Alley Pond Park Day Camp To Present Rhythm Band

School children who attend Alley Pond Park Day Camp are busy making the instruments for a rhythm and melody band which will give its first public performance at the May Day celebration on May 1, for the benefit of school principals, teachers and parents who will be invited.

Alley Pond Park Day Camp is holding a spring session for the first time this year, and school children of Queens for the first time have had the joy of tracking down the first bud on the Nature Trail, discovering the first tightly folded fern, hearing the first bird and the first tree toad of the season.

This camp has been maintained during summer vacations for the past three years through the cooperation of the Board of Education with the WPA Field Activities Project, supervised by Mrs. Anne M. Limpas.

Now for the first time it forms a part of the regular school curriculum, and every pupil is taken at least once each term for a day of painless education and supervised play as a part of the elementary school program. The lesson plan includes instruction in art, wild life, geology, local history and geography, plant life and folk lore—all under the name of "social science."

MRS. HARPER WANTS IN CELL FOR HEARING

Admits She Hasn't a Cent Left of \$50,000 She Took

Pretty Mrs. Helen Harper, trusted bookkeeper who took \$50,000 from her employers and spent it in "keeping up with the Joneses," stood in the police line-up yesterday and smiling admitted she had not a cent of it left.

Accused of embezzlement, the comely 35-year-old woman who traveled around the country before voluntarily surrendering, stood before questioning policemen calm and uncomprehending.

"Is there any of the \$50,000 left?" Captain Dorgan asked.

"No," was the quick reply. "I haven't a cent left."

Mrs. Harper told police she took the money to enable her to live like her swifty neighbors in Great Neck. She admitted she had manipulated her company's books over a six-year period.

She came back to see her daughter, Helen, 10, now living in Jackson Heights with relatives.

From the line-up she was taken still composed and girlish looking, to General Sessions Court and there arraigned on a specific charge of committing a \$274 forgery. She asked that the case be postponed until she could obtain a lawyer.

"I can furnish you with a lawyer from the Legal Aid Society," Judge William Allen told her.

"No, thank you, Your Honor," she said. "I prefer to have my own attorney."

The case was put down for next Thursday and Mrs. Harper was taken to the Women's House of Detention.

OZONE PARK DEATH CAR DRIVER FREED

Accident Victim Was Mother of Orchestra Conductor

A 19-year-old youth was exonerated of a criminal negligence charge yesterday by Magistrate Anthony Savarese in Felony Court, Ridgewood, growing out of a fatal automobile accident in Ozone Park in which an aged woman was killed.

The defendant, Julius Glaser of 111-59 130th street, Ozone Park, was arrested by Detective Harry J. Whitton in connection with the death of Mrs. Minnie Casey, 61, who was knocked down by an automobile operated by Glaser on the night of March 24 at Liberty avenue near 114th street, Ozone Park.

Mrs. Casey, who lived at 95-81 113th street, was removed to Queens General Hospital suffering from a fracture of the skull and died about an hour after being admitted.

Detective Vincent Scibold of the Queens Motor Vehicle Homicide Squad, testified that he questioned Glaser after the accident and the latter informed him that when he saw the woman he swerved the steering wheel to the left, but could not avoid striking her.

In dismissing the complaint Magistrate Savarese said no evidence of criminal negligence had been shown by the defendant. Mrs. Casey was the mother of Ken Casey, orchestra conductor at the Half Moon Hotel, Coney Island.

Adult Education Survey To Be Launched Monday

For the purpose of obtaining a true picture of adult education as it relates to Queens, a study under the auspices of three co-operating agencies will be launched on Monday night in the Flushing Young Men's Christian Association, Flushing.

Dr. Ned Dearborn, a leader in the field of adult education and chairman of the department of adult education of New York University, will be the principal speaker and will relate Queens problems to the present day trends in adult education. The Rev. Dale DeWitt of Hollis, will preside in behalf of the Queens Council of Social Agencies.

The agencies under whose auspices the study is being conducted are the WPA-adult education program of the Board of Education, the New York Adult Education Council and the adult education committee of the Queens Council of Social Agencies.

Preliminary meetings have been held from time to time in the Flushing "Y" at which committees have been planning for the study.

The executive committee comprises Olive Van Horn, chairman; Price Chennault of the WPA-adult Education Research Bureau, and DeWitt. They will be assisted by the following advisory committee composed of three members from each participating group:
