**The mission of the Richard P. Welsh Library is to support the teaching and research needs of the faculty, students and alumni of the NewSchool of Architecture & Design.**

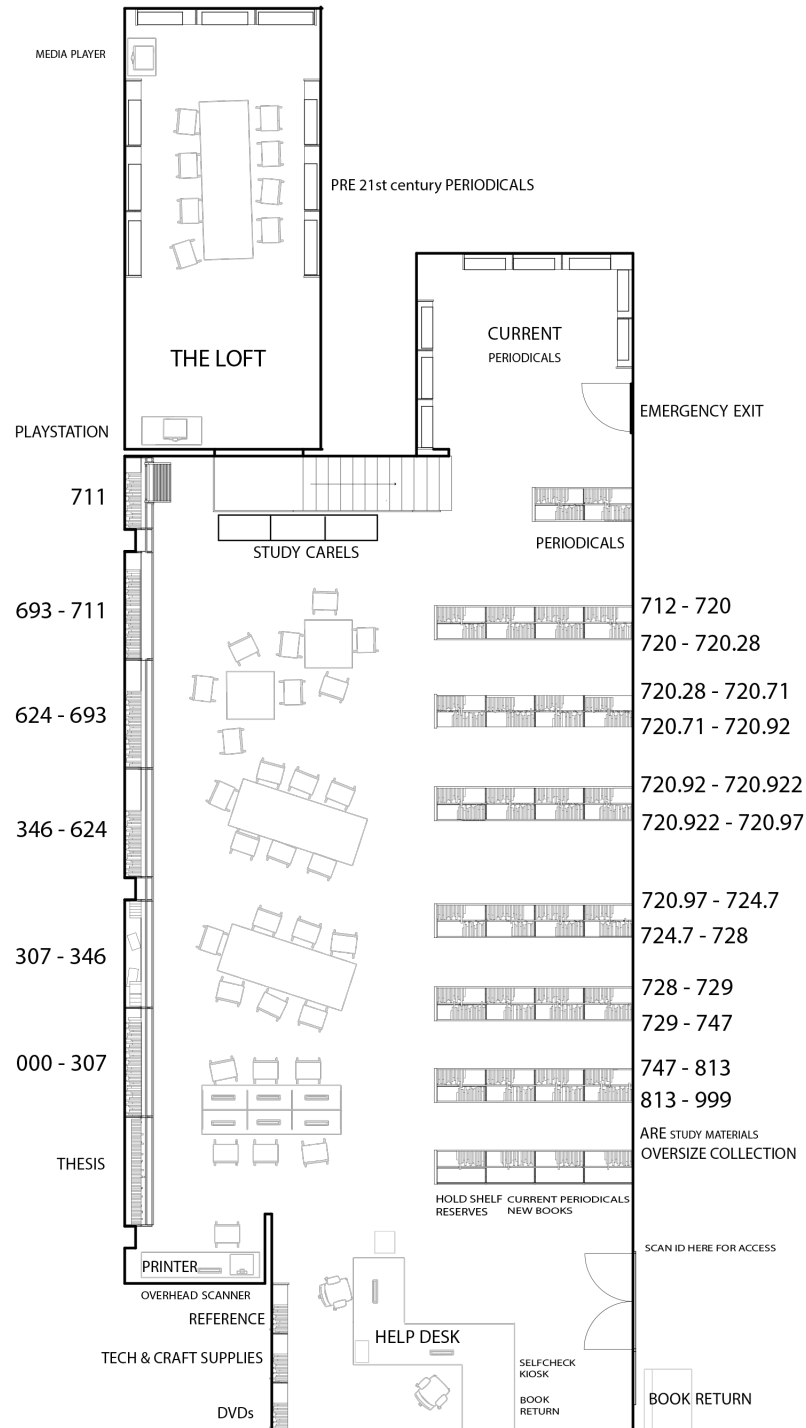
## Learning Outcomes

# Finding Information



## Dewey Decimal Subject Guide

The Dewey Decimal System classifies books and assigns them a number from 0-999 based on subject. Books are shelved in ascending order from left to right. Architecture and Design is found primarily in the 700's, so a large portion of our collection is focused here. This quick subject guide will help you get started looking for what you need. Often simply browsing the shelves in your area of interest can uncover new and useful resources.

# Using the Collection



## Borrowing

NewSchool students, faculty, staff and alumni, and members of the San Diego Chapter of the American Institute of Architects (AIA) are automatically granted the following borrowing rights.

Books	3 weeks
New Books	2 weeks
Magazines & Tech	1 week
Thesis Books	1 week
Reference & Reserve	2 hours

Items can be checked out with staff at the library desk, or via the self-check kiosk. Up to 20 items may be borrowed concurrently. Unless requested by another patron, items can be renewed three times. You can renew online via the library catalog, at the library desk, or by contacting library staff.

## Printing

The library has a black and white printer and an overhead scanner for high resolution image capture. Two multi-function copiers, printers and scanners are located in the student lounge. Users are reminded of the restrictions on photocopying which are defined by the Copyright Law of the United States. Details are posted by all copiers.

## Photo Studios

The campus has two architecture and design photo studios that are open to students the same hours as the campus. Students can check out a tripod, phone mount, and DSLR camera from the library desk. Please treat all equipment respectfully and return the studio to its original condition when you are finished.

## Returning

Items can be returned at the desk or placed in book drops located at the library desk and outside the library entrance.

## Fines

To make your library experience inclusive, accessible, and positive, we have removed late fines on most library materials. Fines still apply for course reserves, and replacement costs are charged for lost or damaged items. Keep in mind unreturned library materials will place a hold on your account that prevents registration.

## Requesting

You can request books that are already on loan to someone via the library catalog or by contacting library staff. You will be contacted via email to let you know when the book is available. Holds expire after two weeks.

## Access

Scan your ID for access outside of staffed hours. The library is open to the wider academic community and the general public. Library staff may ask to see your student ID whenever you are in the library, so please keep it safe.

## Lost & Found

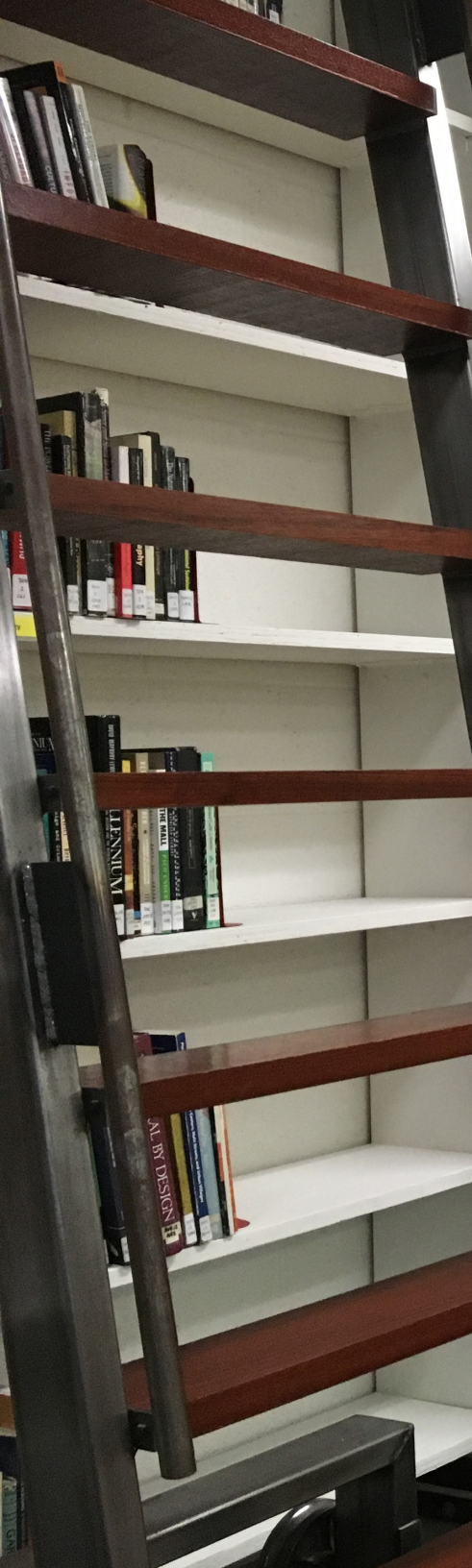
