


#### 1 Introduction

1

It is VERY important that we fully understand why and how the government uses numbers to identify us both on forms and in their computer systems, why it does this, and all the effects upon our rights. In fact, if you want to discontinue voluntary participation in the federal and state income tax systems, the absolute most important thing you can do is to eliminate all identifying numbers in connection with you. Understanding this can literally mean the difference between being a free person and a government slave.

#### 2 What We SPECIFICALLY Object to about Social Security Numbers and <u>Taxpayer Identification Numbers</u>

In our form <u>Why You Aren't Eligible for Social Security</u>, Form #06.001, we prove that it is UNLAWFUL for the Average American to participate in Social Security or any OTHER federal "benefit" program. By "unlawful" we mean NOT EXPRESSLY AUTHORIZED BY LAW. Some people have claimed incorrectly that by stating this, we are undermining their ability to conduct commerce using private banking or loans. This has never been our intention and we will prove in this section why this is so.

We don't object to holding people responsible for satisfying their contracts or agreements created in the absence of duress of any kind. Personal responsibility is, after all, the foundation of freedom and sovereignty as we admit on the opening page of our website:

17 People of all races, genders, political beliefs, sexual orientations, and nearly all religions are welcome here. All are treated equally under <u>REAL "law"</u>. The only way to remain truly free and equal under the civil law is to 18 avoid seeking government civil services, benefits, property, special or civil status, exemptions, privileges, or 19 special treatment. All such pursuits of government services or property require individual and lawful consent to 20 a franchise and the surrender of inalienable constitutional rights AND EQUALITY in the process, and should 21 therefore be AVOIDED. The rights and equality given up are the "cost" of procuring the "benefit" or property 22 from the government, in fact. Nothing in life is truly "free". Anyone who claims that such "benefits" or property 23 should be free and cost them nothing is a thief who wants to use the government as a means to STEAL on his or 24 her behalf. All just rights spring from responsibilities/obligations under the laws of a higher power. If that higher 25 power is God, you can be truly and objectively free. If it is government, you are guaranteed to be a slave because 26 they can lawfully set the cost of their property as high as they want as a Merchant under the U.C.C. If you want 27 it really bad from people with a monopoly, then you will get it REALLY bad. Bend over. There are NO 28 29 constitutional limits on the price government can charge for their monopoly services or property. Those who want no responsibilities can have no real/PRIVATE rights, but only privileges dispensed to wards of the state 30 which are disguised to LOOK like unalienable rights. Obligations and rights are two sides of the same coin, just 31 like self-ownership and personal responsibility. In many cases, globally unique identifying numbers are useful for enforcing PRIVATE contracts and agreements, such as bank loans. They are popular throughout the world primarily for banking purposes, in fact.

"Well then, if you don't object to people being personally responsible for honoring their contracts and commitments, then what is wrong with using government-issued identifying numbers that would hold people financially responsible honoring such commitments to governments?"

- Below is our general answer to this question which appears on one of our forms relating to the compelled use of such identifying numbers:
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This form is intended to provide succinct, convenient evidence proving beyond all doubt that the submitter may not lawfully have or use government issued STATUTORY identifying numbers and would be violating criminal and civil laws to do so. It is intended to be submitted to financial institutions, employers, and businesses who demand PUBLIC numbers from those they do business with.

The reader will note that ALL of our objections about the use of PUBLIC or GOVERNMENT issued identifying numbers could easily be remedied by:

- <sup>33</sup> 1. Creating a PRIVATE company or association to issue globally unique identifying numbers.
- <sup>34</sup> 2. Making these private identifying numbers NOT ACCESSIBLE by any government.
- Using the identifying numbers ONLY in connection with PRIVATE activities relating to banking and credit or
   PRIVATE employment verification.
- 4. Not using the PRIVATE numbers in connection with government identification such as driver's licenses or passports.
- Not using the PRIVATE numbers in connection with any CIVIL or governmental enforcement activity, and especially
   in connection with penalties or income taxation.
- 6. Enforcing the same rules of compelling contractual performance in the case of government as private companies have to follow. Namely:
  - 6.1. No administrative enforcement is permitted, such as penalties, liens, or levies.
    - 6.2. Enforcement requires a common law court action in equity to enforce the contract.
- 6.3. The contract must meet all the requisite elements of a real PRIVATE contract, such as an offer, mutual consideration, mutual obligation, mutual consent, the absence of duress, etc.
- 6.4. Sovereign, official, or judicial immunity may not be asserted by either party to escape the obligations of the contract.

It is precisely the above objections that explain why the Bible describes the Social Security Number and Taxpayer Identification Number as "The Mark of the Beast". See:

So long as the government "benefits" are treated essentially as VOLUNTARY PRIVATE business activity not protected by 43 official, sovereign, or judicial immunity and the government has to meet the same standards of proof in enforcing the contract 44 as any private company, and must do so in a Judicial Branch Article III court rather than an Executive Branch Article I or 45 Article IV court, then we wouldn't have a problem with offering government "benefits" or any other type of government 46 contracts. The problem is that the corrupt government mafia NEVER either recognizes or protects your right to NOT 47 participate, like any private company would have to. Imagine a private company that could force EVERYONE on the planet 48 to buy their product and a court system that enforced their tyrannical right to do so, as is the case currently with government 49 50 "benefits".

This condition described above where government acts as a PRIVATE party in commerce and equity is described by the Clearfield Doctrine of the U.S. Supreme Court:

If you make your OWN definition for "SSN' or "TIN" on the government form or application and reject the STATUTORY definition, even though it uses the same LABEL (e.g. "SSN" or "TIN"), then YOU are the Merchant and GOVERNMENT is the Buyer. In other words, changing the definitions replaces the original Merchant's offer with a COUNTEROFFER by the Buyer. The Buyer then becomes the NEW Merchant and the roles switch.
- 5.3. If the original Merchant then responds to your definition of terms by saying that you have to accept THEIR definition to get the "benefit" of the franchise, you simply respond that you have a right NOT to receive a "benefit" and that the only thing you want is for the government to LEAVE YOU ALONE, which is what "justice" itself is defined as. For instance, having government ID that does not impute a civil statutory status to you such as "citizen", "resident", or "person" has the effect of allowing you to be LEFT ALONE and not attaching any enforcement authority or "benefit" to you. By doing this, you are preventing what we call "bundling", where civil obligations are attached to the receipt of some government service by associating you with a civil statutory status that you don't want. Based on the preceding overwhelming evidence, the inference and conclusion that Social Security Numbers are regarded and treated as a de facto license to occupy a public office is inescapable. The taxation of the exercise of that office, in fact, is the main object of the entire Internal Revenue Code Subtitles A and C. It is de facto, because those exercising said office do so illegally and unconstitutionally in the vast majority of cases.

#### **4** Why Knowing about SSNs and TINs is VERY important

The subject of SSNs and TINs is VERY important to understanding how the income tax actually works. It is a tax upon the GOVERNMENT and ONLY the government. By "government" we mean "the United States" federal corporation. You have to JOIN that corporation as a public officer in most cases to be subject to the tax. The "United States" is defined as follows:

This is the DEFAULT and ONLY geographical definition in the title. The rules of statutory construction and interpretation 36 require that the law must give reasonable notice of all that is included to the reader, and that the reader cannot be required to 37 guess or presume anything about meanings. So the I.R.C. Subtitle A income tax IS and always has been a tax on the government and its offices, and those who volunteer
 for those offices. The above says it is "without limitation as to place" and "wherever the GOVERNMENT extends".

- The government consists of PROPERTY and OFFICES, which are also property. Government is not a physical thing but the property it owns often but not always is.
- The obligation to pay taxes attaches to government offices and property, which are both public property. It is, in effect,
   a rental fee for the beneficial use of government property. See:

OF COURSE the corrupt covetous government has a right to lien an levy public property, which is what it is if you attach a franchise mark, whether you knew that or not.

All of the above requirements to use the SSN for a "foreign person" such as a "nonresident alien" are in connection with the receipt of government property and privileges.

STATUTORY "U.S. Persons", "citizens of the United States", and "residents of the United States" are all FULL TIME public officers on official business. This is because EVERYTHING they do on the 1040 form is subject to 26 U.S.C. §162 "trade or business" deductions and because the regulations MANDATE that all "U.S. persons" must use the SSN franchise mark. Statutory "nonresident aliens", however, are only required to use the SSN/TIN franchise mark when they are engaged in the "trade or business" franchise above or OTHER privileges involving receipt of or beneficial use of government/public property.

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#### 5.2 **Social Security Numbers** 1

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No positive law requires anyone to have or use a Social Security Number (SSN). The Social Security Administration admitted 2 exactly this in a letter they sent to us in response to an inquiry about this subject: 3

All of Title 42 of the U.S. Code, which has the Social Security code embedded within it, for instance, is not positive law, according to the legislative notes under 1 U.S.C. §204, so that even if the code required it, it would not be enforceable against anyone without their individual consent in some form. Neither have we ever seen anyone from the government ever allege that specific sections within <u>Title 42</u> are positive law either. They are simply optional guidance for the average individual, and not "law" as a consequence. To call Social Security a "law" is to establish a state-sponsored religion in violation of the First Amendment, in fact. See the following for abundant confirmation of this fact:

Below is the definition of an "Individual Taxpayer Identification Number (ITIN)" from the Treasury Regulations. Keep in 16 mind that all of Title 26 of the U.S. Code, like Title 42, is NOT positive law and obligates no one to do anything except those 17 who consent to be bound by it by occupying a public office within the U.S. government. # 115.4What kind of identifying number must Members use when corresponding with the IRS and12for PRIVATE purposes then?

Because ITINs may only be issued to aliens and because members may not be aliens and must be nationals, then Members cannot use or apply for an ITIN. "Nationals", in fact, are nowhere even listed within the definition of "individual" at 26 C.F.R. §1.1441-1(c)(3) for withholding purposes. "Nationals" are, however, recognized as being able to file a 1040NR, as we point out in:

- Consequently, the following restrictions apply to members filing 1040NR returns or corresponding with the IRS in the context
   of identifying numbers:
- 19 1. Members may not apply for or use an ITIN because ITINs only apply to "alien individuals" and all Members are 20 "nationals" rather than "aliens".
- Members are also not eligible to participate in Social Security and therefore cannot use a STATUTORY SSN either.

By taking the above approach, we then may still conduct private commerce and develop a credit history, but also actually now OWN the number and control its use by the government. This approach is entirely consistent with the actual BEHAVIOR of government workers, who repeatedly refer to the number as "YOUR NUMBER", and thus YOUR PRIVATE PROPERTY. The fact that it is PRIVATE PROPERTY means you can deprive others of the use of it, place conditions on its use, and even

- 17 CHARGE them for the MISUSE of the number.

We're not suggesting that this is the ONLY way to handle the matter of using identifying numbers, but it's the only method we know of to remain in the private, and to do so consistent with everything we know about the requirements for identifying numbers in 26 U.S.C. §6109. This is such a sensitive Third Rail Issue that you will probably never get anyone in the government to even acknowledge or talk about it.<sup>3</sup> The most they can ever do is call it "frivolous", but its not on their list of frivolous arguments because to justify why its frivolous, they would have to break their silence on this Third Rail Issue. If you have a better approach, then please suggest it to us. If you do, you better think through every aspect we deal with here or your resolution will be incomplete and therefore unusable by our members.

 Security Number issued pursuant to the Social Security Act. Instead, it can mean an IRS-issued number instead.

# 7 <u>Who owns the CARD, the NUMBER, and the LABEL and why you don't</u> "have" a STATUTORY number unless you can control government with it

## 27 7.1 Social Security CARD as PROPERTY

First of all, based on the discussion in section 2 earlier, the only parties who can lawfully be assigned a Social Security Number are federal "employees". The SOCIAL SECURITY CARD is "public property" owned exclusively by the federal government, as confirmed by the regulations authorizing its issuance:

A public purpose or public business has for its objective the promotion of the public health, safety, morals, general welfare, security, prosperity, and contentment of all the inhabitants or residents within a given political division, as, for example, a state, the sovereign powers of which are exercised to promote such public purpose or public business."

[Black's Law Dictionary, Sixth Edition, p. 1231, Emphasis added]

### 14 7.2 Social Security NUMBER as PROPERTY

We have talked so far ONLY about the CARD and not the NUMBER. The regulation at 20 C.F.R. §422.103(d) says NOTHING about who owns the NUMBER. Is the NUMBER ALONE also PUBLIC PROPERTY? The answer to that question is NO. It takes more than just a mere number to be PROPERTY in a legal sense. From a general perspective, no one can own a number.

So it isn't a NUMBER as property they are GRANTING with legal strings attached that gives them the power to regulate its use under Article 4, Section 3, Clause 2 of the Constitution.

### **7.3** <u>"Social Security Number" LABEL as PROPERTY</u>

What about the term "Social Security Number"? Is that property from a legal perspective? The United States Government hasn't copyrighted any of its statutes or labels such as "Social Security Number" and can't legally do so. This is evident by reading the Copyright Act, 17 U.S.C. §105 so they don't OWN the LABEL as intellectual property. If the term "Social Security Number" were property, they would have to trademark it and put an "R" with a circle around it at the end of the name, for instance.

It is true, however, that anything Congress LEGISLATIVELY CREATES it owns. The CREATOR of a thing is ALWAYS
 the owner. See:

A LABEL put on something such a "Social Security Number" that is legislatively created by congress and is used as a legal conduit to CONVEY rights and therefore property can therefore ACT as property subject to the regulation and control of its CREATOR.

The act of legislatively CREATING the label that conveys rights and therefore property occurs in the DEFINITIONS section of legislation. A label such as "Social Security Number" is a THING. THINGs that convey property are called a "res" in law:

**Res.** Lat. The subject matter of a trust or will. In the civil law, a thing; an object. As a term of the law, this word has a very wide and extensive signification, including not only things which are objects of property, but also such as are not capable of individual ownership. And in old English law it is said to have a general import, comprehending both corporeal and incorporeal things of whatever kind, nature, or species. By "res," according to the modern civilians, is meant everything that may form an object of rights, in opposition to "persona," which is regarded as a subject of rights. "Res," therefore, in its general meaning, comprises actions of all kinds; while

An example of a res could be the corpus of a trust or even of the PUBLIC trust. The property interest attached to the "res" called the "Social Security Number" is PUBLIC property owned and controlled by the COLLECTIVE "State" through its agent, the U.S. Inc. federal corporation under 28 U.S.C. §3001(15)(A).

#### **VOLUNTARY and LAWFUL USE of a STATUTORY NUMBER and a STATUTORY** 7.4 1 LABEL in connection with the franchise contract is what incurs legal obligations 2

Earlier in section 3 we did indicate that the number BEHAVES as what the Federal Trade Commission identifies as a 3 "franchise mark". In order for a lawful use or expense of the "res" or property attached to the STATUTORY "Social Security 4 Number" to occur, the following conditions must be met in the use of the franchise mark: 5

- The government as Merchant must offer the use of the "Social Security Number" as property. 1. 6
- The offer must be lawful and in conformance with the terms of the franchise contract, which in this case is the Social 2. 7 Security Act. 8
- 3. The Buyer must VOLUNTARILY apply for and lawfully ACCEPT the offer on a form approved by the GRANTOR of 9 the franchise. 10
- Like any contract, there must be MUTUAL CONSIDERATION and MUTUAL OBLIGATION to be enforceable. 4. 11
- There must be a meeting of the minds. In U.C.C. terms, this means that the Merchant and the Buyer agree on the SAME 12 contract and the SAME definitions for all terms, franchise marks, etc. in the franchise or contract. See: 13

There can be NO duress on either party. A monopoly on the property that is the subject of the franchise is a source of 18 duress if the thing offered is essential to life and could introduce significant economic hardship to do without. This 19 scenario is called an "unconscionable contract" or "adhesion contract". 20

If the Buyer responds to the Merchant's offer with new or replacement definitions or new terms, instead of an acceptance, 21 you have in effect a counter-offer. In the presence of a counter offer, the Buyer then becomes the new Merchant specifying 22 NEW terms. If the original Merchant responds with their cooperation, they have accepted the counter offer of the original 23 Buyer, who then becomes the NEW Merchant. Cooperating with a counter-offer is sometimes called "implied consent". 24 Every major scenario the government uses to impair constitutional rights that are supposed to be UNALIENABLE per the 25 Declaration of Independence almost ALWAYS involves some kind of IMPLIED consent. A synonym for "implied consent" 26 we often use is "invisible consent". See: 27

There are also severe limitations on the government when it acts as a Merchant. It usually has a monopoly on the things it is 32 offering, leaving you very little choice. The actual OFFER is the legislation implementing the grant or franchise contract 33 authored by the Legislative Branch. The Executive Branch are the ones who ADMINISTER the franchise. They have no 34 authority to Legislate and therefore cannot change the definitions within the contract. If the Executive Branch DOES change 35 the definitions, they are exercising LEGISLATIVE powers in violation of the separation of powers doctrine, as we point out 36 in Form #05.023. 37

- The franchise or privilege can be challenged as invalid if: 38
- The Buyer submits evidence to the Merchant that duress was present when they made application. 1. 39
- The Buyer was acting in a representative capacity as an Agent and had no authority to consent. For instance, God's 2. 40 delegation of authority order, the Bible, forbids Christians to consent to ANYTHING the government offers and requires 41 to ALWAYS interact with the government as a MERCHANT. 42
- The franchise was offered in a geographical place not expressly authorized. For instance, the geographical definitions 43 3. in the Social Security Act in Title 42 limit Social Security participation to federal territory ONLY. Areas subject to the 44 exclusive jurisdiction of Constitutional states of the Union are not authorized and therefore UNLAWFUL. 45
- Participating in the franchise would create a conflict of interest on the part of the Merchant or Buyer that would deny 4. 46 justice. For instance, Social Security benefit recipients sitting on a jury and ruling on whether the defendant should 47 contribute to paying their benefits would be a clear conflict of interest. Ditto for judges. 48

- Participation in the franchise was only offered to federal statutory "employees" and 5 U.S.C. §2105 but the buyer is not an "employee" and cannot lawfully impersonate one without committing the crime of impersonating one in 18 U.S.C. §912.
- 6. The office of "employee" that participates is unlawfully exercised in a place not EXPRESSLY authorized as required by
   4 U.S.C. §72.

### 6 7.5 <u>Consequences of using the SSN ONLY when there is LAWFUL participation</u>

PROVIDED that all the requirements of the previous section are met and the participation is LAWFUL, use of the 7 STATUTORY Social Security Number beyond that point constitutes a license to act as a government employee or "trustee" 8 over public property. The PROPERTY under management by the trustee is the "res" represented by the Social Security 9 Number account. The number can <u>only</u> be used in connection with the official employment duties as a federal STATUTORY 10 "employee". If you are a private party who is not acting in a representative capacity and not lawfully exercising the agency 11 of federal employment or private contracts, you cannot lawfully use such a number and you cannot admit to ever having been 12 issued one. The number, which is public property, can only lawfully be assigned to the custody and possession of the federal 13 statutory "employee" or "public officer" while he is acting as a federal statutory "employee" or "public officer", and not to 14 the private human being. It is the same way with private employers, who will often fire their employees if they take company 15 property home for private use. If you use this public property for private use, then: 16

- You would be abusing public/government property, the SSN, for private gain. This is a criminal violation of <u>18 U.S.C.</u>
   <u>\$208</u>(a). Only federal "employees" on official duty can use or dispose of public/government property. If you are not on official duty as a federal "employee", then you cannot possess or "have" such a number and cannot truthfully claim to have ever been issued one.
- 2. You would be embezzling public property and converting it to private use, in violation of <u>18 U.S.C. §641</u>.
- 3. You would be impersonating a public employee, which is a crime under <u>18 U.S.C. §912</u> :

# 7.6 <u>Why you can't "HAVE" a STATUTORY number but CAN "HAVE" a NON-</u> <u>STATUTORY number</u>

In order to "have" a number:

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
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- You must be able to control the use of the number by all those who use it. "Ownership" implies FULL and EXCLUSIVE
   control. All uses of the number must require your consent, in accordance with the Privacy Act, <u>5 U.S.C. §552a(b)</u>.
   Otherwise, it is "their" number and not "yours". Remember: "The" and "IRS" together spells "THEIRS". Everything
   you "think" you own is really "THEIRS" when you use "their" numbers.
- Its use must provide a definite benefit to you personally that is contractually and legally protected. Social security
   benefits are not contractually or legally protected, according to the Supreme Court, and therefore, they are not necessarily
   "benefits".
- It must be in connection with an "entitlement or privilege". It is not a "privilege" to be tracked by IRS computers and be
   terrorized and harassed to illegally pay bribery money to a bloated government that does not respect your rights or obey
   the Constitution. It's a "liability" and not a "privilege".

Since <u>Social Security Numbers</u> (SSNs) and <u>Taxpayer Identifications Numbers</u> (TINs) do not fit any of the above criteria in the context of taxation, then they cannot be described as "your" number. The Supreme Court, in fact, agreed with these conclusions when it said in <u>Flemming v. Nestor, 363 U.S. 603 (1960)</u> that Social Security is <u>not</u> a contract and receipt of benefits is not a "right".

"We must conclude that <u>a person covered by the Act has not such a right in benefit payments</u>... This is not to
 say, however, that Congress may exercise its power to modify the statutory scheme free of all constitutional
 restraint."
 [Flemming v. Nestor, 363 U.S. 603 (1960) ]

Without a contractual entitlement and guarantee, then there is no definite or certain "benefit", which means that one cannot
"have" any right or entitlement to <u>anything</u> by virtue of having such a number. Thus, no valid contract is or can be formed
since there is no MUTUAL consideration and MUTUAL obligation. Consequently, when one is asked what is "your" number,
one can honestly respond by saying:



HOWEVER, if your SS-5 application defined the term "Social Security Number" as a NON-STATUTORY number and provided its own definition, then you removed the number from its franchise context and made a counter-offer with new terms that YOU define. You can therefore HAVE a NON-STATUTORY number in that scenario, as we explain later in section 19. You can also do this by AMENDING your original Form SS-5 application as we do in Form #06.002 as a part of the mandatory process for becoming compliant.

We caution, however, that these techiques of sophistry should be presented with the idea that you will not use them to get something for nothing or to avoid paying for government benefits you consume. So long as they are couched in an equitable setting such as the following, they are legitimate and cannot be frowned upon by the judge or the jury:

# 25 8 Social Security Trust

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<sup>26</sup> The Social Security System, in fact, is a Trust. All trusts require three entities to operate:

- A "*Grantor*" or "*Settlor*", which is the entity that created the trust. That would be the American People who, through their elected representatives, wrote the Social Security Act.
- 29 2. A "*Trustee*", which is you, who is a federal "employee" managing the trust.
- 30 3. A "*Beneficiary*", which is the U.S. government. The purpose of the Social Security System is NOT to pay you benefits 31 in old age, it is to increase the general revenues so as to inflate the federal retirement and power and control of your 32 "public servants".

The Social Security Trust is a "constructive trust", which is created when you complete and sign the SSA Form SS-5, application for Social Security. It is constructive, because you never explicitly signed a trust agreement and agreed to act as "Trustee", nor was your consent fully informed of the terms of the trust. The trust document is the <u>Social Security Act of</u> <u>1935</u>, codified in <u>Title 42 of the U.S. Code</u>. The assets of the trust are accumulated from your earnings. The trust is a "social insurance program" and the federal government is in the "insurance business" for its federal "<u>employees</u>". The federal Constitution, <u>Tenth Amendment</u>, forbids the federal government from offering such social insurance to anything BUT its own "<u>employees</u>", or offering it anywhere except within its own territories under its exclusive control. If you don't believe

- us, look at IRS Form 4029, which identifies Social Security as an "insurance program".
- The <u>Social Security Number</u> attaches to the position of "Trustee" of the trust. The all caps person name that is similar to your name when associated with government property in the form of the number is the legal "<u>res</u>" or "person" who is:
- 1. Acting as the Trustee and federal "<u>employee</u>".
- 44 2. A fiduciary over government payments under <u>26 U.S.C. §6901</u>.

3. A "transferee" under <u>26 U.S.C. §6903</u>.

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4. "An officer of a corporation", where the "corporation" is the United States Government, which is identified in <u>28 U.S.C.</u> <u>\$3002(15)(A) as a "federal corporation". As an "officer of a federal corporation", you are mentioned in <u>26 U.S.C.</u> <u>\$6671(b) and <u>26 U.S.C.</u> <u>\$7343</u> as the only proper subject of the penalty and criminal provisions of the Internal Revenue Code. You are also subject to the penalty and criminal provisions of the I.R.C. without the need for implementing regulations by virtue of the fact that <u>44 U.S.C.</u> <u>\$1505(a)(1)</u> says that implementing regulations are not required for those who are federal employees. Federal statutes may be enforced DIRECTLY against federal employees without the need for implementing regulations.
</u></u>

The so-called Social Security "benefits" that you allegedly receive don't make you the "Beneficiary" of the trust by any stretch of the imagination, but rather simply a federal "<u>employee</u>" and "Trustee" and "fiduciary" over public monies that used to be yours but became public monies when you joined the program and agreed to act as "Trustee". When you filled out and signed the IRS Form W-4, which is a contract (see <u>26 C.F.R. §31.3401(a)-3</u>), you obligated yourself to several things under the terms of the contract or what the government calls a "voluntary withholding agreement". In effect, you signed a private contract with the U.S. government to become part of the government and thereby qualify for federal employee benefits, including "social insurance":

- You changed from a private citizen to a federal public "employee" subject to the legislative jurisdiction of the federal government.
- Your private employment earnings changed character from that of *private* earnings to public property and federal payments. The Internal Revenue Code is the means by which that public property or "gift" is then managed under <u>26</u>
   U.S.C. §321(d). This is documented further in section 5.4.6 of the *Great IRS Hoax, Form #11.302*.
  - "Men are endowed by their Creator with certain unalienable rights,-'life, liberty, and the pursuit of happiness;' and to 'secure,' not grant or create, these rights, governments are instituted. <u>That property which a man has</u> <u>honestly acquired he retains full control of, subject to these limitations: First, that he shall not use it to his</u>
  - neighbor's injury, and that does not mean that he must use it for his neighbor's benefit; second, that if he devotes it to a public use, he gives to the public a right to control

that use [through the Internal Revenue Code, in this case]; and third, that whenever the public needs require, the public may take it upon payment of due compensation.

[Budd v. People of State of New York, 143 U.S. 517 (1892)]

- Your earnings are now called "wages", which is a "word of art" for income connected to a "trade or business" and a
   "public office" that originates from within the District of Columbia. <u>Click here</u> for an article showing how this scam

- 4. You consented to be treated as a "person" with a legal "domicile" within Washington, D.C., even if you in fact do not have a domicile there. <u>4 U.S.C. §72</u> says that all "public offices" must occur in the District of Columbia, and you identified yourself as a federal "employee" holding such an office by virtue of the fact that the upper left corner of the IRS Form W-4 says "employee", which is defined in <u>26 C.F.R. §31.3401(c)-1</u> as an elected or appointed officer of the United States Government. This is the same "public office" which is the only proper subject of levies in <u>26 U.S.C.</u> §6331(a). See the following for more details on this scam:

As a voluntary "Trustee", you become a "fiduciary" under 26 U.S.C. §6901 and a "transferee" under 26 U.S.C. §6903 over 1 federal property, which includes the Social Security Number and the Social Security card. The Social Security retirement 2 benefits, in fact, simply represent deferred federal employment compensation as a "Trustee". All employment compensation 3 is paid to this "Trustee" and not to you as a natural and private person. The payment checks are sent to the all-caps Trustee, 4 not the lower case you the natural person. You must consent or agree by your actions to represent this Trustee in order to 5 cash these deferred employment compensation payments to the Trustee called Social Security Checks. No one can compel 6 you to act as a "Trustee". To do otherwise would be to institute involuntary servitude in violation of the Thirteenth 7 Amendment. Because of the provisions of the Thirteenth Amendment, you can resign at any time as "Trustee" but the 8 government is going to make it very difficult for you to discover how to resign because they want to keep the federal gravy 9 train and your earnings running right up to their front porch. 10

The section above very deceptively doesn't indicate that the main prerequisite of receiving a number is that one is acting as or agrees to act as a federal "employee" or "public officer", but this is indeed the case. The first thing we notice about the above, is that it is in <u>Title 20 of the Code of Federal Regulations</u>, which is entitled "Employee's Benefits". That term "<u>employee</u>" is defined in <u>5 U.S.C. §2105</u>, <u>26 U.S.C. §3401</u>(c), and <u>26 C.F.R. §31.3401(c)-1</u> as a federal employee and NOT a private employee. The federal government has no authority over <u>private</u> employees or <u>private</u> employers in states of the Union, as confirmed by the U.S. Supreme Court:

<sup>31</sup> Under "course of dealing" principles, the IRS therefore has a reason to PRESUME from the past 1040 filings (before he <sup>32</sup> stopped filing) that the party understood they had a duty to make a return whenever they had STATUTORY "gross income" <sup>33</sup> above personal exemption amount---but this would be used primarily to prove their failure was willful.

Since tax is imposed in 26 C.F.R. §1.1-1 on all income of a STATUTORY citizen or resident alien, and supplying an SSN 34 creates a presumption of "citizen of the U.S.\*\*" then the party using an SSN is presumed person liable per 26 U.S.C. §6001. 35 You can see how easy this is to fix in the above regulation--provide proof of foreign status for the SSN or even specify that 36 the number is NOT a statutory number, but a private number. The wording makes it sound like it is more difficult than it is. 37 They use the term "nonresident alien individual" interchangeably with "foreign status", but "nonresident alien 38 INDIVIDUALS or PERSONS" are not the only foreigners. To them, "foreign status" means one who is a "nonresident alien 39 INDIVIDUAL"--which you can "prove" by simply declaring it--they can't FORCE you to remain a citizen of the U.S. when 40 it is a basis for taxing all of your income because that would be slavery. 41

Keep in mind also that "nonresident alien individual" is NOT the only "foreign status". Those who are not aliens but who are nonresidents would not be "nonresident alien individuals", but rather "non-resident non-persons". THIS is what a state national is and the above regulation doesn't even acknowledge the existence of such a party. The reason is that:

- 1. They are completely outside the jurisdiction of the Internal Revenue Code.
- 46 2. They have a foreign domicile but not a foreign nationality. Therefore, they cannot be sued under federal statutes per
   47 Federal Rule of Civil Procedure 17(b).
- 48 3. Social Security cannot be offered or enforced against them. See:

27 Consequently, if you are receiving federal payments or "benefits", there are only two ways to describe the result:

1. Your government is a thief and a Robinhood and you continue to be a private citizen....OR

- 29 2. You are a federal "employee" and the payment is "employment compensation".
- <sup>30</sup> Take your pick, but you *have* to pick either one of the two and not both.

If the number is attached to any of your bank or financial accounts, those accounts are owned by the federal government and under their supervision, because they were opened by its "employees" or "public officers" in the conduct of a type of federal employment called a "trade or business". A "trade or business" is defined in <u>26 U.S.C. §7701</u>(a)(26) as a "public office" in which you essentially become a business partner with the federal government. Your employment compensation consists of:

- 1. Deferred employment compensation called Social Security benefits.
- 36 2. Unemployment compensation (FICA) benefits
- 37 3. Medicare benefits

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- <sup>38</sup> 4. Reductions in federal tax liability taken under the following sections of the code:
  - 4.1. Graduated and reduced rate of tax under <u>26 U.S.C. §1</u>
  - 4.2. Earned income credit under <u>26 U.S.C. §32</u>
  - 4.3. "Trade or Business" deductions under <u>26 U.S.C. §162</u>
- In the context of federal "benefit" programs, which essentially amount to "social insurance", the Privacy Act, 5 U.S.C. §552a
   confirms that all those who participate in such programs are "federal personnel":

- Consequently, anyone who asks you to supply YOUR "Social Security Number" indirectly is asking you the following TWO
   questions:
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1. "Are you a federal "employee" or "public officer" on official duty at the moment?".... AND

2. If you are, what is your license number to act in that capacity?

The answer to this question should always be that you are a private human being and not a statutory "person" or "individual" 9 and who cannot lawfully possess or use government property or numbers, and that it is UNLAWFUL for you to impersonate 10 a "public officer" of the U.S. government in violation of <u>18 U.S.C. §912</u> by providing or using one as a private human being. 11 Furthermore, if they insist that you have or use one, then make sure you fill out an IRS Form 56 and make THEM, not YOU 12 the surety and the person responsible for the duties associated with the "public office" they are effectively creating by using 13 a number against your will. The First Amendment to the United States Constitution guarantees us a right of free association. 14 This implies at least the ability to determine when we are working and when we are off work. The employment contract for 15 federal "employees" is found in Title 5 of the U.S. Code. It doesn't say what the working hours are for federal benefit 16 recipients, and therefore we can choose what those hours are even if we did voluntarily apply for and continue to use such a 17 number. 18

# 10 Social Security Numbers assigned to or used by Nonresident Aliens (Members)

The approach of this site relies on the Nonresident Alien Position. The regulations under 26 U.S.C. §6109 recognize the use of Social Security Numbers by nonresident aliens as follows:

- 26 <u>26 C.F.R. §301.6109-1 Identifying numbers.</u>
- 27 (d) Obtaining a taxpayer identifying number
- 28 (4) Coordination of taxpayer identifying numbers—

4. What is WRONG with the above response is that if you already HAVE an SSN, you aren't ALLOWED to even ask for
an International Taxpayer Identification Number (ITIN) on a W-7 form under 26 U.S.C. §6109(i). They can only be
issued to aliens, and not all "nonresident aliens" are "aliens". State nationals or statutory "U.S. nationals" are not
aliens, for instance.

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26 C.F.R. §301.6109-1 - Identifying numbers.

(3) IRS individual taxpayer identification number-

(i) Definition.

The term IRS individual taxpayer identification number means a <u>taxpayer</u> identifying number <u>issued to an alien</u> <u>individual by the Internal Revenue Service</u>, upon application, for use in connection with filing requirements under this title. The term IRS individual taxpayer identification number does not refer to a social security <u>number or an account number for use in employment for wages.</u> For <u>purposes</u> of this section, the term alien individual means an individual who is not a citizen or national of the United States.

5. We allege that based on the above, the IRS doesn't want you to know HOW to change the status of the SSN from that
of a "U.S. person" to a "nonresident alien". That is why they won't describe how to do it. Further, based on 26 U.S.C.
§6109(g), that change can ONLY be made in the context of Federal Crop Insurance, so filing a 1040NR return doesn't
seem like it would accomplish that.

# 18 11 How to terminate or change the status of the number

The Internal Revenue Code, Section 6109 contains provisions for issuing Taxpayer Identification Numbers but we have found no statutory or regulatory provision for terminating the number or returning it to the government. Likewise, the Social Security Act has provisions to issue the number in 20 C.F.R. §422.104, but we have found no statutory provisions for terminating it. The reason the government does this is that they want to maintain your eligibility to receive the so-called benefit and thereby perpetuate their authority to enforce the franchise agreement codified in the Internal Revenue Code Subtitle A and the Social Security Act against you. This was hinted at by the Supreme Court when it held the following on the subject of "benefits":

Another technique for ensuring they do something about it is to fill out an IRS Form 56 making the IRS commissioner and/or the Commissioner of Social Security the fiduciary for all liabilities relating to the number. Since the number belongs to them, then let THEM take complete and exclusive responsibility for every aspect of its use or abuse. This technique is used on the *Resignation of Compelled Social Security Trustee*, Form #06.002 mentioned above, and it really puts them on the hot seat because now they become the targets for all the collection notices and liens, not you.

This section establishes that both STATUTORY "nonresident aliens" AND STATUTORY "non-resident non-persons" are not required to have or use an SSN or TIN to open bank or financial accounts. The following authorities right from the horse's mouth establish that nonresident aliens don't need Social Security Numbers to either work or to open bank accounts. Use this as ammunition when opening accounts or pursuing employment:

 It is ILLEGAL to assign a "Social Security Number" to a "Nonresident alien". Do you see nonresident aliens listed below? A nonresident alien, defined in <u>26 U.S.C. §7701(b)(1)(B)</u> is NOT the same as an "alien" as defined in <u>26 U.S.C.</u> <u>§7701(b)(1)(A)</u>. Notice also that the regulation is under Title 20, which is "<u>Employee</u>" benefits. They are talking about federal "<u>employees</u>" only, and not everyone generally. The federal government has <u>no authority</u> to legislate for private <u>employees</u>: only PUBLIC employees. They also cannot legislate for people outside of their jurisdiction. A "nonresident" is outside of their jurisdiction.

The above cites don't cover the requirements for STATUTORY "non-resident non-persons" who are entirely PRIVATE, but the implications are obvious. Congress can only regulate and tax PUBLIC conduct of agents and officers of the national government. A "non-resident non-person" is not such an agent or officer.

Even the nonresident aliens mentioned above are such agents and officers IF they use government identifying numbers and IF they were "individuals", meaning officers of the government, BEFORE they used the number. Since the number is a franchise mark that causes the party using it to be ILLEGALLY treated as an agent and franchisee of Uncle Sam, then those who don't use the number are, by definition, exclusively PRIVATE, and not subject but not exempt, from the provisions of the Internal Revenue Code. Any attempt to impute any civil status, including "nonresident alien" or "nonresident alien individual" to an exclusively PRIVATE human not engaged in a public office as an agent of the government and not consenting to do so is, in fact, CRIMINAL IDENTITY THEFT. 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# 18 14 Mandatory Use of SSNs/TINs

### 19 14.1 <u>Compelled use forbidden by Privacy Act</u>

The Privacy Act forbids compelled use of SSNs. Those demanding numbers must disclose BOTH whether the disclosure is MANDATORY or VOLUNTARY, and the statute that makes it mandatory IN YOUR CASE and based on YOUR SPECIFIC STATUS:

### <sup>3</sup> 14.4 <u>When is it mandatory under the I.R.C. to provide government issued numbers?</u>

It will interest the reader to know that the ONLY provision of law mandating use of Social Security Numbers is found in regulations relating ONLY to federal employees! The authority to write such regulations comes from 5 U.S.C. §301 (federal employees), which establishes that the head of an Executive or military department may prescribe regulations for the *internal* government of his department.

This analysis is also consistent with the fact that regulations may NOT exceed the scope of the statutes they implement. 26 U.S.C. §6109 never requires anyone to OBTAIN a Taxpayer Identification Number, so the regulations that implement it cannot UNLESS the obligation is ONLY imposed WITHIN by the Secretary WITHIN the Treasury Department upon his or her OWN statutory "employees" under 5 U.S.C. §2105(a). The U.S. Supreme Court recognized this limitation of regulations in United States v. Calamaro, 354 U.S. 351 (1957).

<u>26 C.F.R. §301.6109-1</u>(b) is the only provision of law which expressly requires the use of Taxpayer Identification Numbers.
 It says on the requirement to use such numbers the following:

Pursuant to 5 U.S.C. §301 (federal employees), the above regulations therefore DO NOT pertain to PRIVATE companies or even government agencies OUTSIDE of the Treasury Department.

Notice also the word "its" in the above regulation. This should clue you into the fact that the tax code doesn't apply to flesh 3 and blood people, who are called "natural persons" in regulations like that above. If they had meant to refer to such a natural 4 person, the word "its" would have said "his" or "her". Consequently, the only type of "person", they can be referring to is a 5 privileged corporation or an officer representing said corporation, as was pointed out at the beginning of chapter 5 of the 6 Great IRS Hoax, Form #11.302. Also keep in your mind that the above regulation implements a code that is not positive 7 law and therefore imposes no obligation upon anyone who does not consent to be bound by it by occupying a public office 8 or position of employment within the U.S. government. The "U.S. person" identified above is defined below to mean a 9 person born in or "resident" only within the District of Columbia, as follows. Note that "United States" is defined in 26 10 U.S.C. §7701(a)(9) and (a)(10) to mean ONLY the District of Columbia: 11

All government identifying numbers may only lawfully be issued to persons participating in government franchises. They act as the equivalent of license numbers for those engaging in franchises. The following IRS publications plainly admit when government-issued numbers are mandatory, and all of them relate to those obtaining or qualifying for some government benefit or privilege. These cites are VERY important because once you can prove the things for which TINs are positively required, then all other uses are VOLUNTARY and not mandatory. Simply show them the list below and if your circumstances are not in it, then demand that they show a statute documenting an affirmative requirement to provide an identifying number:

- <sup>1</sup> To summarize all of the requirements pertaining to the mandatory use of identifying numbers from all the publications above:
- Only STATUTORY "individuals" are required to obtain identifying numbers. "Individuals" are defined in 26 C.F.R.
   §1.1441-1(c)(3) as "aliens", meaning foreign nationals from a foreign country. This is also consistent with the requirements of 20 C.F.R. §422.104.
- 2. "citizens" are nowhere expressly required to obtain an identifying number. Only "aliens" are required to obtain a number, which are foreign nationals born in a foreign country. They are only required to obtain identifying numbers when domiciled on federal territory and outside the exclusive jurisdiction of a state of the Union. The reason they can be required to obtain such a number is because all aliens are "privileged" while they are visiting federal territory. This is confirmed by the following authorities, which prove that "aliens" with a domicile in a country are "privileged":
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"Residents, as distinguished from citizens, are aliens who are permitted to take up a permanent abode [domicile] in the country. Being bound to the society by reason of their [intention of] dwelling in it, they are subject to its laws so long as they remain there, and, being protected by it, they must defend it, although they do not enjoy all the rights of citizenship. They have only certain privileges which the law, or custom, gives them. Permanent residents are those who have been given the right of perpetual residence. They are a sort of citizen of a less privileged character, and are subject to the society without enjoying all its advantages. Their children succeed to their status; for the right of perpetual residence given them by the State passes to their children." [The Law of Nations, p. 87, E. De Vattel, Volume Three, 1758, Carnegie Institution of Washington; emphasis added.]

- If you are participating in a federal benefit or franchise, then you must provide a number. These benefits are identified
   on IRS Form 1042s instructions and include:
  - 3.1. A "trade or business", which is defined in 26 U.S.C. §7701(a)(26) as "the functions of a public office".
  - 3.2. Reduced rate or exemption from tax arising from a tax treaty with a foreign country.
  - 3.3. Exemptions such as child write-offs.
  - 3.4. Any nonresident alien individual claiming exemption from tax under section 871(f) for certain annuities received under qualified plans.
  - 3.5. A foreign organization claiming an exemption from tax solely because of its status as a tax-exempt organization under section 501(c) or as a private foundation.
    - 3.6. Any QI.
  - 3.7. Any WP or WT.
  - 3.8. Any nonresident alien individual claiming exemption from withholding on compensation for independent personal services [services connected with a "trade or business"].
  - 3.9. Any foreign grantor trust with five or fewer grantors.
  - 3.10. Any branch of a foreign bank or foreign insurance company that is treated as a "U.S. person" under 26 U.S.C. §7701(a)(30).
- There is no authority within the I.R.C. to CREATE a "public office" by filling out any form. You must be elected into 35 4. the office by a lawful vote and you can't "elect" yourself into office by simply filling out a form. You must ALREADY 36 be a "public officer" within the U.S. government in order to have a tax liability that can be reduced by any of the above 37 so-called "benefits". 4 U.S.C. §72 says that all "public offices" must be exercised in the District of Columbia and not 38 elsewhere except as expressly provided in an act of Congress. There is no act of Congress which expressly authorizes 39 "public offices" within any state of the Union, and therefore it is ILLEGAL to participate in the "trade or business" 40 franchise as a person domiciled within the exclusive jurisdiction of a state of the Union. Withholding agents will sometimes try to require people who ambiguously claim they are "citizens" to fill out a Form W-9, 1 but it isn't necessary and such parties are NOT even mentioned in 26 U.S.C. §1441 as being subject to withholding or 2 reporting. IRS seems to know this, because they NEVER say in 26 C.F.R. §1.1441-1 EXACTLY WHO must fill out a W-9 3 and only talk about "W-9 required". They do this to illegally rope statutory "U.S. persons", statutory "citizens and residents", 4 and statutory state "nationals" illegally into a tax system that doesn't pertain to them when they are in the country. 5

#### **15** Penalties for failure to disclose numbers 6

#### 15.1 Failure to provide TIN on information returns 7

Information returns include IRS Forms W-2, 1042-S, 1098, 1099, K-1, etc. 26 U.S.C. §6721(a) imposes a penalty against 8 those who file information returns that do not include all the information required on the form. 9

The above statute does not impose a DUTY to obtain a number, but only to disclose the number if they have one under threat of withholding if they don't.

The term "Transferor" is defined at 26 U.S.C. §1445(f)(1) as the person disposing of United States real property, meaning real property owned by the U.S. government and not private parties. 26 U.S.C. §897 further characterizes the "Transferor" as a "nonresident alien individual" or "foreign corporation". Consequently, one would not be a "Transferor" subject to withholding, even without a number, if:

- 1. The entity was not a "nonresident alien individual" or "foreign corporation".
- 28 2. The entity was a "nontaxpayer" not subject to the I.R.C.
- The property was not located in the "United States", which is defined in 26 U.S.C. §7701(a)(9) and (a)(10) as the District of Columbia and no part of any state of the Union.
- The entity was not a "Transferor", meaning a "nonresident alien individual" or "foreign corporation" selling real property in the District of Columbia.

# 16 Getting Rid of SSNs/TINs in your IRS or other government record

By following the procedures given above to rebut any association with an identifying number, you will go a long way toward eliminating it from government records. The other important thing is to make sure that:

- 1. You discontinue using it or writing any identifying numbers on any new government forms you fill out.
- You correct your status with the Social Security Administration by sending in an amended SSA Form SS-5 changing your citizenship status to that of a "national" who is not a STATUTORY "U.S. citizen".
- 39 3. You go back and refile all government forms that are still in use which indicated a number, such as:
- 40 3.1. <u>IRS Form W-8BEN</u> submitted to financial institutions and/or employers
- 3.2. IRS Form W-4 (which you SHOULDN'T be using). See the free Federal and State Tax Withholding Options for

- 3.3. Passport applications.
- 3.4. Jury summons responses. 2
  - 3.5. Voter registration :
- 3.6. Driver's license 4

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- 3.6.1. Driver's license application -get a driver's license without an SSN
  - 3.6.2. Change of Address
- 3.7. Job applications.
- 3.8. Tax returns (by revoking your signature on all past returns filed).
- 4. If anyone files a W-2 in your name because of mistake or coercion or tries to withhold Social Security/FICA taxes 9 documented on the W-2, you MUST submit IRS Form 843 to DEMAND a refund of all such payments and an SSA 10 Form 7008 to correct Social Security records reflecting creditable payments. 11
- 5. If the IRS or state sends you a collection notice, you must emphasize that the number was used under duress and that it 12 is NOT a statutory number and that commercial use of the number by them constitutes consent to YOUR franchise 13 agreement as shown in the following: 14

# **18** Changing the status of the SSN from U.S. person to Foreign Person

26 C.F.R. §301.6109-1(g)(1)(i) establishes the authority to make a change to the status of an SSN from that held by a domestic
 statutory "U.S. person" to that of a "foreign person":

We have found no IRS publication that identifies EXACTLY what would satisfy the requirement for "proof" mentioned above. The IRS Form W-8BEN, like the IRS Form 8832 for accomplishing the change in an EIN, would seem to be one method. However, the IRS Form W-8BEN says on the form NOT to send it the Internal Revenue Service.

If you read the regulation it becomes quite clear that the way to change an SSN to foreign status is through the use of a 1040-NR form. An SSN is only used in regard to an individual. An individual using an SSN is either a nonresident alien or a <sup>1</sup> United States person (citizen or resident of the United States). The term "individual" for withholding purposes is consistently <sup>2</sup> defined in 26 U.S.C. §1.1441-1(c)(3) as an ALIEN and not a national.

As the regulation states that an SSN is generally presumed to belong to a statutory "U.S. person" (whatever that means, but for the sake of this exercise we will presuppose they mean United States person, even though that's not unambiguously manifest), and 26 C.F.R. §1.6012-1(a)(6) regulation states that a 1040 is the prescribed form for such person, it seems reasonable to conclude that since that same regulation set states that a 1040-NR is the prescribed form for the nonresident alien individual that this can translate to "foreign person" as used in the 26 C.F.R. §301.6109-1 regulation.

Consequently, the ONLY lawful way to approach the providing of what the 1040NR form itself identifies as an "Identifying
 Number" and NOT a "Social Security Number" is to provide a SUBSTITUTE number as we describe later in section 19.

We know that tax matters are year to year matters. Therefore, permanent in the context of ONLY the IRS ITIN and NOT the SSN can at best mean permanent within a taxable year. Permanent is defined in 8 U.S.C. §1101, and though not directly applicable to 26 U.S.C., it gives some context as to potential mindset and intent.

(31) The term "<u>permanent</u>" means a relationship of continuing or lasting nature, as distinguished from temporary, but a relationship may be <u>permanent</u> even though it is one that may be dissolved eventually at the instance either of the <u>United States</u> or of the individual, in accordance with law.

Permanent means "of a lasting nature...but which may be changed by x,y,z." Therefore it does not mean FOR-EVERRRRRR (<u>https://www.youtube.com/watch?v=Fdnz-T5cWyQ</u>) in the sense that most people colloquially use the term to connote eternal.

Those circumstances can certainly change with the roll-over of the tax year, when IRS rolls out the skeleton for the new master file for the taxpayer. This usually coincides with what we have observed with some form of information return being posted against the person's number.

For example, if we have an SSN, the IRS presumes it belongs to a statutory "U.S. person". If one has filed a 1040 for decades, that's reasonable. If they file in 2020 using a 1040-NR, and the IRS accepts the return, that status will permanently be assigned to the SSN until circumstances change (as previously mentioned).

This can be observed by the reviewing the IRS online account return transcript at ID.ME. For example, 2019 a wife filed a joint return with her husband on a 1040, and the transcript reflects a 1040 as the form. In 2020, before filing a 1040-NR, wife's transcript showed the default 1040 (as the presumed to be filed form). The wife then filed a Married Filing Single 1040-NR for 2020 and as a result her return transcript for 2020 now shows form as 1040-NR. For 2021, neither wife nor husband have filed so both show presumptive form to be filed as 1040. Wife's "circumstances have changed" and the default status was reverted to.

We think this is as close of an answer as you will find, as we know people who have done FOIA and other info requests and gotten diddly to confirm. For instance. See the following, for instance:

## **19** How to use "substitute numbers" to avoid being privileged

### 4 19.1 DOD ID Numbers for Military Members

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5 DOD ID Numbers can be used as a substitute for Social Security Numbers. They can be used in the following circumstances:

- 6 1. When submitting VA Form 10, Application for Health Benefits.
- 2. When submitting DD Form 108, Application for Retired Pay and Benefits to the department you served in.

The social security number (SSN) has been used throughout the Department of Defense (DOD) as a means to identify and authenticate individuals and its expanded use has increased efficiency, enabling DoD information systems and processes to interoperate and transfer information with a greatly reduced chance of errors. However, the threat of identity theft has rendered this widespread use unacceptable, resulting in the requirement that all Federal agencies evaluate how the SSN is used to eliminate its unnecessary use where possible.

One effort initiated to reduce the use of the SSN is to replace it with the number known as the Electronic Data Interchange-Personal Identifier (EDI-PI) that has been a unique identifier for personnel affiliated with the DoD for many years. Until recently, it was used only by DoD information systems to facilitate machine-to-machine communications and appeared in digital signatures. When the EDI-PI was selected to become the DoD identification number (DoD ID Number), the purpose of the identifier changed.

The expanded use of the DoD ID Number has led to questions regarding its status as personally identifiable information (PII). PII refers to information that can be used to distinguish or trace an individual's identity. The DoD ID Number falls into this category because it is a unique personal identifier and can be used to retrieve records about an individual.

The DoD ID Number is now intended to be known by the individual to whom it belongs, and is printed on DoD identification cards. It is to be used for individual access to systems, on forms, in digital signatures and for other uses typical of physical and technical identification processes.

DOD ID Numbers were introduced to reduce the use of Social Security Numbers to prevent identity theft. They are used for DOD business purposes and may include transactions with entities outside the DOD, so long as individuals are acting on behalf of or in support of the DOD. The DoD ID Number may not be shared with other Federal agencies unless a Memorandum of Understanding (MOU) is agreed upon by both the DoD and the recipient agency. MOUs for sharing the DoD ID Number are managed and administered for the Under Secretary of Defense for Personnel and Readiness (USD(P&R)) by the Defense Manpower Data Center (DMDC). As of the writing of this memorandum, they are mainly used in connection with ID cards. Social Security Numbers have been removed from DOD ID cards throughout the military.

Presence or knowledge of an individual's DoD ID Number alone shall be considered as no more significant than presence or knowledge of that individual's name. The DoD ID Number does not constitute any level of authority to act on that individual's behalf.

The DoD ID Number, by itself or with an associated name, shall be considered internal government operations-related PII. Since the loss, theft or compromise of the DoD ID Number has a low risk for possible identity theft or fraud, a PII breach report will not be initiated unless the breach is associated with other PII elements, such as date of birth, birthplace or mother's maiden name, which would normally require a report to be submitted. As detailed in DoDI 1000.30, "Reduction of Social Security Number (SSN) Use Within DoD", exposure of the DoD ID Number shall not be considered a breach when exposed as a part of a DoD business function.

#### 17 **19.2** <u>Using all zeros</u>

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Yet another approach to avoid using the "government's" numbers is to either use all zeros. The following Social Security publication indicates on pages 16 and 29 that if the subject of the W-2 report does not have an SSN, then the number "000-00-0000" can be used:

#### **19.3 Defining "Social Security Number" with your own definition**

Another useful approach is to use the same number as they use, but to give it a new name so that they can't use it as an SSN or TIN and can only use it as an account number. This prevents them from being able to presume that you are a "taxpayer" or that the number is THEIR number. The following authorities support this approach.

26 C.F.R. §301.6109-1(g)(1)(i) authorizes anyone to send a request to the IRS and the Social Security Administration
 which allows the status of THEIR number to be changed into the equivalent of a "Nontaxpayer Identification Number"
 or "NIN" for short that belongs to a nonresident alien not engaged in a "trade or business".

- "...A person may establish a different status for the number by providing proof of foreign status with the Internal Revenue Service...Upon accepting an individual as a nonresident alien individual, the Internal Revenue Service will assign this status to the individual's social security number... [26 C.F.R. §301.6109-1(g)(1)(i)]
- We have found no IRS publication that identifies EXACTLY what would satisfy the requirement for "proof" mentioned above, but we believe that either of the following two forms would suffice:
  - 2.1. IRS Form W-8BEN, Form #04.202

  - 2.2. <u>Affidavit of Citizenship, Domicile, and Tax Status</u>, Form #02.001 <u>http://sedm.org/Forms/FormIndex.htm</u>
- Every correspondence you send the IRS should include proof of your "foreign status" such as that in the previous step,
   and a brief explanation of any numbers included in the correspondence. By "Foreign status", they mean that you are a
   "nonresident alien" as defined in <u>26 U.S.C. §7701(b)(1)(B)</u> with no "trade or business" earnings, and all of whose
   estate is a "foreign estate" as defined in <u>26 U.S.C. §7701(a)(31)</u>. The correspondence should say that the number, if it
   is included:
- 43 3.1. Is NOT "<u>Social Security Number</u>" or "<u>Taxpayer Identification Number</u>".
- 3.2. Is a PRIVATELY ISSUED number called a "Nontaxpayer Identification Number" whose use is privileged,
   copyrighted, and licensed. That number happens to match the same number in IRS systems but is NOT an SSN or TIN.

3.3. Belongs to a "nonresident alien" not engaged in a "trade or business" as defined in 26 C.F.R. §1.871-1(b)(i).

The ONLY occasion where we would take the above approach of inventing our own number is ONLY if we are sending in corrected information returns. We would not use it in any correspondence or tax returns we send to the IRS because they are handled by individual people, whereas the Information Returns are processed and scanned by computer, and the computers won't automatically fix the erroneous information returns unless they can do numeric matching. This approach of using a SUBSTITUTE NIN would be used, for instance, in submitting any of the following Forms:

Other than in the above specific circumstances, we suggest ALWAYS doing the following when either responding to federal or state collection correspondence or sending in a tax return:

- 1. Making a copy of the original notice you receive on the collection correspondence.
- 27 2. Blacking out any identifying numbers in thick black felt tip pen and writing next to it "WRONG!"
- 3. Not putting any identifying number in your responsive correspondence but instead emphasizing that you "have" no
- number and cannot lawfully possess "public property" such as federal identifying numbers as a "private person". 20
   C.F.R. §422.103(d) says that the number and the card are the property of the Social Security Administration and NOT
   you. Therefore, it constitutes theft and embezzlement, and abuse of public property to use it as a "private person" who
- is NOT a "public officer" and who refuses to act as one.
- 4. Demand that the government IMMEDIATELY destroy ALL records about you, and especially information returns and identifying numbers. This is a requirement of the Privacy Act, <u>5 U.S.C. §552a</u>(b), which says that the government
   *cannot* disclose or maintain any records about you without your consent. Tell them they DON'T have your consent and therefore MUST destroy and redact all records about you. If they violate this request, they are also violating your
   Fourth Amendment right to privacy, which it was the purpose of the Privacy Act to protect in the first place.

   Include our Wrong Party Notice that contains a Copyright License Notice with each correspondence to put them into a
- "privileged" state if they use anything you give them similar to the below. This will cause them to have to pay a
   penalty every time they make demands on your time in responding without addressing any of the legal issues you raise:

# 20 <u>Banking and Financial Industry Policy and Guidance on Use of SSN's and TINs</u>

The banking industry maintains a website called "<u>Bankers Online</u>". On their website, they feature a pamphlet for use by bank personnel regarding the use of TINs by customers who do not wish to have or use them. Below are links to this important document:

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If a bank pressures or compels you to provide a TIN when you want to open an account, you should ask them for the regulation
 that authorizes them to compel use of such a number. Chances are, they will cite <u>31 C.F.R. §1020.220</u>, which says in pertinent
 part:

Note to paragraph (A)(2)(I)(A)(4)(ii):

When opening an account for a foreign business or enterprise that does not have an identification number, the <u>bank</u> must request alternative government-issued documentation certifying the existence of the business or enterprise.

(B) Exception for persons applying for a taxpayer identification number. Instead of obtaining a taxpayer identification number from a customer prior to opening the account, the CIP may include procedures for opening an account for a customer that has applied for, but has not received, a taxpayer identification number. In this case, the CIP must include procedures to confirm that the application was filed before the customer opens the account and to obtain the taxpayer identification number within a reasonable period of time after the account is opened.

(*C*) Credit card accounts. In connection with a <u>customer</u> who opens a credit card <u>account</u>, a <u>bank</u> may obtain the identifying information about a <u>customer</u> required under paragraph (a)(2)(i)(A) by acquiring it from a third-party source prior to extending credit to the <u>customer</u>.

(ii) Customer verification. The CIP must contain procedures for verifying the identity of the customer, using information obtained in accordance with paragraph (a)(2)(i) of this section, within a reasonable time after the account is opened. The procedures must describe when the bank will use documents, non-documentary methods, or a combination of both methods as described in this paragraph (a)(2)(ii).

(A) Verification through documents. For a <u>bank</u> relying on documents, the CIP must contain procedures that set forth the documents that the <u>bank</u> will use. These documents may include:

(1) For an individual, unexpired government-issued identification evidencing nationality or residence and bearing a photograph or similar safeguard, such as a driver's license or passport; and

(2) For a person other than an individual (such as a corporation, partnership, or trust), documents showing the existence of the entity, such as certified articles of incorporation, a government-issued business license, a partnership agreement, or trust instrument.

(B) Verification through non-documentary methods. For a <u>bank</u> relying on non-documentary methods, the CIP must contain procedures that describe the non-documentary methods the <u>bank</u> will use.

(1) These methods may include contacting a customer; independently verifying the customer's identity through the comparison of information provided by the customer with information obtained from a consumer reporting agency, public database, or other source; checking references with other financial institutions; and obtaining a financial statement.

(2) The bank's non-documentary procedures must address situations where an individual is unable to present an unexpired government-issued identification document that bears a photograph or similar safeguard; the bank is not familiar with the documents presented; the account is opened without obtaining documents; the customer opens the account without appearing in person at the bank; and where the bank is otherwise presented with circumstances that increase the risk that the bank will be unable to verify the true identity of a customer through documents.

(C) Additional verification for certain customers. The CIP must address situations where, based on the bank's risk assessment of a new account opened by a customer that is not an individual, the bank will obtain information about individuals with authority or control over such account, including signatories, in order to verify the customer's identity. This verification method applies only when the bank cannot verify the customer's true identity using the verification methods described in paragraphs (a)(2)(ii)(A) and (B) of this section.

(iii) Lack of verification. The CIP must include procedures for responding to circumstances in which the <u>bank</u> cannot form a reasonable belief that it knows the true identity of a <u>customer</u>. These procedures should describe:

(A) When the <u>bank</u> should not open an <u>account</u>;

### 8 21 How to respond to requests for SSNs or TINs

If you do not think that your compensation from federal "employment" or "public office" is sufficient and do not choose to act as a Social Security "Trustee" and federal "employee", and especially not in the context of your private life, then you can follow the instructions in each of the following subsections. In addition to the responses below, you can also use the completed version of the <u>Resignation of Compelled Social Security Trustee</u>, Form #06.002 form mentioned in the previous section as proof of the illegality of using a Social Security Number.

#### 14 21.1 Avoiding confrontations in responding to requests for SSN/TIN from business associates

It is important to avoid conflict in your dealings with your business associates in responding to requests for an SSN/TIN. If you fail at this skill, you could find yourself starving to death on the street. The following sections address how to minimize conflicts in responding to such questions.

#### 18 21.1.1 Legal constraints for requesting an SSN/TIN

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- 19 1. STATUTORY SSNs/TINs are government property. 20 C.F.R. §422.103(d).
  - 1.1. It functions as what the Federal Trade Commission (F.T.C.) classifies as a "franchise mark".
  - 1.2. If they ask you for "YOUR Social Security Number" they effectively are asking: "Are you a public officer on official business, and if so, please present your LICENSE NUMBER to act in such a capacity".
- Only PUBLIC OFFICERS on official business can use PUBLIC property. A public officer, after all, is legally defined
   as someone in charge of the PROPERTY of the public.
- If they ask you for "YOUR Social Security Number" they are advertising to you that the version of it they are asking
   for is the one you absolutely own and can use to control THEM with.
  - 3.1. If it is YOUR absolutely owned PRIVATE property, you have a right to deny them the use of it and control EVERY aspect of how they use it and even deny them the ability to use it for reporting purposes.
  - 3.2. If it is the GOVERNMENT'S property, then it's not YOUR property, but Uncle's property, in which case you CANNOT use or benefit from public property while you are acting in a PRIVATE capacity. That would be theft and conversion.
- Whether the term "SSN" or "TIN" is PUBLIC or PRIVATE property is determined by who DEFINES what the term means during the process of completing a government form or application.
  - 4.1. He who writes the RULES or the DEFINITIONS always wins.
  - 4.2. You as the person filling out the form are the only one who can DEFINE what the terms mean, because you are the only one filling out the form as a witness. It's a crime to threaten or tamper with such a witness.
  - 4.3. The government CANNOT define the terms on the form, because the courts have repeatedly held that YOU CANNOT TRUST anything the government administratively says or prints or publishes as legal evidence of ANYTHING. See Form #05.007.
- 4.4. You can ALWAYS win by defining the terms on the form to turn the form from a GOVERNMENT OFFER into
   a GOVERNMENT ACCEPTANCE OF YOUR OFFER. This is covered in:

- 5. It is a crime to compel the use of SSNs in 42 U.S.C. §408(a)(8) for those who BELIEVE they are subject to federal law, which people in the states of the Union are NOT, INCLUDING your business associates.
  - 5.1. To overcome the burden of proof that it is a crime, your business partner must produce a statute and not regulation mandating the use of the number.
- 5.2. If they cannot produce the statute, then they are committing this crime.
- 6 6. Those asking for a number therefore have a DUTY and burden of proof to:
  - 6.1. Produce the statute MANDATING the use of said number for someone with YOUR DECLARED CIVIL STATUS. Not the REGULATION, but the STATUTE. There is no such statute, by the way. It's all in the regulations, which is proof that the mandate only applies within the Department of the Treasury to EMPLOYEES who work for the Secretary of the Treasury. We prove this in Form #08.024.
  - 6.2. Prove that both YOU and THEY are SUBJECT to the statute they are enforcing.
  - If they cannot satisfy this burden of proof, then use cannot be compelled. They cannot claim they have a policy to do so and still violate the law above in doing so. Such a policy is a CRIMINAL act, in fact, if no authority is provided for mandating use.
- 7. Whether an SSN/TIN is required is determined by the CIVIL STATUS that one claims in their interactions with their business associates:
  - 7.1. <u>"U.S. Person" (Form W-9)</u>: Those claiming STATUTORY "U.S. person" status under 26 U.S.C. §7701(a)(30) are required to use an SSN/TIN. 26 C.F.R. §301.6109-1(a). These fictions are also referred to as "U.S. persons" under 26 C.F.R. §1.1441-1. Because the OBLIGATION to produce a number is found in REGULATIONS and NOT the statute, then the only lawful TARGET of said mandate are employees of the Secretary of the Treasury in the Department of the Treasury. The U.S. Supreme Court has held that regulations may not mandate anything that the statutes they implement do NOT. We explain this in Form #08.024.
  - 7.2. <u>"Foreign Person" (Form W-8)</u>: Those claiming "nonresident alien" status are only required to use an SSN/TIN if they are engaged in a STATUTORY "trade or business"/public office franchise. 26 C.F.R. §301.6109-1(b). These people are referred to as "foreign persons" under 26 C.F.R. §1.1441-1. Because the OBLIGATION to produce a number is found in REGULATIONS and NOT the statute, then the only lawful TARGET of said mandate are employees of the Secretary of the Treasury in the Department of the Treasury. The U.S. Supreme Court has held that regulations may not mandate anything that the statutes they implement do NOT. We explain this in Form #08.024
  - 7.3. <u>"Employee" (Form W-4)</u>: Those claiming this civil status on a Form W-4 effectively VOLUNTEER to be treated AS IF they are a GOVERNMENT EMPLOYEE whose earnings are GOVERNMENT PROPERTY pursuant to 26 U.S.C. §3402(p). NEVER USE THIS FORM!
- Your business associates may not COMPEL you to claim any specific civil status from the list above, and certainly not as a "withholding agent":
  - 8.1. Anyone who claims the authority to use civil statutory law indirectly is claiming that you are a government public officer. A "public officer", after all, is anyone who can be the lawful target of government civil enforcement or civil statutory obligations.

- 8.2. In acting as a "withholding agent" or "employer" subject to IRS enforcement, they are an instrumentality of the government and as such, may not violate your First Amendment rights.
- 8.3. All they can do is ASK YOU to provide evidence of your status on the appropriate form signed under penalty of perjury.
- 8.4. They cannot compel you to fill out a specific withholding form. If they do, they again are violating your First Amendment right as a government instrumentality. If they compel or threaten you to change your withholding form or provide a number that your status doesn't require, you need to gather evidence of that so you can prosecute them later.
- 9. Even the requirement for backup withholding pertaining to "nonresident aliens" pertains to "EMPLOYEES". It is found in 26 U.S.C. §3406 under Internal Revenue Code, Subtitle C, which is "Employment Taxes".

#### 34 **21.1.2** <u>Best strategy</u>

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- It is important to avoid an argument with your business associates, or they may in effect terminate their business
   relationship. The best method of doing so is the Socratic method, by which you as a series of factual questions of their
   legal counsel with witnesses present.
- 2. You should never ask a question that you don't already know the answer to and have researched the answer to in advance. You can use what you know about the CORRECT answer to:
  - 2.1. Pattern questions that follow their answer.
  - 2.2. Remind them that they are violating the law as you understand it and ask them to explain why they do not think they are doing so.
- It is always best for interactions relating to withholding to be IN WRITING signed by both parties. That way there is
   an evidentiary trail you can use later in court. Your business associate may have a legal department, and you can be
   sure that the main purpose for their presence in the company is <u>risk reduction</u>. They do this by preventing the
   production of legal evidence of their own wrongdoing, which is clearly the case if they won't allow you to submit what
- 47 you know and can prove with evidence is the correct withholding paperwork.
- 48 3.1. Avoid in-person discussions or phone discussions that don't have witnesses.
- 49 3.2. If they insist on a meeting, record it and/or bring your own witnesses.

  - Do you know that the term "nonresident alien" isn't defined in the Internal Revenue Code? The I.R.C. says what it 8. ISN'T and not what it is. 26 U.S.C. §7701(b)(1)(B).
  - What makes you think that I am THE STATUTORY "citizen" upon whom the tax is imposed in 26 C.F.R. §1.1-1(c)? 9. 9.1. Do you think this "citizen" includes people in a constitutional state?
    - 9.2. If so, what proof do you have?
  - 10. Do you realize that:
    - 10.1. The civil status of "citizen", or ANY civil status including "person" is voluntary?
    - 10.2. I don't have to volunteer?
      - 10.3. If you compel me to assume the obligations of the status, you are engaging in slavery and human trafficking in violation of the Thirteenth Amendment?
- 11. Would you be willing to contract with me to deliver property on a regular basis and treat me as a supplier of religious 30 property covered by a Form W-8. 31
- 12. What makes you think that the ONLY way you can interact with me is as a statutory "employer" who works for the 32 government? A statutory "employer" is defined as someone with statutory "employees" in 26 U.S.C. §3402(d) and an 33 "employee" in turn is defined as someone who works ONLY for the national government as a public officer. 26 34 U.S.C. §3401(c), which per the rules of statutory construction excludes private workers selling private labor for hire. 35
- "...the term [employee] includes officers and employees, whether elected or appointed, of the United States, a 36 [federal] State, Territory, Puerto Rico or any political subdivision, thereof, or the District of Columbia, or any 37 agency or instrumentality of any one or more of the foregoing. The term 'employee' also includes an officer of a 38 corporation." 39 [26 C.F.R. §31.3401(c)-1 Employee] 40

NOTE: I'm not suggesting that IDIOTS cannot volunteer to become uncompensated statutory "employees" of the 41 national government by filling out a Form W-4 and thereby through legal ignorance EXPAND the above definition. 42 I'm not such an IDIOT and for you to coerce me into becoming one is an assault on my dignity and self-ownership as a 43 human being with constitutional rights. 44

#### 21.2 Dealing with Requests by Withholding Agents for an SSN/TIN to "U.S. Persons" on a W-9 45

The text after the line below is text you can use in responding to a request by a "withholding agent" for an SSN or TIN in 46 connection with the submission of IRS Form W-9: 47

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I allege that you as a withholding agent have the authority to REQUEST but not to COMPEL the use of an SSN or TIN. The 49 reasons set forth are described herein. 50

The Privacy Act Notice reveals that in order to be legitimate, all forms must display an Office of Management and Budget 1 (OMB) number placed in the upper right or left corner. Said number must be there because the IRS is required to submit to 2 the OMB all forms which request information, along with the applicable statute and/or regulation that authorizes the collection 3 of the information requested. Forms which do not have an OMB number - such as Form W-9, are deemed by the federal 4 courts as "bootleg" forms, and lack enforcement authority so as to harmonize with the legal requirements for Form 1099 5 under I.R.C. §6041 and its regulations wherein the legal authority to demand information is limited to name and address only. 6 While some persons are required to request a TIN for a 1099, no legal authority is granted to require or demand that the 7 recipients provide a TIN; Payors are only authorized to request a TIN. 8

The above information is further confirmed in the Privacy Act Notice within the Form W-9 itself, on page 6. While said Notice could be misread as requiring the recipient to provide a TIN, it actually requires that a correct TIN be provided -should the recipients wish to do so. Form W-9 does not require providing a number as it would conflict with the very purpose of the Privacy Act:

"Privacy Act Notice" (W-9)
"Section 6109 of the Internal Revenue Code requires you to provide your correct TIN to persons who must file
information returns with the IRS to report interest, dividends, and certain other income paid to you, mortgage
interest you paid, the acquisition or abandonment of secured property, cancellation of debt, or contributions you
made to an IRA or Archer MSA." ... further citation omitted.
[IRS Form W-9, p. 6]

Not only does the "Privacy Act Notice" establish that 26 U.S.C. Section 6109 is controlling, but also that its subsection (3) (shown below) is likewise controlling, and re-confirms that the Payor's obligation is NOT to "furnish a number" by demanding it from the recipient, but merely "shall request from such other person, ..., such identifying number as may be prescribed...":

"IRC § 6109. Identifying numbers

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(a) Supplying of identifying numbers.--When required by regulations prescribed by the Secretary:

(1) Inclusion in returns. Any person required under the authority of this title to make a return, statement, or other document shall include in such return, statement, or other document such identifying number as may be prescribed for securing proper identification of such person. ... "

(2) Furnishing number to other persons. Any person with respect to whom a return, statement, or other document is required under the authority of this title to be made by another person or whose identifying number is required to be shown on a return of another person shall furnish to such other person such identifying number as may be prescribed for securing his proper identification.

(3) Furnishing number of another person.--Any person required under the authority of this title to make a return, statement, or other document with respect to another person shall request from such other person, and shall include in any such return, statement, or other document, such identifying number as may be prescribed for securing proper identification of such other person." ... further citation omitted ...

Section (3) above authorizes a statutory "withholding agent" to "request... such identifying number as may be prescribed", but implementing regulations are "prescribed" for Section 6109 in 26 C.F.R. §301.6109-1 which are limited to employees of the Treasury Department pursuant to 5 U.S.C. §301, and the 18 regulations referencing it have nothing to do with reporting of payments with which we are concerned. However, identifying numbers may be required of a person IF – and only IF -the person is required to file a return on behalf of the recipients (i.e. foreign entities). Please review 26 C.F.R. §1.6041-6, which was previously shown on page 2.

Clearly, the lack of implementing regulations for I.R.C. §6109(a)(2) renders the laws and regulations compliant with the
 Privacy Act by requiring from recipients to furnish only their name and address upon demand. The list of regulations for
 I.R.C. §6109 relating to TINs reveals that the implementation of 26 U.S.C. §6109 varies from code section to code section.

While there may be concerns that IRS charges penalties for "incomplete" 1099 Forms pursuant to 26 U.S.C. §§6721 - 6723 which impose a maximum penalty of \$50 for each failure to provide complete information, such charges are superseded by 26 U.S.C. §6724(a), which also conforms to the Privacy Act by placing "no penalty" on either Payee, or Payor, if proper documentation shows "that such failure is due to reasonable cause and not to willful neglect.": 1 2

#### 3 SUMMARY:

- 1. I.R.C. §6041 requires that payments of \$600 or more to be shown in a return, together with the name and address of the recipient, and requires that recipients provide their name and address upon demand;
- <sup>6</sup> 2. 26 C.F.R. §1.6041-6 a Form 1099 reporting shall include the name and address of the recipient;
- I.R.C. §6109(a)(2) conditions the request for numbers to "as may be prescribed", but the prescriptions are limited to treasury employees pursuant to 5 U.S.C. 301 and 26 C.F.R. 301.6109-1;
- I.R.C. §6109(a)(3) the person required to make a return shall request an identifying number but that request is limited to treasury employees pursuant to the above treasury regulations;
- 5. Form W-9 is to Request a TIN, not to require it, and thus has no OMB number;
- 6. The Payor lacks legal authority to demand information beyond the name and address of the recipient or Payee, or any
   other information unless the party is a treasury employee;
- The Payee who is not a Treasury employee has no legal obligation to provide a TIN to the Payor, but if a number is provided, there is a requirement that the number be correct;
- 16 8. The Payor who is paying a Treasury Employee may use Form W-9 to demand the name and address of the Payee;
- A statement of reservation of right to privacy from the Payee is reasonable cause for the Payor to NOT include the Payee's TIN on a Form 1099.
- Businesses that file numerous 1099s keep a record that a request for the TIN was made by using Form W-9. By following the law and the regulations scrupulously, the Payee's privacy is protected, and the Payor has proof of the request within the provisions of law.

This letter provides the name and address per your request, and constitutes documentary confirmation of our keeping within the Privacy Act provisions. It also provides the lawful reasonable cause for not entering a TIN on a 1099 Form as well as the relevant excerpts from Treasury Decision 8734 and 26 U.S. Code §7701(a)(30) regarding information reporting for purposes of withholding of tax on certain U.S. source income as entered in the record by the service provider.

   sue them personally for recruiting you into slavery, in violation of the <u>Thirteenth Amendment</u>, <u>42 U.S.C. §1994</u>, and <u>18</u>
   7 U.S.C. §1581.
- 10. You can show them the definition of "married" and "unmarried" individuals in <u>26 C.F.R. §1.1-1</u>(a)(2)(ii), who are
   "aliens engaged in a 'trade or business'" and then explain that you are neither an "alien" or engaged in a "trade or
   business". See:

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- 11. If you are self-supporting and not an "employee" [federal instrumentality] but a private contractor, you can identify
- yourself as a "<u>nonresident alien</u>" and read them <u>26 U.S.C. §1402(b)</u>, which says that "nonresident aliens" do not earn "self employment income" and therefore need not report.
- <sup>14</sup> Whichever one or more of the above options you select:
- Make sure you either have witnesses present or send everything registered overnight mail with return receipt. That
   way, you will have proof, if they decide to discriminate by either not hiring or firing you for basically refusing to
   violate the law or reward their ignorance with a surrender of your sovereign immunity under the Foreign Sovereign
   Immunities Act.
- Warn them IN WRITING that because you are not engaged in a "trade or business", it is a CRIME and a CIVIL TORT for them to fill out and send in ANY information return, such as IRS Forms W-2 and 1099 and that any such document they might submit on you would be FRAUDULENT. FORMS 8 and 9 in sections 27.8 and 27.9 of the FREE Federal and State Tax Withholding Options for Private Employers, Form #09.001 book are very useful for this.
  - 2.1. <u>26 U.S.C. §7207: Fraudulent returns, statements, or other documents.</u> This provision makes it a civil tort to knowingly file false information returns.
    - 2.2. <u>18 U.S.C. §912</u>: Falsely impersonating an officer [PUBLIC OFFICER] or employee of the United States. A person engaged in a "trade or business" is defined as a "public officer" in <u>26 U.S.C. §7701(a)(26)</u>. It is a crime to claim that either you or anyone else is a "public officer" who in fact is not.

   give them the following forms and ask them to rebut it with witnesses present or send it to them via certified mail with
   a proof of service in case they decide to fire or not hire you:

#### 21.5 Government applications for an account or benefit

- Government application for an account or benefit. When the government asks for the number on an application for an 1. account or benefit:
  - 1.1. Indicate "None".
  - 1.2. If they ask you whether you were ever issued such a number say "No". The reason you can say this is that the number is public property and can only be issued to public employees acting in their official capacity. Since you are not a public employee acting in your official capacity, then it wasn't issued to you, who are a private person.
- 1.3. You do not choose to act as a "Trustee" or federal "employee" and you resigned your federal "employment" position.
  - 1.4. It is illegal for you to use public property for private gain unless on official duty as a public employee, and you are not on official duty.
- Government notice. When the government sends you a notice and refers to you with such a number: 14 2.
  - 2.1. It is not the correct number.
- 2.2. The government should correct its records to reflect this fact and discontinue illegal collection actions against you, 16 because you are no longer and never were a federal "employee".
- 2.3. The employment compensation of the Trustee position is inadequate and you quit the position years ago and 18 NEVER participated voluntarily. The compensation you want must ALSO include no federal tax liability and the 19 federal government is unwilling to add this to the terms of the Trust Indenture document. 20

When the IRS wants to request an identifying number, it asks for a "Social Security Number" on its forms. The IRS' own 23 Internal Revenue Manual however, in Internal Revenue Manual (I.R.M.), Section 4.10.7.2.8, says that you can't rely on the 24 accuracy of its forms and publications: 25

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"IRS Publications, issued by the National Office, explain the law in plain language for taxpayers and their advisors... While a good source of general information, publications should not be cited to sustain a position." [Internal Revenue Manual (I.R.M.), Section 4.10.7.2.8 (05-14-1999)]

Consequently, it would be unreasonable to conclude that an SSN as legally defined is really what they are asking for. If the 29 IRS asked for a "Taxpayer Identification Number", however, they would have a lot fewer "taxpayers" because few people 30 have TINs but most people apply for SSNs. Consequently, they falsify their forms to instead ask for the SSN instead of the 31 TIN. Whenever you see the phrase "SSN", or "Social Security Number", you must conclude that they are really asking for a 32 Taxpayer Identification Number. 26 C.F.R. §301.6109-1(d)(3) authorizes Taxpayer Identification Numbers to be issued by 33 and used ONLY by "aliens", not "citizens". Since most Americans don't have TINs because they are not "aliens" or 34 "residents" of the District of Columbia, then the safe way to answer such a question is to: 35

- 1. Line out "SSN" and write "TIN" above it. 36
- In the box underneath write "None". 2. 37
- In the "Notes" section or blank area on the form, put: 3. 38
- "Not authorized to use SSN in place of TIN. Please cite positive law if you disagree. In accordance with <u>5 U.S.C.</u> 39 40 \$552a(b), you do not have my permission to use any identifying number in association with me and are COMMANDED to remove all such numbers from your records. All personal information about me is copyrighted 41 and a trade secret and may not be maintained in ANY government information system or shared with any state 42 revenue agency. Violation of the copyright will subject the violator to \$1,000,000 for each occurrence." 43

If the IRS or a state revenue agency sends you a notice or form to fill out and an identifying number appears on the form or 44 letter or correspondence, you should immediately respond to the notice by: 45

- 1 1. Lining in thick felt-tip pen all identifying numbers.
- 2 2. Writing next to this the following:
- 3

"Invalid. Please remove this wrong number from my record. See attached 'Wrong Party Notice'."

#### 4 3. Attaching the following form to your response, available below:

<u>Wrong Party Notice</u>, Form #07.105 http://sedm.org/Forms/FormIndex.htm

Then on the responsive letter, use language like what we showed you in this section to aver that the number is NOT "your" number. This will create doubt in the minds of the IRS or state revenue agency about whether they have the right number.

When this doubt exists, they are far less likely to pursue illegal enforcement actions because they may be doing so against the WRONG target, which will subject them to personal liability for a tort. It will also increase the likelihood that all incorrect

the WRONG target, which will subject them to personal liability for a tort. It will also increase the likelihood that all incorrect identifying numbers will be removed from any records they maintain about you. If they don't remove the invalid identifying

number from their records, then you have a legal recourse for violation of copyright and of the Privacy Act.

If a financial institution or private employer asks you to complete and submit any government form that asks for a government identifying number, we highly recommend attaching the following form on our website per the instructions:

### 13 21.6 Dealing with "public servants" who demand a number at an audit or examination

Those who are invited into the company of IRS employees for an audit or "examination", or should we say a "proctology examination", will definitely be asked for "THEIR Social Security Number". This question, in fact, is usually the first question out of the mouth of the agent. It is very important to respond to such questions properly so as not to jeopardize your sovereignty by connecting you to:

18 1. Federal office, employment, or agency, and therefore federal jurisdiction.

"The restrictions that the Constitution places upon the government in its capacity as lawmaker, i.e., as the regulator of private conduct, are not the same as the restrictions that it places upon the government in its capacity as employer. We have recognized this in many contexts, with respect to many different constitutional guarantees. Private citizens perhaps cannot be prevented from wearing long hair, but policemen can. Kelley v. Johnson, 425 U.S. 238, 247 (1976). Private citizens cannot have their property searched without probable cause, but in many circumstances government employees can. O'Connor v. Ortega, 480 U.S. 709, 723 (1987) (plurality opinion); id., at 732 (SCALIA, J., concurring in judgment). Private citizens cannot be punished for refusing to provide the government information that may incriminate them, but government employees can be dismissed when the incriminating information that they refuse to provide relates to the performance of their job. Gardner v. Broderick, [497 U.S. 62, 95] <u>392 U.S. 273, 277</u>-278 (1968). With regard to freedom of speech in particular: Private citizens cannot be punished for speech of merely private concern, but government employees can be fired for that reason. Connick v. Myers, 461 U.S. 138, 147 (1983). Private citizens cannot be punished for partisan political activity, but federal and state employees can be dismissed and otherwise punished for that reason. Public Workers v. Mitchell, 330 U.S. 75, 101 (1947); Civil Service Comm'n v. Letter Carriers, 413 U.S. 548, 556 (1973); Broadrick v. Oklahoma, 413 U.S. 601, 616 -617 (1973). [Rutan v. Republican Party of Illinois, 497 U.S. 62 (1990)]

- 2. Federal benefit or commerce, which results in a surrender of sovereign immunity in satisfaction of <u>28 U.S.C. §1605(a)(2)</u>.

- Below is an example script you can use when IRS agents ask for "YOUR Social Security Number" at an audit or examination:
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#### 39 **IRS AGENT QUESTION:**

#### 1 What is YOUR Social Security Number?

#### 2 YOUR ANSWER:

20 C.F.R. §422.103(d) says the "Social Security Number Card" but NOT the STATUTORY SSN belongs to the government. Since you didn't ask me for the card but the number, then you aren't asking me for government property you can place conditions on the use of. The only way the SSN could therefore be MY number as you call it is if I am the ABSOLUTE and PRIVATE owner of the number and the associated franchise it connects to and am appearing here today as a Merchant offering billable services to you under MY franchise contract. Thank you for inviting me here today to do business with you as a Merchant who makes all the rules and conditions under which I render services to you as the absolute owner and seller of myself and all of my property.

On the other hand, if you are going to use the SSN to connect me to YOUR Social Security franchise contract in Title 42 that only you own and control, then I don't HAVE THAT account number and there is no such thing, because:

<sup>12</sup> My participation is clearly illegal, and an illegal act is not an official act you or I can lawfully participate in or use for profit.

My God forbids me to act as a Buyer of anything you own or control, to surrender constitutional or natural rights to you, or to allow you to make rules or laws that circumvent His holy laws. He is my ONLY CIVIL lawgiver according to the Bible.

Which of the two types of Social Security Numbers are you therefore asking me for today: PUBLIC STATUTORY number under your franchise contract or PRIVATE number under MY franchise contract? This will determine who is in charge of making the rules for use of the Number under these circumstances.

#### 18 **IRS AGENT QUESTION:**

The only thing we can talk about here today are STATUTORY Social Security Numbers. The civil statutes enacted by Congress including the Social Security franchise in Title 42 are the source of our authority.

#### 21 YOUR ANSWER:

Well then you are asking me to consent to participate in something that is clearly illegal and which I also have no delegated authority to do from My God as His full-time trustee. In which case, I don't HAVE a STATUTORY Social Security Number since participation is clearly ILLEGAL. Please destroy any records that I am eligible and stop using it for PUBLIC purposes or civil enforcement purposes outside the government. This is clearly criminal identity theft, which I have already notified you of on IRS Form 14039. [See our Form #14.020]. Further, I as a "nonresident alien" not engaged in a "trade or business" who consents to NOTHING you offer me and elects NOTHING am excluded by law from the requirement to furnish a Social Security Number per 26 C.F.R. §301.6109-1(b). So why do you even need such a number under the circumstances?

#### 29 **IRS AGENT QUESTION:**

That's ridiculous. Everyone HAS a STATUTORY SSN. How else are we going to manage our relationship with you without one?

#### 32 YOUR ANSWER:

When are you going to get it through your thick skull that I don't WANT ANY COMMERCIAL RELATIONSHIP with you 33 and simply want to be CIVILLY LEFT ALONE as justice itself requires? The fact that no one else realizes that or takes that 34 approach and blindly uses SSNs to become government cattle on the government plantation doesn't mean I have to. Unlike 35 the rest of the stupid cattle you "service" who volunteer to be cattle, I'm not your stupid whore who volunteers to work for 36 free or donates my entire body to a public use without compensation. I as the exclusive and absolute owner of myself under 37 the Thirteenth Amendment decide what my services to you or the use of my property are worth, not you, and they aren't free. 38 The charge for my services to act as a federal "employee" or officer or trustee in possession of public property such as a 39 STATUTORY SSN is documented in the following agreement: 40

1 Will you agree in writing to the above agreement to act essentially as your federal coworker, because if you don't, then it's 2 not MY number?

#### 3 **IRS AGENT QUESTION:**

<sup>4</sup> Don't play word games with me. It's YOUR number and we have a RIGHT to use it.

#### 5 YOUR ANSWER:

<sup>6</sup> Well good. Then if it's MY number and MY property, then I have EXCLUSIVE control and use over it and may LICENSE

<sup>7</sup> its use to you. That is what the word "property" implies. That means I, and not you, am the only one who may control or

8 regulate its use under the following franchise:

If it's MY property as you indicate, then your job as an alleged "government" is to protect me from abuses of MY property. If you don't want to do that job, you're not really a government, but a de facto government. If you can control and penalize me for misusing YOUR procedures and forms, which are YOUR property, then I am EQUALLY entitled to penalize you for misusing MY property. I can't be free unless I'm at least equal to you, according to Supreme Court:

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No duty rests more imperatively upon the courts than the enforcement of those constitutional provisions intended to secure that equality of rights which is the foundation of free government." [Gulf, C. & S. F. R. Co. v. Ellis, <u>165 U.S. 150</u> (1897)]

Are you willing to sign an agreement in writing to pay for the beneficial use of what you call MY property such as the NON-STATUTORY SSN, because if you aren't, you are depriving me of exclusive use and control over MY property and depriving me of the equal right to prevent abuses of my property, my identity, and my life??

#### 19 **IRS AGENT QUESTION:**

20 OK, well it's OUR number. Sorry for deceiving you. Can you give us OUR number that WE assigned to you?

#### 21 YOUR ANSWER:

I can find no statutory proof that the STATUTORY SSN ALONE absent the "Social Security Number CARD" is your property. Please provide evidence of same. And if it IS in fact YOUR property or PUBLIC property, why do you LIE to me by calling it MY property and MY number?

If the STATUTORY SSN is PUBLIC or GOVERNMENT property, then you can't allow me to use it as a private person, which is what I am appearing here today as. You can't lawfully issue public property such as an SSN to a private person or allow them to use it for a private purpose. That's criminal embezzlement. Therefore, the only way that PUBLIC property such as what you allege is a STATUTORY SSN could have been assigned to me is if I'm acting as a "public officer" or federal employee at this moment, and I am NOT. I am here as a private person and not a public employee who retains ONLY constitutional and not STATUTORY protections. Therefore, it couldn't have been lawfully issued to me.

Keep this up, and I'm going to file a criminal complaint with the U.S. Attorney for embezzlement in violation of 18 U.S.C. 31 <u>§641</u> and impersonating a public officer in violation of <u>18 U.S.C. §912</u>. I'm not here as a public officer and you are asking 32 me to act like one without compensation that only I can determine and without demonstrated legal authority. Where is the 33 compensation that I demand to act as a fiduciary and trustee over your STINKING number, which you claim is public property 34 without proof? I remind you that the very purpose why governments are created is to PROTECT and maintain the separation 35 between "public property" and "private property" in order to preserve my inalienable constitutional rights that you took an 36 oath to support and defend. Why do you continue to insist on co-mingling and confusing them in order to STEAL my labor, 37 property, and money without compensation in violation of the Fifth Amendment takings clause? 38

#### **IRS AGENT QUESTION:** 1

We have received third party reports relating to tax withholding or reporting that connect you to a STATUTORY SSN and 2

indirectly, to a "trade or business" per 26 U.S.C. §6041(a). We therefore have reasonable cause to inquire of you about these 3

reports and any possible income tax liability attached to the transactions they document. 4

#### **YOUR ANSWER:** 5

Third party information returns are classified by the courts as "lay legal opinions". That means none of the LABELS on the 6 form can have any actionable effect and are therefore not necessarily statutory terms. 26 U.S.C. §6041(a) connects the FILER 7 of the information return to a "trade or business" and a public office under 26 U.S.C. §7701(a)(26), and NOT the TARGET 8 of the report. These reports also do NOT authorize the FILER to convert PRIVATE property to PUBLIC property and a 9 PUBLIC office without the consent of the ABSOLUTE owner, which is me. Further, even the FILER is not lawfully engaged 10 in a "trade or business" and public office as someone who was never lawfully appointed or elected to a public office and is 11 not serving in the District of Columbia as required by 4 U.S.C. §72. So these reports are hereby declared to be false and also 12 possibly FRAUDULENT under penalty of perjury. See:

The 1040NR return acknowledges that these information return reports do NOT necessarily connect me to such a public 14 office by calling the earnings on the return "EFFECTIVELY connected" rather than merely "ACTUALLY connected". If I 15

enter the amounts reported on these false information returns onto the 1040NR return, I am "in effect" and "effectively" 16

donating the PRIVATE property they describe to a PUBLIC use, a PUBLIC purpose, and a PUBLIC office and thus 17

subjecting them to income taxation and governmental control. I DO NOT consent to do that because all my earnings are 18

EXCLUDED rather than EXEMPT from taxation as a nonresident alien not engaged in a "trade or business"/public office 19

and whose earnings do not originate from the statutory geographical "United States" under 26 U.S.C. §871. See: 20

I don't need your stinking exemptions or deductions on the 1040NR form if all my earnings are lawfully excluded under: 21

1. Earnings originate from outside: 22

- 1.1. The STATUTORY "United States\*\*" as defined in 26 U.S.C. §7701(a)(9) and (a)(10) (federal zone) and
- 1.2. The U.S. government federal corporation as a privileged legal fiction.
- 24 Thus, their earnings are expressly EXCLUDED rather than EXEMPTED from "gross income" under 26 U.S.C. §871 25 and are a "foreign estate" under 26 U.S.C. §7701(a)(31). See 26 U.S.C. §872 and 26 C.F.R. §1.872-2(f) and 26 C.F.R. 26 <u>§1.871-7(a)(4)</u> and <u>26 U.S.C. §861(a)(3)(C)(i)</u> for proof. 27
- Earnings are expressly EXCLUDED rather than EXEMPTED from STATUTORY "wages" as defined in 26 U.S.C. 2. 28 <u>§3401(a)</u> because all services performed outside the <u>STATUTORY "United States\*\*"</u> as defined in <u>26 U.S.C.</u> 29 \$7701(a)(9) and (a)(10) (federal zone) and the CORPORATION "United States" as a legal fiction. Therefore, not 30
- subject to "wage" withholding of any kind for such services per: 31
- 2.1. 26 C.F.R. §31.3401(a)(6)-1(b) in the case of income tax. 32
- 2.2. <u>26 C.F.R. §31.3121(b)-3(c)(1)</u> in the case of Social Security. 33
- Expressly EXCLUDED rather than EXEMPTED from income tax reporting under: 3. 34
- 3.1. 26 C.F.R. §1.1441-1(b)(5)(i). 35
- 3.2. <u>26 C.F.R. §1.1441-1(e)(1)(ii)(A)(1)</u>. 36
- 3.3. 26 C.F.R. §1.6041-4(a)(1). 37
- 4. Expressly EXCLUDED rather than EXEMPTED from backup withholding because earnings are not reportable by 26 38 U.S.C. <u>§3406</u> and <u>26 C.F.R. §31.3406(g)-1(e)</u>. Only "reportable payments" are subject to such withholding. 39

My earnings are excluded, by the way, because they are PRIVATE and the owner who is me never consented to convert them 40 to PUBLIC. Stop engaging in sophistry to rope me into your servitude and pay money I don't owe. This is despicable! 41

#### **IRS AGENT QUESTION:** 42

Even if your participation in Social Security is illegal, everyone still uses Social Security Numbers at least for financial,

<sup>2</sup> banking, or lending purposes. If your participation is illegal, then how can you bank or get a loan?

#### 3 YOUR ANSWER:

Your question presupposes that my activities in getting a loan or opening a financial account are PUBLIC activities using 4 PUBLIC property and that I am therefore subject to taxation and regulation in doing so. I and not you get to decide when I 5 am acting in a PRIVATE or PUBLIC capacity and to define the meaning of all terms that affect the enjoyment of my 6 ABSOLUTELY OWNED PRIVATE PROPERTY and LABOR. YOU have NO AUTHORITY to write definitions affecting 7 property that you have no ownership interest in, because doing so would be an interference with the absolute control over 8 said property and therefore for a THEFT of property. I use ownership and control synonymously here. You even admit in 9 IRM 4.10.7.2.8 that no one should trust any of your forms, which means no one should trust the WORDS or LABELS on the 10 forms either, including but not limited to "Social Security Number", "Taxpayer", etc. If the forms and the labels on the forms 11 are not ACTIONABLE or even factual, then my writing on the form even under penalty of perjury doesn't make them 12 actionable either or connect them to a civil statutory context unless I expressly do so myself, which I DO NOT. 13

We have already established that the NUMBER is NOT public property under 20 C.F.R. §422.103(d), and that only the 14 CARD is PUBLIC property. You have also essentially admitted that the NUMBER is MY absolutely owned property and 15 therefore not YOURS or the GOVERNMENT'S or PUBLIC property by calling it "YOUR Social Security Number". And 16 if it is "MY ABSOLUTELY OWNED PROPERTY" as you call it, then I have the right as the only lawful owner to control 17 ANY and ALL commercial uses of it by ANYONE and EVERYONE, including banks or lenders and even YOU and every 18 government. I exercise that control by specifying all the definitions affecting its use and the CONTEXT of those definitions: 19 PUBLIC or PRIVATE. If I don't have a right to control my identity, my reputation, and the commercial use of information 20 about me that might damage me through no act of my own, then you can turn the SSN into a vehicle for criminal identity 21 theft. That appears to be what you are doing here and now. I remind you that you appear to be using this proceeding to IN 22 FACT engage in criminal identity theft, and that you are trying to get my permission to allow you to abuse aspects of my 23 identity and reputation for an unauthorized commercial use and for ILLEGAL tax enforcement purposes. By "illegal" I mean 24 NON-CONSENSUAL purposes. 25

"Public office. State v. Brennan, 49 Ohio.St. 33, 29 N.E. 593. [Black's Law Dictionary, Fourth Edition, p. 1235]

The property mentioned above in the context of Social Security, according to 20 C.F.R. §422.103(d) and the back of the 21 Social Security Card itself, is the number and the card itself, which are the initial corpus of the Social Security trust established 22 by those who lawfully and consensually participate. Note that this regulation is found in Title 20, which is "Employees' 23 Benefits". If you weren't a statutory "employee" as defined in 5 U.S.C. §2105(a) BEFORE you made application for the 24 card or the number, then you can't CREATE such an office by making such an application as a PRIVATE human and would 25 be criminally impersonating a public officer in violation of 18 U.S.C. §912 to even try to do so. 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## 2 21.8 Proving to federal agencies that they are FORBIDDEN by the Privacy Act from compelling 3 the use of an SSN

There are many occasions where you may be asked to PROVE to a federal agency that they are NOT PERMITTED to either maintain an SSN in your records or force you to disclose one in the context even of income taxation. By far the most prevalent occasion where this happens is with people from states of the Union who are either active duty military or discharged veterans dealing with military benefits or taxation. This section will focus exclusively on this group, all of whom typically deal directly or indirectly with any of the following:

- 9 1. Department of Defense (DOD).
- 10 2. Defense Finance Accounting Service (DFAS).
- 11 3. Veterans Administration (VA).

You can apply the concepts described in this section to ANY federal agency, because the concepts described apply to ALL federal agencies.

#### 14 **21.8.1** Forcing the agency to satisfy their burden or proof

Within the Department of Defense, the only UNIVERSAL id that is permitted is the DOD ID number. This was covered earlier in section 19.1. Most of the time this ID number alone is sufficient, but you will still encounter problems with specifying an SSN when dealing with DFAS. DFAS will ask for this when you apply for retirement benefits on the using the Form DD2656 entitled "Data for payment of Retired Personnel".

<sup>19</sup> First of all, the Privacy Act specifies that federal agencies may only ask for an SSN when MANDATED by law:

- 35 The bottom line is that when a federal agency asks for the SSN they must satisfy the following two requirements:
- 1. They must specify whether its use is VOLUNTARY or MANDATORY.
- 2. They must tell you the SPECIFIC law that mandates providing it.

- <sup>1</sup> If they either don't provide the law mandating the use of the SSN as required by 5 U.S.C. §552a Legislative Notes, they can't
- <sup>2</sup> ask for or keep it in their system of records. Even if they do provide the CIVIL statute mandating the use of the SSN, there
- is an additional burden of proof even beyond that, which is a providing proof that of how you became subject to the specific

4 law they cite. Whether you are subject to the law they cite usually depends upon your CIVIL STATUTORY STATUS, which

5 ONLY YOU can decide and acquire by an act of YOUR EXPRESS CONSENT.

- <sup>6</sup> Ultimately then, the federal agency must provide not only the law, but HOW you consented to the specific law they are citing
- <sup>7</sup> by choosing a civil status that the law applies to such as CIVIL STATUTORY "U.S. person", "U.S. citizen", or "U.S.
- <sup>8</sup> resident". All of these civil statuses are entirely voluntary and you can withdraw your consent to receive the "benefits" of

- <sup>10</sup> We must ALWAYS remember in scenarios like this that:
- Every CIVIL statutory status is a legislative creation of and PROPERTY of the government grantor. That means it is
   PUBLIC property.
- Every CIVIL statutory status has both PRIVILEGES and OBLIGATIONS attached to it. These are two sides of the
   SAME coin.
- If you ACCEPT, ASK FOR, or APPLY FOR the PRIVILEGES, BENEFITS, or PUBLIC RIGHTS of a CIVIL
   statutory status, then you implicitly ALSO accept the OBLIGATIONS that go with it as well. In that sense, there is an
   IMPLIED "quid pro quo" obligation to pay for whatever you ask for. If this were not so, those doing so would be
   STEALING from whomever has to PAY to DELIVER the PRIVILEGES that apply to those who invoke the status.
   Nothing in life is free.

"Public office. The right, authority, and duty created and conferred by law, by which for a given period, either 24 fixed by law or enduring at the pleasure of the creating power, an individual is invested with some portion of the 25 26 sovereign functions of government for the benefit of the public. Walker v. Rich, 79 Cal.App. 139, 249 P. 56, 58. An agency for the state, the duties of which involve in their performance the exercise of some portion of the 27 sovereign power, either great or small. Yaselli v. Goff, C.C.A., 12 F.2d. 396, 403, 56 A.L.R. 1239; Lacey v. State, 28 13 Ala.App. 212, 68 So. 706, 710; Curtin v. State, 61 Cal.App. 377, 214 P. 1030, 1035; Shelmadine v. City of 29 Elkhart, 75 Ind.App. 493, 129 N.E. 878. State ex rel. Colorado River Commission v. Frohmiller, 46 Ariz, 413, 52 30 P.2d. 483, 486. Thus, by asking for or receiving the PUBLIC property, rights, privileges, or "benefits", you ultimately must implicitly agree to be TREATED effectively as a "public officer" subject to CIVIL legislative control of Congress.

With the above in mind, anyone who would consent, either implicitly or explicitly, to ANY CIVIL statutory status that the obligation to provide the SSN attaches to is a FOOL. Those who ask for the numbers typically don't know any of this. The correct way to respond to a request for an SSN is therefore to:

- 1. Ask whether the disclosure is VOLUNTARY or MANDTORY.
- 43 2. Ask for the specific LAW that mandates the use of the SSN.
- 3. Ask them to provide legally admissible evidence that you satisfy the criteria for ACQUIRING the civil status that the
- 45 obligation attaches to. In most cases, that CIVIL STATUTORY STATUS is STATUTORY "U.S. person" (26 U.S.C.
  - §7701(a)(30)), "U.S. citizen", or "U.S. resident" as indicated in the Privacy Act itself at 5 U.S.C. §553a(a)(2):
- 47 <u>5 U.S. Code § 552a Records maintained on individuals</u>

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(a)DEFINITIONS.

For purposes of this section—

(2) the term "individual" means a citizen of the United States or an alien lawfully admitted for permanent residence;

The "citizen of the United States" as used above is not directly defined, but it can only mean a human being DOMICILED on federal territory within the exclusive jurisdiction of Congress. The separation of powers doctrine forbids federal CIVIL jurisdiction of Congress within the exclusive jurisdiction of a Constitutional State.

### 7 21.8.2 Proving that the TAX LAWS at least DO NOT require the use of an SSN in your case

It is a requirement of membership that all of our members must be nonresident aliens. In the case of nonresident aliens filing retirement papers with DFAS, for instance, they are asked to file the Form DD2656. That form is the first form that MANDATES providing an SSN in your interactions with the DOD, which naturally leads to questions about why and how the SSN could be mandatory in such a scenario to someone who is a compliant member. Ultimately, the authorities in section 19.1 prove that the DOD ID is mandatory for everything EXCEPT DFAS and tax issues. What, then, about "taxes" makes the SSN mandatory? The answers are found in 26 C.F.R. §301.6109-1:

- SSN is mandatory for STATUTORY "U.S. citizens" and "U.S. persons". STATUTORY "U.S. citizens" are

- 2.1. A <u>foreign person</u> that has income effectively connected with the conduct of a U.S. trade or business at any time
   during the <u>taxable year</u>. "Effectively connected" MEANS private property DONATED to a public use, public
   purpose, or public office to procure the "benefits" of 26 U.S.C. 162 deductions from tax on the 1040NR form.

The "office or place of business" must be in the STATUTORY geographical "United States" defined in 26 U.S.C. §7701(a)(9) and (a)(10) and 26 C.F.R. §301.7701-7(b). Thus, it EXCLUDES any part of the GEOGRAPHICAL states of the Union.
- 2.3. A nonresident alien treated as a resident under section 6013(g) or (h). This scenario is where a "nonresident alien" files on a 1040 return with a spouse who is a STATUTORY "U.S. person".
  - 2.4. A <u>foreign person</u> that makes a return of <u>tax</u> (including income, estate, and gift <u>tax</u> returns), an amended return, or a refund claim under this title but excluding information returns, statements, or documents. Note that a "return of tax" is NOT the same as a "tax return". If no tax is owed, there is no such thing as a "return of tax" and the party is not a "taxpayer", but a victim of theft if money was withheld involuntarily by the withholding agent defined in 26 U.S.C. §7701(a)(16).
- 2.5. A <u>foreign person</u> that makes an <u>election</u> under <u>§301.7701</u>–3(c).

2.6. A <u>foreign person</u> that furnishes a <u>withholding certificate</u> described in <u>§1.1441</u>–1(e)(2) or (3) of this chapter or <u>§1.1441</u>–5(c)(2)(iv) or (3)(iii) of this chapter to the extent required under <u>§1.1441</u>–1(e)(4)(vii) of this chapter.

- 2.7. A <u>foreign person</u> whose <u>taxpayer</u> identifying number is required to be furnished on any return, statement, or other <u>document</u> as required by the income <u>tax</u> regulations under section 897 or 1445. This paragraph (b)(2)(vii) applies as of November 3, 2003.
- 2.8. A foreign person that furnishes a withholding certificate described in <u>§1.1446</u>-1(c)(2) or (3) of this chapter or
   whose <u>taxpayer</u> identification number is required to be furnished on any return, statement, or other <u>document</u> as
   required by the income <u>tax</u> regulations under section 1446. This paragraph (b)(2)(viii) shall apply to <u>partnership</u>
   <u>taxable years</u> beginning after May 18, 2005, or such earlier time as the regulations under <u>§§1.1446</u>-1 through
   1.1446-5 of this chapter apply by reason of an <u>election</u> under <u>§1.1446</u>-7 of this chapter.

An application for retired pay from the Defense Finance Accounting Service (DFAS) on Form DD2656 on the part of a compliant member who is a "nonresident alien" does NOT, by the way, fit into any of the categories listed in item 2 above WITHOUT your consent in some form. Only by CONSENT in the following forms:

- 1. You DONATE your earnings to a public office and public purpose by declaring exemptions and deductions under 26 U.S.C. §162 on the 1040NR return.
  - 1.1. These are PRIVILEGES and BENEFITS that have financial value and thus constitute consideration that forms the basis for an obligation on your party.
- 1.2. Since ALL the earnings of most Americans physically present and domiciled within a constitutional state are "excluded" rather than "exempted" under 26 U.S.C. §872, these deductions are UNNECESSARY in most cases. See:

- You have to "return a tax" by virtue of having payments from the U.S. government and NOT anyplace within the statutory geographical "United States" under 26 U.S.C. §7701(a)(9) and (a)(10).
  - 2.1. Ordinarily, in order to even RECEIVE a payment from the U.S. government, you must be engaged in a privilege, and thus, incur the obligation to pay a tax. This is the case with Social Security, for instance, which is Taxable "gross income" by statute in 26 U.S.C. §861(a)(8).
- 2.2. Even in the case of government payments, some are not taxable, such as those that are a product of selling "labor" in exchange for money under 26 U.S.C. §83, as in the case of those receiving retired pay. The entitlement to RECEIVE the retirement pay was earned with your labor, which cost money to produce and is therefore not "profit" in a constitutional or Sixteenth Amendment sense. See:

   spouse on a 1040 return. This is done by an "election" under 26 U.S.C. §6013(g) and (h).

All of the above circumstances are NOT known at the time of APPLYING for retirement pay on Form DD2656. They don't even happen until AFTER you even RECEIVE the pay. So, there is NO WAY that the DFAS could satisfy the burden of proving that there is a STATUTORY requirement IN YOUR CASE AND WITHIN YOUR CIRCUMSTANCES as a "nonresident alien" to supply an SSN. As such, if they demand or insist on a Social Security Number or even continue to maintain a record of one against your consent, they are VIOLATING the Privacy Act of 1974 because there is no statute MANDATING said use or collection. In that scenario, the only thing they can ask for or enforce a REQUIREMENT for is a DOD ID Number and NEVER a Social Security number as we indicated earlier in section 19.1.

The only defense that DFAS can have at this point in insisting on an SSN is to PRESUME that you are a STATUTORY "U.S. 26 person" (26 U.S.C. §7701(a)(30)) or "U.S. citizen" under 8 U.S.C. §1401 (someone born in a TERRITORY) and hope you 27 don't CHALLENGE said presumption. You should NEVER let them get away with this presumption and INSIST that they 28 PROVE you are one or even that they can FORCE you to "elect" to be one if you don't want to. Clearly, such an "election" 29 cannot lawfully even be made if you truly are a "nonresident alien" born within a CONSTITUTIONAL state and domiciled 30 there. In fact, there is no provision in the Internal Revenue Code or Treasury Regulations even AUTHORIZING such an 31 "election" and such an election is NOT listed in 26 C.F.R. §301.6109-1(b) either a the origin of the requirement to have or 32 use an SSN. In fact, all such ELECTIONS are a crime in violation of 18 U.S.C. §911: 33

#### 4 **FALSE STATEMENT:**

The California Vehicle Code (CVC) requires the Department of Motor Vehicles (DMV) to collect your social security number (SSN). (CVC §§1653.5(a)(b), 12800(a), 12801) Federal law also allows any state to use a person's SSN for the purpose of establishing his/her identification. #### 12 **REBUTTAL:**

It is illegal and unconstitutional to compel the surrender of any constitutional right in exchange for any state service
 such as a license of any kind. This prohibition includes compelling people to misrepresent their civil status or the
 location as being on federal territory when they are not there and cannot consent to be treated as IF they are there.
 Therefore, all statutes compelling the surrender of any constitutional right must be and in fact are "directory in nature"

- The U.S. Supreme Court has held that federal legislation doesn't apply to the internal affairs of states. The statute you cite is IRRELEVANT to those domiciled and present within a constitutional state and not present on federal territory:
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"It is no longer open to question that <u>the general government, unlike the states</u>, Hammer v. Dagenhart, <u>247 U.S.</u> <u>251, 275</u>, 38 S.Ct. 529, 3 A.L.R. 649, Ann.Cas.1918E 724, <u>possesses no inherent power in respect of the internal</u> <u>affairs of the states</u>; <u>and emphatically not with regard to legislation.</u>"</u> [Carter v. Carter Coal Co., <u>298 U.S. 238</u>, 56 S.Ct. 855 (1936)]

The recipient, which is the CONSTITUTIONAL and not STATUTORY state of California, has ten days to rebut the above evidence or be found to agree and be in estoppel in pais.

Furthermore, a failure to rebut constitutes an admission that by denying a constitutional right, they are in possession and have STOLEN private property and PRIVATE rights protected by the Bill of Rights and the Fourteenth Amendment. As such, they are subject to the following conditions of the loan of such property. This agreement establishes a franchise not unlike the "trade or business" franchise to defend the applicant against usurpations. It is patterned after the government's similar use of loans of government property to establish obligations in the form of a franchise. I have an equal right to establish government obligations in the same way they try to do to me, and to do it as a defense against government's attempts to do

# 10 23 <u>Summary and Conclusions</u>

We will now summarize all of the conclusions of fact and conclusions of law derived from the evidence provided in this document:

- 13 1. Government-issued identifying numbers include:
  - 1.1. Social Security Numbers (SSN) issued by the Social Security Administration under the authority of 20 C.F.R. §422.104. Issued only to "U.S. persons" defined in 26 U.S.C. §7701(a)(30) with a domicile on federal territory.
  - 1.2. Taxpayer Identification Numbers. Issued by the IRS pursuant to 26 U.S.C. §6109. Can be issued only to "U.S. persons" as defined in 26 U.S.C. §7701(a)(30) who have a domicile on federal territory.
    - 1.2.1. Employer Identification Numbers (EIN) obtained using IRS Form SS-4.
      - 1.2.2. Taxpayer Identification Numbers obtained using IRS Form W-9.
    - 1.3. Individual Taxpayer Identification Numbers (ITIN) obtained using IRS Form W-7. ITINs can only be issued to aliens pursuant to 26 C.F.R. §301.6109-1(d)(3)
  - 2. SSNs and TINs are made interchangeable for the purposes of income taxes pursuant to the following authorities:
  - 2.1. <u>26 U.S.C. §6109</u>(a) (at the end) authorizes the substitution of an SSN for a TIN, but neither MANDATES it nor states the circumstances under which it is appropriate.
  - 2.2. 26 C.F.R. §301.7701-11.
  - 2.3. 26 U.S.C. §6011(b).
- Only persons with a domicile on federal territory that is no part of a state of the Union are eligible to be issued Taxpayer
   Identification Numbers or Social Security Numbers. 20 C.F.R. §422.104 and 26 U.S.C. §6109. Persons domiciled
   outside of federal territory such as in a state of the Union are NOT eligible for federally issued identifying numbers.
- The possession or use of the Social Security Card or Social Security Number causes a surrender of constitutional rights and conveys to the government the authority to penalize the abuses of these forms of public property and the activities of the "trustees", fiduciaries, and "public officers" who are in custody of them:
- 4.1. The back of the Social Security Card itself admits this:

- The only penalty prescribed in the Internal Revenue Code for failure to use or disclose an identifying number is that
   found in 26 U.S.C. §6721(a) and 26 C.F.R. §1.6721-1(a)(1), which collectively impose a penalty of \$50 for the filing of
   an information return that does not contain all the information required on the form.
