

C-SPAN's Coverage Plans for Iowa and New Hampshire:

Speeches, Guests ... and in Iowa LIVE Coverage of a Caucus On TV and Digital Platforms

(Tuesday, January 9, 2024) -- C-SPAN is continuing its over 40-year commitment to providing the public affairs network's audience with extensive coverage of the Iowa presidential Caucus and the New Hampshire primary.

For the January 15, 2024, Republican Caucus in Iowa, and the January 23 presidential primary in New Hampshire, C-SPAN is planning the following:

- Starting Tuesday, January 9, C-SPAN is on the ground in Iowa with Republican presidential candidates in the final week of campaigning before the first-in-the-nation Caucus. Our viewers can hear the candidates' closing arguments to caucus-goers, watch voters meet the candidates and experience what it is like on the campaign trail.
- We'll be LIVE each night beginning Friday, January 12th, through caucus night, on Monday January 15. Hear candidates make their final pitches to lowa caucus-goers before the Hawkeye State's contest. We'll also feature campaign analysis with Iowa reporters and Caucus experts, viewer calls and social media reaction.
- We will take a similar approach in the days leading up to the New Hampshire primary, starting Tuesday, January 16.
- In New Hampshire, we will be LIVE each night beginning Saturday, January 20th, through primary night on Tuesday, January 23.
- C-SPAN's morning call-in guest program "Washington Journal" will originate from Iowa in the days before the Caucus and in New Hampshire before that state's primary.

CAUCUS NIGHT PROGRAMMING

• On Monday night, LIVE coverage of the Iowa GOP Caucus begins on C-SPAN and C-SPAN2 at 7:30pm ET. We'll preview the first-in-the-nation voting and then take viewers inside a Republican Caucus in Iowa.

 Once the Caucus begins, C-SPAN viewers will watch the process unfold—unfiltered and uninterrupted—from registration to caucus captain speeches to vote counts. On C-SPAN 2, we'll do something different — offering our viewers the CaucusCast — two experts providing historical context and real-time, play-by-play analysis of each step of the night's caucus.

- C-SPAN teams on the ground in Iowa will collect "Voices 2024," short video vignettes from onthe-street people answering the question - "What issue is most important to you in this election and why?" These videos will be shared on C-SPAN's TV, digital, and social media platforms.
