3) Describe the key dependent variable(s) specifying how they will be measured.

LWA anti-hierarchical aggression as conceptualized and measured in Costello et al. (2022).

4) How many and which conditions will participants be assigned to?

None, as this is a correlational study.

5) Specify exactly which analyses you will conduct to examine the main question/hypothesis.

Pearson product-moment correlation between LWA anti-hierarchical aggression and social justice commitment. Pearson product-moment correlation between LWA anti-hierarchical aggression and narcissism.

Multiple linear regression predicting LWA anti-hierarchical aggression by social justice commitment and narcissism. Also, supplementary analyses adding covariates (i.e., Machiavellianism, psychopathy, LWA subscale anti-conventionalism, LWA subscale top-down censorship, virtue signaling, age, gender) to this multiple regression model will be conducted.

For the analyses of the two relationships which are of central interest (i.e., LWA anti-hierarchical aggression and social justice commitment, LWA anti-hierarchical aggression and narcissism), we will apply a Bonferroni corrected .025 (two-tailed) as significance level (.05/2 = .025). For all remaining analyses, we will apply the conventional .05 significance level.

6) Describe exactly how outliers will be defined and handled, and your precise rule(s) for excluding observations.

We will exclude participants who did not provide complete data on the central variables (i.e., LWA anti-hierarchical aggression, social justice commitment, narcissism).

In addition, we will exclude participants who failed the attention check by responding with a president's name. We will accept responses such as "none," "-," and "dssdfwrk," as these could have a different reason than failed attention (e.g., worry that the survey software would require a response for continuing with the survey).

In addition, we will exclude participants who can be identified by the applied Qualtrics software as duplicate respondents.





All these exclusions will be made prior to the analyses.

7) How many observations will be collected or what will determine sample size? No need to justify decision, but be precise about exactly how the number will be determined.

We will engage the platform Prolific (https://www.prolific.co/) through its online crowdsourcing system to recruit 400 participants. Depending on Prolific's recruitment system, it is possible that the goal of 400 participants will be exceeded a little.
