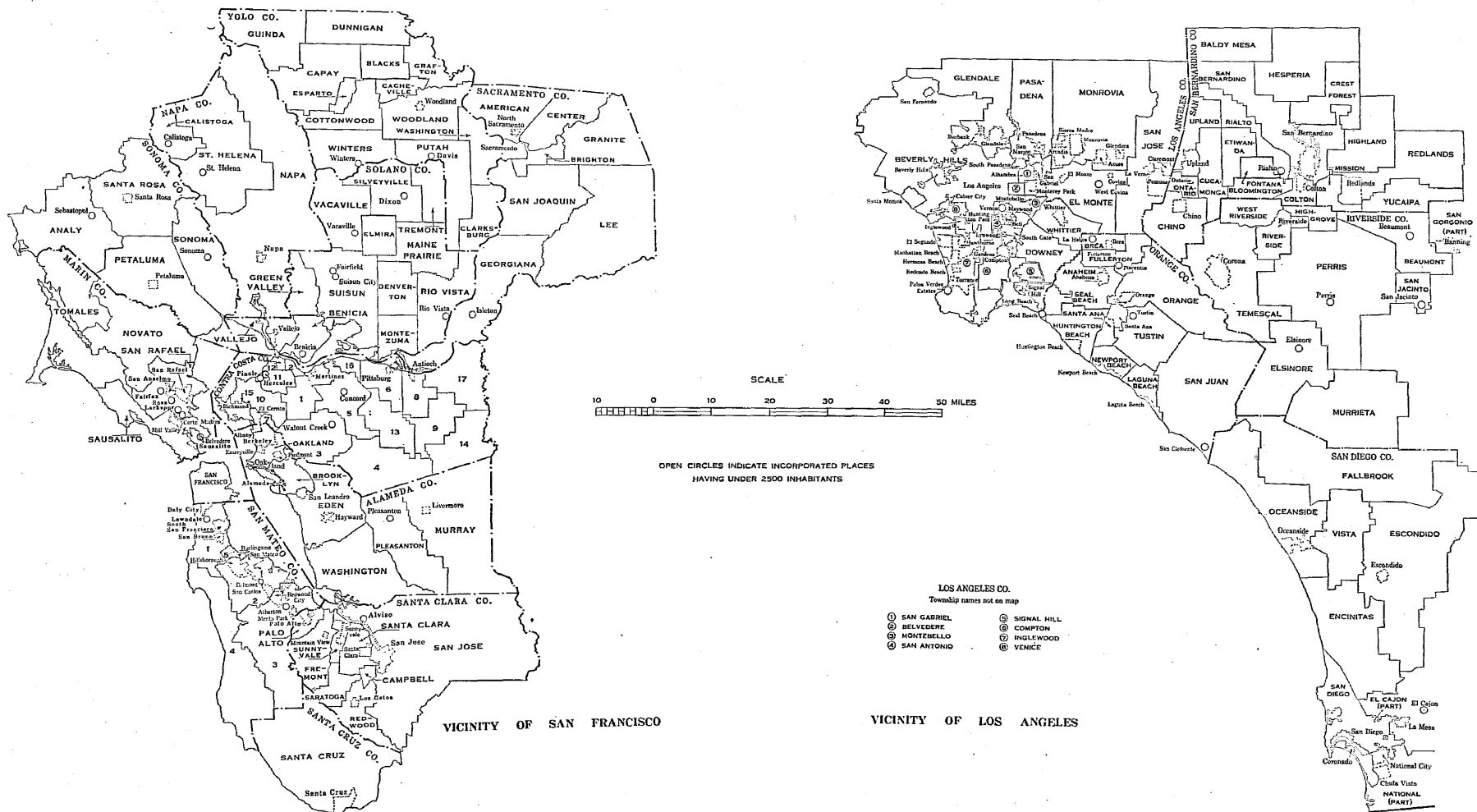






# CALIFORNIA—SAN FRANCISCO AND LOS ANGELES AREAS

## NUMBER OF INHABITANTS

**Population of the State.**—California was organized as a State from a part of the area acquired from Mexico in 1848, and was admitted to the Union as the thirty-first State in 1850, with boundaries as at present. Its population on April 1, 1940, according to the Sixteenth Census, was 6,907,387, which represents an increase of 1,230,136, or 21.7 percent, as compared with the population on April 1, 1930. The total land area of the State, as shown in table 3, is 156,803 square miles. The average number of inhabitants per square mile in 1940 was 44.1, as compared with 36.2 in 1930.

Table 1 shows the population of California from 1850, the year in which its area was first enumerated, to 1940, together with the increase during each decade. The urban and rural population of the State at each census is presented in this table and is also shown graphically in the accompanying chart. The urban

population of California, as defined by the Census Bureau, consists mainly of those persons living in incorporated places of 2,500 or more. It also includes the population of one township (not incorporated as a municipality nor containing any areas so incorporated)<sup>1</sup> that had a total population of more than 10,000 and a population density of more than 1,000 per square mile. The remainder of the population is classified as rural. The urban and rural areas are not necessarily constant from one census to the next, since new places are added to the urban list from time to time as they meet the requirements. Places are likewise taken off the urban list when, through decline in population, they no longer meet the requirements. For example, Benicia qualified as urban in 1920 and 1930, but not in 1910 or 1940.

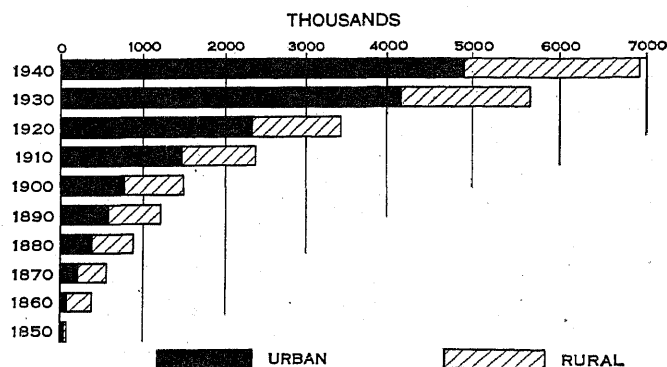

**Geographic subdivisions.**—In tables 2 to 5 the population of California is shown by counties, judicial

townships, cities, and towns, with some comparative figures from previous censuses. Table 6 gives the population of cities by wards or assembly districts. Data for the metropolitan districts are presented in tables 7 to 7-F and for the census tracts of the tracted cities and adjacent areas in tables 8, 8-A, and 8-B.

**Cities of 10,000 or more.**—There are 59 cities in the State that had a population of 10,000 or more in 1940. Table 2 shows the population of these cities at each census for which figures are available, together with the increase or decrease during each decade. Los Angeles, the largest city, had a population in 1940 of 1,504,277; and Sacramento, the capital of the State, had a population of 105,958.

Counties.—Table 3 shows the population of the 53 counties of California from 1920 to 1940, together with the land area of each county and its population per square mile in 1940. The land areas given here are the result of new measurements recently compiled and differ somewhat from those published in earlier census

reports. Fifty-six of these counties increased in population between 1930 and 1940, and two decreased. No new counties have been organized, and there have been no changes in county boundaries since the census of 1930. This table also presents the urban and rural population of each county for 1940 and 1930.

Minor civil divisions.—To the primary political divisions into which the counties are subdivided the Census Bureau applies the general term "minor civil divisions." The primary divisions of the counties in California are called judicial townships. San Francisco is in a class by itself, being incorporated as the "City and County of San Francisco." The incorporated cities (except San Francisco) and towns form secondary subdivisions of the minor civil divisions in which they are located. There are 235 cities (including San Francisco) and 845 towns. Ordinarily, each of the

secondary divisions forms a part of some judicial township (or townships).

Table 4 shows the population of each county by judicial townships, cities, and towns for the last three censuses. The population of the cities and towns is shown in *italics* under the population of the primary divisions in which the places are respectively located. Where an incorporated place is located in two or more judicial townships, the total population of the place is given in connection with the presentation for the first township.

Metropolitan districts.—Metropolitan districts have been set up for use in the 1940 Census of Population in connection with each city of 50,000 or more, two or more such cities sometimes being in one district. The general plan is to include in the district, in addition to the central city or cities, all adjacent and contiguous minor civil divisions or incorporated places having a population of 150 or more per square mile. In some metropolitan districts a few less densely populated contiguous divisions are included on the basis of special qualifications. Only a portion of a minor civil division is included if the minor civil division has a large area and the principal concentration of population is in a small section near the central city with the more remote sections being sparsely settled. In such cases, the

unit considered is not the minor civil division but component enumeration districts. (For example, not all of the enumeration districts in National township of San Diego County are included in the San Diego metropolitan district.) A metropolitan district is thus not a political unit but rather an area including all the thickly settled territory in and around a city or group of cities. It tends to be a more or less integrated area with common economic, social, and, often, administrative interests.

Table 7 shows the population of the Fresno metropolitan district and its constituent political units in 1940. This district was defined for the first time in 1940. For comparison the 1930 population of the units comprising the present district is also shown, together

with the increase between 1930 and 1940. In 1940 the Fresno metropolitan district had 97,504 inhabitants, while in 1930 the same area had a population of 78,118.

Table 7-A shows the population of the Los Angeles metropolitan district and its constituent political units in 1940 and 1930, together with the increase or decrease during the decade. In 1940 the Los Angeles metropolitan district had 2,904,596 inhabitants, while in 1930 the district as then constituted had a population of 2,318,526. Catalina township, in Los Angeles County, which was in the metropolitan district in 1930, was not included in the metropolitan district in 1940. The redistricting of Los Angeles County between 1930 and 1940 necessitated an additional redefinition of the boundaries of the metropolitan district, resulting in a slight increase in the area included in the district. The net effect of these changes was to alter the area of the metropolitan district only slightly; the net effect upon the population increase in the district is not ascertainable.

Table 7-D shows the population of the San Francisco-Oakland metropolitan district and its constituent political units in 1940 and 1930, together with the increase or decrease during the decade. In 1940 the San Francisco-Oakland metropolitan district had 1,428,525 inhabitants, while in 1930 the district as then constituted had a population of 1,290,094. Townships 6, 8, and 16, and part of township 5, all in Contra Costa County, were included in the metropolitan district in 1940 for the first time. Bolinas township, Marin County, which was not included in the district in 1930, was annexed to Sausalito township and is now included; similarly, part of Fremont township, Santa Clara County, not previously included, was annexed to Palo Alto township between 1930 and 1940. The redistricting of San Mateo County necessitated an additional redefinition of the boundaries of the metropolitan district, resulting in a slight increase in the

area included in the district. Finally, the part of Washington township, Alameda County, included in the metropolitan district was increased between 1930 and 1940. The combined effect of all these changes was to increase the area of the metropolitan district considerably, but the effect upon the population increase in the district is not ascertainable.

Table 7-E shows the population of the San Jose metropolitan district and its constituent political units in 1940 and 1930, together with the increase or decrease during the decade. In 1940 the San Jose metropolitan district had 129,367 inhabitants, while in 1930 the district as then constituted had a population of 103,428. That part of Fremont township south of the San Francisco-San Jose Highway was included in the metropolitan district in 1940 for the first time; a part of that part of Fremont township which was in the metropolitan district in 1930 was annexed between 1930 and 1940 to Palo Alto township, outside the metropolitan district, and was not included in the district in 1940. The net effect of these changes was to increase the area of the metropolitan district; the net effect upon the population increase in the district is not ascertainable.

Table 7-F shows the population of the Stockton metropolitan district and its constituent political units in 1940. This district was defined for the first time in

1940. For comparison the 1930 population of the units comprising the present district is also shown, together with the increase between 1930 and 1940. In 1940 the Stockton metropolitan district had 79,337 inhabitants, while in 1930 the same area had a population of 61,880.

**Census tracts.**—Census tracts are small areas into which certain large cities (and sometimes their adjacent areas) have been subdivided for statistical and local administrative purposes, through cooperation with a local committee in each case. Through the use of census tract data, comparisons may be made from census to census. Tracts are laid out with a view to approximate uniformity in population and with some regard for uniformity in area, and each is designed to include an area fairly homogeneous in population characteristics. In table 8 the 1940 population of Los Angeles, Long Beach, and adjacent areas is shown by census tracts. Comparative figures for 1930 are not shown because of extensive revision of tract boundaries since 1930. The tracted area adjacent to Los Angeles and Long Beach comprises the remainder of Los Angeles County. In table 8-A the 1940 population of Oakland, Berkeley, and adjacent areas is shown by census tracts. Since the tracts for Oakland and the adjacent areas were not established until after 1930, there are no comparative figures for earlier censuses. In 1930 there were six tracts (health districts) in Berkeley. The 26 tracts in 1940 represent subdivisions of the original 6, as explained in the footnote on table 8-A. In table 8-B the 1940 population of San Francisco is shown by census tracts. Since these tracts were not established until after 1930, there are no comparative figures for earlier censuses. All the tracted areas are shown on the accompanying maps.

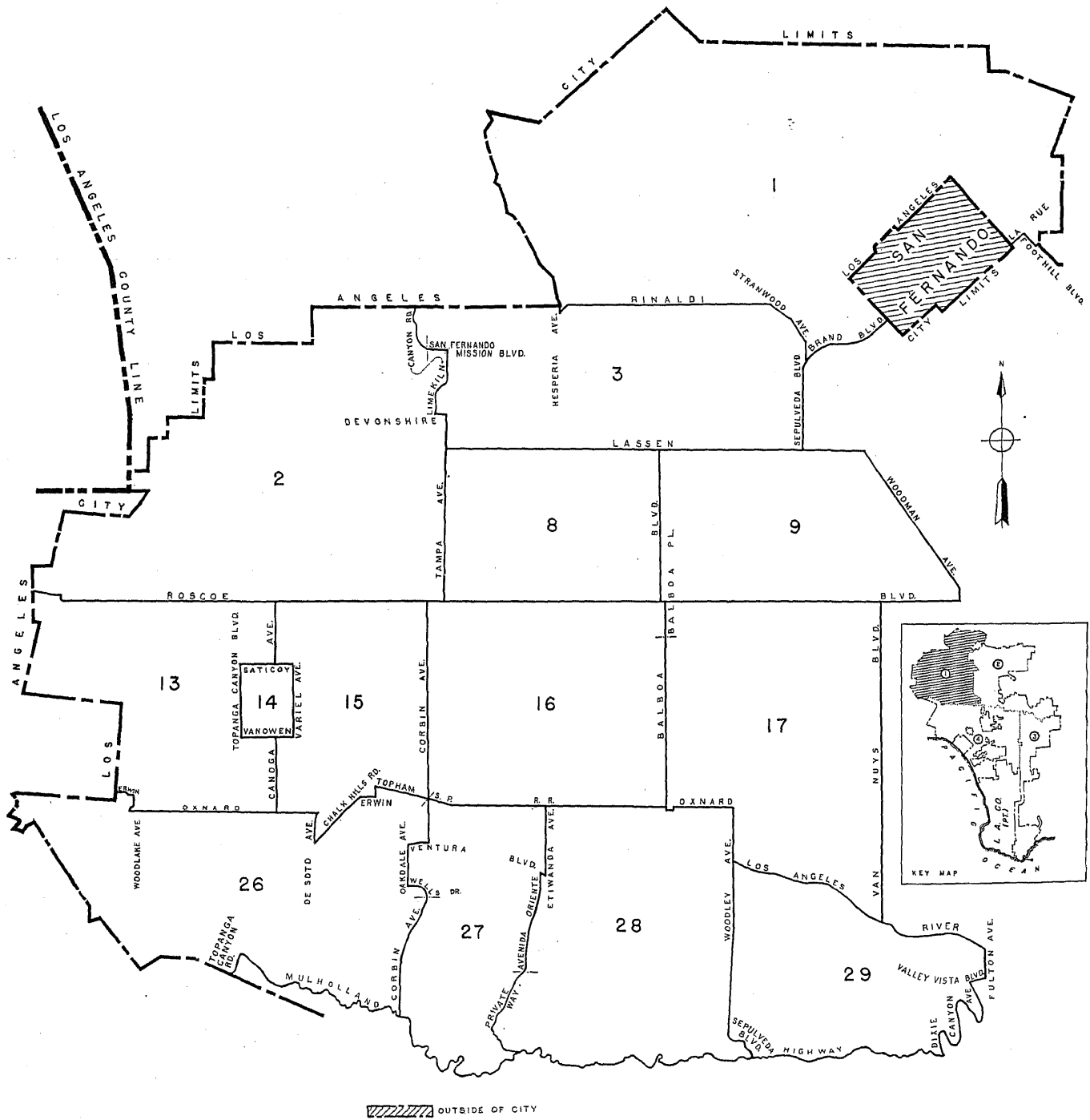

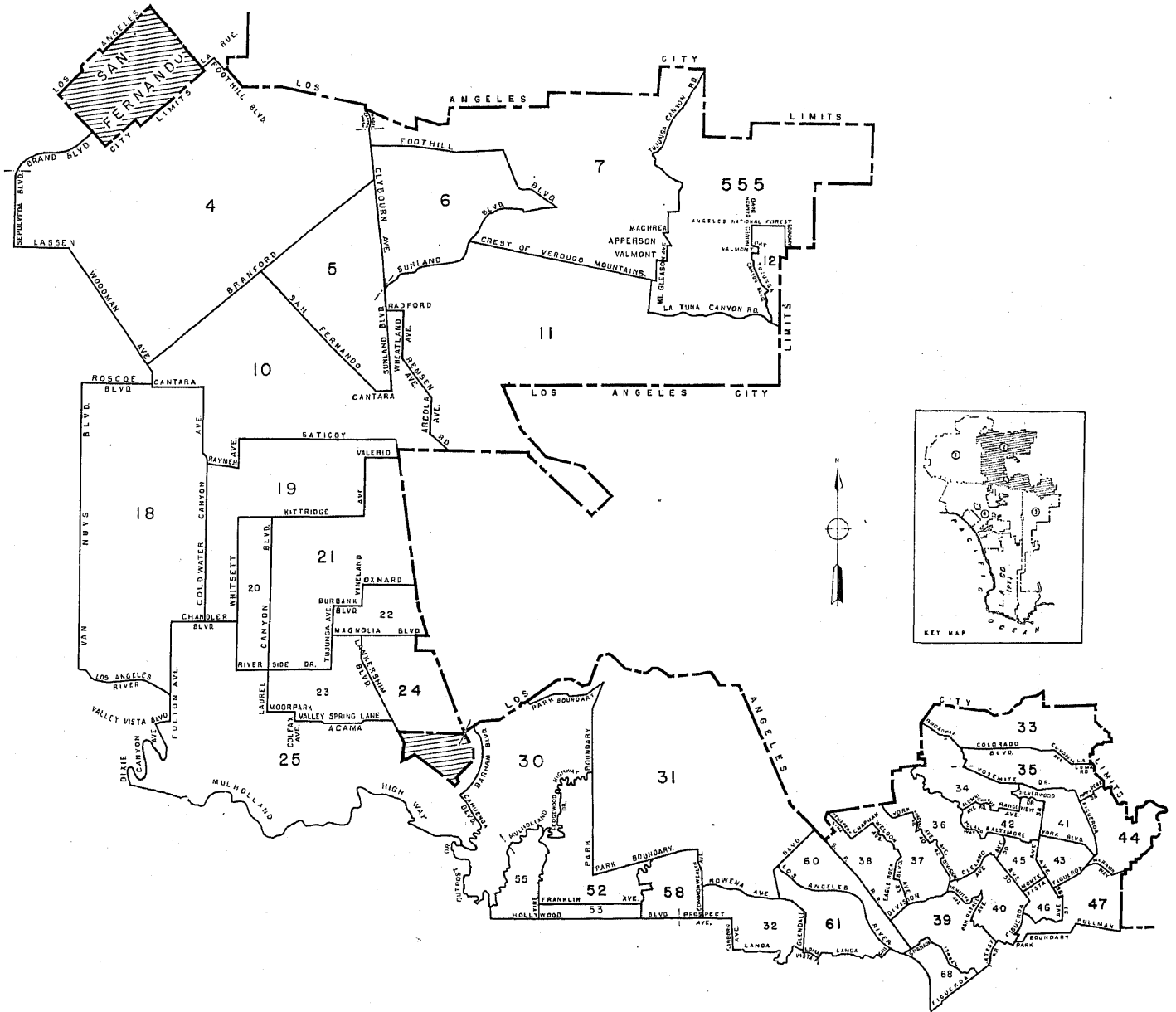

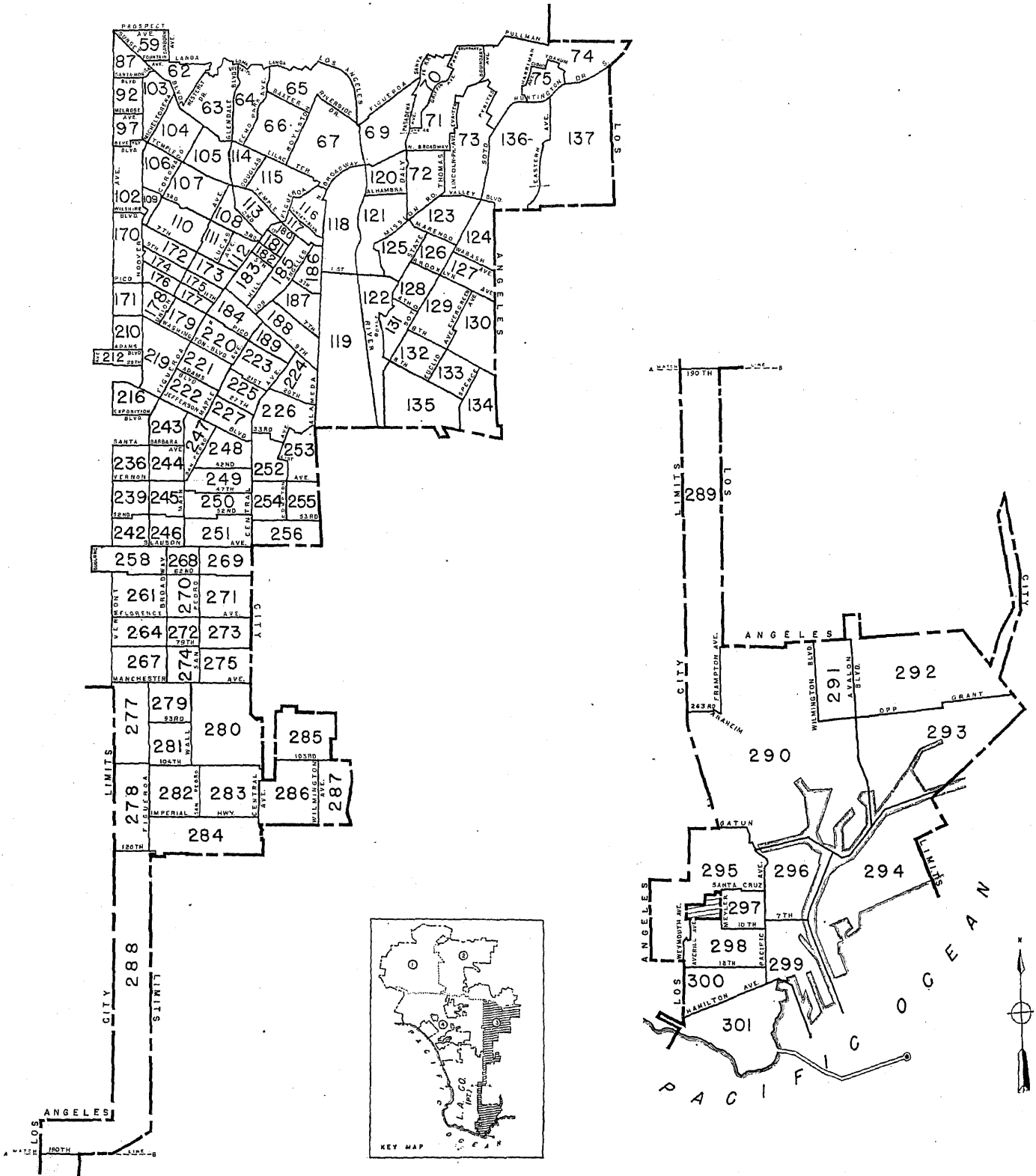
LOS ANGELES AND ADJACENT AREAS BY CENSUS TRACTS

Tracts in Los Angeles city—Part 2



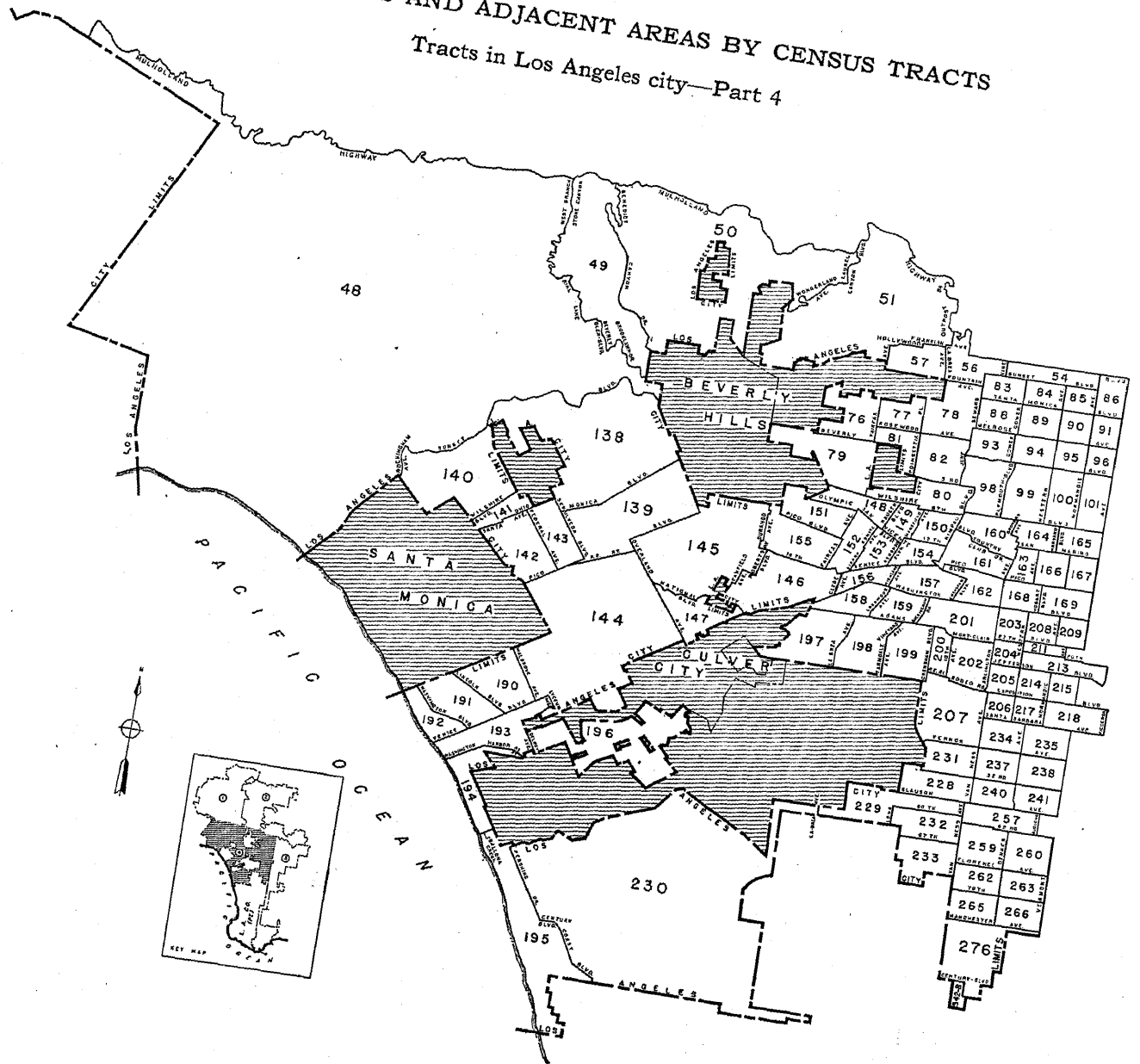

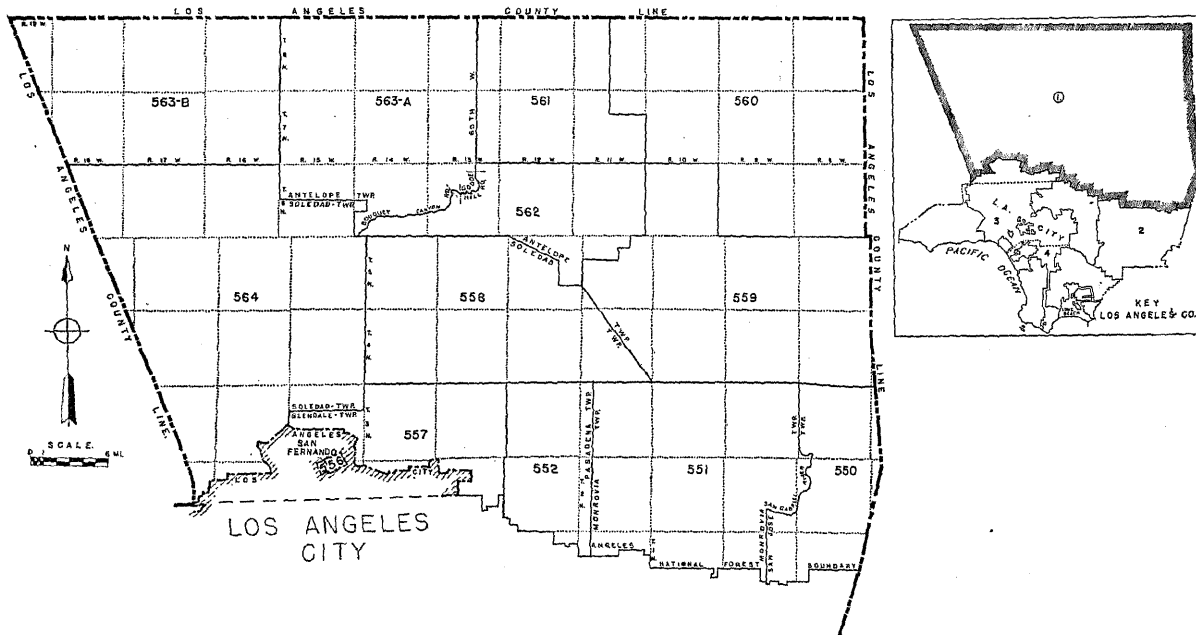

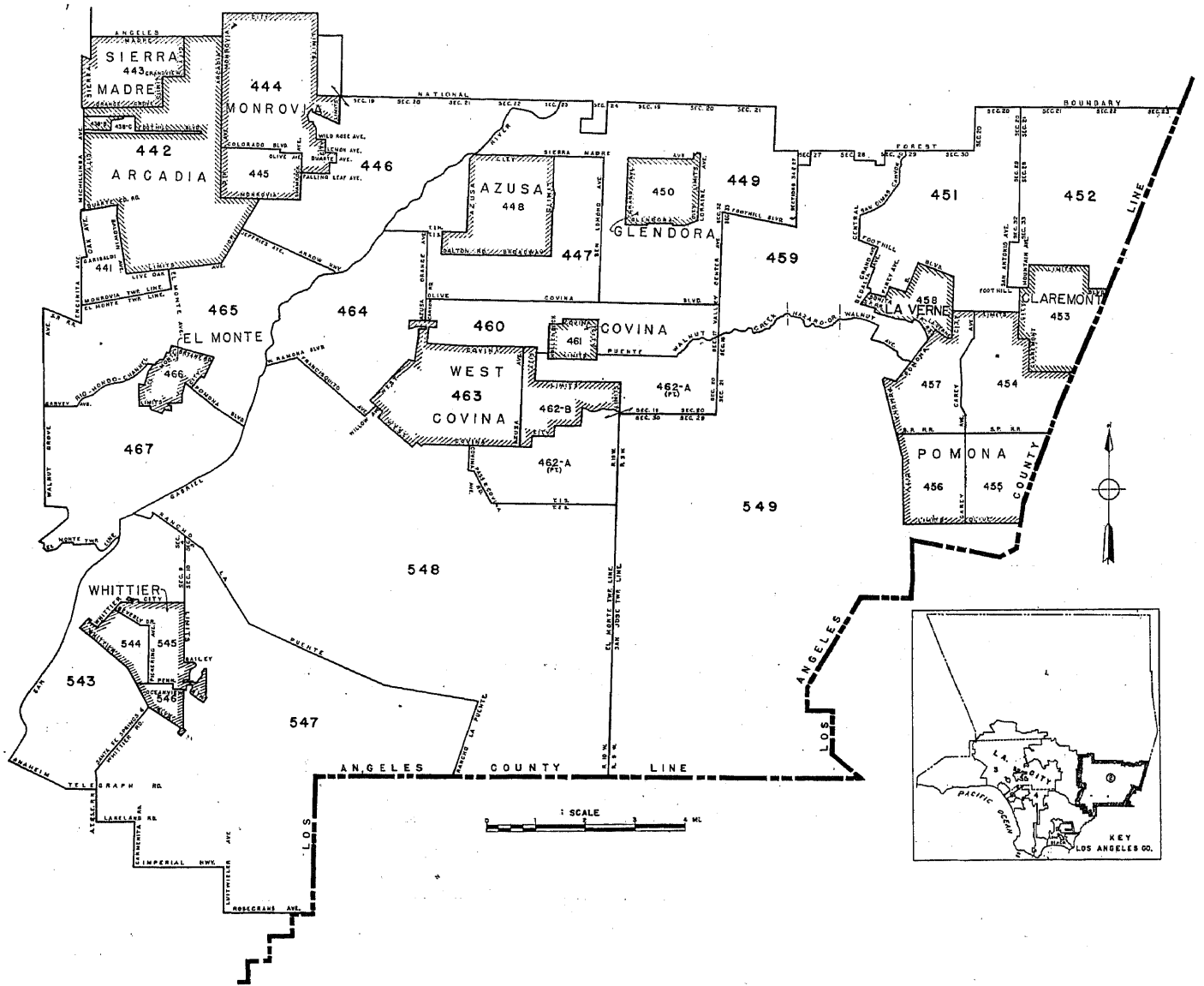


## LOS ANGELES AND ADJACENT AREAS, BY CENSUS TRACTS Tracts in Los Angeles County—Part 1



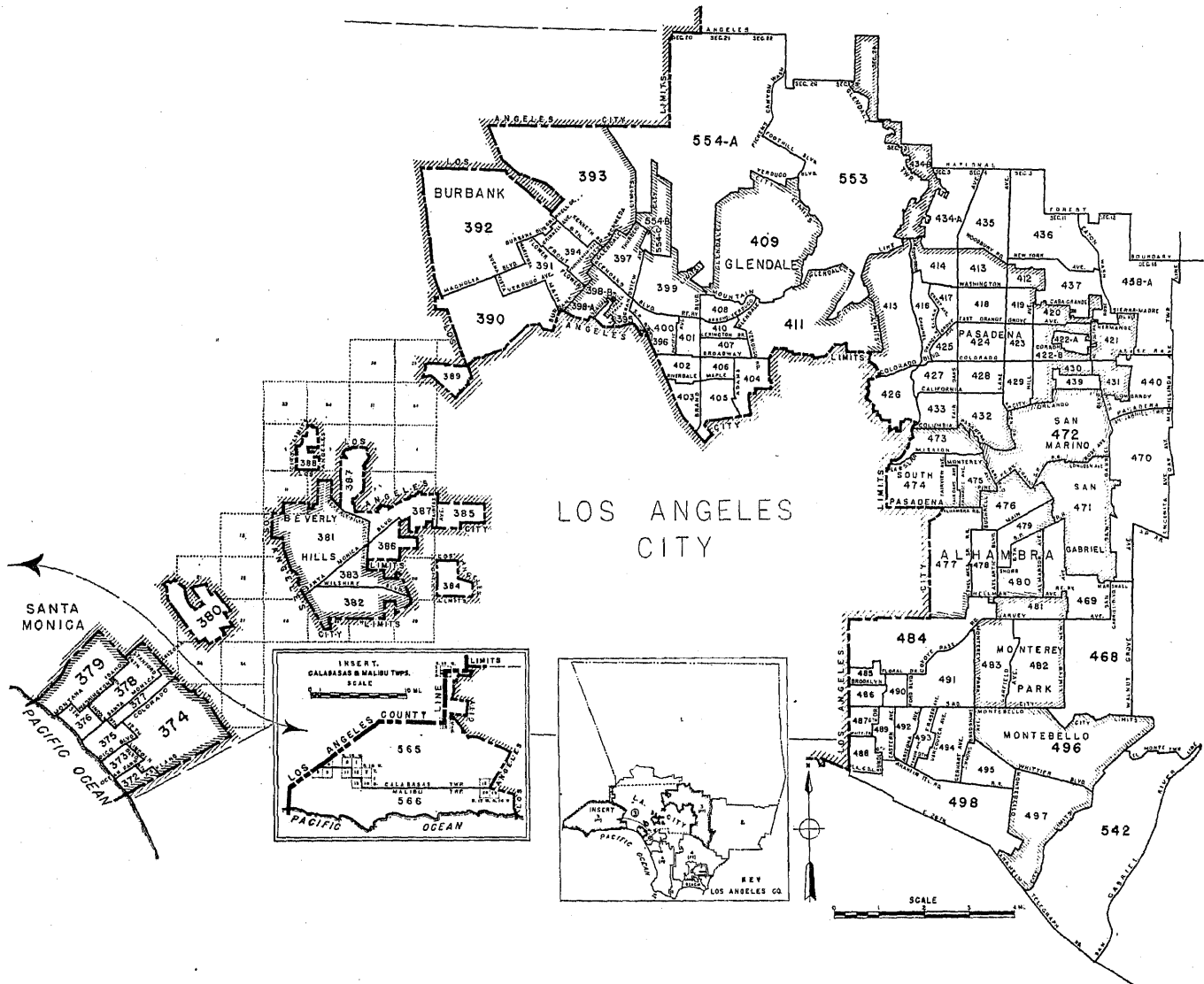

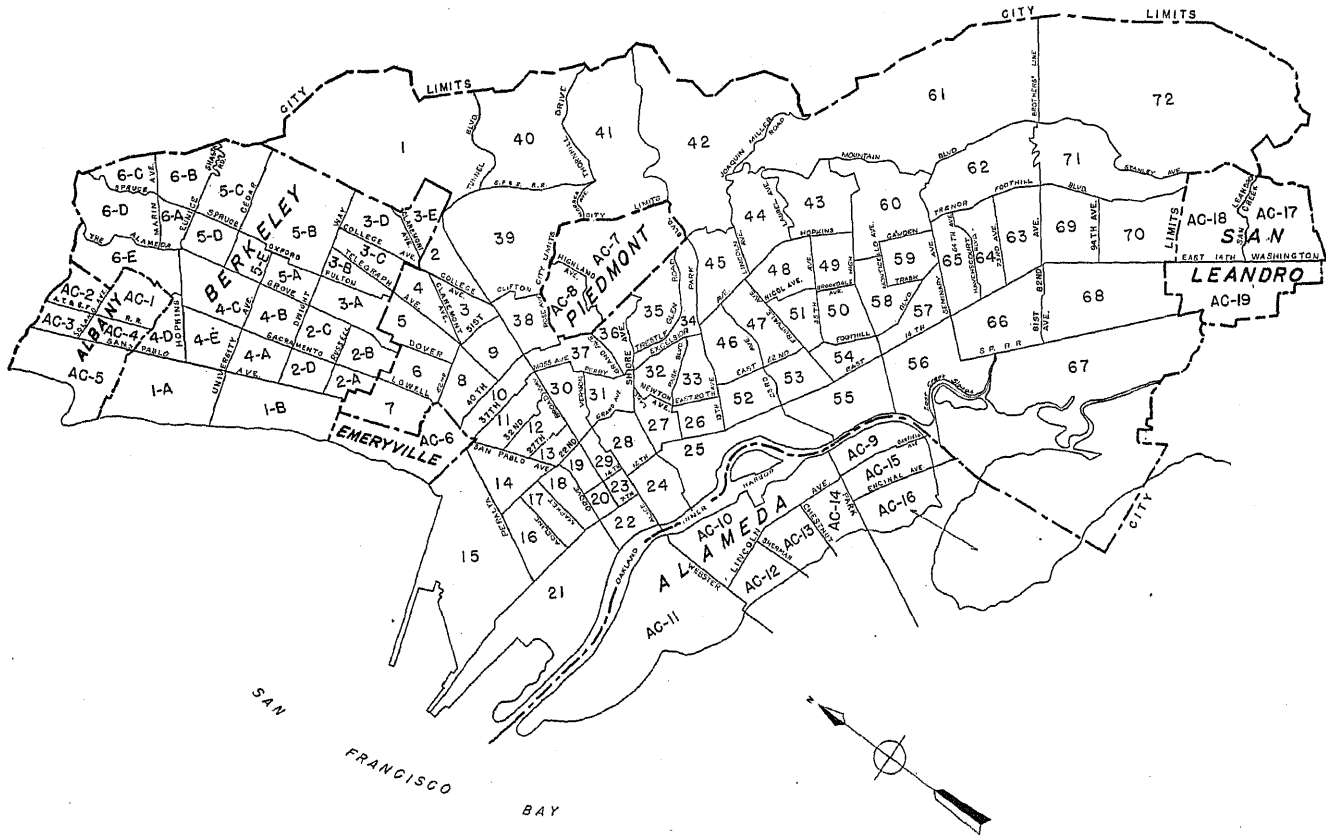

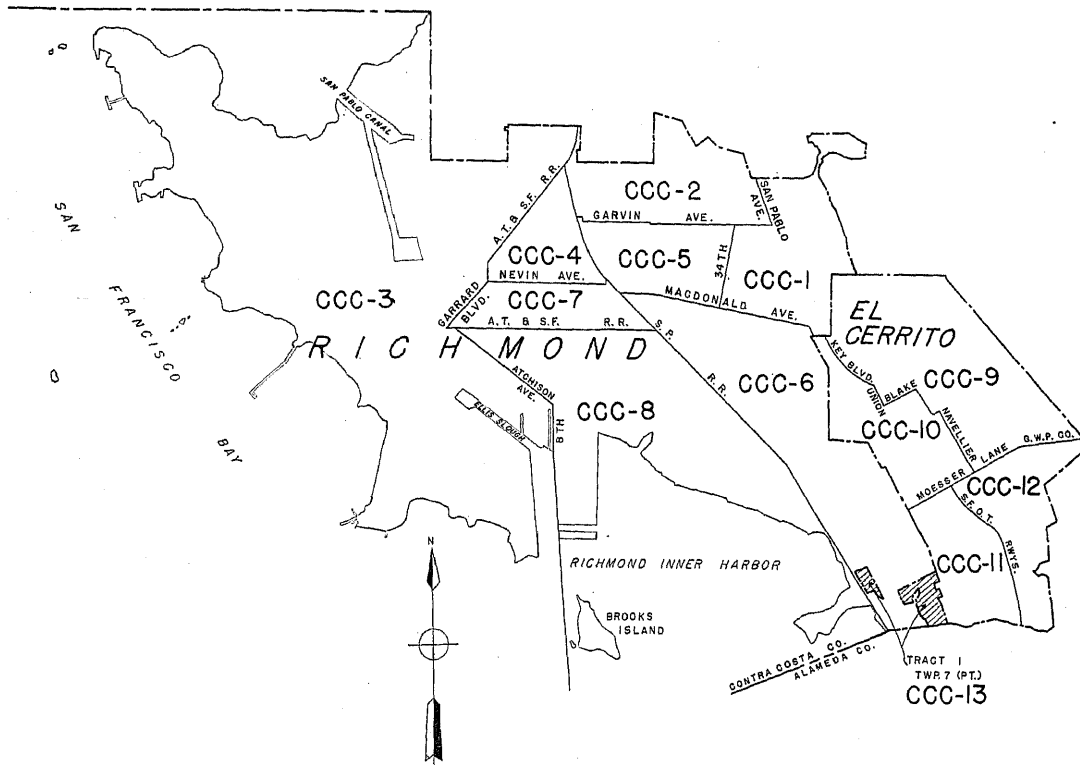
OAKLAND, BERKELEY, AND ADJACENT AREAS, BY CENSUS TRACTS

Tracts in Alameda County



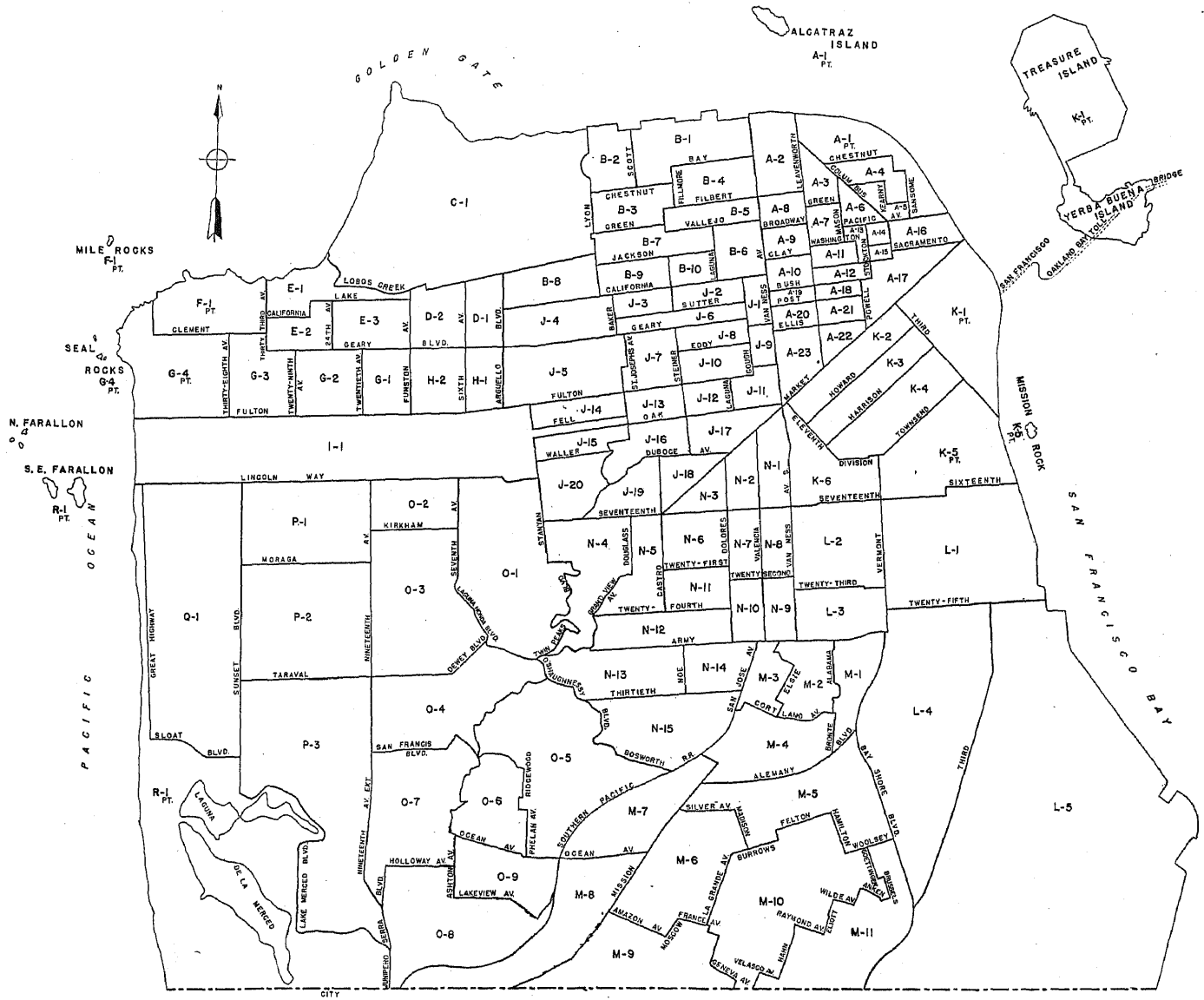
OAKLAND, BERKELEY, AND ADJACENT AREAS, BY CENSUS TRACTS

Tracts in Contra Costa County



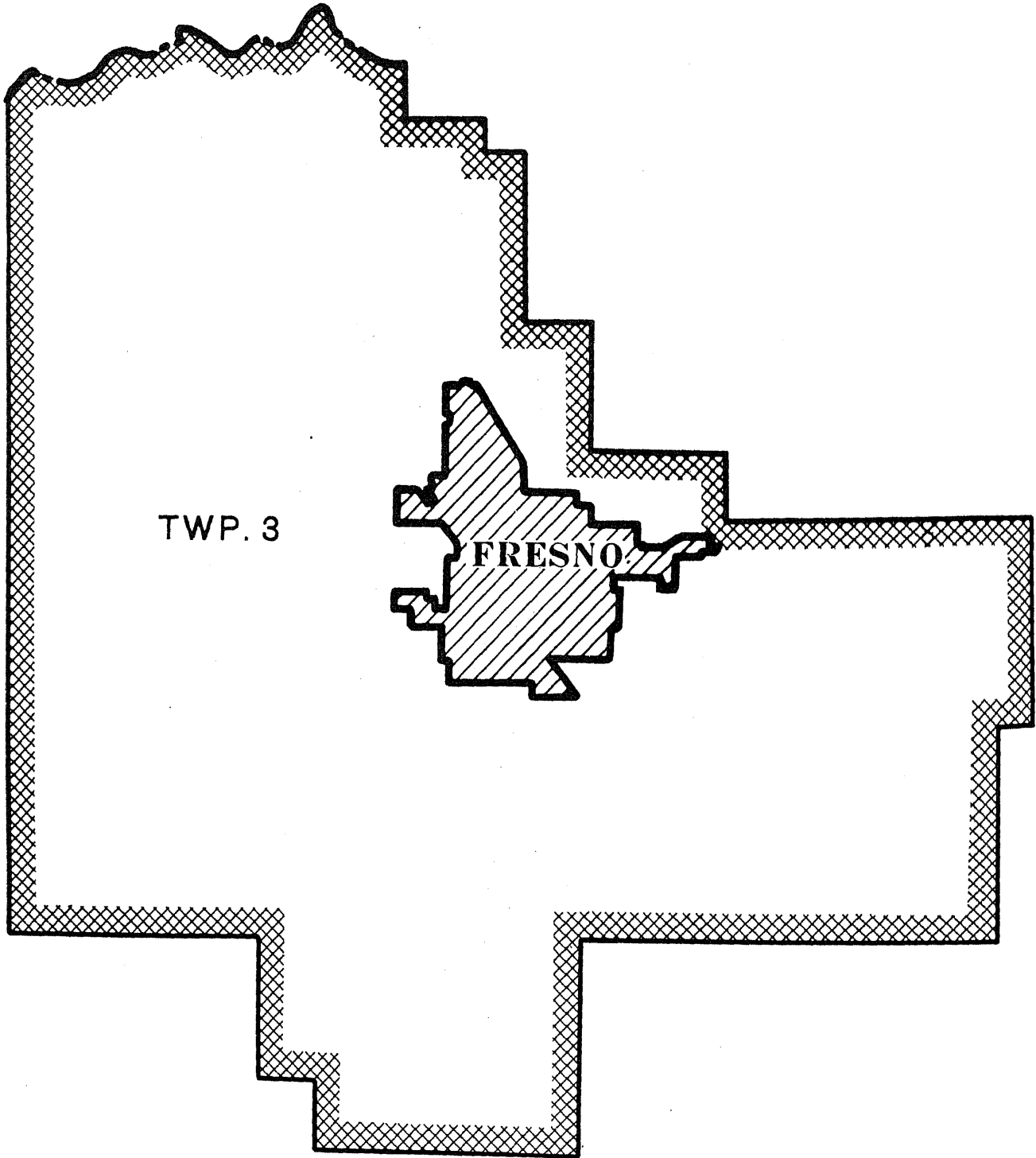


SAN FRANCISCO BY CENSUS TRACTS

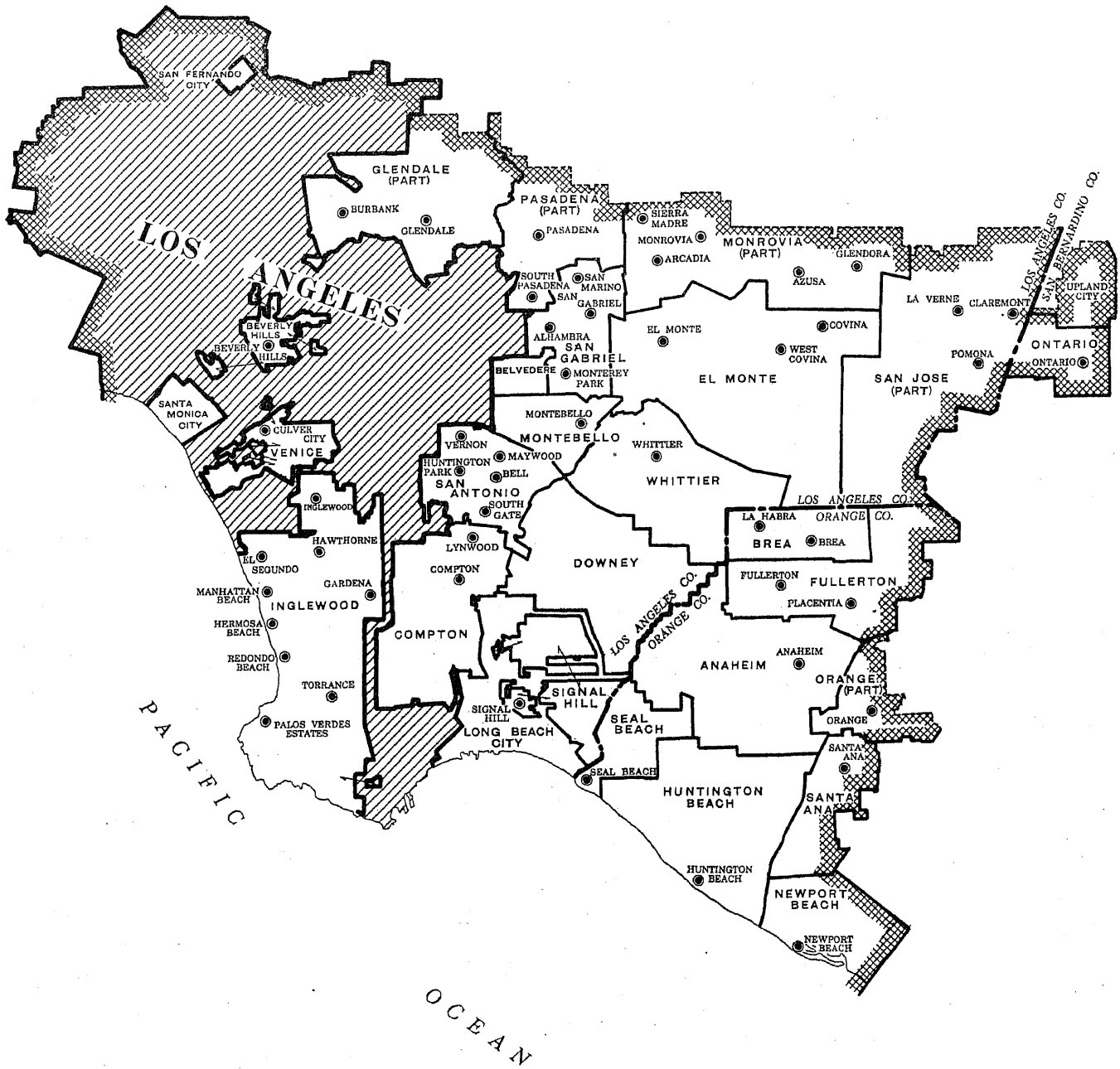

## NUMBER OF INHABITANTS

**Population of the State.**—Colorado was organized as a Territory in 1861 from parts of the Kansas, Nebraska, New Mexico, and Utah Territories. In 1876, without change in boundaries and with boundaries as at present, it was admitted to the Union as the thirty-eighth State. Its population on April 1, 1940, according to the Sixteenth Census, was 1,123,296, which represents an increase of 87,505, or 8.4 percent, as compared with the population on April 1, 1930. The total land area of the State, as shown in table 3, is 103,967 square miles. The average number of inhabitants per square mile in 1940 was 10.8, as compared with 10.0 in 1930.

Table 1 shows the population of Colorado from 1860, the year in which the area now included in the State

was first separately enumerated, to 1940, together with the increase during each decade. The urban and rural population of the State at each census is presented in this table, and is also shown graphically in the accompanying chart. The urban population of Colorado consists of those persons living in incorporated places of 2,500 or more, the remainder of the population being classified as rural. The urban and rural areas are not necessarily constant from one census to the next, since new places are added to the urban list from time to time as they attain a population of 2,500 or more. Places are likewise taken off the urban list when, through decline in population, they fall below this limit. For example, Florence qualified as urban in 1920 and 1940 but not in 1930.

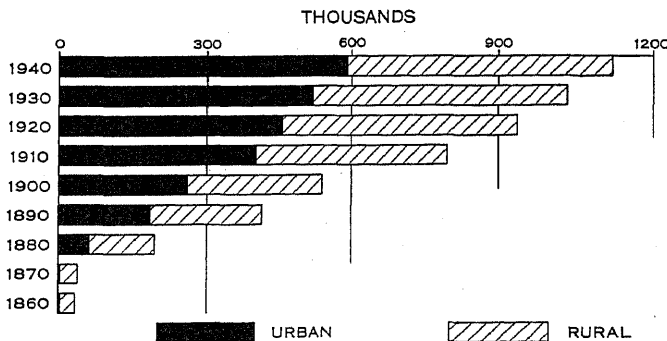

**Geographic subdivisions.**—In tables 2 to 5 the population of Colorado is shown by counties, election precincts, cities, and towns, with some comparative figures from previous censuses. Table 6 gives the population of cities by wards. Data for the Denver and Pueblo metropolitan districts are presented in tables 7 and 7-A and for the census tracts of Denver in table 8.

**Cities of 10,000 or more.**—There are eight cities in the State that had a population of 10,000 or more in 1940. Table 2 shows the population of these cities at each census for which figures are available, together with the increase or decrease during each decade. Denver, the capital and largest city, had a population in 1940 of 322,412.

Counties.—Table 3 shows the population of the 63 counties of Colorado from 1920 to 1940, together with the land area of each county and its population per square mile in 1940. The land areas given here are the result of new measurements recently compiled and differ somewhat from those published in earlier census

reports. Thirty-nine of these counties increased in population between 1930 and 1940, and twenty-four decreased. No new counties have been organized, and there have been no changes in county boundaries since the census of 1930. This table also presents the urban and rural population of each county for 1940 and 1930.

Minor civil divisions.—To the primary political divisions into which the counties are subdivided the Census Bureau applies the general term "minor civil divisions." The primary divisions of the counties in Colorado are the election precincts and some of the cities. (The Consolidated Ute Indian Reservation, in Montezuma County, is also classified as a primary division.) There are 41 cities and 206 towns, of which 5 cities are independent of election precinct organization and form primary divisions of the counties. In addition, Denver is in a class by itself, being incorporated as the "City and County of Denver." The remaining cities and the towns, each of which is a part of one or more precincts, form secondary subdivisions of the minor civil divisions in which they are located.

Table 4 shows the population of each county by election precincts, cities, and towns for the last three censuses. The population of the cities and towns that constitute secondary divisions is shown in *italics* under the population of the primary divisions in which the places are respectively located. Where an incorporated place is located in two or more precincts in the same county, the total population of the place is given in connection with the presentation for the first precinct. Where the place is situated in two or more counties, the total population is given in connection with each county. The population of the cities that comprise several entire precincts is shown in roman type, followed by the precinct population in *italic* type.

Metropolitan districts.—Metropolitan districts have been set up for use in the 1940 Census of Population in connection with each city of 50,000 or more, two or more such cities sometimes being in one district. The general plan is to include in the district, in addition to the central city or cities, all adjacent and contiguous minor civil divisions or incorporated places having a population of 150 or more per square mile. In some metropolitan districts a few less densely populated contiguous divisions are included on the basis of special qualifications. Only a portion of a minor civil division is included if the minor civil division has a large area and practically all of the population is concentrated in a small section in or near the central city with the more remote sections being very sparsely settled. In such cases, the unit considered is not the minor civil division but component enumeration districts. (For example, not all of the enumeration districts in precincts 1, 9, 14, 34, and 35, of Pueblo County are included in the Pueblo metropolitan district.) A

metropolitan district is thus not a political unit but rather an area including all the thickly settled territory in and around a city or group of cities. It tends to be a more or less integrated area with common economic, social, and, often, administrative interests.

Table 7 shows the population of the Denver metropolitan district and its constituent political units in 1940 and some comparative figures for 1930, together with the increase or decrease during the decade. In 1940 the Denver metropolitan district had 384,372 inhabitants, whereas in 1930 the district as then constituted had a population of 330,761. Precinct 28, Baker, in Adams County, was included in the metropolitan district in 1940 for the first time. The re-districting of Arapahoe County also resulted in a net increase in the part included in the metropolitan district. The increase in the population of the metropolitan district attributable to the total change in area included is thus not obtainable.

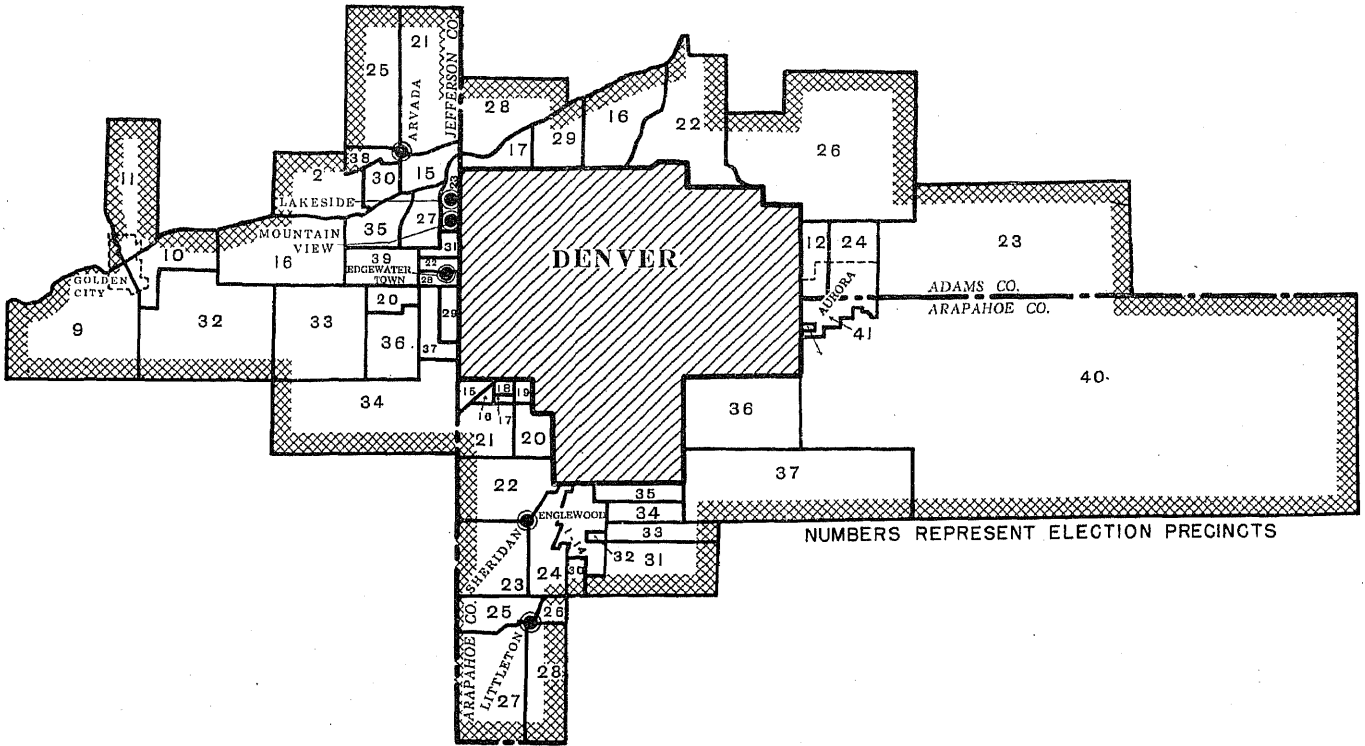
Census tracts.—Census tracts are small areas into which certain large cities are subdivided, for statistical and local administrative purposes, through cooperation with a local committee in each case. The tracts are permanently established, so that comparisons may be made from census to census; they are laid out with a view to approximate uniformity in population and with some regard for uniformity in area; and each is designed to include an area fairly homogeneous in population characteristics. In table 8 the 1940 population of Denver is shown by census tracts. Since these tracts were not established until after 1930, there are no comparative figures for earlier censuses. The census tracts for Denver are shown on the accompanying map.

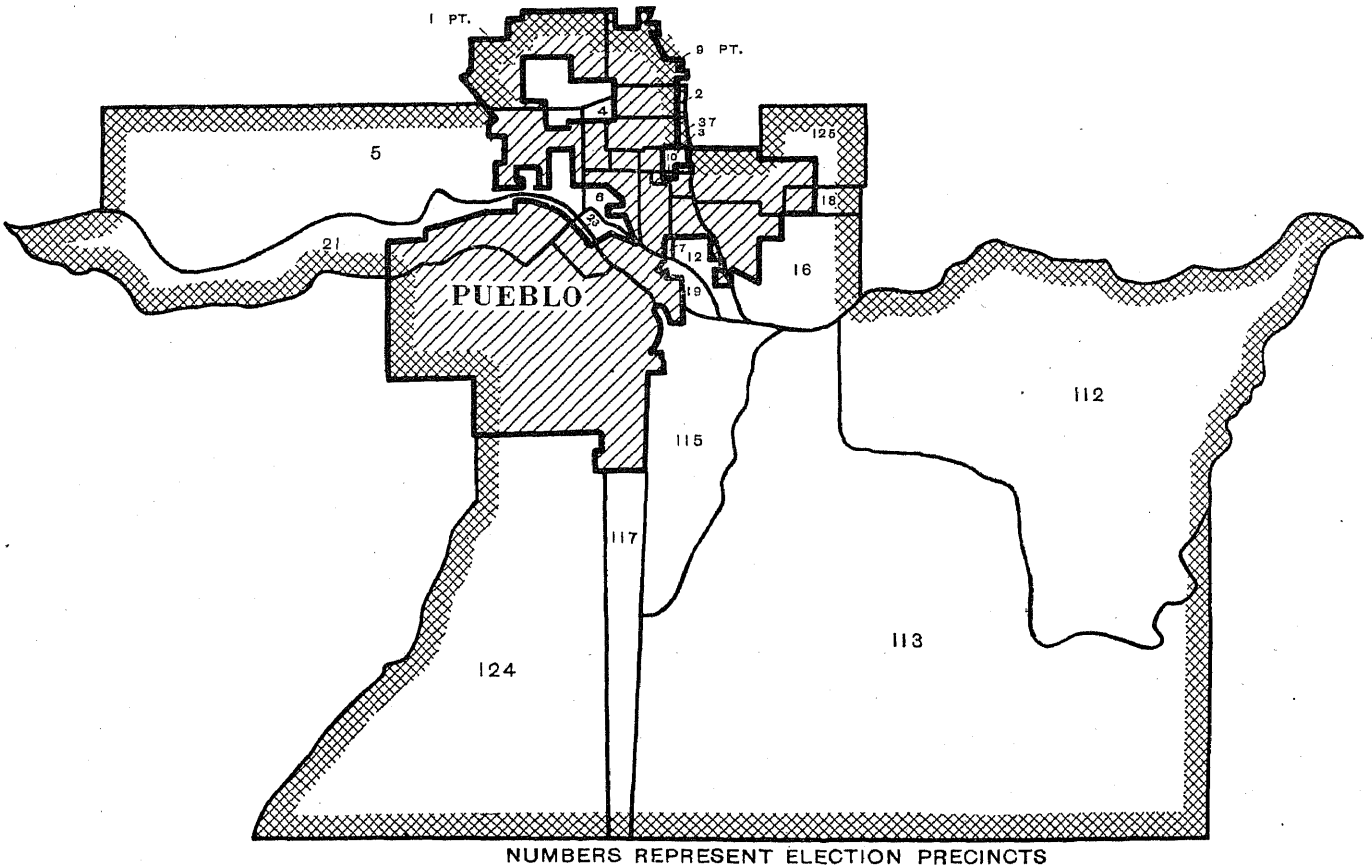

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# CONNECTICUT

## NUMBER OF INHABITANTS

**Population of the State.**—Connecticut was one of the Thirteen Original States. Its population on April 1, 1940, according to the Sixteenth Census, was 1,709,242, which represents an increase of 102,339, or 6.4 percent, as compared with the population on April 1, 1930. The total land area of the State, as shown in table 3, is 4,899 square miles. The average number of inhabitants per square mile in 1940 was 348.9, as compared with 328.0 in 1930.

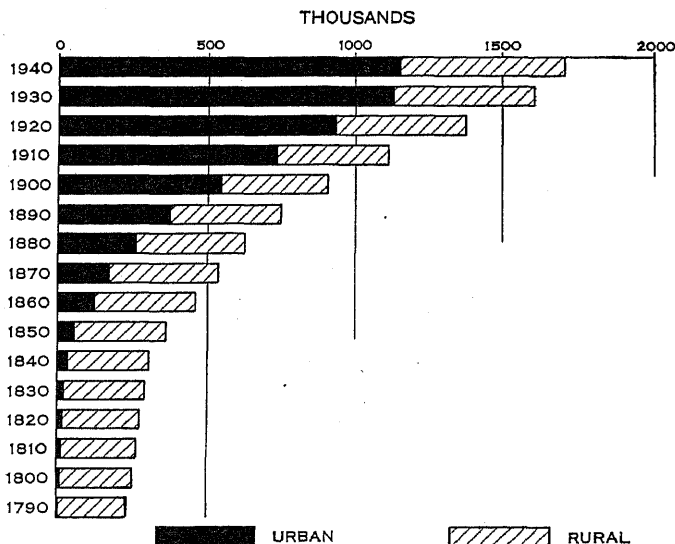
Table 1 shows the population of Connecticut from 1790, the year of the first Federal census, to 1940, together with the increase during each decade. The urban and rural population of the State at each census is presented in this table and is also shown graphically

in the accompanying chart. The urban population of Connecticut, as defined by the Census Bureau, consists mainly of those persons living in incorporated places of 2,500 or more. It also includes the population of four towns (not incorporated as municipalities nor containing any areas so incorporated) that had a total population of 10,000 or more and a population density of 1,000 or more per square mile. The remainder of the population is classified as rural. The urban and rural areas are not necessarily constant from one census to the next, since new places are added to the urban list from time to time as they meet the requirements. Places are likewise taken off the urban list when, through decline in population, they no longer meet the requirements.

**Geographic subdivisions.**—In tables 2 to 5 the population of Connecticut is shown by counties, towns, cities, and boroughs, with some comparative figures from previous censuses. Table 6 gives the population of incorporated places by wards. Data for the metropolitan districts are presented in tables 7 to 7-C and for the census tracts of Hartford and its adjacent areas, and of New Haven in tables 8 and 8-A, respectively.

**Incorporated places of 10,000 or more.**—There are 20 incorporated places in the State that had a population of 10,000 or more in 1940. Table 2 shows the population of these incorporated places at each census for which figures are available, together with the increase or decrease during each decade. Hartford, the capital and largest city, had a population in 1940 of 166,267.

Counties.—Table 3 shows the population of the eight counties of Connecticut from 1920 to 1940, together with the land area of each county and its population per square mile in 1940. The land areas given here are the result of new measurements recently compiled and differ somewhat from those published in earlier

census reports. All eight of these counties increased in population between 1930 and 1940. No new counties have been organized, and there have been no changes in county boundaries since the census of 1930. This table also presents the urban and rural population of each county for 1940 and 1930.

Minor civil divisions.—To the primary political divisions into which the counties are subdivided the Census Bureau applies the general term "minor civil divisions." The primary divisions of the counties in Connecticut are the towns. The incorporated cities and boroughs in some cases form secondary subdivisions of the minor civil divisions in which they are located and in other cases are coextensive with them. There are 21 cities

and 17 boroughs. Ordinarily, each of these secondary divisions forms a part of some town. Fourteen cities and one borough are coextensive with the towns in which they are located.

Table 4 shows the population of each county by towns, cities, and boroughs for the last three censuses. The population of the cities and boroughs is shown in *italics* under the population of the primary divisions in which the places are respectively located.

**Metropolitan districts.**—Metropolitan districts have been set up for use in the 1940 Census of Population in connection with each city of 50,000 or more, two or more such cities sometimes being in one district. The general plan is to include in the district, in addition to the central city or cities, all adjacent and contiguous minor civil divisions having a population of 150 or more per square mile. In some metropolitan districts a few less densely populated contiguous divisions are included on the basis of special qualifications. A metropolitan district is thus not a political unit but rather an area including all the thickly settled territory in and around a city or group of cities. It tends to be a more or less integrated area with common economic, social, and, often, administrative interests. The following tables give data for the four metropolitan districts with central cities in Connecticut. Parts of the New York-Northeastern New Jersey and Springfield-Holyoke metropolitan districts are also situated in Connecticut; data for these districts are presented in the bulletins for New York and Massachusetts, respectively.

Table 7 shows the population of the Bridgeport metropolitan district and its constituent political units in 1940 and 1930, together with the increase during the decade. In 1940 the Bridgeport metropolitan district had 216,621 inhabitants, whereas in 1930 the district had a population of 203,969. The metropolitan district in 1940 had exactly the same area as in 1930.

Census tracts.—Census tracts are small areas into which certain large cities and sometimes their adjacent areas are subdivided for statistical and local administrative purposes, through cooperation with a local committee in each case. Through the use of census tract data comparisons may be made from census to census. Tracts are laid out with a view to approximate uniformity in population and with some regard for uniformity in area, and each is designed to include an area fairly homogeneous in population characteristics. In table 8 the 1940 population of Hartford and some adjacent areas in Hartford County is shown by census tracts. Since these tracts were not established until after 1930, there are no comparative figures for earlier censuses. In table 8-A the 1940 and 1930 population of New Haven is shown by census tracts. The tracted areas are shown on the accompanying maps.

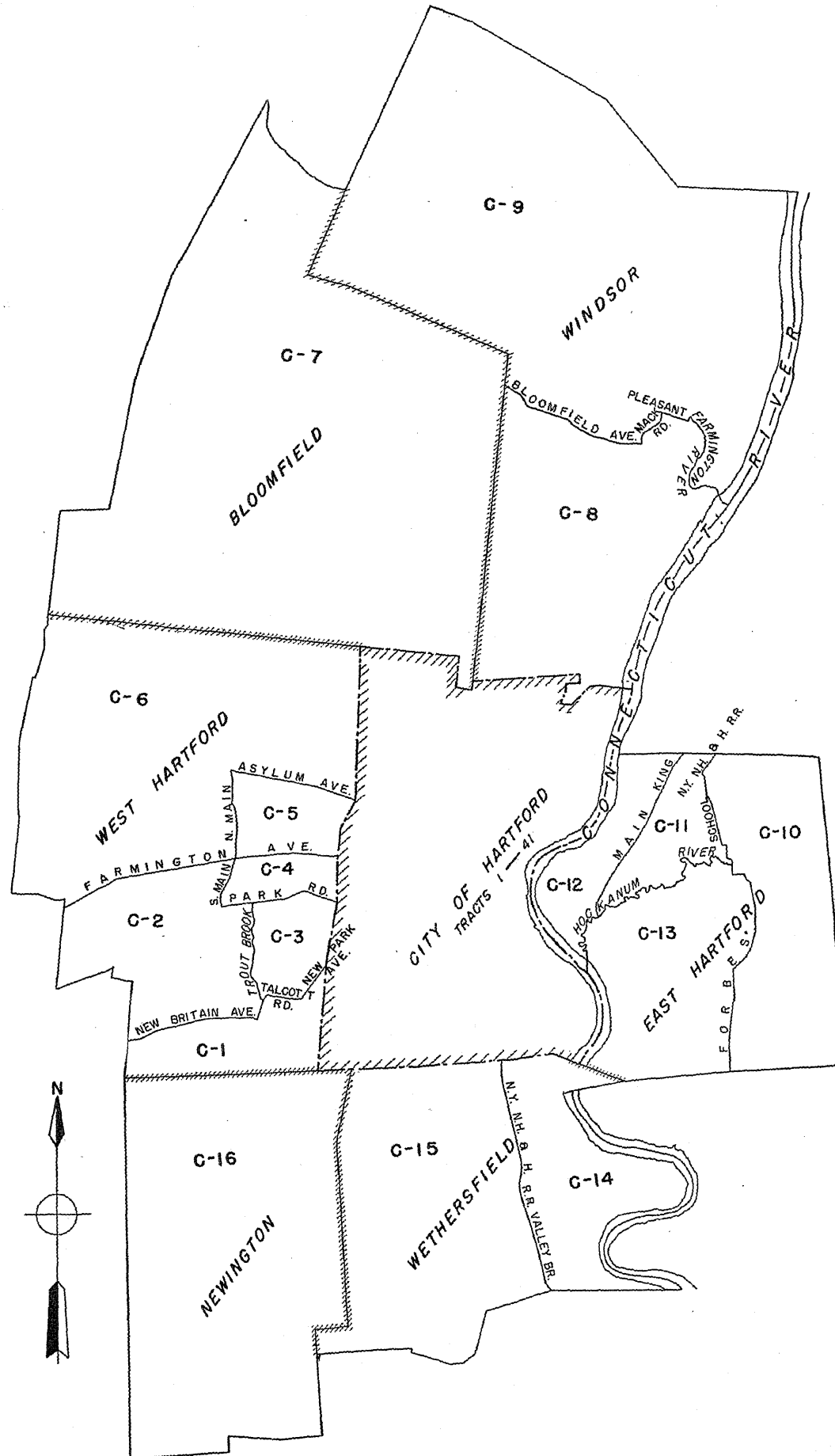

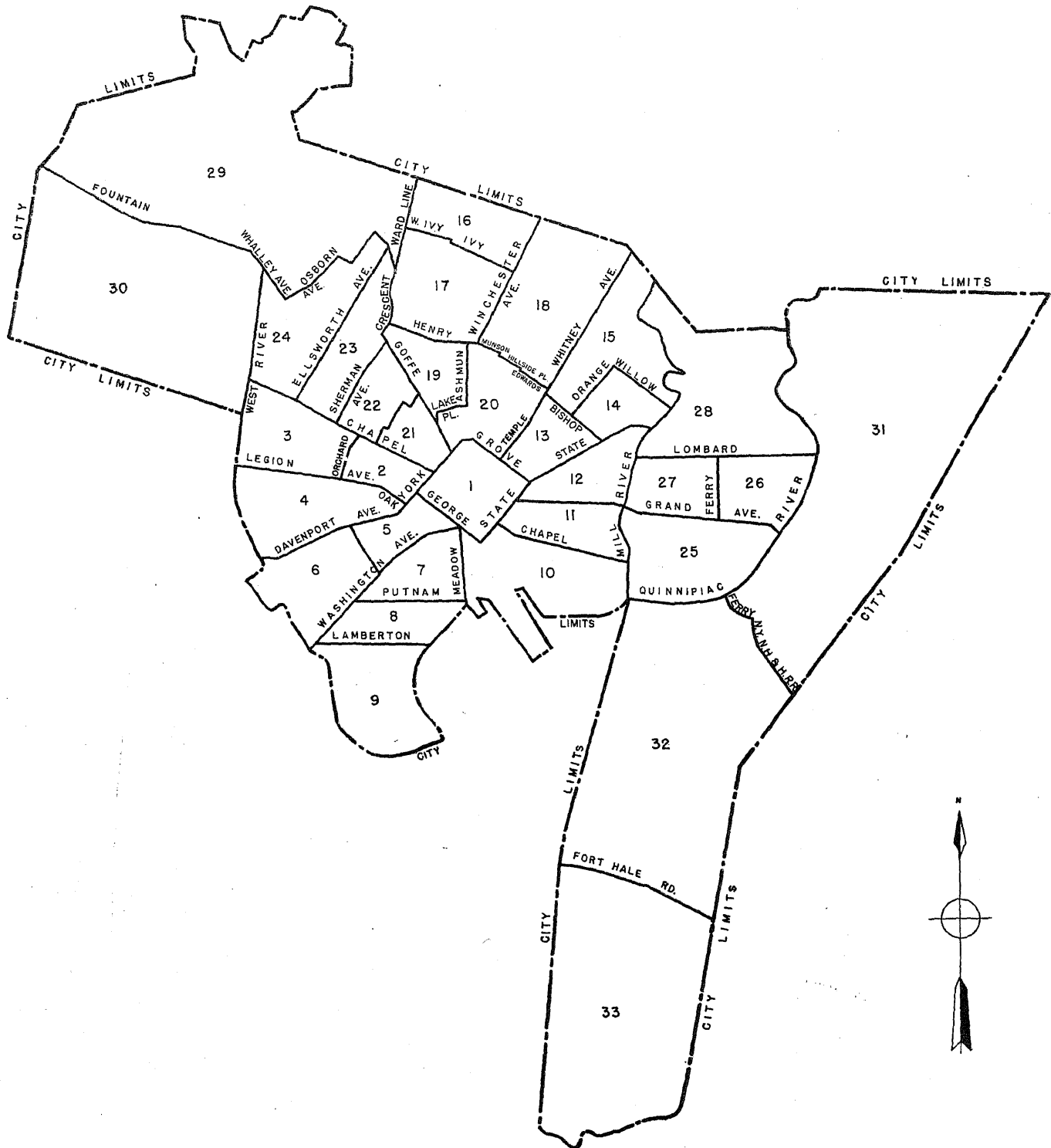

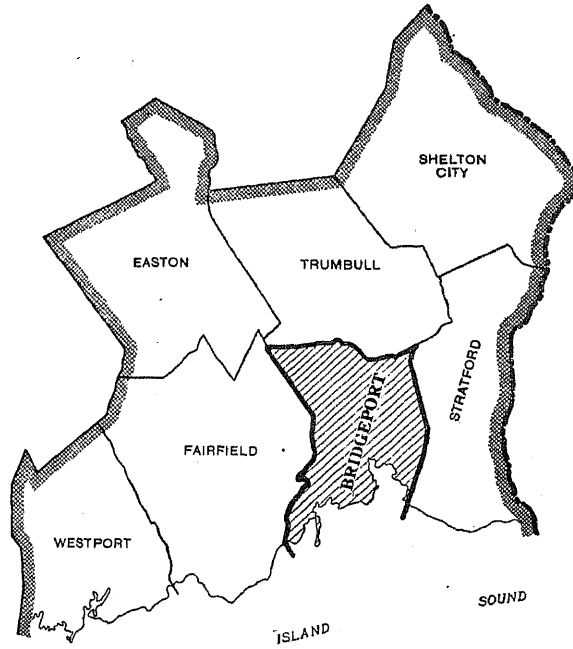
HARTFORD AND ADJACENT AREAS BY CENSUS TRACTS



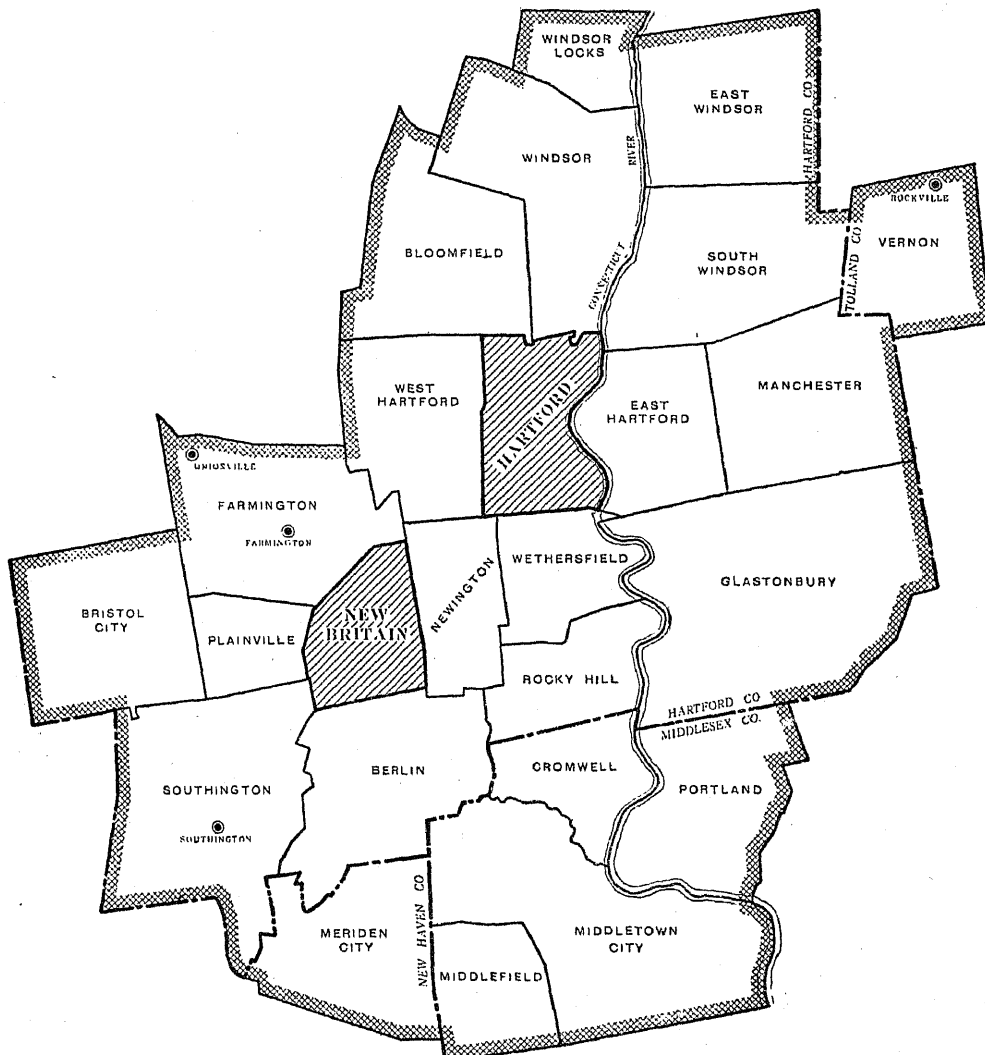
NEW HAVEN BY CENSUS TRACTS



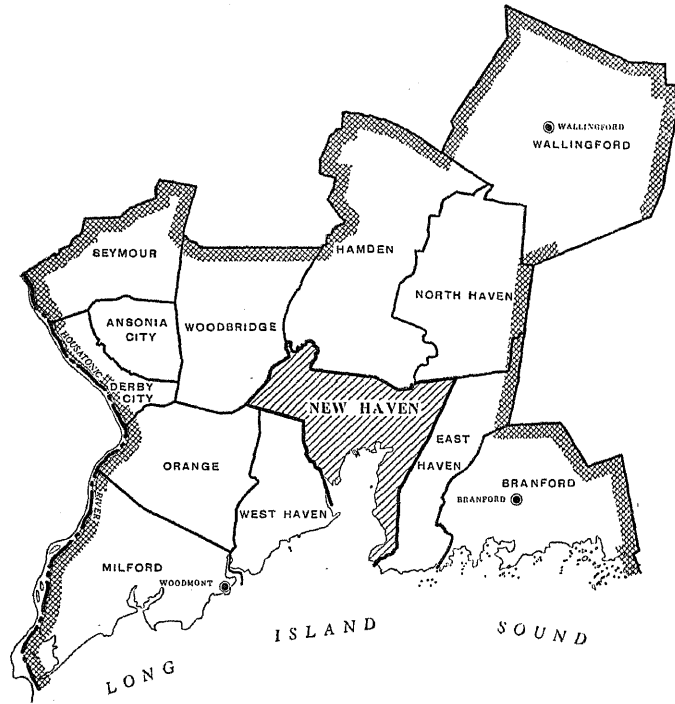
BRIDGEPORT METROPOLITAN DISTRICT



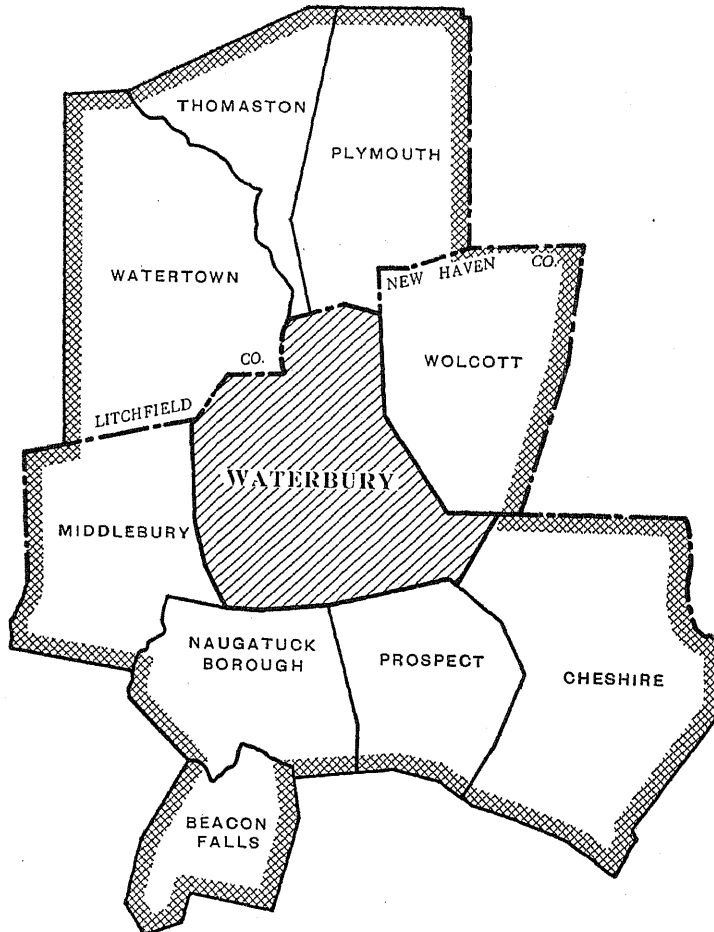
HARTFORD-NEW BRITAIN METROPOLITAN DISTRICT

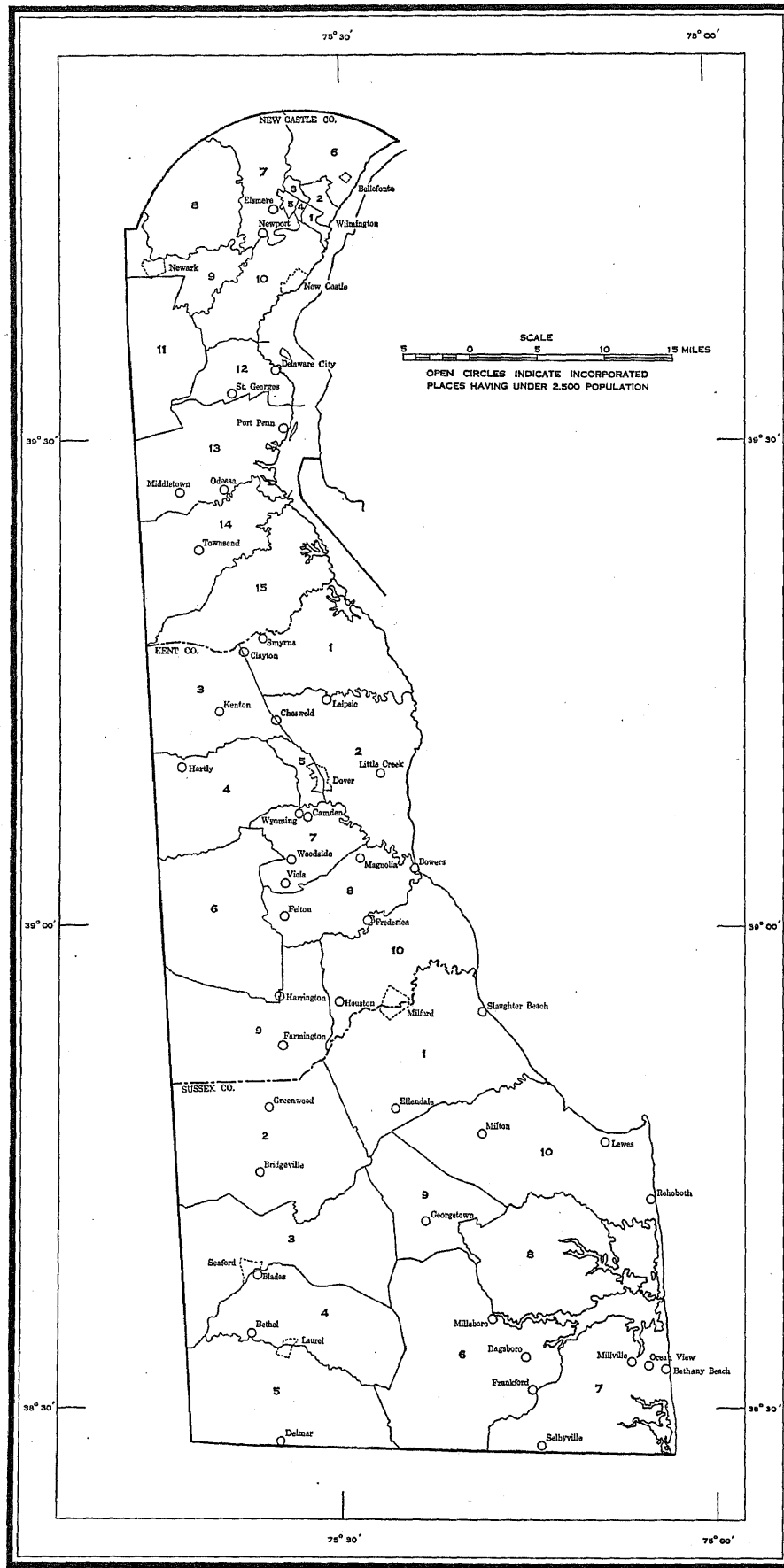

## NUMBER OF INHABITANTS

Population of the State.—Delaware was one of the Thirteen Original States. Its population on April 1, 1940, according to the Sixteenth Census, was 266,505, which represents an increase of 28,125, or 11.8 percent, as compared with the population on April 1, 1930. The total land area of the State, as shown in table 3, is 1,978 square miles. The average number of inhabitants per square mile in 1940 was 134.7, as compared with 120.5 in 1930.

Table 1 shows the population of Delaware from 1790, the year of the first Federal census, to 1940, together with the increase during each decade. The urban and rural population of the State at each census is also presented in this table and is shown graphically in the accompanying chart.

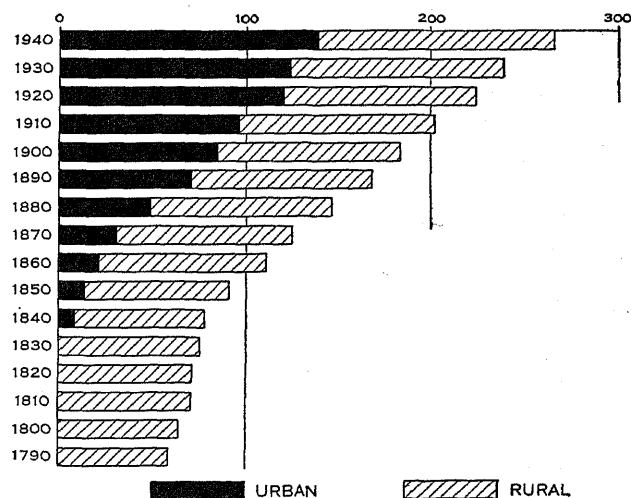
The urban population of Delaware consists of all persons living in incorporated places of 2,500 or more, the remainder of the population being classified as rural.

The urban and rural areas are not constant from one census to the next, since new places are added to the urban list from time to time as they attain a population of 2,500 or more; for example, Bellefonte was classified as urban in 1940 for the first time. Places are likewise taken off the urban list when, through decline in population, they fall below this limit.

Geographic subdivisions.—In the tables that follow (tables 2 to 5) the population of Delaware is shown by counties, representative districts, cities, and towns, with some comparative figures from previous censuses. Table 6 gives the population of the city of Wilmington by wards, and table 7 presents data for the Wilmington metropolitan district.

Cities of 10,000 or more.—Table 2 shows the population of Wilmington, the only city in Delaware with more than 10,000 inhabitants, from 1840, the first census

subsequent to its incorporation, to 1940, together with the increase during each decade. Wilmington had a population in 1940 of 112,504.

**Counties.**—Table 3 shows the population of the three counties of Delaware from 1920 to 1940, together with the land area of each county and its population per square mile in 1940. The land areas given here are the result of new measurements recently compiled and differ somewhat from those published in earlier census reports. All three of these counties increased in population between 1930 and 1940. This table also presents the urban and rural population of each county for 1940 and 1930.

**Minor civil divisions.**—To the primary political divisions into which the counties are subdivided the Census Bureau applies the general term "minor civil divisions." The primary subdivisions of the counties in Delaware are called representative districts. The incorporated cities and towns form secondary subdivisions of the minor civil divisions in which they are located. There are 5 cities and 47 towns. Ordinarily, each of these secondary divisions, or incorporated places, forms a part of some representative district (or districts).

Table 4 shows the population of each county by

districts, cities, and towns for the last three censuses. The population of cities and towns is shown in *italics* under the population of the districts in which the places are respectively located. Where an incorporated place is located in two districts in the same county, the total population of the place is given in connection with the presentation for the first district. Where the place is situated in two counties, the total population is given in connection with each county. The population of Wilmington, which comprises several entire districts, is presented in roman type, followed by the district population in *italic* type.

**Metropolitan districts.**—Metropolitan districts have been set up for use in the 1940 Census of Population in connection with each city of 50,000 or more, two or more such cities sometimes being in one district. The general plan is to include in the district, in addition to the central city or cities, all adjacent and contiguous minor civil divisions having a population of 150 or more per square mile. In some metropolitan districts, a few less densely populated contiguous divisions are included on the basis of special qualifications. A metropolitan district is thus not a political unit but rather an area including all the thickly settled territory in and around a city or group of cities. It tends to be a more or less integrated area with common economic, social, and, often, administrative interests.

The Wilmington metropolitan district is the only one in Delaware. Like several other districts it occupies some territory in more than one State. New Garden township and Avondale borough, both in Chester County, Pennsylvania, were included in the Wilmington metropolitan district in 1940 for the first time.

Table 7 shows the population of the Wilmington metropolitan district and its constituent political units in 1940 and 1930, together with the increase during the decade. In 1940 the metropolitan district had 188,974 inhabitants, whereas in 1930 the district as then constituted had a population of 163,592. It may also be noted that the political units that made up the district in 1940 had a population of 166,746 in 1930.

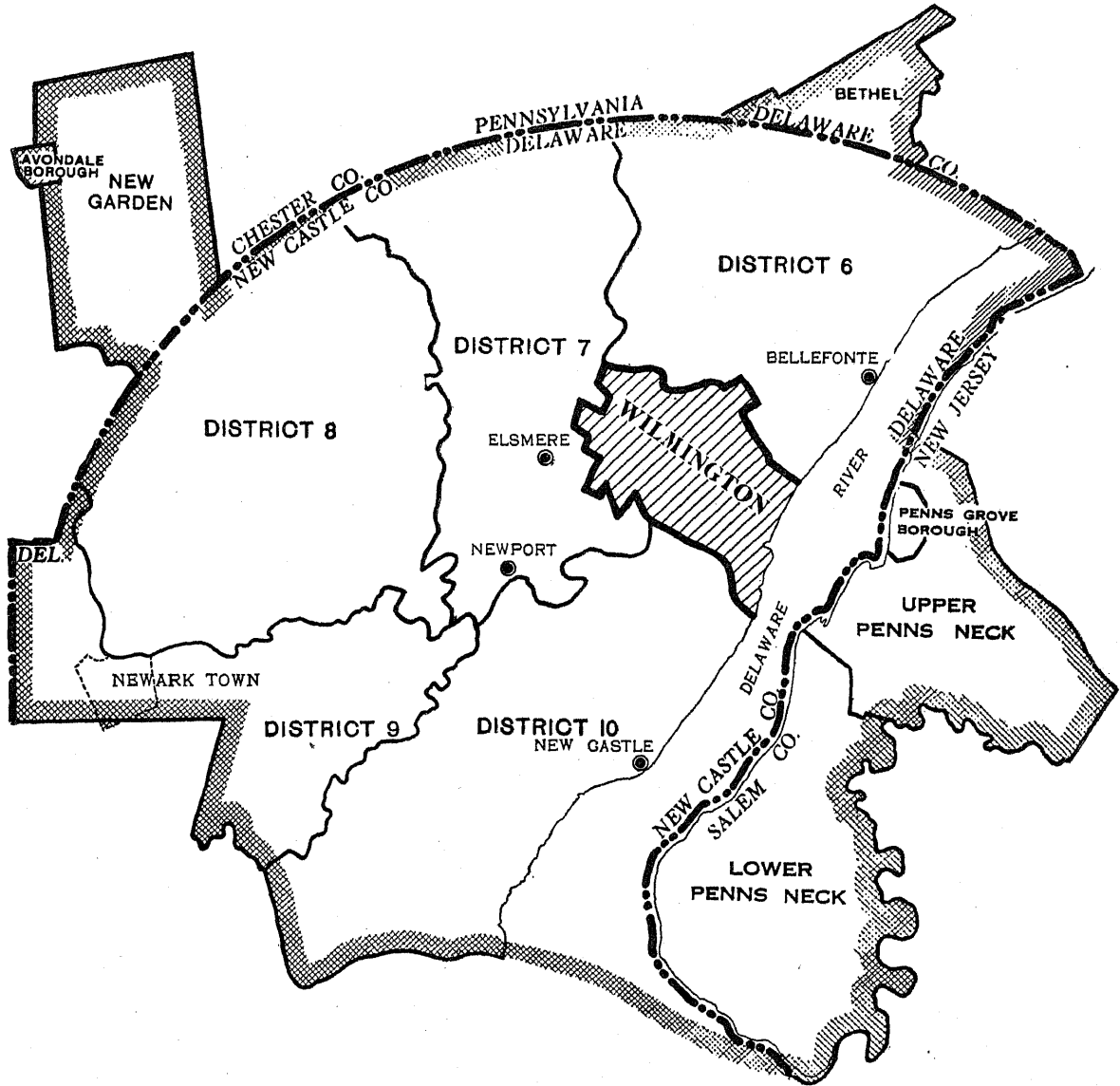

WILMINGTON METROPOLITAN DISTRICT



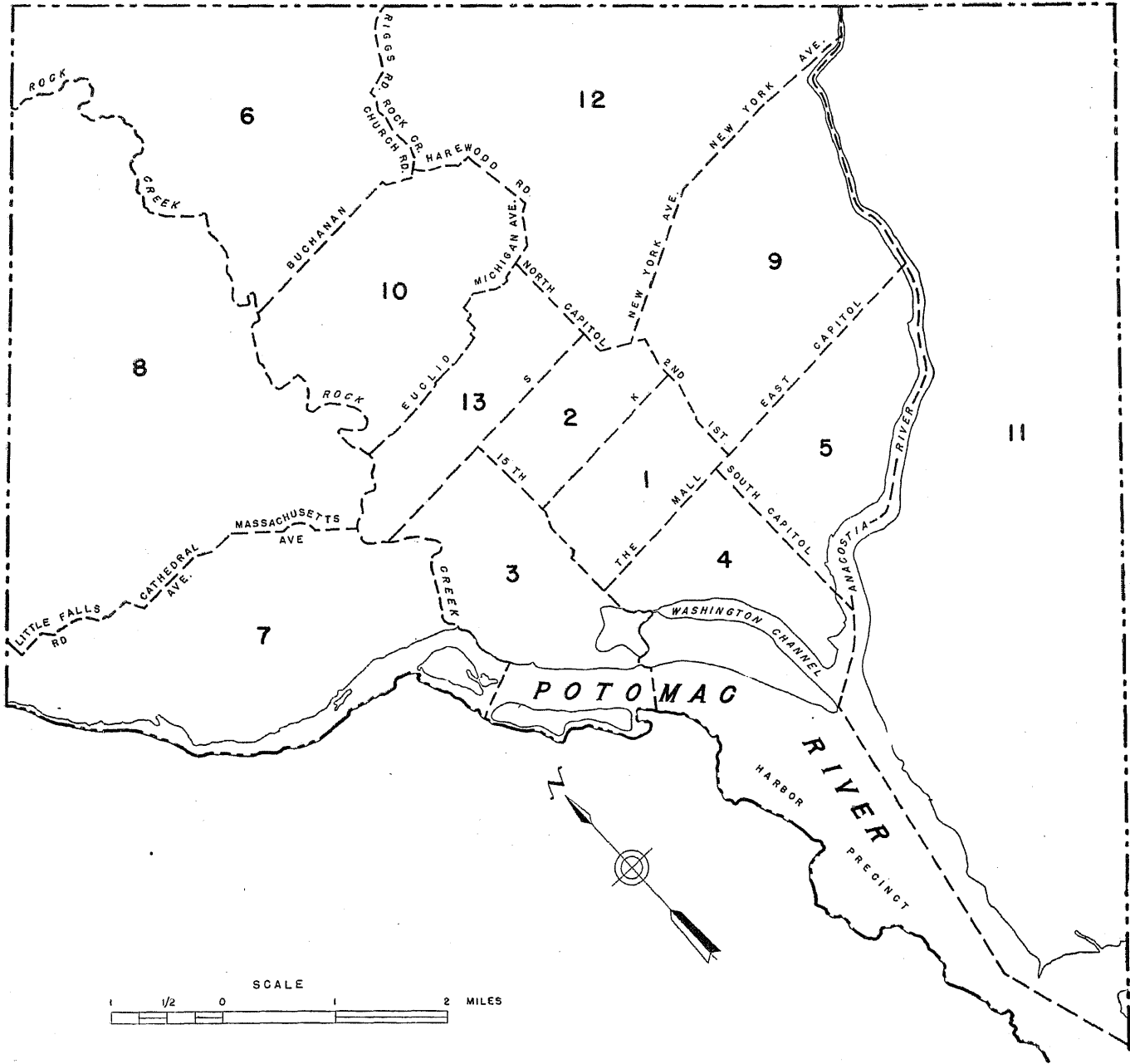

# DISTRICT OF COLUMBIA

## NUMBER OF INHABITANTS

**Population of the District.**—The District of Columbia, formed from territory ceded by Maryland and Virginia, was established as the seat of the Federal Government in accordance with acts of Congress passed in 1790 and 1791. In 1791 the boundaries of the District were defined as including the present area, together with about 30 square miles on the Virginia side of the Potomac; Georgetown and Alexandria were thus both included. The city of Washington was incorporated in 1802. In 1846 the area south of the Potomac (including Alexandria) was retroceded to Virginia, leaving the District of Columbia with its present limits. The city of Washington has been coextensive with the District of Columbia since 1895.

The population of the District of Columbia on April 1, 1940, according to the Sixteenth Census, was 663,091, which represents an increase of 176,222, or 36.2 percent,

as compared with the population on April 1, 1930. The total land area of the District is 61 square miles. The average number of inhabitants per square mile in 1940 was 10,870.3, as compared with 7,981.5 in 1930.

Table 1 shows the population of the District of Columbia from 1800, the year in which its area was first separately enumerated, to 1940, together with the increase during each decade. The figures for the censuses prior to 1850 include the population of the area south of the Potomac, which was retroceded to Virginia in 1846. The urban and rural population of the District at each census is presented in this table and is also shown graphically in the accompanying chart. The urban population consists of those persons living in incorporated places of 2,500 or more, the remainder of the population being classified as rural. The District has been entirely urban since 1890.

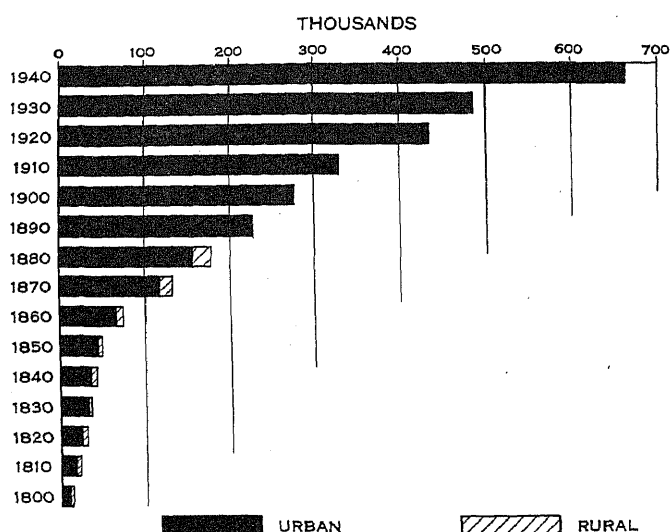

**Subdivisions.**—Tables 2 and 4 present data, respectively, for the city of Washington and the Washington metropolitan district; and tables 3 and 5 present data for the District of Columbia by police precincts and census tracts, respectively.

**Population of Washington.**—Table 2 shows the population of the city of Washington from 1800 to 1940, together with the increase during each decade. The figures for the censuses prior to 1900 are for the city before it became coextensive with the District.

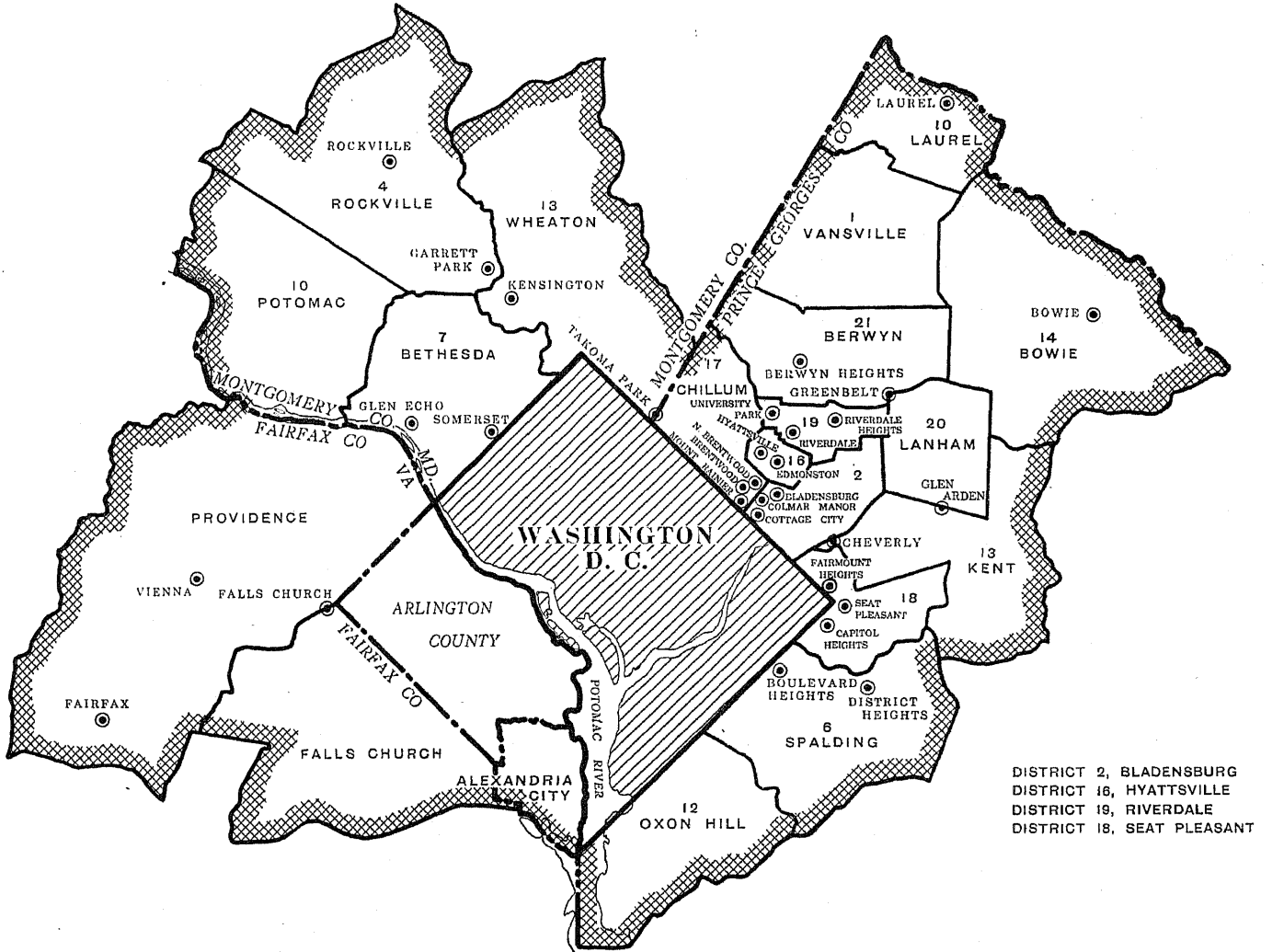

**Metropolitan districts.**—Metropolitan districts have been set up for use in the 1940 Census of Population in connection with each city of 50,000 or more, two or more such cities sometimes being in one district. The general plan is to include in the district, in addition to the central city or cities, all adjacent and contiguous minor civil divisions having a population of 150 or more per square mile. In some metropolitan districts a few less densely populated contiguous divisions are included on the basis of special qualifications. A metropolitan district is thus not a political unit but rather an area including all the thickly settled territory in and around a city or group of cities. It tends to be a more or less integrated area with common economic, social, and, often, administrative interests.

Table 4 shows the population of the Washington metropolitan district and its constituent political units in 1940 and 1930, together with the increase or decrease during the decade. Since all of the metropolitan district outside the city of Washington is in Maryland or Virginia, a map of the metropolitan district is presented herewith. In 1940 the Washington metropolitan district had 907,816 inhabitants, while in 1930 the district as then constituted had a population of 621,059. District 10, Laurel, in Prince Georges County, Maryland, and that part of Falls Church district, Fairfax County, Virginia, outside Falls Church town, were included in the metropolitan district in 1940 for the first time. The population of this new area was 9,089 in 1940 and 5,999 in 1930.

**Census tracts.**—Census tracts are small areas into which certain large cities have been subdivided for statistical and local administrative purposes, through cooperation with a local committee in each case. Through the use of census tract data comparisons may be made from census to census. Tracts are laid out with a view to approximate uniformity in population and with some regard for uniformity in area, and each is designed to include an area fairly homogeneous in population characteristics. In table 5 the 1940 and 1930 population of the District of Columbia is shown by census tracts. The census tract boundaries were radically changed in 1935, but a special tabulation of the 1930 data was made for the new tracts, from which are taken the 1930 figures in table 5. These tracts are shown on the accompanying map.

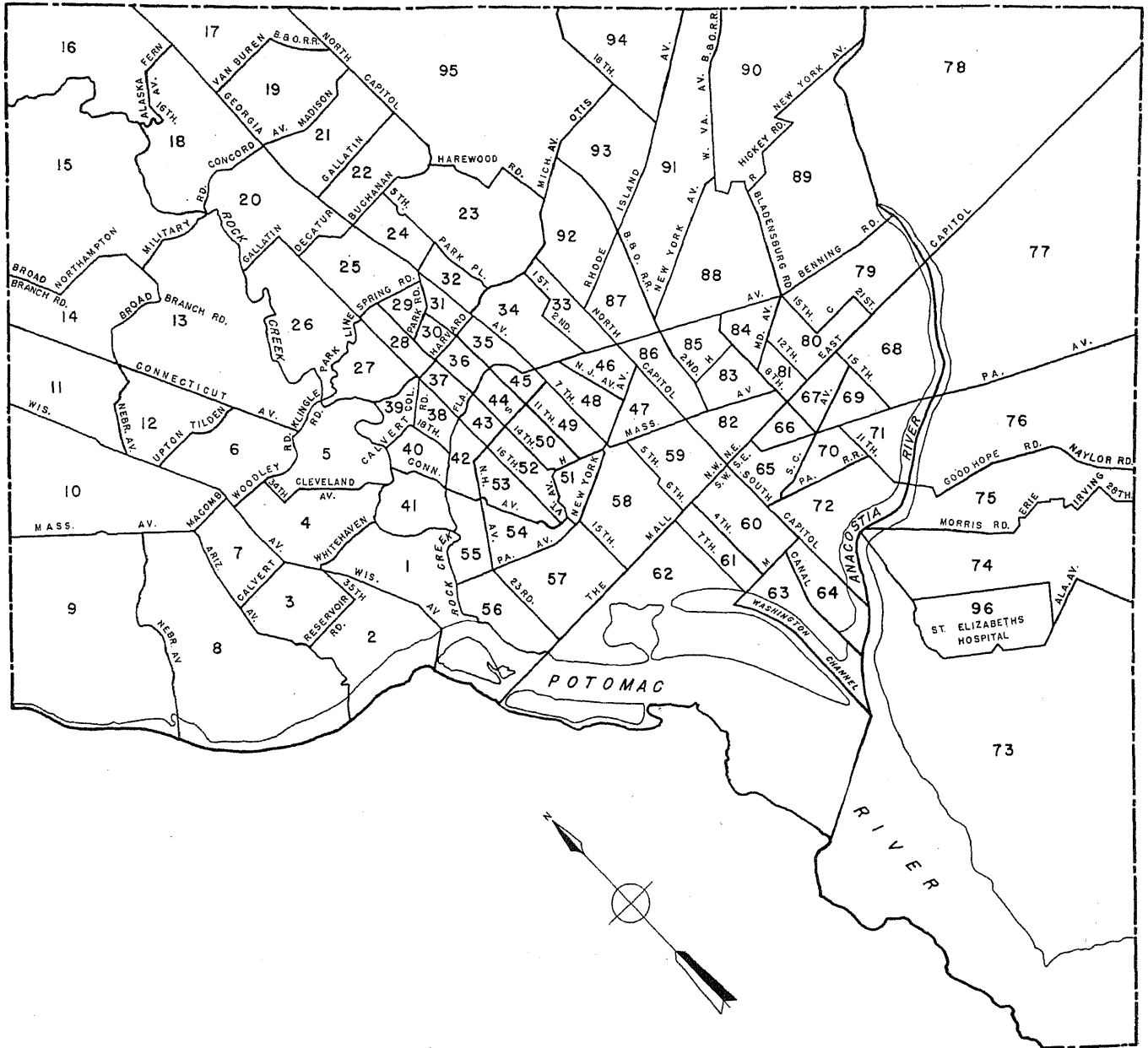

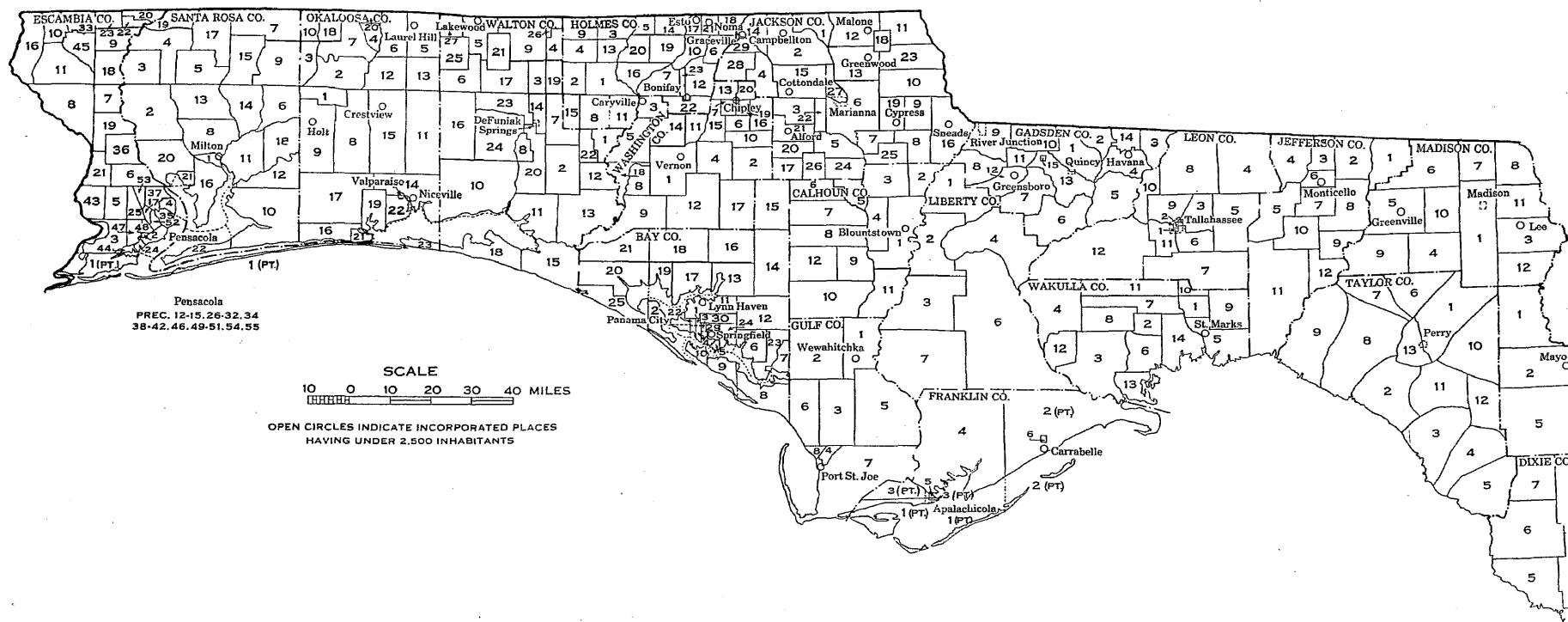

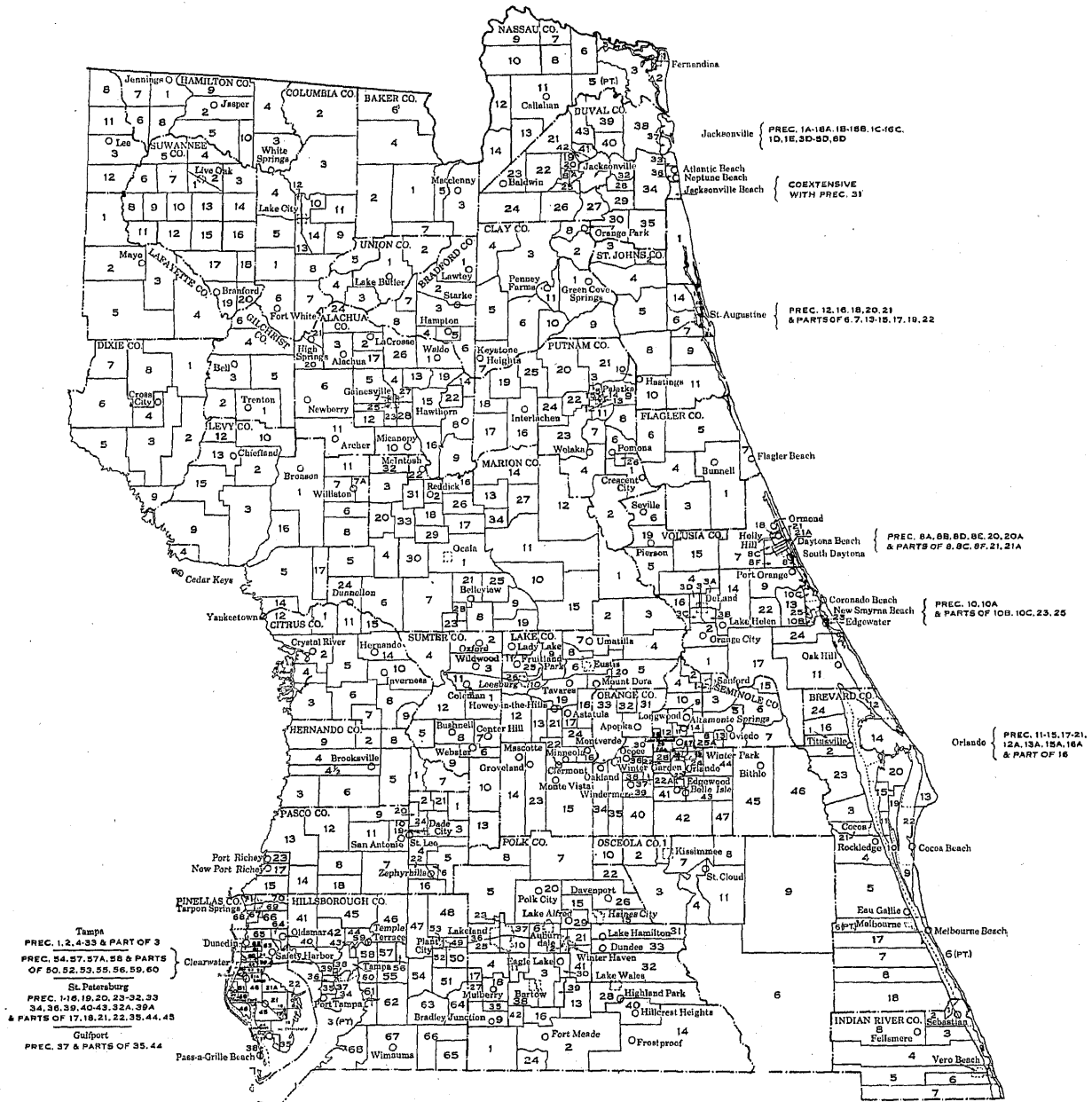

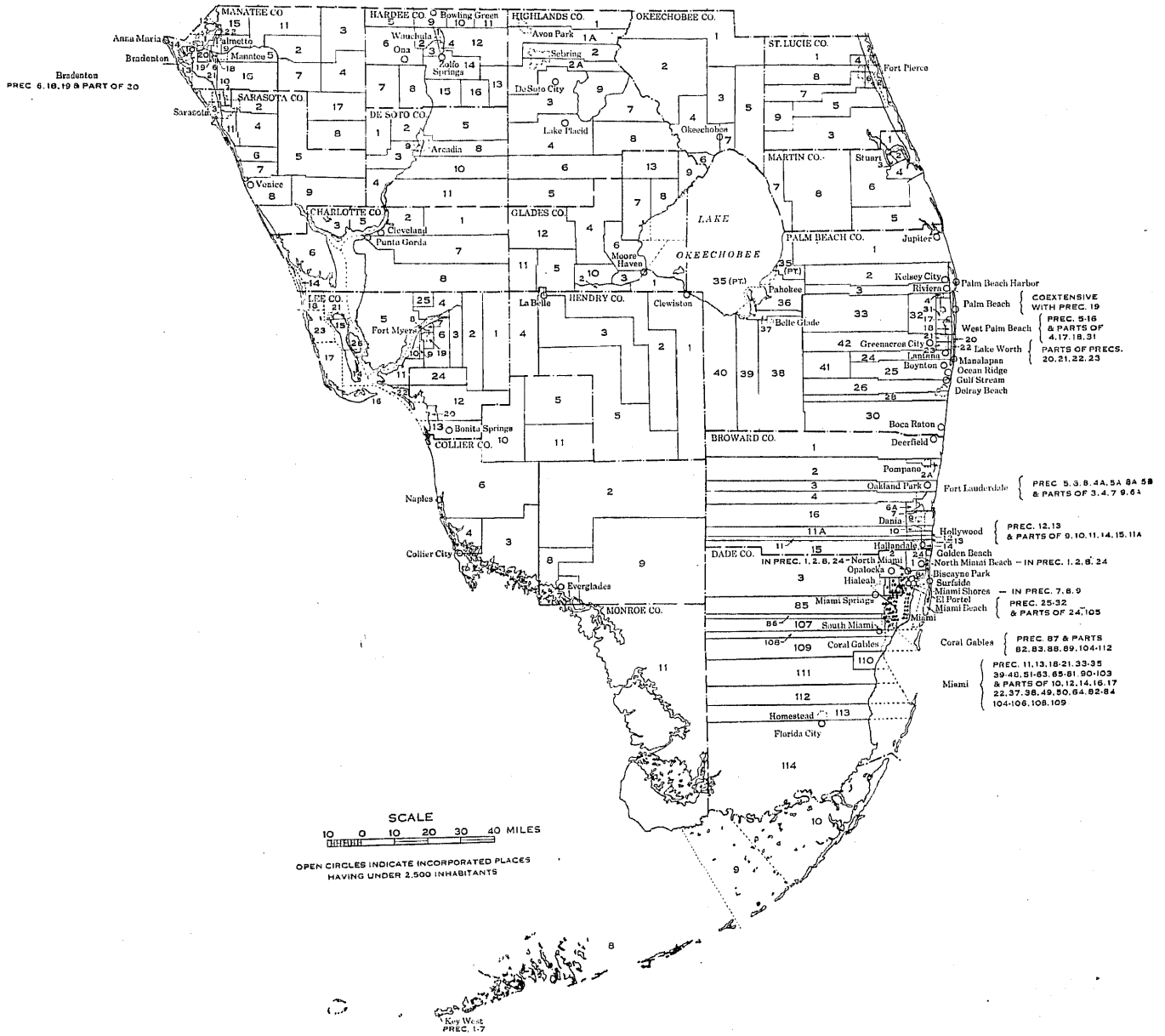
FLORIDA—NORTHEASTERN PART

# FLORIDA

## NUMBER OF INHABITANTS

**Population of the State.**—Florida was organized as a Territory in 1822, with boundaries as at present, from area purchased from Spain in 1819 and transferred to the United States in 1821. It was admitted to the Union in 1845 as the twenty-seventh State. The population of Florida on April 1, 1940, according to the Sixteenth Census, was 1,897,414, which represents an increase of 429,203, or 29.2 percent, as compared with the population on April 1, 1930. The total land area of the State, as shown in table 3, is 54,262 square miles. The average number of inhabitants per square mile in 1940 was 35.0, as compared with 27.1 in 1930.

Table 1 shows the population of Florida from 1830, the year in which the Territory of Florida was first

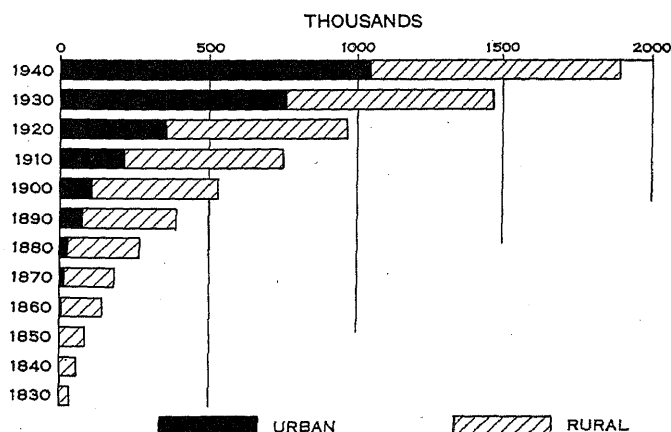
enumerated, to 1940, together with the increase during each decade. The urban and rural population of the State at each census is presented in this table and is also shown graphically in the accompanying chart. The urban population of Florida consists of those persons living in incorporated places of 2,500 or more, the remainder of the population being classified as rural. The urban and rural areas are not necessarily constant from one census to the next, since new places are added to the urban list from time to time as they attain a population of 2,500 or more; for example, Auburndale was classified as urban in 1940 for the first time. Places are likewise taken off the urban list when, through decline in population, they fall below this limit.

**Geographic subdivisions.**—In tables 2 to 5 the population of Florida is shown by counties, election precincts, cities, towns, and villages, with some comparative figures from previous censuses. Table 6 gives the population of cities by wards. Data for the metropolitan districts are presented in tables 7, 7-A, and 7-B.

**Cities of 10,000 or more.**—There are 20 cities in the State that had a population of 10,000 or more in 1940. Table 2 shows the population of these cities at each census for which figures are available, together with the increase or decrease during each decade. Jacksonville, the largest city, had a population in 1940 of 173,065; and Tallahassee, the capital of the State, had a population of 16,240.

Counties.—Table 3 shows the population of the 67 counties of Florida from 1920 to 1940, together with the land area of each county and its population per square mile in 1940. The land areas given here are the result of new measurements recently compiled and differ somewhat from those published in earlier

census reports. Of the 65 counties whose boundaries remained unchanged since 1930, 52 increased in population between 1930 and 1940, and 13 decreased. Part of Glades County was annexed to Hendry County in 1937. This table also presents the urban and rural population of each county for 1940 and 1930.

NUMBER OF INHABITANTS

Minor civil divisions.—To the primary political divisions into which the counties are subdivided the Census Bureau applies the general term "minor civil divisions." The primary divisions of the counties in Florida are called election precincts. The incorporated cities, towns, and villages form secondary subdivisions of the minor civil divisions in which they are located. There are 125 cities, 145 towns, and 3 villages. Ordinarily, each of these secondary divisions forms a part of some election precinct (or precincts).

Table 4 shows the population of each county by election precincts, cities, towns, and villages for the

last three censuses. The population of the cities, towns, and villages is shown in *italics* under the population of the primary divisions in which the places are respectively located. Where an incorporated place is located in two or more election precincts in the same county, the total population of the place is given in connection with the presentation for the first precinct. Where the place is situated in two or more counties, the total population is given in connection with each county. The population of Jacksonville and Key West cities, which comprise several entire precincts, is shown in roman type, followed by the precinct population in italics.

**Metropolitan districts.**—Metropolitan districts have been set up for use in the 1940 Census of Population in connection with each city of 50,000 or more, two or more such cities sometimes being in one district. The general plan is to include in the district, in addition to the central city or cities, all adjacent and contiguous minor civil divisions or incorporated places having a population of 150 or more per square mile. In some metropolitan districts a few less densely populated contiguous divisions are included on the basis of special qualifications. A metropolitan district is thus not a political unit but rather an area including all the thickly settled territory in and around a city or group of cities. It tends to be a more or less integrated area with common economic, social, and, often, administrative interests.

Table 7 shows the population of the Jacksonville metropolitan district and its constituent political units in 1940 and some comparative figures for 1930, together with the increase during the decade. In 1940 the Jacksonville metropolitan district had 195,619 inhabitants, while in 1930 the district as then constituted had a population of 148,713. The redistricting of Duval County in 1940 necessitated a redefinition of the boundaries of the metropolitan district, resulting in a slight increase in the area included in the district; the effect upon the population increase in the district

is not ascertainable. Comparative figures for 1930 cannot be shown for the precincts.

## NUMBER OF INHABITANTS

Table 7-B shows the population of the Tampa-St. Petersburg metropolitan district and its constituent political units in 1940 and some comparative figures for 1930, together with the increase or decrease during the decade. In 1940 the Tampa-St. Petersburg metropolitan district had 209,693 inhabitants, while in 1930 the district as then constituted had a population of 169,010. The redistricting of Hillsborough and Pinellas Counties between 1930 and 1940 necessitated a redefinition of the boundaries of the metropolitan district, resulting in a slight change in the area included in the district; the effect upon the population increase in the district is not ascertainable. Comparative figures for 1930 cannot be shown for the precincts.

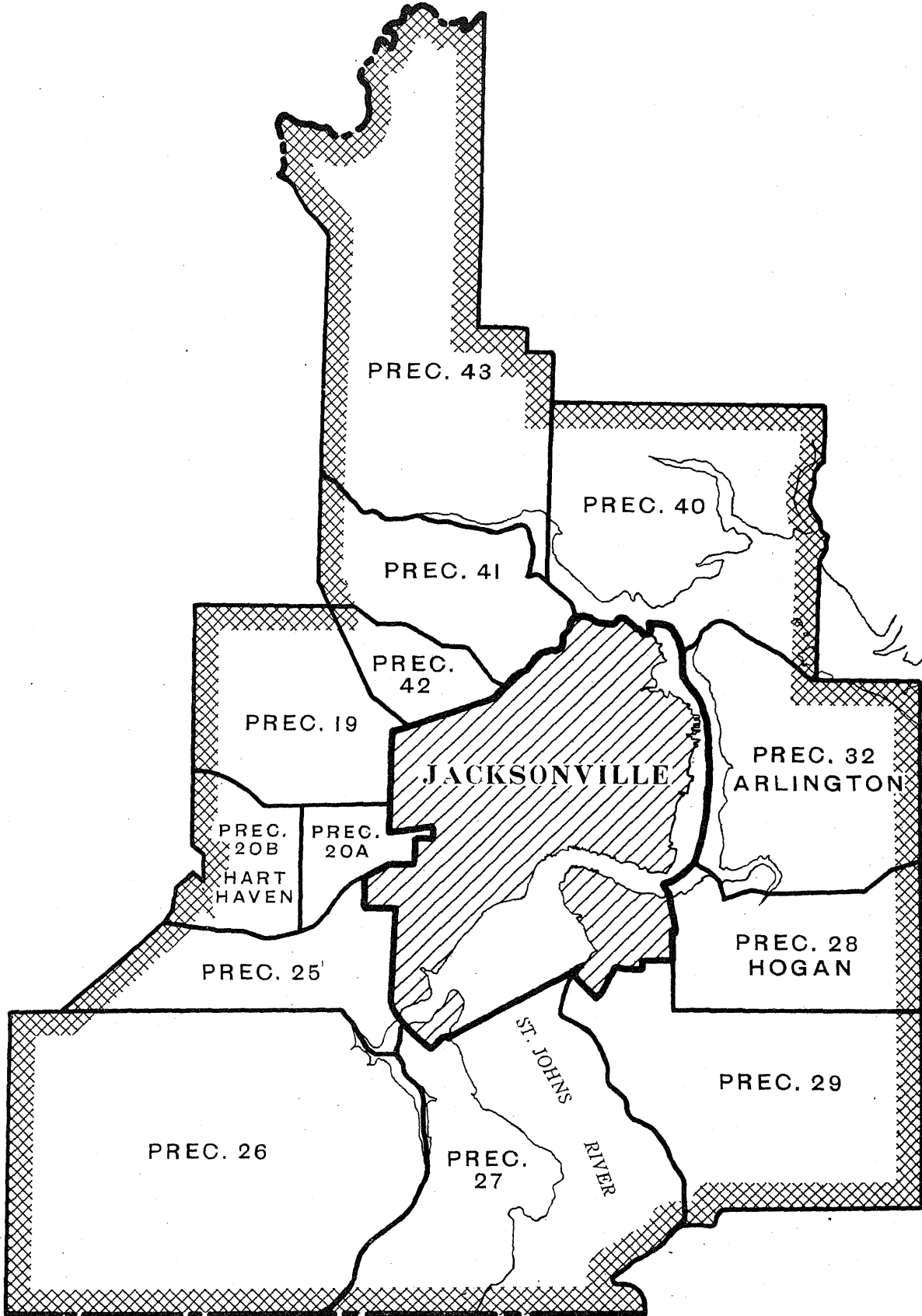
