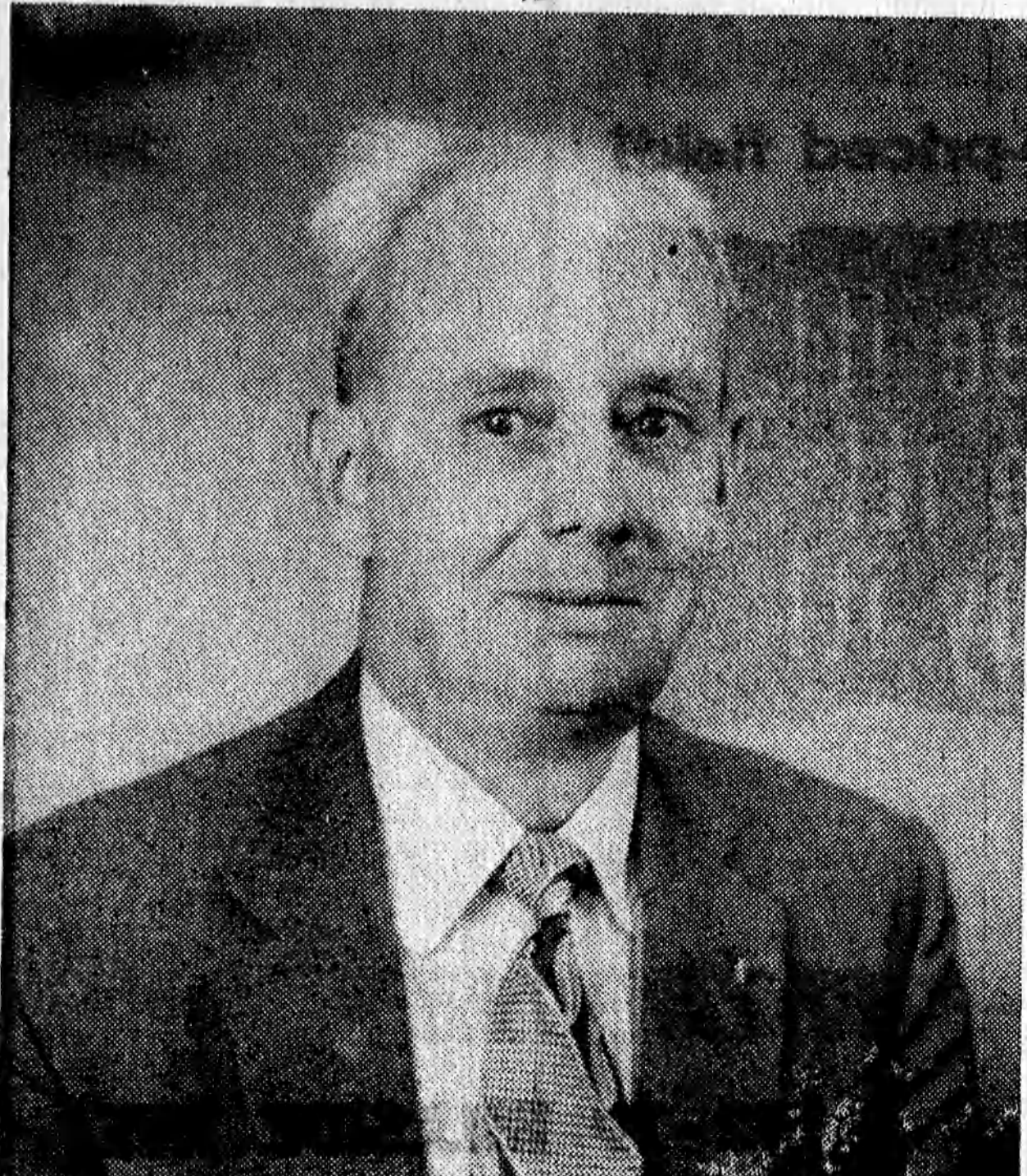

## St. John's Holds Record Exercises

Before an audience of more than 1,000 relatives and friends of the graduates, St. John's Preparatory School last night,

Thursday, June 19th) awarded diplomas to 214, largest graduating class in the history of the School. This year's Commencement set a second record when, for the first time, the graduates from Queens communities outnumbered the Brooklynites, though by but a slight margin —

there were 105 from Queens, 99 from Brooklyn, with the balance of the Class from Nassau and Suffolk Counties.

Honorable Sirs—by contract dated August 14, 1933, as amended, The City of New York granted to Jamaica Buses, Inc., a corporation organized and existing under and by virtue of the Laws of the State of New York, the franchise right and consent to maintain and operate omnibuses for the transportation of persons for hire on certain routes in the Borough of Queens, all as more particularly described in said contract of August 14, 1933, and the amendments thereto.

Said contract having been for a term of twenty-five (25) years, expiring in the year 1958, Jamaica Buses, Inc. hereby petitions this Honorable Board for a renewal of said franchise contract, as amended, with the various route descriptions to read as hereinafter set forth:

**Route A, Belmont Park-Jamaica—4.4 miles**  
Beginning at or near the intersection of Parsons boulevard and Hillside avenue; Thence along Parsons boulevard to Jamaica avenue; along Jamaica avenue to Hempstead avenue; along Hempstead avenue to 223d street; along 223d street to 103d avenue; along 103d avenue to 225th street; along 225th street to Hempstead avenue;

Also along Hempstead avenue between 223d street and 225th street; along 213th street between Hempstead avenue and Jamaica avenue; along 179th place between Jamaica avenue and Hillside avenue; along Hillside avenue between 179th place and 187th place; along 187th place between Hillside avenue and Jamaica avenue; along 161st street between Jamaica avenue and Hillside avenue; along Hillside avenue between 161st street and Parsons boulevard; along 180th street between Hillside avenue and Jamaica avenue; and along Jamaica avenue between 212th street and 213th street.

**Route B, New York Boulevard-Jamaica-Hook Creek, 6.4 miles**

Starting at or near the intersection of Parsons boulevard and Hillside Avenue; Thence along Parsons boulevard to Jamaica avenue; along Jamaica avenue to New York boulevard; along New York boulevard to Rockaway boulevard; along Rockaway boulevard to the City line at Hook Creek;

Also along 161st street between Jamaica avenue and Hillside avenue; along Hillside avenue between 161st street and Parsons boulevard;

Also on 112th road between New York boulevard and Dillon street; on Dillon street between 112th road and Linden boulevard; on Linden boulevard between Dillon street and New York boulevard; on 145th drive between New York boulevard and 177th place; on 177th place between 145th drive and Farmers boulevard; on Farmers boulevard between 177th place and New York boulevard; on Baisley boulevard between New York boulevard and 161st street; on 161st street between Baisley boulevard and 128th avenue; on 128th avenue between 161st street and New York boulevard.

**Route C, Ozone Park-Jamaica—4.3 miles**  
Beginning at or near the intersection of Parsons boulevard and Hillside avenue; Thence along Parsons boulevard to Jamaica avenue; along Jamaica avenue to Union Hall street; along Union Hall street to South road; along South road to Waltham street; along Waltham street to Liberty avenue; along Liberty avenue to 98th street; along 98th street to 103d avenue; along 103d avenue to 101st street; along 101st street to Liberty avenue;

Also along 160th street between South road and Jamaica avenue; along Jamaica avenue between 160th street and 161st street; along 161st street between Jamaica avenue and Hillside avenue; and along Hillside avenue, between 161st street and Parsons boulevard.

**Route D, Far Rockaway—1.8 miles**  
Starting at or near the intersection of Beach Channel drive and the County line in Far Rockaway;

Thence along Beach Channel drive to Hassock street; along Hassock street to Nameoke street; along Nameoke street to Far Rockaway boulevard; along Far Rockaway boulevard to Mott avenue; along Mott avenue to Caffrey avenue; along Caffrey avenue to Beach 17th street; along Beach 17th street to Seagirt avenue; along Seagirt avenue to Beach 20th Street;

Also along Seagirt avenue between Beach 17th street and Beach 13th street; Thence along Beach 13th street to Mott avenue; along Mott avenue to Beach Channel drive; along Beach Channel drive to Hassock street;

Also along Seagirt avenue between Beach 13th street and Beach 9th street; along Beach 9th street between Seagirt avenue and Cornaga avenue; along Cornaga avenue between Beach 9th street and Mott avenue; along Caffrey avenue between Beach 9th street and Mott avenue.

**Route F, Aqueduct Race Track—4.3 miles**  
Beginning at or near the intersection of Hillside avenue and Parsons boulevard; Thence along Parsons boulevard to Jamaica avenue; along Jamaica avenue to Union Hall street; along Union Hall street to Liberty avenue; along Liberty avenue to 111th street; along 111th street to Rockaway boulevard; along Rockaway Rockaway boulevard to 108th street;

Also along 160th street between Liberty avenue and Jamaica avenue; along 161st street between Jamaica avenue and Hillside avenue; and along Hillside avenue between 161st street and Parsons boulevard.

**Route G, Belmont Park Race Track—4.7**

Starting at or near the intersection of miles Jamaica-Belmont Park (express) Hillside avenue and Parsons boulevard; Thence along Parsons boulevard to Jamaica avenue; along Jamaica avenue to Hempstead avenue; along Hempstead avenue to the City line in Queens County;

Also along 213th street between Hempstead avenue and Jamaica avenue; along Jamaica avenue between 213th street and 212th street; along 161st street between Jamaica avenue and Hillside avenue; along Hillside avenue between 161st street and Parsons boulevard; along Francis Lewis boulevard between Jamaica avenue and Hillside avenue; along Hillside avenue between Francis Lewis boulevard and 180th street; along 188th street between Hillside avenue and Jamaica avenue; along 187th place between Hillside avenue and Jamaica avenue; and along 180th street between Hillside avenue and Jamaica avenue.

**Route H, Jamaica Race Track—2.16 miles**  
Beginning at or near the intersection of Hillside avenue and Parsons boulevard; Thence along Parsons boulevard to Jamaica avenue; along Jamaica avenue to Union Hall street; along Union Hall street to Liberty avenue; along Liberty avenue to New York boulevard; along New York boulevard to 122d avenue; along 122d avenue to Smith street; along Smith street to Baisley boulevard; along Baisley boulevard to New York boulevard; along New York boulevard to 122d avenue;

Also along Liberty avenue between Union Hall street and 160th street; along 160th street between Liberty avenue and Jamaica avenue; along 161st street between Jamaica avenue and Hillside avenue; along Hillside avenue between 161st street and Parsons boulevard; along New York boulevard between 122nd avenue and Baisley boulevard.

**Route, Brooklyn-Roosevelt Raceway — 11.0 miles**

Beginning on Ashford street at or near the intersection of New Lots avenue in the Borough of Brooklyn;

Thence along Ashford street to New Lots avenue; along New Lots avenue to Logan street; along Logan street to Sutter avenue; along Sutter avenue to Pine street; along Pine street to Glenmore avenue; along Glenmore avenue to Drew street; along Drew street to Pitkin avenue; along Pitkin avenue to 81th street, in the Borough of Queens; along 81th street to Sutter avenue; along Sutter avenue to Cross Bay boulevard; along Cross Bay boulevard to Woodhaven boulevard; along Woodhaven boulevard to 95th street, in the vicinity of 95th avenue; along 95th street to Atlantic avenue; along Atlantic avenue to Van Wyck Expressway; along Van Wyck Expressway, and all service roadways thereof to Hillside avenue; along Hillside avenue to the boundary line of the City of New York and the County of Nassau, in the vicinity of Langdale street;
