2 False Indigobush	2 Buttonbush	2 Silky Dogwood
(Amorpha fruiticosa)	(Cephalanthus occidentalis)	(Cornus amomum)
6-12' tall. Full sun to part shade. Moist to dry soils.	6-12' tall. Partial to full shade. Moist to wet soils.	6 - 12' tall. Full sun to part shade. Moist soils.
Loose, airy shrub with small purple to dark blue spike-like flower clusters April – June. Can form thickets. Larval host to silver- spotted skipper and gray hairstreak butterflies. Especially valuable to native bees.	Showy shrub with fragrant white to light pink flowers that resemble pincushions July - August. Tolerant of wet soils and standing water. Beneficial to birds, butterflies, moths, and native bees. Ducks and waterbirds eat the seeds.	Shrub with clusters of yellowish white flowers March – August followed by blue or gray berries in the fall. Gets its name from silky hairs on twigs and underside of leaves. Attracts birds and pollinators.

(Alnus serrulata)	(Corylus americana)	(Prunus angustifolia)
10-15' tall. Full sun. Moist to wet soils.	10-15' tall. Part shade. Dry to moist soils.	15' tall. Full sun to full shade. Dry to moist soils.
A multi-trunked shrub or small tree with dark green leaves that turn to yellow tinged with red in the fall. In late winter, slim, green, male flowers and red, female flowers mature.	Multi-stemmed shrub that naturally forms thickets. Ideal for dry sites with poor soil. Brown or red flowers March – April. Yellow to copper red fall foliage. Edible nuts attract many species of birds and squirrels.	Fragrant white flower clusters February - May and yellow fruit ripening to red in August - September. Plums can be eaten fresh or made into preserves. Attracts birds and butterflies.
