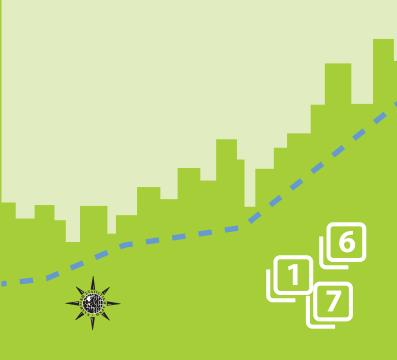

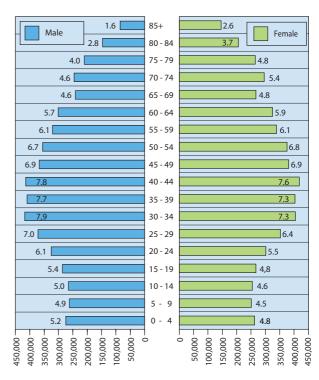

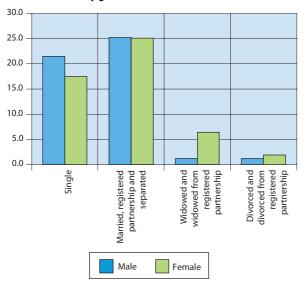

Percentage distribution of Resident Population by gender and marital status

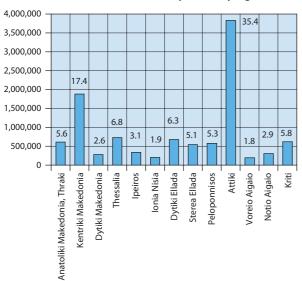

Distribution (%) of Resident Population by region

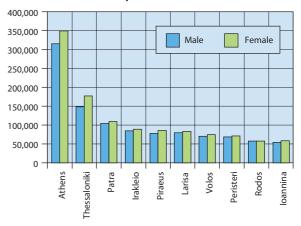

Resident Population by gender in the 10 largest **Municipalities of Greece**

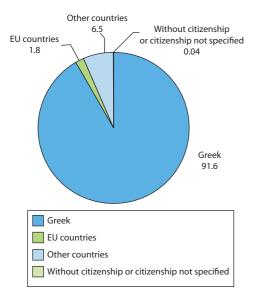

Resident Population by citizenship group (%)

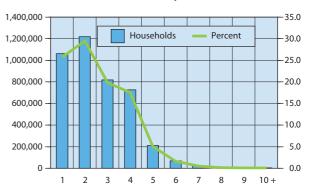

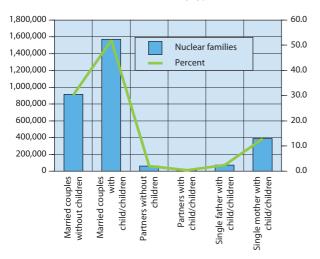

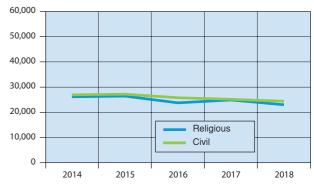

The total fertility rate is used in order to determine the level of replacement of the generations, which, in developed countries is considered to be 2.1. Total mortality rate: the number of deaths per 1,000 people.

Infant mortality rate: the number of children dying at less than 1 year of age divided by the number of live births that year. The ratio is expressed by 1,000 live births.

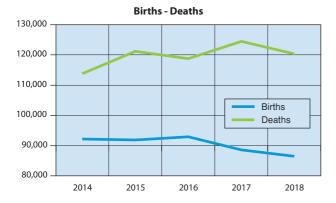

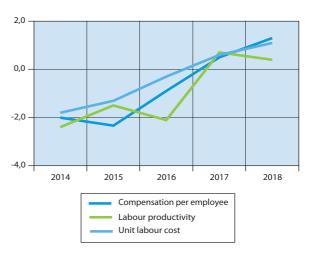

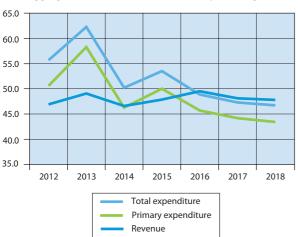

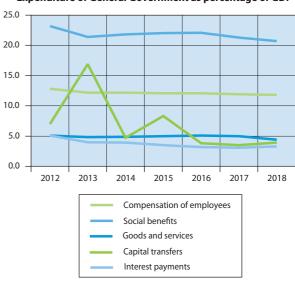

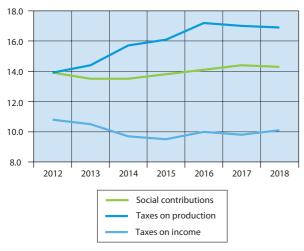
Main aggregates of General Government as percentage of GDP



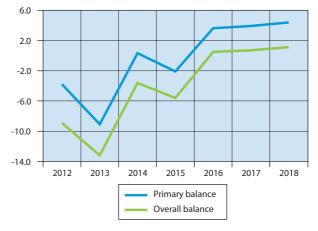
Expenditure of General Government as percentage of GDP

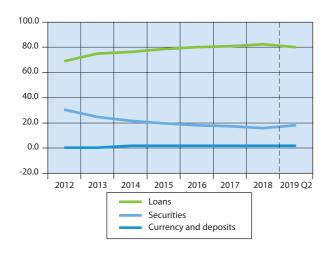

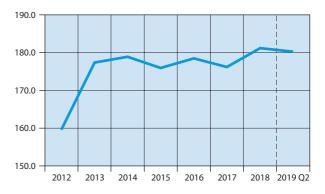

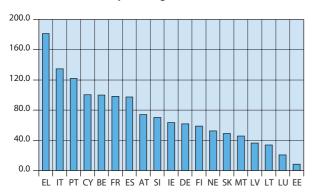
Euro area countries: General Government deficit/surplus as a percentage of GDP, 2018

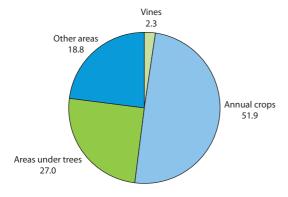

Percentage distribution of the utilised agricultural area of the holdings by basic categories of land use



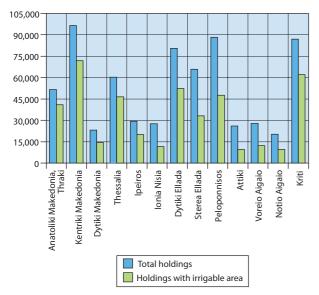

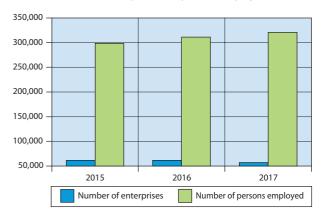

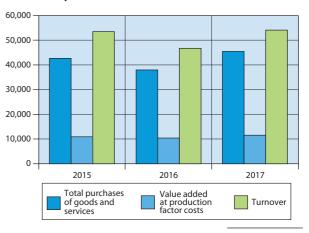

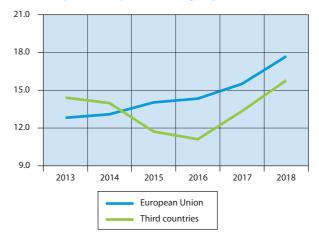

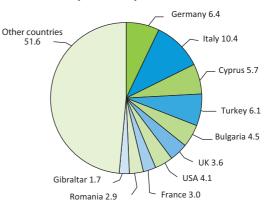

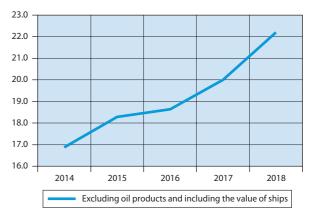

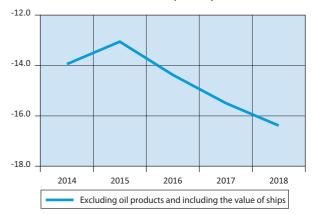
Arrivals - Imports (in bil. €)

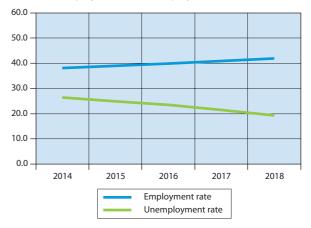

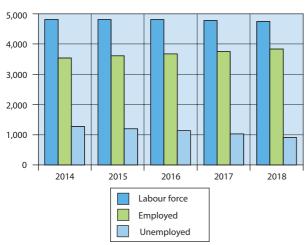

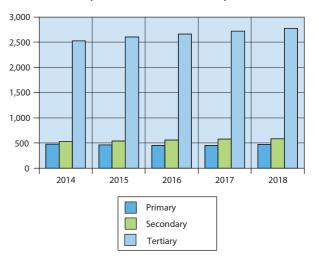
Population aged 15 years and over by employment status

Persons employed aged 15 years and over by main sector of the economy



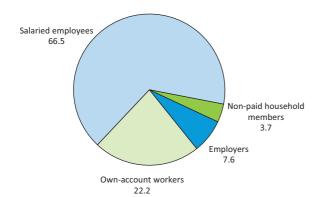

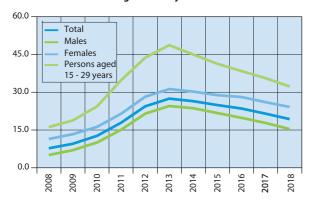

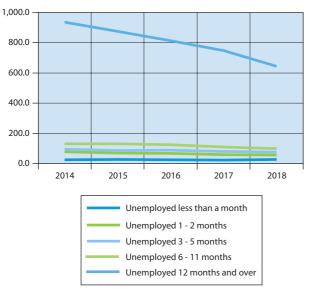

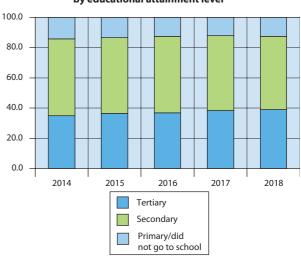

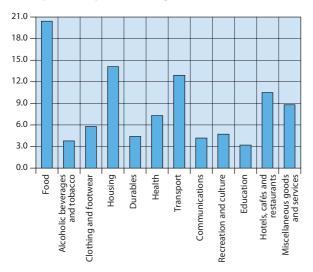
Unemployment rate (%) in euro area countries, 2018

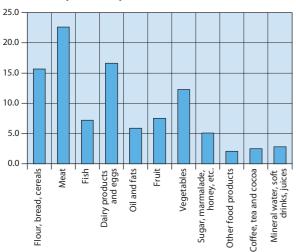
Percentage distribution of average monthly household expenditure (purchases) on goods and services, 2018

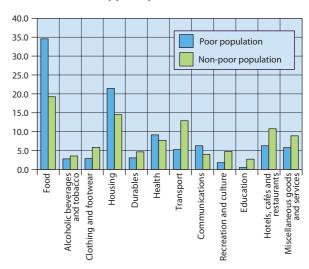
Percentage distribution of average monthly expenditure (purchases) on food, 2018

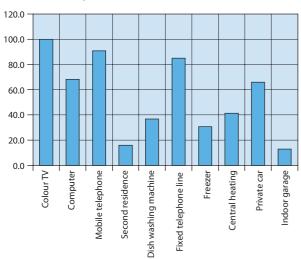
Percentage distribution of average monthly purchases by poverty status, 2018

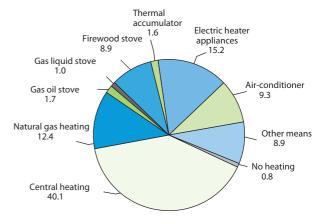

Percentage distribution of households by main heating means, 2018



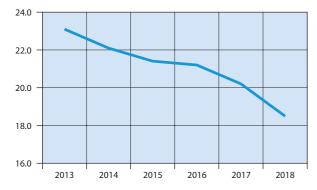

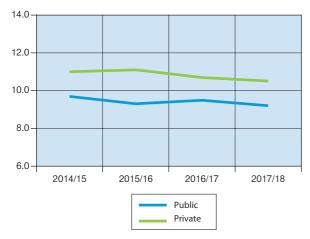

Pupils per teacher (primary schools)

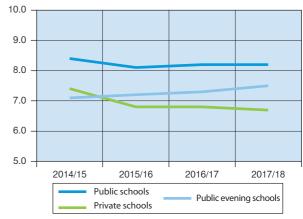

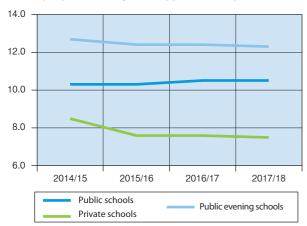
Pupils per teacher (lower secondary schools)

Pupils per teacher (general upper secondary schools)

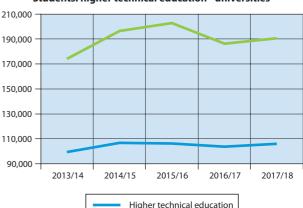

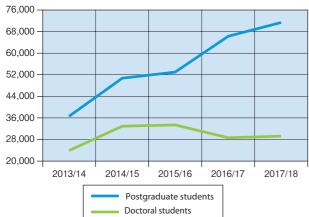

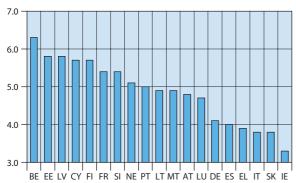

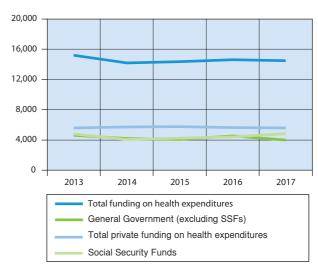

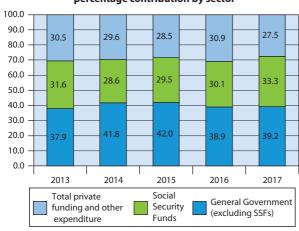

Percentage of population making use of PC and having internet access

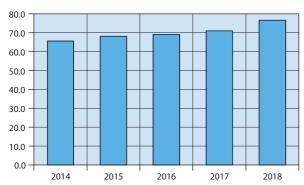

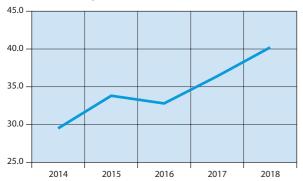

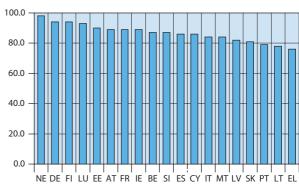
