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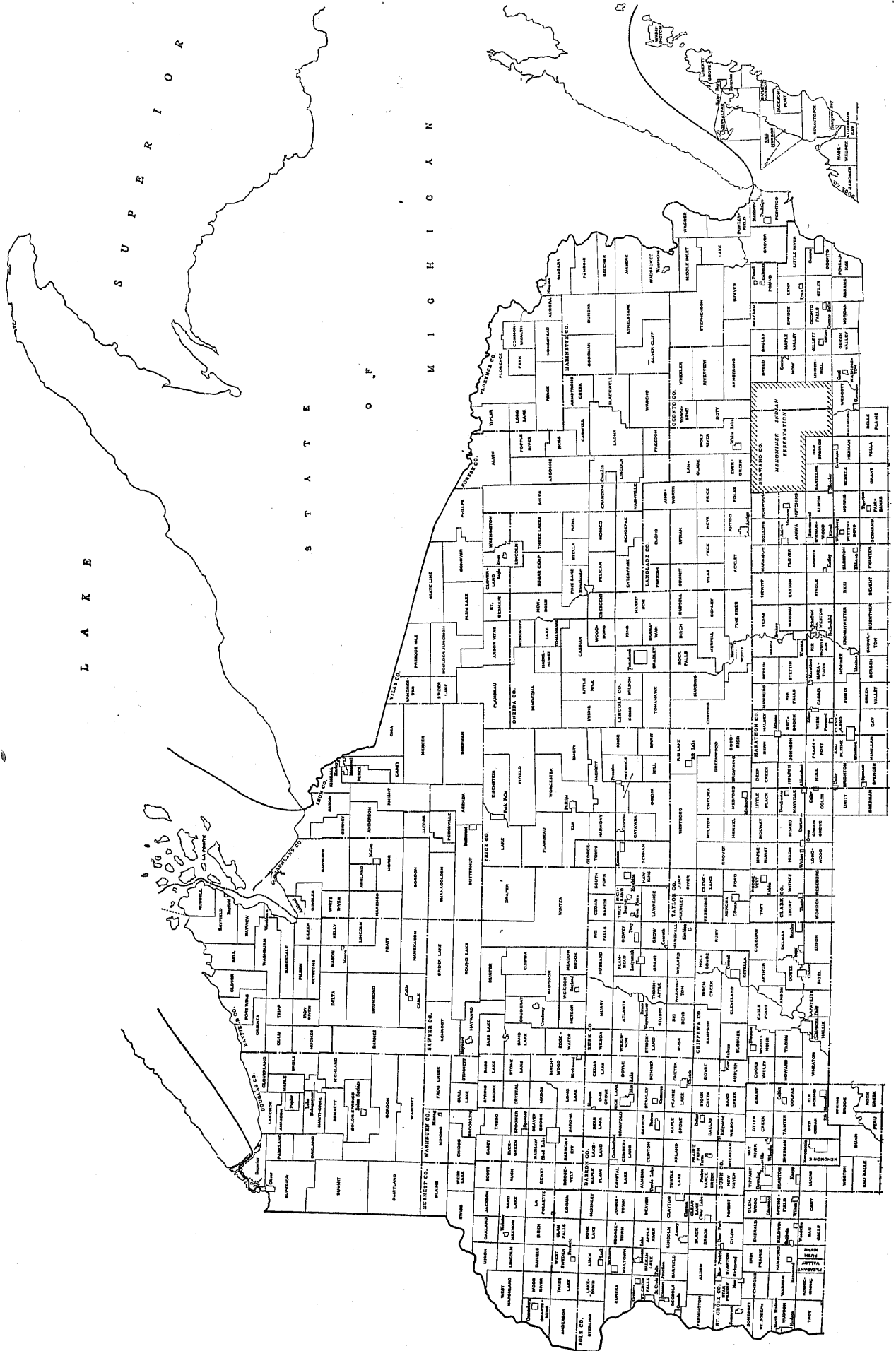
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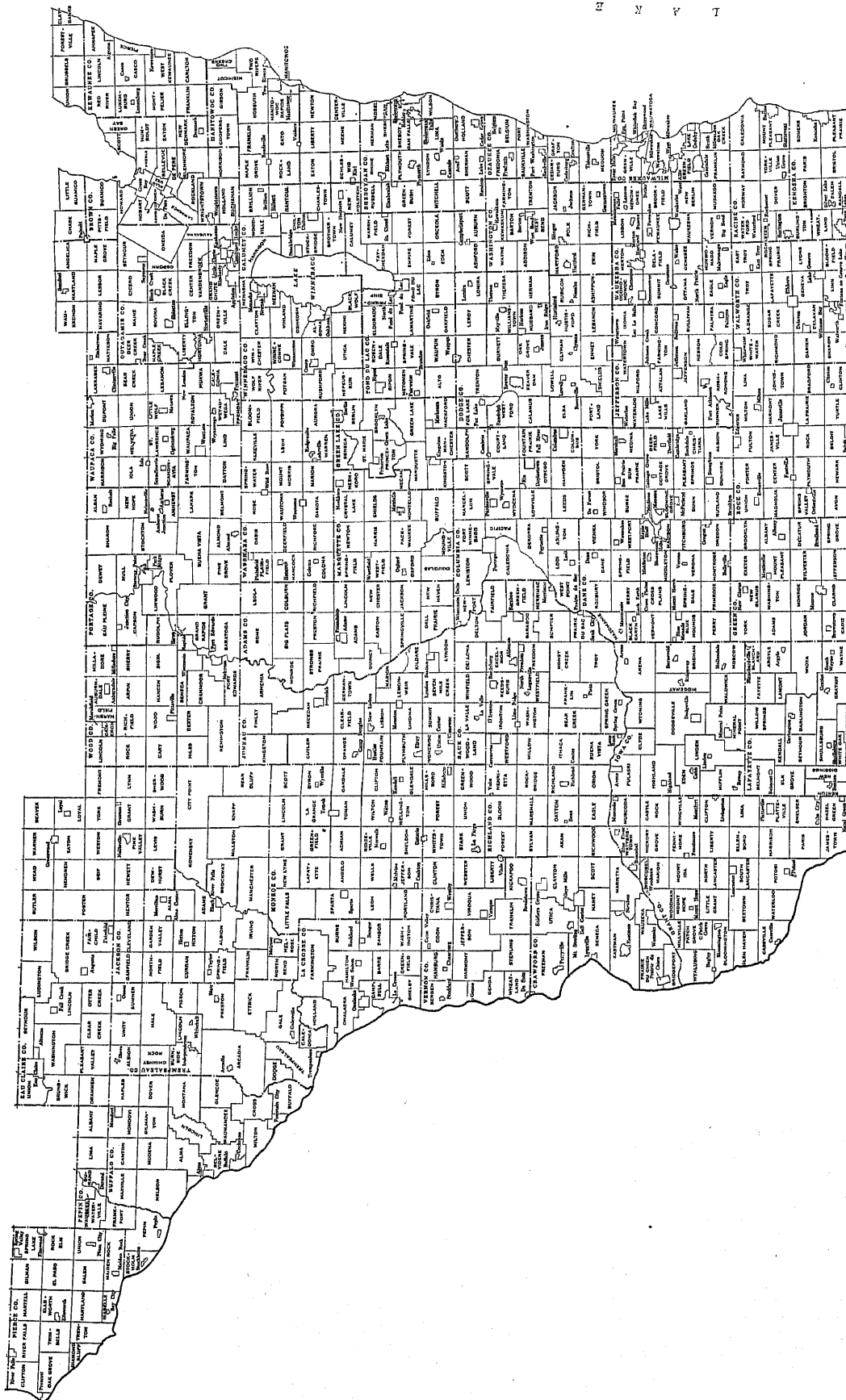

NUMBER OF INHABITANTS

Population of the State.—The Territory of Wisconsin, including the area now constituting the States of Wisconsin, Iowa, Minnesota, and parts of North and South Dakota, was organized in 1836 from part of Michigan Territory. In 1838 that part of Wisconsin Territory situated west of the Mississippi River and a line drawn from its source to the Canadian boundary was organized as the Territory of Iowa. In 1848, Wisconsin, with boundaries as at present, was admitted to the Union as the thirtieth State.

The population of Wisconsin on April 1, 1940, according to the Sixteenth Census, was 3,137,587, which represents an increase of 198,581, or 6.8 percent, as compared with the population on April 1, 1930. The total land area of the State, as shown in table 3, is 54,715 square miles. The average number of inhabitants per square mile in 1940 was 57.3, as compared with 53.7 in 1930.

Table 1 shows the population of Wisconsin from 1840, the year in which the Territory of Wisconsin was first separately enumerated, to 1940, together with the increase during each decade. The urban and rural population of the State at each census is presented in this table and is also shown graphically in the accompanying chart. The urban population of Wisconsin consists of those persons living in incorporated places of 2,500 or more, the remainder of the population being classified as rural. The urban and rural areas are not necessarily constant from one census to the next, since new places are added to the urban list from time to time as they attain a population of 2,500 or more. Places are likewise taken off the urban list when, through decline in population, they fall below this limit. For example, Columbus qualified as urban in 1910 and 1930 but not in 1920.

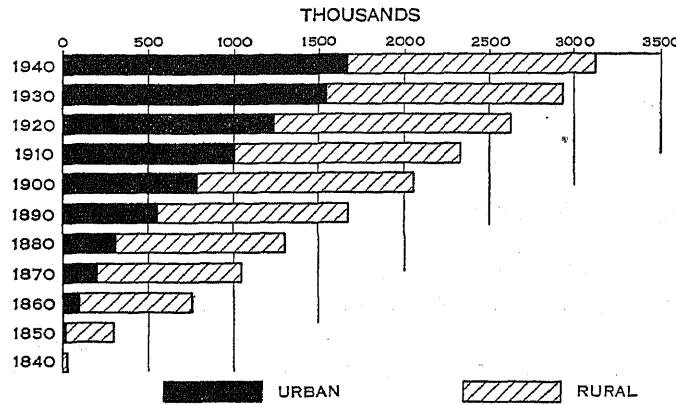

Geographic subdivisions.—In tables 2 to 5 the population of Wisconsin is shown by counties, cities, towns, and villages, with some comparative figures from previous censuses. Table 6 gives the population of cities by wards. Data for the metropolitan districts are presented in tables 7, 7-A, and 7-B, and for the census tracts of Milwaukee in table 8.

Incorporated places of 10,000 or more.—There are 33 incorporated places in the State that had a population of 10,000 or more in 1940. Table 2 shows the population of these incorporated places at each census for which figures are available, together with the increase or decrease during each decade. Milwaukee, the largest city, had a population in 1940 of 587,472; and Madison, the capital of the State, had a population of 67,447.

Counties.—Table 3 shows the population of the 71 counties of Wisconsin from 1920 to 1940, together with the land area of each county and its population per square mile in 1940. The land areas given here are the result of new measurements recently compiled and differ somewhat from those published in earlier census reports.

Of the 69 counties whose boundaries remained unchanged since 1930, 63 increased in population between 1930 and 1940, and 6 decreased. Part of Monroe County was annexed to Vernon County in 1939. This table also presents the urban and rural population of each county for 1940 and 1930.

Minor civil divisions.—To the primary political divisions into which the counties are subdivided the Census Bureau applies the general term “minor civil divisions.” The primary divisions of the counties in Wisconsin are the towns, cities, and villages. (The Menomonee Indian Reservation, in Oconto and Shawano Counties, is also classified as a primary division.) There are 150 cities and 363 villages. There are no secondary divisions.

Table 4 shows the population of each county by cities, towns, and villages (and the one reservation) for the last three censuses. Where a city or village is located partly in one county and partly in another, the part in a given county is presented in the regular way as a primary division of that county, but, to make the presentation complete, the population is also shown, in italics, for the part outside that county and for the city or village as a whole.

Metropolitan districts.—Metropolitan districts have been set up for use in the 1940 Census of Population in connection with each city of 50,000 or more, two or more such cities sometimes being in one district. The general plan is to include in the district, in addition to the central city or cities, all adjacent and contiguous minor civil divisions having a population of 150 or more per square mile. In some metropolitan districts, a few less densely populated contiguous divisions are included on the basis of special qualifications. A metropolitan district is thus not a political unit but rather an area including all the thickly settled territory in and around a city or group of cities. It tends to be a more or less integrated area with common economic, social, and, often, administrative interests. The following tables give data for the three metropolitan districts with the main central city in Wisconsin. One of the central cities of the Duluth-Superior metropolitan district is also situated in Wisconsin; data for this district are presented in the bulletin for Minnesota.

Table 7 shows the population of the Madison metropolitan district and its constituent political units in 1940. This district was defined for the first time in 1940. For comparison the 1930 population of the units comprising the present district is also shown, together with the increase between 1930 and 1940. In 1940 the Madison metropolitan district had 78,349 inhabitants, whereas in 1930 the same area had a population of 64,350.

Table 7-A shows the population of the Milwaukee metropolitan district and its constituent political units in 1940 and 1930, together with the increase or decrease during the decade. In 1940 the Milwaukee metropolitan district had 790,336 inhabitants, whereas in 1930 the district as then constituted had a population of 743,414. That part of Greendale village that was incorporated from Franklin town, and that part of Waukesha town that was annexed to Waukesha city were included in the metropolitan district in 1940 for the first time. The population of these new areas is not obtainable for either 1940 or 1930.

Table 7-B shows the population of the Racine-Kenosha metropolitan district and its constituent political units in 1940 and 1930, together with the increase or decrease during the decade. In 1940 the Racine-Kenosha metropolitan district had 135,075 inhabitants, whereas in 1930 the district had a population of 133,463. The metropolitan district in 1940 had exactly the same area as in 1930.

Census tracts.—Census tracts are small areas into which certain large cities are subdivided through cooperation with a local committee in each case for statistical and local administrative purposes. The tracts are permanently established, so that comparisons may be made from census to census; they are laid out with a view to approximate uniformity in population and with some regard for uniformity in area; and each is designed to include an area fairly homogeneous in population characteristics. In table 8 the 1940 population of Milwaukee is shown by census tracts. Since these tracts were not established until after 1930, there are no comparative figures for earlier censuses. The census tracts for Milwaukee are shown on the accompanying map.

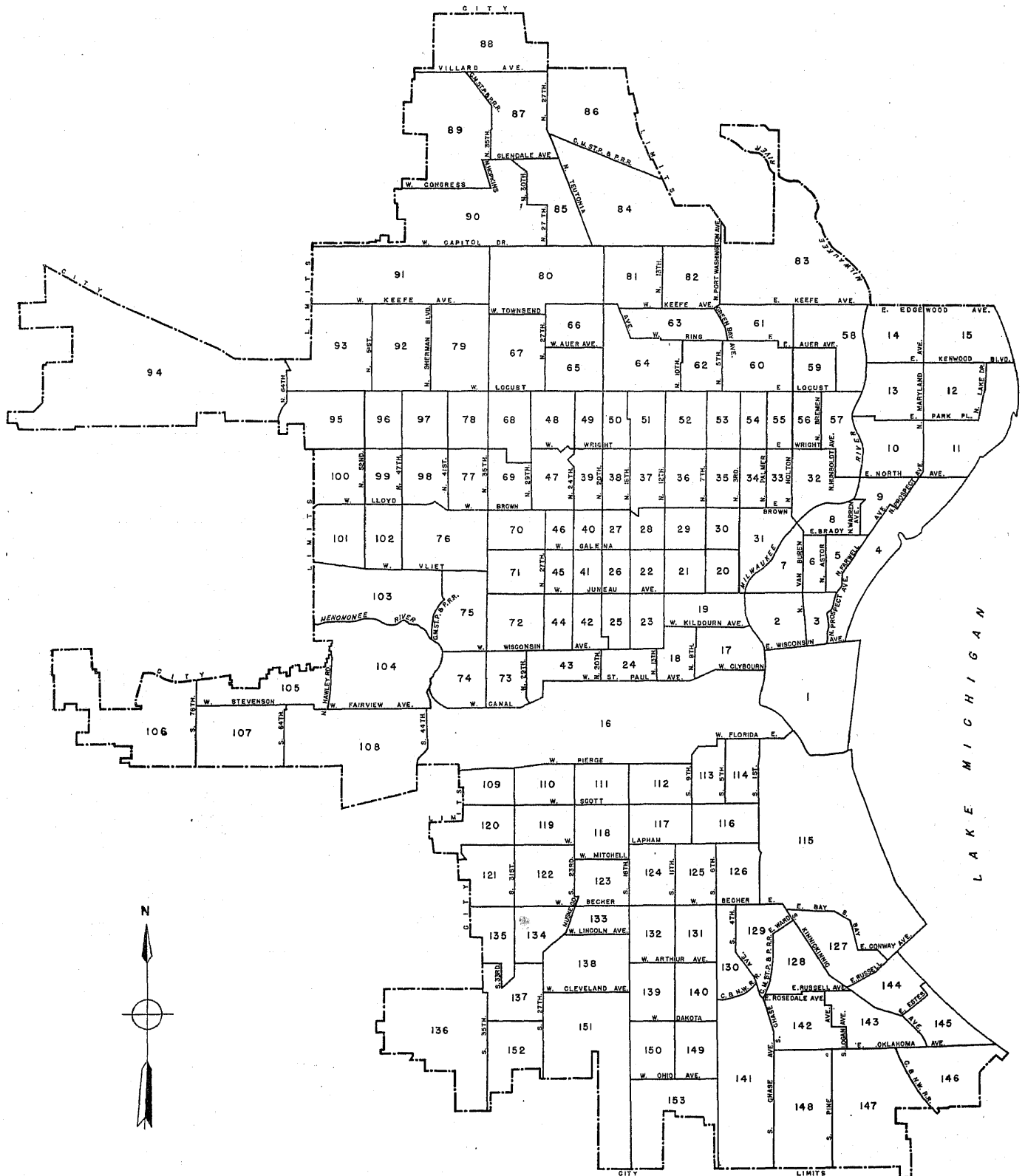

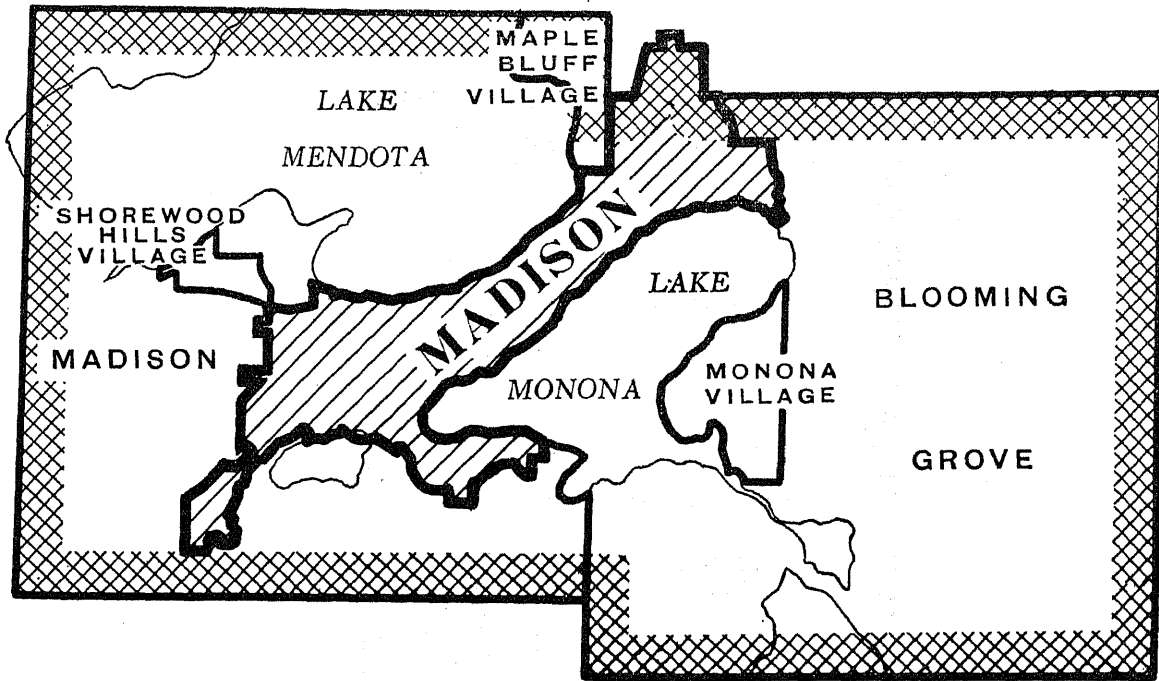

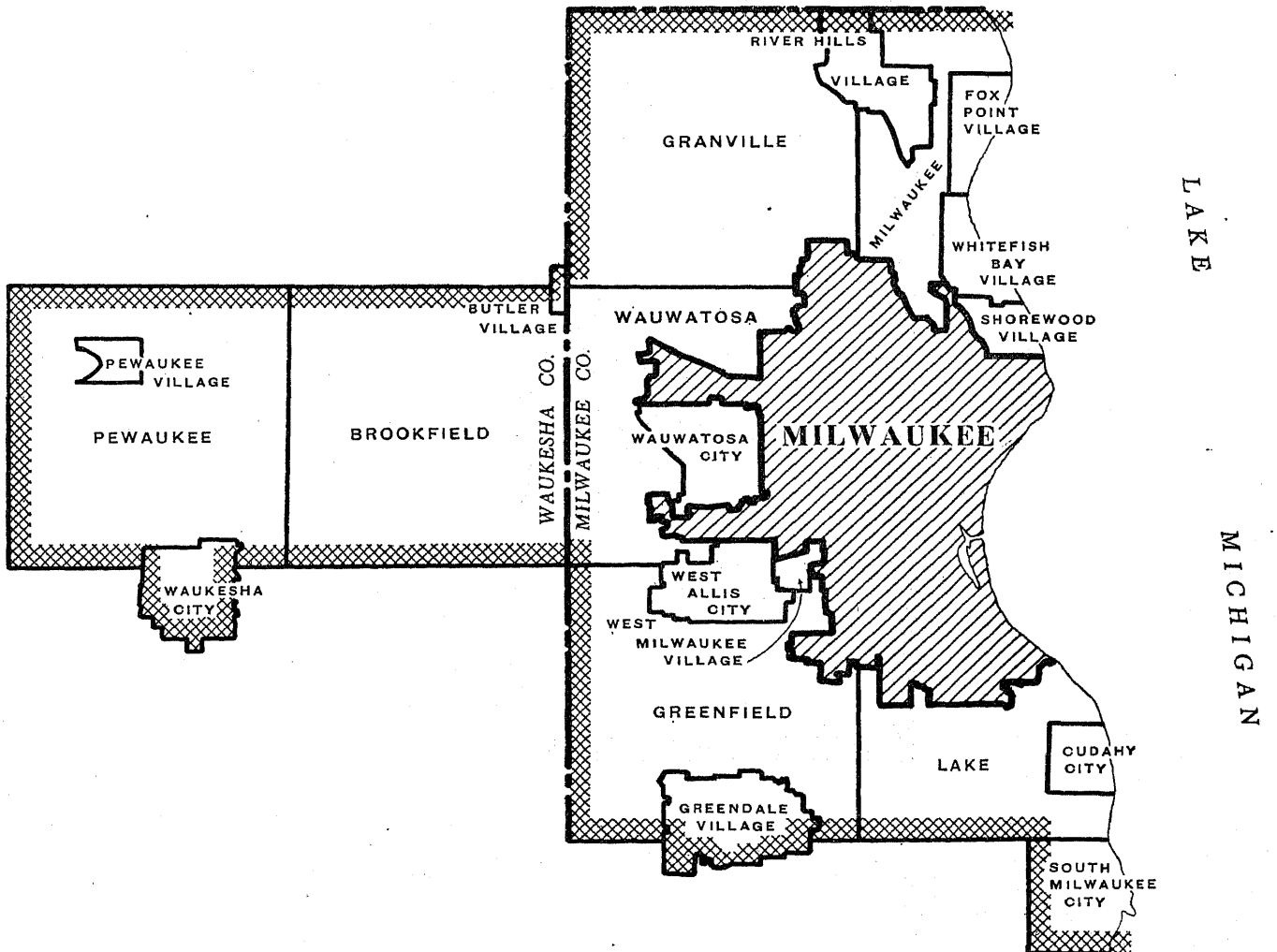
MILWAUKEE BY CENSUS TRACTS



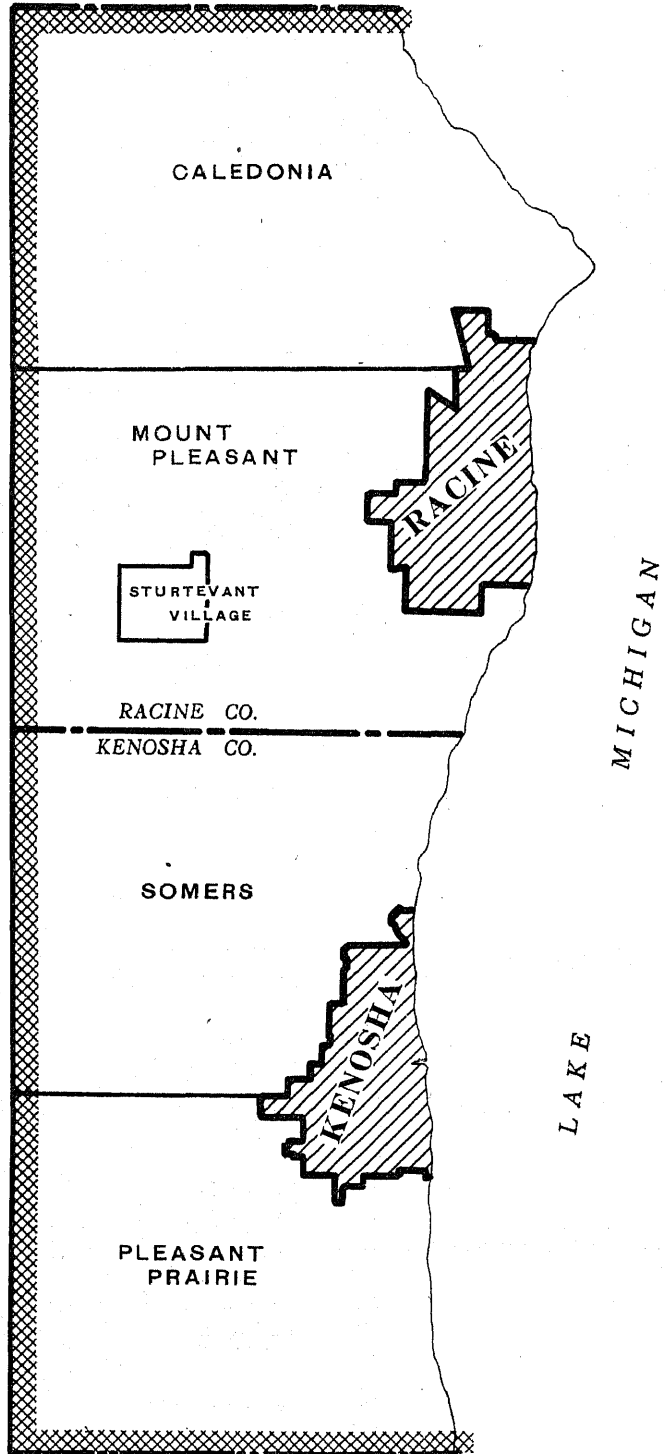
MADISON METROPOLITAN DISTRICT

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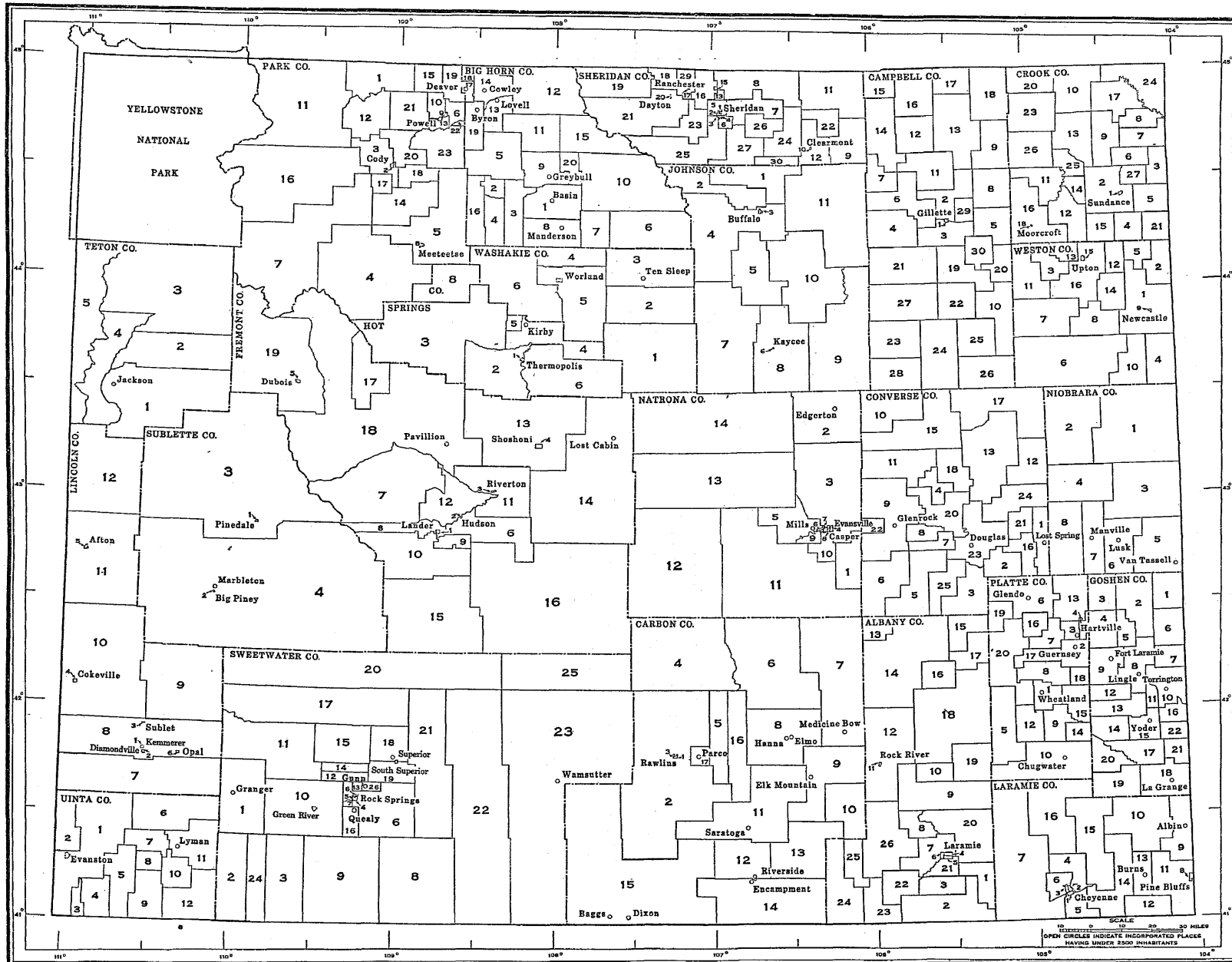

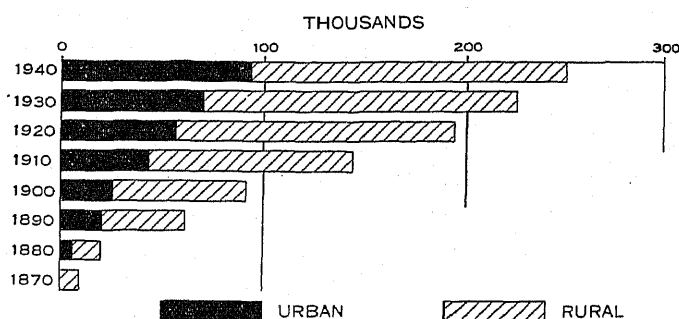

Population of the State.—Wyoming was organized as a Territory in 1868 and was admitted to the Union as the forty-fourth State in 1890. Its population on April 1, 1940, according to the Sixteenth Census, was 250,742, which represents an increase of 25,177, or 11.2 percent, as compared with the population on April 1, 1930. The total land area of the State, as shown in table 3, is 97,506 square miles. The average number of inhabitants per square mile in 1940 was 2.6, as compared with 2.3 in 1930.

Table 1 shows the population of Wyoming from 1870, the year in which its area was first separately enumerated, to 1940, together with the increase during each decade. The urban and rural population of the State at each census is presented in this table and is also shown graphically in the accompanying chart. The urban population of Wyoming consists of all persons living in incorporated places of 2,500 or more, the remainder of the population being classified as rural. The urban and rural areas are not necessarily constant from one census to the next, since new places are added to the urban list from time to time as they attain a

population of 2,500 or more; for example, Cody was classified as urban in 1940 for the first time. Places are likewise taken off the urban list when, through decline in population, they fall below this limit.

Geographic subdivisions.—In tables 2 to 5 the population of Wyoming is shown by counties, election districts, cities, and towns, with some comparative figures from previous censuses. Table 6 gives the population of cities by wards.

Cities of 10,000 or more.—There are four cities in the State that had a population of 10,000 or more in 1940. Table 2 shows for these cities the population at each census for which figures are available, together with the increase or decrease during each decade. Cheyenne,

the capital and largest city in the State, had a population in 1940 of 22,474. The other three cities in this size group, in order of population, are Casper, Laramie, and Sheridan. Laramie and Sheridan are included in this size group for the first time.

Counties.—Table 3 shows the population of the 23 counties of Wyoming from 1920 to 1940, together with the land area of each county and its population per square mile in 1940. The land areas given here are the result of new measurements recently compiled and differ somewhat from those published in earlier census reports. Seventeen of these counties increased in popu-

lation between 1930 and 1940, and six decreased. No new counties have been organized, and there have been no changes in county boundaries since the census of 1930. Yellowstone National Park, the greater part of which is located in this State, is independent of any county organization. This table also presents the urban and rural population of each county for 1940 and 1930.

Minor civil divisions.—To the primary political divisions into which counties are subdivided the Census Bureau applies the general term “minor civil divisions.” In Wyoming the primary divisions of the counties are called election districts. The incorporated cities and towns form secondary subdivisions of the minor civil divisions in which they are located. There are 8 cities and 80 towns. Ordinarily, each of these secondary divisions, or incorporated places, forms a part of some election district (or districts).

Table 4 shows the population of each county by

election districts, cities, and towns for the last three censuses. The population of the cities and towns is shown in *italics* under the population of the primary divisions in which the places are respectively located. Where an incorporated place occupies two or more districts or parts of districts, the total population of the place is given in connection with the presentation for the first district. The population of the cities that comprise several entire districts is presented in roman type, followed by the district population in *italic* type.
